"We continue to hear from them that they intend to honour the deal. They want to see the deal completed in that regard," one of the advisors told reporters on condition of anonymity.

This came as Israel's defence minister yesterday threatened to resume fighting if Hamas does not honour the terms of a US-backed ceasefire that halted the war in Gaza.

Bahrain is set to field its largest-ever delegation at the third Asian Youth Games, with just six days remaining before the event officially begins.

The Bahrain Olympic Committee (BOC) confirmed yesterday that 356 individuals will represent the Kingdom, including 204 athletes.

Held under the royal patronage of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, the Kingdom's contingent aims to secure podium finishes across multiple disciplines while competing on home soil.

Lineup

The athlete lineup includes 150 boys and 54 girls, with futsal fielding the largest squads at 38 players each.

Indoor volleyball follows with 36 athletes, while equestrian endurance features 27 competitors.

Both men's and women's swimming teams include 24 athletes, and boys' handball comprises 23 participants.

Bahrain's athletes will vie for a share of nearly 2,000 medals across 26 sports, including athletics, 3x3 basketball, badminton, volleyball (indoor and beach), road cycling, equestrian, futsal, golf, handball, Muay, jiu-jitsu, judo, kabaddi, mixed martial arts, table tennis, e-sports, taekwondo, wrestling, boxing, triathlon, weightlifting,

teqball, swimming, camel racing, pencak silat, and kurash.

Officials

The first batch of international officials arrived this week, including representatives from Iran, the Maldives, Jordan, Thailand, and Indonesia.

Other participating nations have confirmed their delegation sizes ahead of travel — China (293 athletes), the UAE (152),

Mongolia (135), Jordan (120), and Sri Lanka (100).

The official opening ceremony will take place at Exhibition World Bahrain on Wednesday, marking the first time the Asian Youth Games inauguration will be held indoors.

Several competitions — including boys' handball, volleyball, kabaddi, pencak silat, and kurash — will begin before the ceremony.

Girls' handball, teqball, and beach volleyball will follow, with all remaining sports set to start afterward and continue until the closing ceremony on October 31.

Public warned over fake traffic violation messages and payment links

The General Directorate of Traffic has issued a warning to the public about fraudulent text messages being circulated by unknown parties.

These messages falsely claim that the recipient has pending traffic violations and include fake payment links designed to steal personal information.

Authorities urge citizens and residents to verify traffic violations only through official platforms and applications, and to avoid clicking on any unofficial links.

Individuals who receive such messages are advised to report the incident immediately and block the sender.

The warning comes as part of ongoing efforts to protect the public from online scams and ensure the security of personal data.

NATO, EU to boost drone defences to counter Russia

NATO and the EU yesterday sought ways to boost anti-drone defences, as Europe scrambles to counter the threat from Russia after a series of air incursions.

High-profile incidents in Poland and Estonia have set off a flurry of activity from European officials to plug gaps in the continent's defences.

NATO has launched a new mission and beefed up forces on its eastern border, but it is playing catch-up as it tries to tap Ukraine's experience and get to grips with the drone threat from Moscow.

Alliance head Mark Rutte said NATO was now "testing integrated systems that will help us detect, track and neutralise aerial threats" for use on its eastern flank.

The push from the military alliance comes as the European Union is itself debating creating a "drone wall" to try to tackle the menace.

Strategic transport and logistics cooperation



Bahrain and Saudi Arabia have moved beyond coordination to full-fledged integration in vital sectors such as transport and logistics, Deputy Prime Minister, His Excellency Shaikh Khalid bin Abdulla Al Khalifa, said during talks with Saudi Deputy Minister of Transport and Logistics Services Dr. Rumaih bin Mohammed Al Rumaih at Gudaibiya Palace yesterday. Shaikh Khalid bin Abdulla said that this approach strengthens economic and social ties between the two countries and their peoples. He also noted that land and maritime transport linkage projects, both existing and planned, form a strategic corridor that reinforces the two countries' positions as international hubs for trade and logistics. These projects facilitate passenger and cargo movement and establish modern transit ports aligned with economic and commercial growth, contributing to the objectives of Bahrain's Economic Vision 2030 and Saudi Vision 2030, which jointly aim to diversify economies and enhance infrastructure efficiency.

No Ramadan Break

Government rejects Ramadan school break for last 10 days

No holiday for Ramadan's last 10 days as the government says the 180-day legal minimum and fixed exam dates leave no room to cut lessons.

In a written reply to Parliament, the government said the school year is set by Law No. 27 of 2005 on Education, which requires at least 180 teaching days in the basic and secondary stages.

Lesson times are already re-



shaped during Ramadan to balance study with the demands of the month.

Each year, a specialist committee draws up the academic calendar, exam dates and official holidays after detailed studies.

Plan

The plan aims to complete the syllabus without trimming content or approved standards and to secure enough classroom hours for pupils to meet set learning goals.

