Bahrain and India explore ways to enhance relations

Reform agenda

Shura Council to discuss renewable energy, work permits, and new dismissal rules today

Three items will be discussed by the Shura Council today: a renewable energy bill, a proposed grace period for work-permit renewals, and new rules on economic dismissals.

Members are expected to examine the three draft laws along with their accompanying committee reports, reviewing the details and recommendations for each proposal.

The Council will discuss the report of the Public Utilities and Environment Committee on the draft law proposal concerning renewable energy, submitted by members Talal Al Mannai, Dalal Al Zayed, Dr Mohammed Ali Hassan, Jumaa Al Kaabi and Ali Abdullah Al Aradi.

Recommendation

The report carries the committee's recommendation that the proposal, in the form of a law, should be taken up for consideration.

According to the committee, the proposal aims to support Bahrain's Economic Vision 2030 by creating an inviting setting for investment in renewable energy and keeping pace with the global shift towards clean power.



It seeks to put in place a comprehensive legal framework for the renewable energy sector that shows the strong attention the Kingdom of Bahrain gives to this growing field.

Burden

The draft also aims to ease the burden of electricity consumption on citizens and other users in their homes and businesses, reduce pressure on the electricity grid and secure savings in the budget of the Ministry of Electricity and Water.

The committee said the

proposed law is designed to strengthen the Kingdom's ability to develop renewable and sustainable energy resources by encouraging the production of clean energy, coupled with a reduction in power generated from traditional sources based on fossil fuels.

It added that the measure supports Bahrain's path towards carbon neutrality and its targets for cutting carbon emissions, and forms part of the steps taken to face environmental challenges shared by countries around the world and to keep meeting

The committee recommends not approving, in principle, a draft, which concerns the organisation of the termination of employment contracts for economic reasons.

international environmental obligations.

In its report, the committee noted that the proposal in the form of a law gives shape to the lofty Royal vision of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, as set out in his directives during the opening of the fourth ordinary session of the sixth legislative term.

In that address, HM the King stressed the importance of focused investment in renewable energy in order to reach the level of self-reliance needed to pro-

tect and grow the Kingdom's resources, and to support the continuity of the natural and agricultural environment.

The committee explained that the proposal requires any person wishing to connect an electricity-generation unit from renewable energy sources to the distribution system to obtain prior approval from the Authority, in line with rules laid down by a decision of the minister.

Connection

The aim is to ensure that each connection meets technical requirements that do not harm the distribution system, to keep the distribution network running smoothly and to avoid technical faults that might arise from connections made without regard to engineering standards.

In the same sitting, the Council will look at the report of the Services Committee on a draft law amending Article (26) of Law No. (19) of 2006 on the Regulation of the Labour Market, prepared in the light of a bill proposed by Parliament.

The committee recommends not approving, in principle, the draft law, which would give an employer extra time to renew a work permit so that the penalty in Article (36) of the law is not imposed as soon as the permit expires.

Weather relief

Bahrain braces for cooler, stronger winds next week

The Meteorological Directorate at the Ministry of Transportation and Communications has forecast a noticeable improvement in Bahrain's weather starting mid-next week, as north winds resume their activity and influence the Kingdom's atmosphere.

The Directorate said the winds are expected to gradually shift to a northwesterly direction from the evening of tomorrow, with speeds ranging from light to moderate.



Wind speeds are predicted to increase on Tuesday, becoming active to strong, and this activity is expected to continue until Thursday, November 20, 2025.

The Directorate warned that these conditions may lead to dust storms in some areas and a noticeable drop in humidity levels.

Daytime temperatures

Temperatures are also expected to gradually decrease toward the end of the week, with maximum daytime temperatures

reaching around 26 degrees Celsius and minimum nighttime temperatures around 17 degrees.

However, the actual feeling of cold is expected to be less intense, particularly during night and early morning hours, due to the influence of the northerly winds.

The Meteorological Directorate urged citizens, particularly those frequently at sea, to take necessary precautions and follow official bulletins and warnings issued through its various communication channels.

