Ethan Hawke: Falling in love on set is 'dangerous'

Ethan Hawke admits there is "danger" to falling in love on a movie set.

The 54-year-old star met his first wife Uma Thurman when they made Gattaca in 1997 and he explained the "imaginative intimacy" actors share on a project can deepen their feelings for one another, even though there is no "connection" to "real life".

Speaking to GQ Hype, Ethan - who split from Uma in 2003 - said: "Have you ever played Spin the Bottle? There's a certain intimacy to the work that we do. Imaginative intimacy. It's such a high. It feels dangerous and thrilling. It turns the temperature up in your life. It can be like falling in love at summer camp. It doesn't have any connection to the dailiness of real life. That's the danger of it."

The Blue Moon star found the attention his relationship with Uma attracted very uncomfortable.

He said: "It's humiliating. It's almost humiliating even when they're saying positive things."

At the time, Ethan - who has children Maya, 27, and Levon, 23, with Uma, and Clementine, 17, and Indiana, 14, with wife Ryan Shawhughes - auditioned for the role of Jack Dawson in Titanic but with hindsight, he's relieved he didn't get the part.

He said: "I don't think I would have handled that success as well as Leo. He was a Beatle."

"If you each other the doubt and start you have in common that's the only way we can get out of this mess we're in."

"And that was a really helpful class to take."

The Interstellar star also revealed why she wanted to do a Master's degree.

Jessica explained: "I just like to be challenged and learn, and exercise my brain in a new way. And I was really surprised by the classes that I'm responding to."

As well as negotiation, Jessica recently said she has "got the hots" for statistics.

The IT Chapter Two actress said on a recent episode of The Tonight Show Starring Jimmy Fallon: "I was just wanting to learn new things."

"And you know what? My favourite class ended up being quantitative methods, which is like statistics. And at Juilliard, you know, we never ... As theatre nerds, we never got to learn stuff like that."

"So I am a secret nerd. I got the hots for, like, scatter graphs and, like, bell curves."

Jessica has got two semesters left of the "mid-career programme".

Looking to the future after her degree, she quipped: "My goal is to take over the world."

The rapper split from her husband Offset - the father of her three children - last year and she recently went public with her new romance with NFL player Stefon Diggs and she has confessed it feels strange to share details of her private life with her followers.

The Breaking Bad actor plays Continental Studio CEO Griffin Mill in The Studio and after turning to the show's creator and co-star Ike Barinholtz for advice on how to behave in a scene where his character ingested a large dose of the hallucinogenic, the "huge druggies" advised him to give them a go himself.

Appearing on Jimmy Kimmel Live!, Bryan said: "I'm playing this character who is wiped out and I had never had any experience in that."

"Not that many drugs at all, as a matter of fact, and so I didn't know really how to behave."

"So I was asking Seth Rogen and Ike Barinholtz, 'You guys are huge druggies! What can you tell me?'"

The pair advised Bryan, 69, to start out by microdosing.

He continued: "I said, 'I don't even know what that is. What is that?' Well, it's a microdose, you know?"

"And I said, 'Well, what would the effects be?' And he said, 'Well, try some!' And I go, 'Whoa, whoa, whoa, hang on.'"

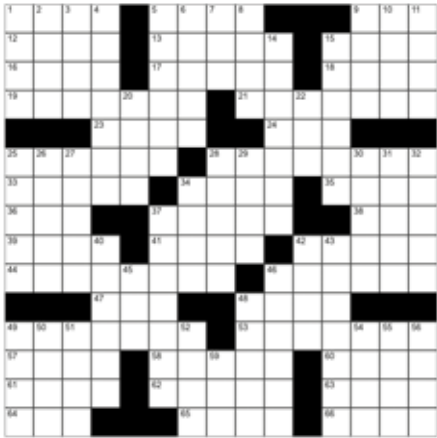