Granting a blanket break for the last 10 days of Ramadan would cut actual teaching days, risk weaker attainment and force changes to curricula, study

plans and assessment dates that are fixed to precise timetables.

Disruption would be sharpest as final exams near.

Constraints

Public higher-education institutions would face similar constraints, the reply said, with any lost time threatening the

completion of modules against accreditation and quality rules and, in turn, the intended learning outcomes.

University timetables are tied to defined academic requirements that track international practice.

The reply said the intent of the proposal is already met through adjusted lesson times in Ramadan.

Interests

The government added that it remains keen to work with Parliament while keeping pupils'

interests and education quality to the fore.

In March, MPs Hassan Bukhammas, Munir Seroor, Mohammed Al Ahmed, Ahmed Qarata and Mohammed Al Olaiwi lodged an urgent recommendation seeking a holiday over the last 10 days of Ramadan for students in schools, institutes and universities.

They said the period includes Laylat al-Qadr and that time away from classes would allow worship and ease study pressure amid busier religious and social activity.

Prosecution orders detention after driver confesses negligence

● Woman admits negligence

● Child left inside car

A woman accused of causing the death of a four-and-a-half-year-old boy in Hamad City after forgetting him inside her vehicle has confessed to the charge, prosecutors said.

The Family and Child Prosecution said the suspect admitted leaving the child, identified as Hassan Al Mahariy, in her private car for several hours at

midday. She has been detained pending investigation.

Illegal transport

Prosecutors said the woman had been transporting children and students to kindergartens and schools without an official licence, using her own private ve-

hicle, which was not authorised for transport.

Investigators visited the scene, carried out the required examination, ordered the vehicle seized for testing, and appointed a forensic doctor for a forensic examination. The child's body



was released to his family.

Continuing probe

Earlier, police said the Northern Governorate Police Directorate had taken legal measures after the incident was reported by a kindergarten employee. According to findings and family accounts, Hassan boarded a bus to kindergarten in the Damistan

housing area, fell asleep on the way, and remained inside the locked vehicle for hours under the midday heat. The case was referred to the Public Prosecution.

Authorities urged parents to avoid unlicensed drivers and reaffirmed ongoing awareness campaigns on student transport safety.

Seniority rule

MP Hassan urges Parliament to base state housing solely on application date across all governorates

Use seniority alone to allocate state housing, MP Hassan Ibrahim told Parliament, arguing that priority should rest only on the date an application was lodged and apply across all governorates without area weighting.

He also called for walk-in service offices for housing applicants in every governorate, saying such counters should extend beyond the Housing Ministry to other public bodies to ease access and improve service.

In a written reply, the government said it had studied the call to rely on seniority only.

It said current policy already treats seniority as the main yardstick, citing Decision No. 909 of 2015 on the Housing System and noting that Article 79 sets seniority as the base rule for ownership allocation in any location.

It added that seniority alone

does not secure a balanced spread of units or take into account varied household needs. System

These include where the applicant lives at the time of allocation, earlier places of res-

idence and years spent there, where the wider family lives, such as the parents and grandparents of the applicant and of the spouse, the applicant's stated preference, and any special cases the minister may judge.

The government said current policy already treats seniority as the main yardstick, citing Decision No. 909 of 2015 on the Housing System.

The government said this mix keeps seniority at the core while using the stock well and taking personal and social factors into account.

On the Capital Governorate, the government noted the squeeze on land for growth and said work is ongoing on ways to meet local demand.

It said it aims for a fair spread of units between governorates while recognising that needs differ from one area to another.

The reply closed by saying that, with seniority already the base rule alongside the listed guiding tests, the aim of the proposal is met.

Gulf national jailed for fatal road accident

The First High Criminal Court has sentenced a Gulf national to two years in prison and imposed a BD3,000 fine after convicting him of causing a man's death in a traffic accident while driving under the influence of alcohol.

According to the Public Prosecution, the incident occurred on August 28, 2025, when the defendant's impaired driving led to a collision that killed the victim.

He was additionally charged with failing to report the accident, neglecting to provide aid to the injured, damaging public and private property, driving without due care, and endangering pedestrians' lives.

The General Directorate of Traffic reported that at 3:52 a.m., the victim had stopped on

the emergency lane of the King Fahd Causeway, standing beside his vehicle with the driver's door open while speaking to pedestrians.

The defendant's vehicle struck the right side of the victim's car, forcing the door open and crushing the pedestrian against another vehicle.

The impact threw the victim backward, causing severe injuries that led to his death at the scene. Investigations revealed that the defendant continued driving for about one kilometre after the collision before being apprehended.

Subsequent tests confirmed he was under the influence of alcohol at a level that impaired his ability to drive safely.