MPs to ratify new Bahrain-Kyrgyzstan air services deal strengthening regional links

● **Formalising passenger and cargo routes**

New air links between Bahrain and Kyrgyzstan will go before MPs on Tuesday, as the Parliament reviews a draft law to ratify a 27-article air services agreement attached to Decree No. (35) of 2025.

Signed in Manama on 21 April 2025, the deal would open direct routes for passengers and cargo, give airlines on both sides more room to plan services and place Bahrain-Kyrgyzstan flights within the Chicago Convention on International Civil Aviation.

The Public Utilities and Environment Committee has backed the draft in principle and urged MPs to pass it in its current form.

Preamble

The draft law itself is short, made up of a preamble and two articles.

The first article ratifies the air services agreement and attaches it to the law, while the second is an executive clause requiring the Prime Minister and ministers to implement its provisions, with the law to take effect the day after publication in the Official Gazette.

Behind that sits a detailed framework that sets out traffic rights, safety and security rules, environmental measures and a list of routes.

Emergencies

Each state may name its own airlines to run the agreed services and grant them operating permission, while both keep the power to curb or halt flights during emergencies or for public security.



The agreement aims to secure efficient, competitive air services, give airlines scope to offer a wider range of options and keep high standards of safety and security.

Airlines are allowed to set fares on commercial grounds, with only narrow room for government intervention.

The agreement also calls for fair and equal chances for carriers from both countries to run services that match demand for travellers, freight and mail.

Clauses

Other clauses cover recognition of airworthiness certificates and licences, the use of leased aircraft, how to deal with inadmissible passengers and deportees, and the sharing of statistics between aviation authorities. Both governments state that they will follow interna-

tional rules on flight safety and the protection of civil aviation from unlawful acts, including hijacking, and that they will assist each other if such incidents occur or are threatened.

They also say they will support sustainable aviation in line with International Civil Aviation Organization guidance on environmental protection.

Arbitration

Disputes are to be settled first by talks and, if that fails, by arbitration.

In its written view to Parliament, the Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications said the agreement would

strengthen air links with the Kyrgyz Republic, open the way to future destinations for citizens and residents and raise service levels at Bahrain International Airport.

It added that the text follows model bilateral agreements used at the International Civil Aviation Organization and allows multiple airline designations and an open-skies style approach.

Ties

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs said the deal sits within Bahrain's wider effort to deepen ties with friendly states.

It said the agreement aims to secure efficient, competitive air services, give airlines scope to offer a wider range of options and keep high standards of safety and security.

The Public Utilities and Environment Committee ended its report by recommending approval in principle of the draft law and backing the title, preamble and both articles as submitted by the government.

Bahrain a 'global model of tolerance'

Bahrain's pioneering initiatives to promote tolerance and coexistence have consolidated the Kingdom's standing as a global model of religious and cultural respect.

This was emphasised by His Excellency Dr. Abdullatif bin Rashid Al Zayani, Minister of Foreign Affairs and Chairman of the National Human Rights Committee.

"The humanitarian and diplomatic approach of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa has consolidated the Kingdom of Bahrain's position as a leading global model of tolerance, coexistence, and respect for religious and cultural diversity," Dr. Al Zayani said.

Approach

Speaking on the occasion of the International Day for Tolerance, the Minister noted that this approach has reinforced Bahrain's role as "a key partner in promoting regional and international security, peace, and dialogue among civilizations."

Dr. Al Zayani stressed that Bahrain's vision, guided by His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa and His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, prioritises the protection of human rights and religious freedoms.

"This vision supports the protection of human rights and religious freedoms, and advances noble humanitarian values, solidarity, and mutual understanding," he said, noting these values are embedded in both the Government Plan and the National Human Rights Plan.

Outlining concrete measures, the minister highlighted

Launch

He also pointed to the launch of the King Hamad Prize for Coexistence and Tolerance and other international humanitarian awards.

Dr. Al Zayani drew attention to Bahrain's educational emphasis and international advocacy, including the kingdom's call for "an international convention to criminalise religious and racial hate speech."

He said Bahrain's global outreach extends to organising conferences that promote interfaith and intercultural dialogue, and to partnerships that amplify its message of pluralism.