Housing Ministry to build 137 new units in Salman City

The Ministry of Housing and Urban Planning has signed agreements to construct 137 new housing units in Salman City, further advancing the Kingdom's housing development plans.

The initiative comes as part of the Ministry's continued efforts to provide adequate housing solutions for Bahraini citizens.

The project will be implemented in partnership with Delmon Gate, Almoayyed Con-

tracting Group, Naseej Real Estate, and First Bahrain Real Estate Development Company, reflecting the government's collaboration with the private sector to accelerate housing delivery and support national urban development goals.

Partnership

The projects fall under the Government Land Development Rights Programme in partnership with the private sector.

Under the agreements, Naseej Real Estate and Almoayyed

Contracting will build 24 units, Delmon Gate will construct 69 units, and First Bahrain will implement 44 units as part of the ongoing programmes.

The agreements were signed by Her Excellency Amna bint Ahmed Al Rumaihi, Minister of Housing and Urban Planning, along with Amin Al Arrayed, CEO of Naseej Real Estate, Hala Farooq Almoayyed, Contracting Executive Director of Almoayyed Contracting, Abdullah Ali, CEO of Delmon Gate, and Omar Faisal Al Tamimi, CEO of Bahrain First

Development Company.

Strategy

Al Rumaihi said the projects align with the ministry's strategy to expand the Government Land Development Rights Programme across the Kingdom, which has already succeeded in projects such as the "Suhail" housing project in the Lawzi district, "Al Naseem" district project in Salman City, "Al Wadi" in Buhair, and Hawrat Sanad, providing hundreds of homes for beneficiaries.

Beijing’s rare earths control is ‘China versus the world’

US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent slammed Beijing’s rare earth export curbs Wednesday as “China versus the world,” vowing that Washington and its allies would “neither be commanded nor controlled.” “This should be a clear sign to our allies that we must work together, and work together we will,” Bessent told reporters at a press conference.

His comments came as global economic leaders gather in Washington this week for the International Monetary Fund and World Bank’s fall meetings.

“We do not want to decouple. We should work together to de-risk and diversify our supply chains away from China as quickly as possible,” Bessent urged.

He spoke days after Beijing imposed fresh controls on the export of rare earth technologies and items.

US Trade Representative Jamieson Greer told the same press briefing that “this is not

just about the United States.”

He said: “China’s announcement is nothing more than a global supply chain power grab.” “This move is not proportional retaliation. It is an exercise in economic coercion on every country in the world,” he added. Trade tensions between Washington and Beijing have reignited in US President Donald Trump’s second presidency, with tit-for-tat duties reaching triple-digit levels at one point.

Trump threatens to end cooking oil purchases from China

US President Donald Trump slammed China’s halt of American soybean purchases as an “economically hostile act,” warning Tuesday that his country could in turn stop buying cooking oil from the world’s second-biggest economy.

“We are considering terminating business with China having to do with Cooking Oil, and other elements of Trade, as retribution,” Trump said on his Truth Social platform.

His comments online, however, came shortly after he appeared to soothe rising temperatures between Washington

and Beijing. “We have a fair relationship with China, and I think it’ll be fine. And if it’s not, that’s okay too,” Trump told reporters at the White House.

Trade tensions between the world’s two biggest economies have reignited in Trump’s second presidency, with tit-for-tat duties reaching triple-digit lev-

els at one point.

In an interview with the Financial Times on Monday, US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent slammed Beijing, accusing it of seeking to harm the global economy following China’s sweeping new export controls in the strategic field of rare earths.

IMF lifts 2025 global growth forecast

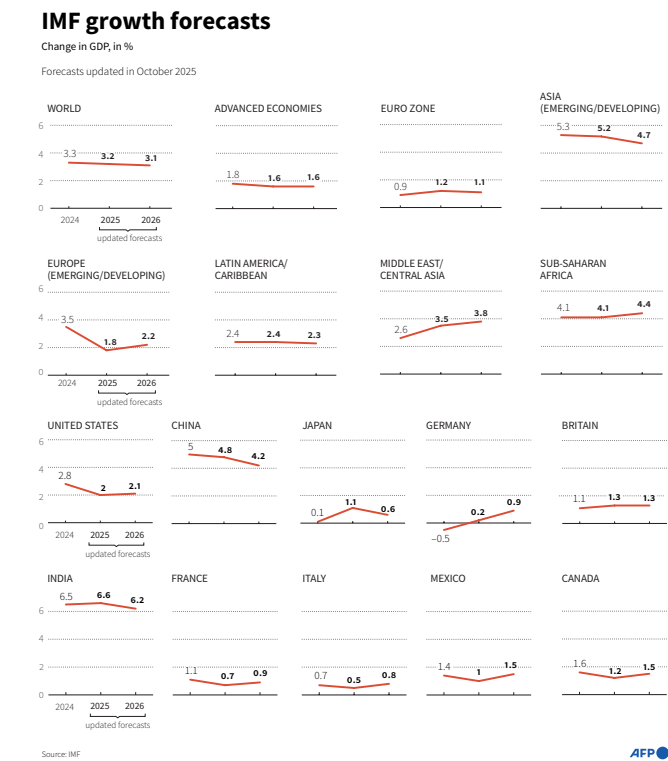

The International Monetary Fund on Tuesday lifted its outlook for global growth this year, flagging a milder-than-expected economic hit from President Donald Trump’s tariff policies while warning of risks ahead.