'Beacon of religious and cultural diversity'

Royal vision

Programmes Dr. Shaikh Abdulla bin Ahmed outlined a series of educational and training programmes the Centre is delivering to foster mutual understanding.

These include the second edition of the Joint Postgraduate Diploma in Coexistence — run in cooperation with the University for Peace (UPEACE) and the Gioya Higher Education Institute in Malta — and the second cohort of the King Hamad Leadership in Coexistence Programme, offered in partnership with British academic institutions.

LMRA reviews wage protection system

● **Push for electronic salary payment to support stable labour relations**

The Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) has reviewed its projects for 2025-2026 aimed at developing the labour market environment, enhancing customer services, and strengthening oversight in line with Bahrain's Economic Vision 2030, the Government Plan, and the National Labour Market Plan 2023-2026.

This came as the Board of Directors, chaired by His Excellency Yousif bin Abdulhussein Khalaf, Minister of Legal Affairs and Acting Minister of Labour, held its regular meeting in the presence of board members and H.E. Nibras Mohammed Talib, LMRA CEO.

The meeting reviewed plans

to update labour market policies and supporting procedures to meet sector needs and keep pace with economic changes.

It also discussed efforts to improve operational efficiency, simplify processes, and enhance integration across government systems to support service qual-

ity, competitiveness, and investment appeal.

The board was briefed on key development projects, including progress in implementing the Wage Protection System and aligning all financial and banking institutions with its requirements.

It emphasised the system's

importance in protecting the rights of employers and workers and promoting a fair and secure work environment.

At the end of the meeting, the board urged employers to comply with electronic salary payment and take advantage of the system's benefits in supporting stable labour relations.

BD100 disability allowance paid to eligible staff: CSB

The Civil Service Bureau has said that an allowance for those who teach, train or care for persons with disabilities is already in place, paying BD100 a month to educational and specialist staff and BD50 to employees in the general jobs group.

In a written response to a parliamentary proposal on a special allowance for teachers of special-needs groups, the Bureau stressed that the government is responsible for setting salaries, benefits and the rules for paying allowances.

Government bodies, it added, draw up lists of employees who meet the criteria and submit them to the Bureau.

Allowance

The allowance is then paid to everyone who qualifies in public schools and in rehabilitation centres run by the competent bodies.

According to the Bureau, the Civil Service Instructions place the onus on government entities to identify those who qualify for the allowance under the set rules, before the lists are signed off by the competent authority and sent on to the Bureau.

This is meant to ensure that

the money goes only to staff who are actually carrying out teaching, training or care duties for persons with disabilities.

Reply

The Ministry of Education, in its own reply, said the allowance proposed by MPs 'already exists on the ground' and is paid to those who meet the conditions laid down.

The ministry said its role is limited to determining the eligible groups and forwarding the names to the Civil Service Bureau.

It explained that the BD100 allowance is paid to staff who hold a special education diploma together with a bachelor's degree, to those with a bachelor's degree in special education, or to those with qualifications tied to teaching or training persons with disabilities, such as physiotherapy, psychotherapy and speech therapy.

A BD50 allowance is paid to staff in the general jobs group who carry out teaching, training or care work for persons with disabilities in public schools and in organisational units of the ministry.

The allowance can also be granted to staff who are seconded or assigned to educational centres supervised by the ministry.

Scholarships

The ministry added that it is working to encourage and prepare national staff through scholarships, training programmes and specialist courses.

The responses came after a proposal was submitted by MPs Mohammed Al Masrefi, Mohammed Al Rafai, Jaleela Alawi and Mohsen Al Asboul.

The MPs had first called for the allowance to be introduced, then asked for their proposal to be amended so that "the value of the allowance be increased to BD200 for the educational and specialist category instead of BD100, and to BD100 for the general jobs category instead of BD50, while stressing the need to include all teachers who are actually performing teaching, training and care duties for students with disabilities, including in inclusive education classes".

Funds fraud

Businessman jailed 10 years for illegally collecting over BD3m and managing unlicensed investments

The First High Criminal Court has sentenced a businessman to 10 years in prison and fined him BD100,000 after finding him guilty of illegally collecting and managing funds without a license, as well as embezzling movable assets and large sums exceeding BD3 million.

The court also ordered the confiscation of criminal proceeds and the restitution of funds to their rightful owners.

In addition, the defendant was ordered to pay BD6,000 in temporary civil compensation to the first plaintiff and BD1,000 to the second plaintiff for the material and moral damages they suffered.

Solicitation

According to the Public Prosecution, between 2020 and 2023 the defendant solicited and received large sums of money from three victims under the pretext of investing, managing, and developing their funds in real estate, company



formation, vehicles, distinctive plate numbers, and luxury watches – without obtaining the required license from the competent regulatory authorities.

He then unlawfully appropriated the money and assets for himself.

Case documents reveal that the defendant received more than BD1.67 million from the first victim through bank transfers, cash, vehicles, jet skis, and equipment, all purportedly for investment.

However, he misappropriated the funds and assets for personal gain.

Shoreline

The second victim transferred one million Saudi riyals

for a real estate and recreational investment project involving jet skis and padel courts near the Manama shoreline.

The defendant returned part of the money but kept SR50,000 and failed to deliver any profits.

The third victim gave the defendant BD45,000 via cash and bank transfers for investment in real estate and movable assets.

The defendant promised him employment in one of his companies, profit returns, a BD100,000 cheque, and a luxury car, and convinced him to transfer ownership of two special number plates.

Cheque

He later retrieved the cheque deceitfully and kept the funds.

A Gulf businessman also testified that he gave the defendant approximately BD2 million between 2020 and 2024 for investments in real estate, vehicles, watches, and company formation.

He later discovered that no accounts were opened in his name and that all assets were registered under the defendant, who continuously evaded repayment.

Asians held for stealing BD5,000 metal sheets

The Ministry of Interior announced that the Muharraq Governorate Police Directorate has arrested several Asians for stealing metal sheets valued at BD5,000 from a construction site in the Muharraq Governorate.

The Directorate explained that immediately after receiving the case, police initiated search and investigation procedures, gathering information and evidence, which led to identifying the suspects, arresting them, and recovering the stolen items.

Legal proceedings were taken, and the case was referred to the Public Prosecution.

Man arrested for selling alcoholic beverages

The Ministry of Interior announced that the Capital Governorate Police Directorate has arrested a 39-year-old Asian for selling alcoholic beverages in the Maameer area.

An investigation into received information led to identifying the suspect and arresting him for possession of alcoholic substances.

The necessary legal measures are being taken in preparation for referring the case to the Public Prosecution.

Drugs found in man's abdomen

● Attempt to smuggle 100 drug capsules

The First High Criminal Court has scheduled December 15 to issue its verdict in the case of a 46-year-old Asian man accused of attempting to smuggle 100 drug-filled capsules inside his body for distribution within Bahrain.

The defendant's plan was foiled by the vigilance of Customs officers at Bahrain International Airport.

According to testimony from a Customs officer, the suspect aroused suspicion while passing through inspection points.

Check

He was redirected to the red channel for a thorough check, where X-ray imaging revealed multiple round objects concealed inside his abdomen, believed to be drug capsules.

The Anti-Narcotics office was notified, and during the procedures the defendant requested to use the restroom.

He subsequently expelled 42 yellow capsules, followed shortly by an additional 16.

After being transferred to the hospital, he released 28 more, and later 14 additional capsules – bringing the total to 100 capsules in three separate batches.

Investigations revealed the man was part of a drug-importation network operating with the intent to traffic and distribute narcotics inside Bahrain.

Payment

His role involved smuggling the capsules internally in exchange for payment.



change for payment.

He admitted to the charges during Public Prosecution questioning and confessed that he had carried out the same act twice before without being detected.

The Public Prosecution charged him with importing and possessing controlled substances with intent to traffic.

Bahrain diabetes forum

Festival activities will run daily and feature a diverse range of cultural and artistic experiences, including live musical performances, within the Pearling Path site.

Bahrain court declines jurisdiction in \$400,000 Arabic film rights case

Four hundred thousand dollars in worldwide rights to an Arabic film are in dispute in a case the High Commercial Court has ruled it cannot hear for lack of jurisdiction, a stance backed by the High Commercial Court of Appeal, according to lawyer AbdulAdheem Hubail.