In its flagship World Economic Outlook (WEO) report -- compiled before the most recent US-China tariff spat -- the IMF hiked its 2025 global growth forecast to 3.2%, up from 3.0 in July, while leaving its prediction for 2026 unchanged at 3.1%.

The global inflation rate is expected to remain elevated at 4.2% this year, and 3.7% in 2026, underpinned by elevated inflation in several countries including the United States.

“The tariff shock itself is smaller than initially feared,”



IMF chief economist Pierre-Olivier Gourinchas told reporters in Washington on Tuesday, adding that the private sector had also supported growth by

responding to Trump’s tariffs in an agile way.

Other factors, including the AI boom and fiscal policies in Europe and China had also helped

to prop up the global economy, he said.

But, he warned, “the tariff shock is here, and it is further dimming already weak growth prospects.”

Since returning to office, Trump has imposed sweeping tariffs on top trading partners including China and the European Union in a bid to reshape US trading relationships and boost domestic manufacturing.

US upgraded, China unchanged

The IMF raised its prospects for economic growth for the United States, the world’s largest economy, by 0.1% this year and next, to 2.0% in 2025, and to 2.1% in 2026.

However, this still represents a marked slowdown from 2024, when US growth hit 2.8%.

Despite the trade tensions between the world’s two biggest economies, the Fund still expects China’s economy to slow to 4.8% this year from 5.0% in 2024, before cooling sharply to just 4.2% in 2026, in line with pre-

vious estimates.

China’s slowdown has been driven by a reduction in net exports, which have been at least partly offset by growing domestic demand fueled by policy stimulus, the Fund said.

Elsewhere in Asia, the IMF raised India’s 2025 growth forecast to 6.6% from 6.4% in the last outlook update in July, and hiked its prediction for growth in Japan to 1.1% -- up 0.4 percentage points.

Europe’s growth troubles continue

The outlook for Europe has improved slightly from July, with the



Eurozone now expected to grow by 1.2% this year and by 1.1% in 2026.

But despite the upgrade, Europe’s growth trajectory still significantly lags the United States.

Germany’s economy is expected to bounce back from recession to register growth of 0.2% this year, up 0.1% age point, before picking up to 0.9% next year.

And France, which is in the midst of a prolonged political crisis, is expected to see growth cool to 0.7% this year, before rising slightly to 0.9% in 2026.

The one market exception in the Eurozone is Spain, which saw an upgrade and is now expected to see growth remain resilient at 2.9% this year and 2.0% in 2026.

Growth in the United Kingdom is now expected to hit 1.3% this year and next.

As the war in Ukraine continues, the Russian economy is likely to see a marked slowdown in growth this year to just 0.6% this year from 4.3% in 2024, the IMF said, cutting its outlook by 0.4% age points.

◆ **The increase in the** amount of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere last year was the biggest ever recorded, the United Nations said yesterday, calling for urgent action to slash emissions. Levels of the three main greenhouse gases -- the climate-warming CO2, methane and nitrous oxide -- all increased yet again in 2024, with each setting new record highs, the UN's weather and climate agency said. The World Meteorological Organization said the increase in CO2 levels in the atmosphere from 2023 to 2024 marked the biggest one-year jump since records began in 1957. Continued fossil CO2 emissions, greater emissions from wildfires, and a troubling reduced absorption by land and sea all drove the increase, the WMO said. Wednesday's update, which comes ahead of the November 10-21 COP30 UN climate summit in Belem, Brazil, focused exclusively on concentrations of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere. A separate UN report, out next month, will detail shifts in emissions of the gases, but those numbers are also expected to rise, as they have every year with the world continuing to burn more oil, gas and coal.

Protein powders found with high levels of lead: report

◆ **More than** a dozen protein powders tested by US non-profit organization Consumer Reports had troubling levels of lead, according to their investigation. Of the 23 protein powders tested, more than two-thirds contained more lead in a single serving than the safe daily intake limit (0.5 micrograms), the association said on Tuesday. The average levels of lead in these products also appeared to be worsening compared to previous years. Levels of heavy metals in plant-based products were on average nine times higher than those found in dairy proteins, such as whey, and twice as high as quantities found in beef-based ones, Consumer Reports found.

◆ **Hollywood illustrator** Drew Struzan, the man behind legendary film posters for hit films such as "E.T.", "Star Wars" and "Indiana Jones" has died at the age of 78, prompting a flood of tributes. Struzan was a favourite of directors Steven Spielberg and George Lucas, and his drawing style came to symbolise the posters of Hollywood's late 1970s and 1980s heyday -- and decorated teenagers' bedrooms around the world. His death following years of struggle with Alzheimer's was announced on Tuesday on his Instagram page with a post by his manager saying that Struzan had "moved on from this world as of ... October 13th". "His creativity, through a single illustrated image, opened up a world full of life in vivid color... even at a glance," Lucas wrote in a statement on his company's website. "I was lucky to have worked with him time and time again." Spielberg said that Struzan "made event art" and "nobody drew like Drew."

Man charged with murder over US teen's livestreamed suicide

A man accused of luring children worldwide into a sadistic online abuse network was charged by German prosecutors yesterday with hundreds of crimes -- including murder, for a 13-year-old American's livestreamed suicide.

Using the pseudonym "White Tiger", the 21-year-old Hamburg man, a German-Iranian national, allegedly victimised more than 30 children with online sexual abuse, manipulation and exploitation as a part of a virtual network of abusers known as "764".

He allegedly coerced a US boy, 13, into killing himself in 2022, which was broadcast via livestream.

Authorities said the crimes occurred between January 2021, when the suspect was 16 years old, and September 2023, when he was 19.

Prosecutors in Hamburg announced 204 criminal charges against him, including allegations of committing one murder and five attempted murders as an "indirect perpetrator".

"White Tiger" would find vulnerable children and adolescents in online chats or games, develop a bond to groom them for abuse, then exploit them into producing pornographic content and harming themselves on video,

authorities said. The man was arrested at his parents' home in June.

Authorities said at the time they had identified eight victims of "White Tiger" aged between 11 and 15 from Germany, England, Canada and the United States.

The case has caused horrified reactions and prompted questions about whether German authorities could have acted sooner and prevented some of the abuse.

The Zeit newspaper reported that the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) in the United States alerted German authorities in 2021 to an apparently Hamburg-based predator going by the name of "White Tiger".

According to the newspaper, NCMEC provided a roughly 40-page document containing chat transcripts from the Discord online platform in which "White Tiger" demanded photos from two young girls, urging them to harm themselves and suggesting they take their own lives.

Police questioned the suspect at the time, but he was not arrested until this year.

During the arrest, police also seized illegal weapons -- knives, brass knuckles and a baton -- as well as computers and hard drives, which are still being analysed, according to prosecutors.

The lifeline Rafah crossing between Gaza and Egypt remained shut yesterday despite reports that it could reopen to aid

convoys, as Israel insisted Hamas hand over the remains of the last deceased hostages it holds.

Early in the day, Israeli public broadcaster KAN reported that the crossing point would reopen, but humanitarian sources told AFP this had not happened and a government spokeswoman ignored questions on the subject.

UN humanitarian chief Tom Fletcher expressed frustration that the ceasefire, brokered by US President Donald Trump and hailed by world leaders, had yet to facilitate the scale of relief needed in the devastated Palestinian territory.

"As Hamas have agreed, they must make strenuous efforts to return all the bodies of deceased hostages, urgently. I am also gravely concerned by the evidence of violence against civilians in Gaza," Fletcher said.

"As Israel has agreed, they must allow the massive surge of humanitarian aid -- thousands of trucks a week -- on which so many lives depend, and on which the world has insisted. We need more crossings open."

Humanitarian risk

Israel and Hamas are expected to continue their exchange of human remains, which also hit an unexpected obstacle on Wednesday.

So far, Hamas has handed back eight bodies, seven of which have been identified. The remains of 20 others remain in Gaza, and there is domestic pressure on Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu to tie aid to the fate of the bodies.

The eighth -- unidentified -- body was not that of a former

hostage, the Israeli military said after overnight tests, leading some Israeli politicians to accuse Hamas of breaking the ceasefire agreement.

Israel's far-right National Security Minister Itamar Ben Gvir has threatened to cut off aid supplies to Gaza if Hamas fails to return the remains of soldiers still held in the territory.

Israel, meanwhile, transferred another 45 Palestinian bodies that had been in its custody to Nasser Hospital in southern Gaza, bringing the number handed back to 90, the territory's Hamas-run health ministry said.

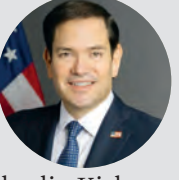

‘India Proved Doubters Wrong...’: IMF Chief’s praise in Global Economy Meet

International Monetary Fund chief Kristalina Georgieva praised India’s ‘bold economic and structural reforms’ - from revised direct and indirect tax laws to the mass rollout of a digital payments ecosystem and the conceptualisation and integration of a digital social identity (i.e., the Aadhaar) - on the first day of the global financial body’s semi-annual gathering of finance ministers and central bank governors

“I’m very big on India because of the boldness of their reforms. For example, everyone told India that digital identity on a mass scale could not be done... but India proved them wrong,” she said Monday.