A Bahraini company had sued an international company and one of its executives, saying they agreed to pay \$400,000 in instalments for all external distribution rights to the feature film.

The deal was set out in a contract to purchase all exploitation rights to the film and in two exclusive distribution agreements covering commercial screenings around the globe.

Profit

The claimant told the court it had honoured its side of the bargain in full, while the defendants had failed to pay half the sum, \$200,000, and had gone on to profit from and sell the film, which is now carried on Netflix.

It argued that, as a Bahraini company with bank statements showing incoming transfers, it was entitled to bring the case



before Bahrain's courts.

The court of first instance said it had examined copies of the two contracts and found they were drawn up on the defendant company's own letterhead and bore only a signature attributed to that company.

The preamble and the foot of the pages stated that the company's registered office is in a GCC state.

There was no wording to show that the contracts were concluded in Bahrain, or that performance of the obligations, in whole or in part, took place or was meant to take place there.

On that basis, the court held that the condition in Article 15 of the Civil and Commercial Procedures Law, which turns on the place of performance, did not apply.

The judges noted that the subject of the two agreements was the distribution of commercial rights to the film.

Nothing in their clauses or annexes pointed to any direct or indirect link between performance of the obligations and the territory of Bahrain, or suggested that Bahrain would be used as a venue for distribution, screening, payment or delivery.



Bahraini courts do not have international jurisdiction unless one of the specific cases laid down in the Civil and Commercial Procedures Law is met.

From the documents on file, the court said it could not draw any meaningful territorial link that would give the Bahraini courts international jurisdiction.

Evidence

The court added that the claimant had not produced evidence that the defendant company carried out any act in

Bahrain tied to the contracts in dispute, or that the contractual relationship was legally and substantially tied to Bahraini territory.

In the court's view, the dispute was not connected in law to the Kingdom by any of the grounds set out in the statute for international jurisdiction.

It stressed that the fact the claimant is a Bahraini company does not, on its own, give Bahraini courts international jurisdiction.

That requires a link to the territory, through performance of the obligation or through the event that gave rise to the right claimed in the lawsuit. That link was missing here.

Contractual clause

The court further found that the claimant had not put forward any clear contractual clause assigning jurisdiction to the courts of Bahrain.

Instead, clause sixteen of the contract for the purchase of all exploitation rights to the film around the world assigned jurisdiction to the courts of the Arab Republic of Egypt, and clause eleven of the distribution contract for the film worldwide, apart from Egypt, followed the same approach.

Focus on Kingdom's foreign policy

The Bahrain Institute for Political Development (BIPD) held a session on Bahrain's foreign policy as part of its "National Paths" programme, presented by His Excellency Ambassador Ahmed Mohammed Al Tarifi, Chief of the Arab and African Affairs Sector at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

According to Al-Qasimi, economic shifts beginning in the 1930s supported the establishment of schools and spaces that—directly or indirectly—allowed art to flourish.

Among Bahrain's earliest pioneers, he highlighted Abdullah

Al-Muharraqi, who first gained recognition at age twelve after winning a drawing competition held for the then-ruler.

Al-Muharraqi was later commissioned by BAPCO to produce paintings for its offices and for official diplomatic gifts, marking an early institutional embrace of art in the Kingdom.

This experience, Al-Qasimi noted, became an entry point for a generation of Bahraini artists whose work expressed a growing national and cultural awareness.

Notable work

He cited Al-Muharraqi's notable 1992 work, "The Civilizational Dimension of the GCC States," housed at the GCC General Secretariat in Riyadh.

The piece integrates maritime symbols—such as the sea, diving, and pearl-making—with modern urban landmarks and communication networks, offering a unified visual narrative that bridges heritage with rapid contemporary transformation.

Foundation of a just, progressive society

Our society is shaped by important responses that we make to the everyday needs of our families and groups with vulnerabilities. By recognizing the need to protect and nurture family units and children and by implementing better workplace conditions and enhanced salary for the special skillsets of those who work with the disabled, we are taking important steps towards a better world.