Among the big-ticket ‘bold’ reforms Georgieva was referring to was the recalibration of Goods and Services Tax brackets in September. The government approved sweeping reforms that included dropping the 12 per cent and 28 per cent slabs and introducing a 40 per cent ‘sin tax’.

The change, the government had said, would boost domestic consumption by making a myriad items, including daily essentials like ghee, milk, paneer, butter, coffee, and roti, much cheaper.



The government has also overhauled income tax slabs and re-written tax laws.

The praise builds on more positive comments from last week, when she called the economy a ‘key growth engine’ within the context of a global economy still recovering from the pandemic.

The global growth forecast is roughly three per cent over the medium term - down from 3.7 per cent pre-pandemic, she had said. “... global growth patterns have been changing... with China decelerating steadily while India develops into a key growth engine,” the IMF boss had said.

As of July data, the IMF pre-

dicts 6.5 per cent growth for India in 2025 and ‘26.

The Reserve Bank of India, however, was more optimistic. In October RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra said the federal bank had raised its projection to 6.8 per cent based on implementation of growth-inducing structural reforms, including streamlining GST brackets.

The Indian economy received special praise. The G20, however, did not; the IMF boss said she would continue to push it to focus on persistent debt issues burdening developing economies.

“Growth is slow, debt is high and the risks of financial downturn are ... there,” she said, add-

ing the IMF continues to work with the World Bank to look at countries with liquidity issues.

Last week she said global public debt is expected to cross 100 per cent of GDP by 2029.

The concern for the here-and-now, meanwhile, is that already some 150 developing countries are either unable to make debt repayments or are rapidly nearing that threshold.

She also said the IMF continues to work with the World Bank to help countries with severe liquidity problems, in addition to trying to keep debt issues on the radar at the G20.

These comments are critical for the immediate future. The current chair of the G20 is

South Africa, which has made debt sustainability a key issue. The next chair, however, is the United States, and President Donald Trump has made not signalled any great interest in this topic.

Georgieva also underscored potential uncertainties - arising from the impact of the US outrageous trade tariffs - in the global economy for 2025 that she had flagged back in January.

Her remarks this morning came against the backdrop of renewed US-China trade tension.

Last week, China unveiled new export restrictions on critical minerals and the US President Donald Trump responded with a ‘100 per cent tariff’ threat and risked triggering a full trade war.

That would sabotage a truce crafted by Washington and Beijing over the past five months that reduced tariffs from triple-digit levels and prompted the IMF to upgrade its global growth outlook. IMF officials, past and present, have called for ‘sanity’ to prevail in this situation.

“If Trump goes back to 100% tariffs on Chinese goods, there’s going to be a lot of pain in the markets for him,” Martin Muehleisen, a former IMF strategist, told news agency.

Ceasefire called after new Pakistan-Afghanistan clashes

Dozens of troops and civilians were killed in a fresh round of border skirmishes between Pakistan and Afghanistan yesterday, officials on both sides of the frontier said, hours before Islamabad said the two sides had agreed to a 48-hour ceasefire.

The ceasefire was announced by Pakistan’s foreign ministry after a week of violence between the two neighbours that flared after explosions in Kabul and elsewhere in Afghanistan that were blamed on Pakistan.

The Taliban government in Kabul launched an offensive along parts of its southern border in retaliation, prompting

Islamabad to vow a strong response of its own.

Islamabad has accused Afghanistan of harbouring mili-

tant groups led by the Pakistani Taliban (TTP) on its soil, a claim

Kabul denies. With both countries on edge, plumes of black smoke were seen rising above Kabul after the two blasts in the Afghan capital on Wednesday evening, AFP reporters said.

Taliban government spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid said an oil tanker and a generator had exploded, sparking fires, although he did not explicitly link the blasts to the clashes with Pakistan.

However, a Pakistani security source told AFP that Islamabad had carried out “precision strikes” in the Afghan capital.

Ambulances raced through Kabul and shattered glass from damaged buildings littered the streets, AFP saw.

Step aside, popemobile: Pope gets a white purebred horse

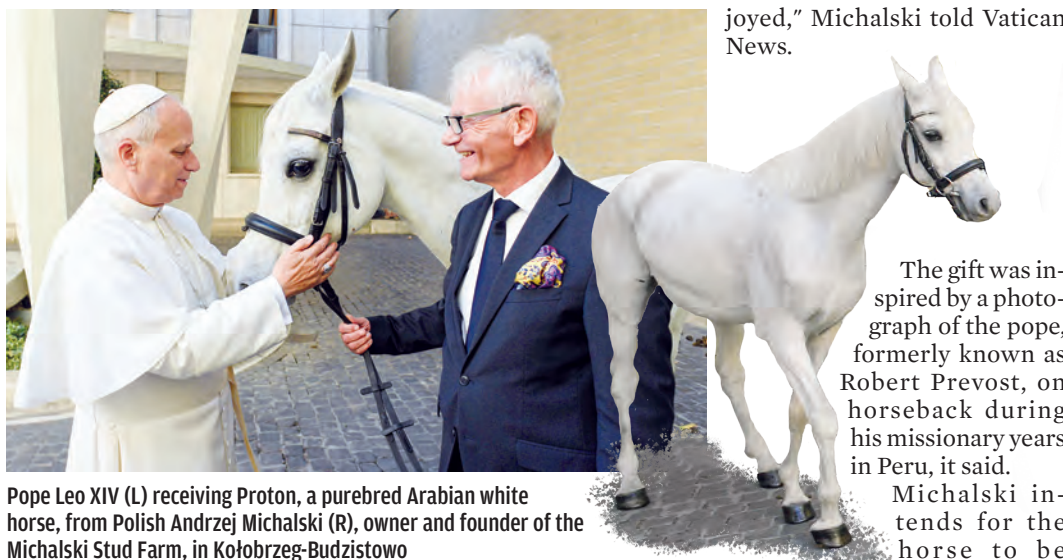

Popes regularly receive gifts from the faithful or visiting dignitaries, which are often sold at auction for charitable purposes.

During his 12-year pontificate, Pope Francis notably received two donkeys and a Lamborghini painted in the colours of the Vatican.

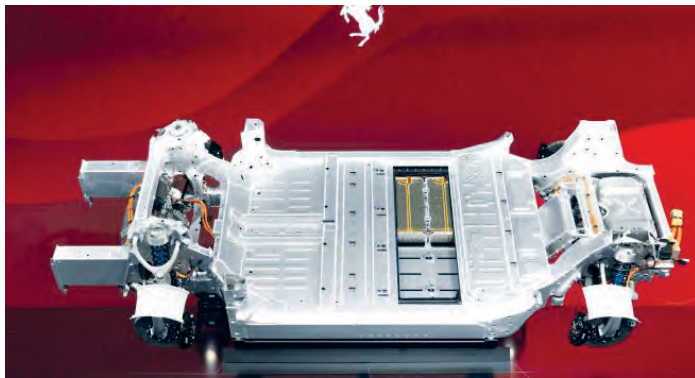

Ferrari will begin its cautious shift to electric vehicles in 2026 with its first battery-powered four-seat coupe.

The luxury brand with the prancing horse logo presented details of its first electric sports car, to be released next year, during a presentation to investors and media at its Maranello factory, even while revealing it would scale back its electrification plans.

The four-seat coupe, "Elettrica," will offer over 1,000 horse-

that there aren't too many cars on the road," he said.

No price for the Elettrica was disclosed, but analysts say Ferrari will need to carefully position it in relation to the nearly 500,000 euros (\$580,500) base price of its Purosangue SUV.

Ferrari already sells nearly half of its cars in hybrid versions, but until now has not made the shift to electric, which comes several years after Porsche, Lamborghini, Lotus, and the very fast Rimac.

Electric models will account for only 20 % of Ferrari's offering in 2030, compared with the 40 percent announced previously, with combustion engine models continuing to dominate.

Amplified sound

As expected, the Elettrica

promises to be fast, going from zero to 100 kilometres per hour in 2.5 seconds with a maximum speed of 310 km/h.

The classic Ferrari shift paddles on the steering wheel will be used on the Elettrica to opt between a smooth or sporty driving style, modulating the power of the motors and the suspension control.

In a homage to large gasoline engines, the Elettrica offers a simulated downshift, while the purr of the traditional engines will be replaced with an amplified sound from the electric motor to signal information about the feel of the road to the driver, said Gianmaria Fulgenzi, Ferrari's product director.

"It's like choosing between a sailboat and a motorboat: both are exciting but in different ways," he said.

The brand has taken on the costly development of most of the technical innovations, particularly the integrated battery pack -- one of the only components it will not manufacture itself -- "because keeping that expert knowledge in-house means we can stay competitive", he said.

The Elettrica is equipped with a huge 122 kWh battery, bringing its weight to 2.3 tonnes -- the heaviest Ferrari ever built.

Set a daunting 277-run target for victory, the visitors and World Test champions were bowled out for 183 in the afternoon session on day four.

Man of the match Noman finished with 4-79 and 10-191 in the match for his third haul of ten wickets or more in Tests.

With the Gaddafi Stadium pitch taking sharp turn and low bounce, the 39-year-old exploited the conditions well despite a stubborn 73-run stand between Dewald Brevis and Ryan Rickelton in the morning.

In all, spinners from both sides took 34 wickets, with just six going to fast bowlers.