Last week it was reported that legislators are looking at just that – there are discussions to extend maternity leave from the present two months of paid leave to additional longer leave under defined conditions. As it is, current maternity laws in Bahrain allow mothers up to two months of paid maternity leave and then two hours of nursing time off until the child is two years old. Mothers can also take up to two years of unpaid childcare leave up to three times in the course of their career with a firm.

It is but natural that employers are worried that any more leave on these grounds will hit productivity. But look at it this way – we have placed respect for women's role in the family unit as central to Bahraini society (and that includes expat families too); Bahrain boasts a 57.4% female workforce. It is only correct that we honour the promise to the majority of our workforce and the responsibility we have entrusted them with.

The other heartening proposal was that trained workers who deal with children with special needs will soon get pay increase commensurate with the work that they are doing. This recognizes their unique skillsets and the need for their expertise to integrate children with these requirements into society as equal contributing partners in progress.

While these are proposals before the legislators, I fervently wish that they shall be translated into reality. They are foundational to the expansion of scope for a just and dedicated society.

Trump says he 'sort of' decided on what to do with Venezuela

◆ US President Donald Trump said Friday he has "sort of" made up his

mind about Venezuela, as his escalating military deployment in Latin America has ignited concerns about a wider regional conflict. "I sort of made up my mind," Trump told reporters on Air Force One as he traveled to his estate in Florida. "I can't tell you what it is, but we made a lot of progress with Venezuela in terms of stopping drugs from pouring in," Trump added.



◆ Brazil's far-right former president Jair Bolsonaro is running out of options to avoid prison, after judges rejected his appeal against a 27-year sentence for a botched coup bid.

Prison looms for Brazil's Bolsonaro after court rejects his appeal

Bolsonaro lost the 2022 elections and was convicted in September for his efforts to prevent President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva from taking power after the polls. Prosecutors said the scheme -- which included plans to assassinate Lula and a top Supreme Court judge -- failed only due to a lack of support from military top brass. A panel of Supreme Court judges weighing Bolsonaro's appeal all voted to uphold the sentence last week. The result was not considered official until midnight on Friday



Men moving 81 macaques, meth arrested in Thailand

◆ Thai rangers have arrested two men suspected of being part of an international wildlife

smuggling network, the military said yesterday after they were intercepted in a car carrying 81 macaques near the Cambodian border. Thailand is a major transit hub for wildlife smugglers, who often sell highly-prized endangered creatures on the lucrative black market in China, Taiwan and Southeast Asia. A patrol stopped the vehicle on Friday afternoon in Aranyaprathet district of Sa Kaeo province, where troops found the monkeys stuffed into a blue net bag. "At 3:20 pm, authorities arrested the two suspects and inspected their vehicle," the 12th Ranger Forces Regiment, which is responsible for the area, said in a statement on Facebook.



Trump demands probe into Epstein links to Bill Clinton

New email trove intensifies controversy as Trump redirects focus toward rivals

● Trump orders FBI, DOJ to probe Epstein links

● Clinton, Summers, JPMorgan among targets

● Epstein emails revive questions about Trump's ties

US President Donald Trump told law enforcement chiefs to investigate links between Jeffrey Epstein and ex-president Bill Clinton, seeking to deflect growing questions about his own ties to the late alleged sex trafficker.

Under mounting pressure from the release of a new trove of Epstein emails, Trump also demanded the Justice Department and FBI probe banking giant JP-Morgan Chase and ex-Harvard president Larry Summers, who served as Clinton's treasury secretary.

The 79-year-old Republican accused Democrats of pushing the "Epstein hoax" after emails emerged in which the disgraced financier suggested Trump "knew about the girls" and spent hours with one of the victims at his house.

"I know nothing about that. They would have announced that a long time ago," Trump told reporters aboard Air Force One as he headed to Florida for the

weekend.

"Jeffrey Epstein and I had a very bad relationship for many years."

Questions about his long friendship with Epstein have dogged Trump since his return to the White House in January.

Epstein died in prison in 2019 -- by suicide, authorities ruled -- before he could face trial on federal sex trafficking charges. But questions over his alleged masterminding of a sex ring where powerful men were provided with underage girls have only mounted.

Trump said on Truth Social that he would be "asking" Attorney General Pam Bondi and the FBI "to investigate Jeffrey Epstein's involvement and relationship with Bill Clinton, Larry Summers, Reid Hoffman, J.P.

Morgan, Chase, and many other people and institutions."

"Records show that these men, and many others, spent large portions of their life with Epstein, and on his 'Island.'"

Bondi named senior New York prosecutor Jay Clayton to "take the lead" on Trump's request.

'Damning information'

The order for a probe comes even though the FBI and Justice Department said in a memo in July that they had not uncovered evidence that would justify an investigation of uncharged third parties.

That memo also sparked a huge backlash in Trump's MAGA movement after it said a "client list" Bondi claimed to have been reviewing did not in fact exist.

Democratic former president Clinton has long faced scrutiny over his ties to Epstein and flew on his private plane, although he has never been accused of wrongdoing in the scandal, either.

China tells citizens to avoid Japan travel as Taiwan row grows

China has advised its citizens to avoid travelling to Japan, following a diplomatic feud sparked by remarks from Tokyo's new premier about a hypothetical attack on Taiwan.

Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi told parliament on November 7 that use of force against the self-ruled island claimed by China could warrant a military response from Tokyo.

On Friday, Beijing said that it had summoned Japan's ambassador, while Tokyo said it had summoned China's ambassador after an "inappropriate" and now-removed online post.

Tokyo has since said its position on Taiwan, just 100 kilometres (62 miles) from the nearest Japanese island, is unchanged.

In an online post late Friday, China's embassy in Japan warned its citizens against travelling to the country.

"Recently, Japanese leaders

have made blatantly provocative remarks regarding Taiwan, severely damaging the atmosphere for people-to-people exchanges," the WeChat post said.

The situation presents "significant risks to the personal safety

and lives of Chinese citizens in Japan", it added.

"The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Chinese embassy and consulates in Japan solemnly remind Chinese citizens to avoid travelling to Japan in the near

future."

Reacting to the statement, Japan's Chief Cabinet Secretary Minoru Kihara told reporters yesterday that Beijing's call was "inconsistent with the promotion of a strategic and mutually beneficial relationship", Jiji Press reported.

The Japanese government has requested the Chinese side to take "appropriate measures", Jiji reported.

In a further development yesterday, China's largest airlines offered full refunds for flights on Japan routes before the end of the year.

Air China, China Southern and China Eastern all published separate statements on the policies, which will allow ticket holders to refund or change Japan itineraries free of charge for flights from yesterday through December 31.

Beijing insists Taiwan, which Japan occupied for decades until 1945, is part of its territory and has not ruled out the use of force to seize control.

Trump says will sue BBC for billions over video edit

President escalates dispute over edited speech as broadcaster apologizes but denies defamation

● Trump threatens \$5 billion lawsuit

● Edited clip sparks political firestorm

US President Donald Trump said he would sue the BBC for up to \$5 billion, after the British broadcaster apologized but said it would not pay damages for a misleading speech edit.

The broadcaster has rejected Trump's legal defamation claim, but the president appears determined not to let the matter rest, even after the departure of top BBC executives and as the controversy threatens to become a strain on ties with London.

"We'll sue them for anywhere between a billion and five billion dollars, probably some time next week. I think I have to do it. They've even admitted that they cheated," Trump told reporters

aboard Air Force One.

Trump earlier said he would sue the BBC for \$1 billion, an already enormous sum that represents 13 percent of the organization's annual revenue. It is mostly funded by a license fee paid by the British public.

The broadcaster has been in turmoil since the edited clip from

its flagship news program "Panorama" -- aired before the 2024 presidential elections -- resurfaced last week.

On Monday, the BBC apologized for giving the impression in the documentary that Trump had directly urged "violent action" just before the assault on the US Capitol by his supporters

on January 6, 2021.

"The people of the UK are very angry about what happened, as you can imagine, because it shows the BBC is fake news," Trump said on Friday.

He added that he planned to raise the issue with British Prime Minister Keir Starmer, who has backed the broadcaster's inde-

pendence while avoiding taking sides against Trump.

"I'm going to call him over the weekend. He actually put a call into me. He's very embarrassed," Trump said.