South African left-armers Senuran Muthusamy took 11-174 in the match.

Pakistan made 378 in their first innings, with South Africa scoring 269 in reply.

On a deteriorating surface, the hosts collapsed in their second-innings 167 but it proved enough.

"We won the Test match and it's gone exactly to plan," said Shan Masood, who now has four wins in 13 Tests as captain, with nine losses.

Ferrari currently top the manufacturers' standings with 204 points, as Porsche and Cadillac follow with 165 points and 143 points, respectively – with both needing extraordinary results

in Bahrain to wrest away the crown from the leaders.

Hypercar Drivers' Championship

In the Hypercar drivers' championship battle, Ferrari AF Corse's #51 crew of Alessandro Pier Guidi, Antonio Giovinazzi, and James Calado are leaders on 115 points, but they are just 13 ahead of the AF Corse's trio of Philip Hanson, Robert Kubica, and Yifei Ye in their #83 Hypercar. Porsche Penske Motorsport's #6 crew of Kevin Estre and Laurens Vanthoor – two of last season's Hypercar drivers' title winners – are still in the fight with 84 points, while Cadillac Hertz Team Jota's #12 team of Alex Lynn, Norman,

Nato, and Will Stevens have a slim chance to take the crown but are mathematically in the hunt.

LMGT3 Categories

Meanwhile, also to be won in Bahrain are the FIA Endurance Trophy for LMGT3 Teams and FIA Endurance Trophy for LMGT3 Drivers.

Both the LMGT3 teams' and drivers' standings are currently led by Manthey 1st Phorm's #92 crew of Riccardo Pera, Richard Lietz, and Ryan Hardwick with 105 points as they chase back-to-back title doubles. Vista AF Corse's #21 triumvirate of Alessio Rovera, Francois Heriau, and Simon Mann follow on 94 points, while TF Sport's #81

trio of Charlie Eastwood, Rui Andrade, and Tom Van Rompuy are third with 81 points.

Tearful Osaka battles injury to reach Japan quarter-finals

Naomi Osaka battled through injury to reach the quarter-finals of the Japan Open yesterday, choking back tears after hitting the winning shot against defending champion Suzan Lamens.

Top seed Osaka, playing a singles tournament in her native Japan for the first time in three years, won 7-6 (8/6), 3-6, 6-2 to set up a last-eight match against Romania's Jaqueline Cristian.

The former world number one was leading 5-0 in the final set in the city of Osaka when she needed a medical timeout to receive treatment on her left leg.

She returned with heavy strapping on her thigh and

lost the next two games before closing out the match in 2 hours, 20 minutes.

Four-time Grand Slam champion Osaka hit a backhand winner and then bent over and put her hand to her face before walking to the net appearing to fight back tears.

“It was definitely really difficult. I'm kind of sorry about my attitude,” Osaka said in an on-court interview that had to be cut short due to her injury.

The 27-year-old is playing in her first tournament since reaching the US Open semi-finals, where she lost to Amanda Anisimova of the United States.

Osaka had not progressed to the second week of a major since winning the Australian Open for a second time in 2021.

The opening race of Round 2 of the FIA-certified Aramco F4 Saudi Arabian Championship concluded today, Wednesday, at the Bahrain International Circuit. Promoted by ALTAWKILAT Motorsport under the supervision of the Saudi Automobile and Motorcycle Federation (SAMF), the event brought together 14 male and female drivers for an action-packed day of competition.

The race delivered fierce on-track battles among the young talents, who showcased exceptional pace and precision, reflecting the steady rise in the championship's level from one



round to the next. At the checkered flag, Emirati driver Adam Al Azhari (Valvoline) claimed a dominant victory, followed by Swedish driver Scott Kin Lindblom (Red Bull) in second place, and British driver Kit Belofsky

(PEAX) in third. Belofsky also earned the Best Rookie Driver Award, while American driver Ava Dobson (PEAX) was recognized as the Best Female Driver.

Earlier in the day, Al Azhari topped the qualifying session

with a blistering lap of 2:06.907, edging out Lindblom by 0.547 seconds, while Belofsky secured third just 0.592 seconds behind. Theo Palmer, Ari Bansal, and Chiara Bättig completed the top six.



The race was briefly neutralized by a Safety Car following a collision between Swiss driver Chiara Bättig (Red Bull) and British driver Megan Bruce (CARAAGY) on lap seven. Meanwhile, German newcomer Esme Kustermann impressed with a strong performance, climbing from 12th on the grid to finish ninth.

Round 2 action continues tomorrow, Thursday, with the sec-

ond and final race of the weekend, as fans eagerly anticipate another thrilling showdown between the rising stars of the championship. With margins tighter than ever and podium battles heating up, another exciting race is expected at the technically demanding Bahrain International Circuit, before the championship heads to the Jeddah Corniche Circuit, the world's fastest street track.