Sensitive period for BBC

Trump's lawyers sent the BBC a letter on Monday accusing the broadcaster of defaming the president and giving it until Friday to apologize and pay compensation.

The BBC said Thursday that its chairman Samir Shah had sent "a personal letter to the White House making clear to President Trump that he and the corporation are sorry for the edit of the president's speech."

Trump calls Thailand, Cambodia after new clashes

US President Donald Trump said he called Thailand and Cambodia to bolster the peace deal he helped broker, after fresh clashes erupted between the Southeast Asian neighbours.

Trump co-signed a truce between the two countries on October 26 during a tour of Asia, touting it as one of several peace deals around the world that he believes should win him the Nobel Peace Prize.

But Thailand suspended the deal on Monday after an alleged landmine blast, and the two sides traded accusations of new clashes on Wednesday in which Phnom Penh said a civilian was killed.

Addressing reporters on Air

Force One as he flew to Florida, Trump said he spoke to the leaders of both countries.

"I stopped a war just today through the use of tariffs, the threat of tariffs," Trump said after a journalist asked whether he was referring to Thailand and Cambodia.

"They're doing great. I think they're gonna be fine," he added. The White House said he also engaged with Malaysia, which has been acting as a broker in ending the conflict. Trump co-signed the deal in Kuala Lumpur.

Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Manet yesterday reiterated his "firm commitment" to the agreement, and said Trump would monitor to "ensure no armed clashes reoccur" at the border.

Nine killed in accidental explosion at Kashmir police station

Nine people were killed and 31 injured when confiscated explosives accidentally blew up at a police station in India's Kashmir, police said yesterday, just days after a car blast in Delhi killed a dozen people.

The incident happened in Nowgam and the explosives at the police station were recovered from Faridabad in the northern state of Haryana earlier this week, just hours before the powerful blast in Delhi that killed 12 people.

Samples from the recovered material were being sent for further forensic examination since Thursday, the region's director general of police Nalin Prabhat said, and the procedure was being handled with "utmost caution" due to its "unstable and sensitive nature".

"However, unfortunately during this course (on Friday) around 11:20 pm, an accidental explosion has taken place. Any other speculation into the cause of this incident is unnecessary," he told reporters.

The victims included police personnel, forensic team members and two crime photographers and other members from the local administration.

"The building of the police station has been severely dam-

aged and the adjacent buildings have been affected," he added.

Local media reported that the militant organisation People's Anti-Fascist Front (PAFF), said to be close to the Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) group, had taken responsibility for the explosion, but the region's police dismissed the claims.

Attacks blamed on JeM include the 2001 assault on India's parliament, and the 2019 Pulwama suicide bombing, which killed 40 security personnel.

"The claim of PAFF or any other terrorist group is patently false, baseless and mischie-

vous!" the Jammu and Kashmir police said in a post on X.

The explosion comes just days after powerful blast on Monday killed at least 12 people and wounded 30 others in the Indian capital New Delhi.

It was the most significant security incident since April 22, when 26 civilians were killed at the tourist site of Pahalgam in Kashmir.

India's government on Wednesday vowed to bring the "perpetrators, their collaborators, and their sponsors" of the deadly car blast in the heart of the capital to justice and called it an act of terrorism.





Croatia qualify for 2026 World Cup, Netherlands close, Germany in limbo

Croatia qualifies despite a scare, while Germany's fate rests on a final match

Croatia booked their ticket to the 2026 World Cup in North America with an unconvincing 3-1 win over the in-form Faroe Islands on Friday as the Netherlands all but booked their spot in the finals too.

Germany's qualification hopes still rest on their final qualification match on Monday at home to Slovakia despite a Nick Woltemade brace giving them a laboured 2-0 win at Luxembourg.

But it was a night when the underdogs struck fear into more illustrious opponents, without managing to strike a telling blow.

The Faroes, who were on a

three-match winning run coming into their Group L encounter in Rijeka and still harboured faint hopes of qualification, had the audacity to take the lead against the 2018 World Cup finalists, who only needed a draw

to progress.

Geza David Turi picked up the ball just inside the Croatia half and strode forwards unmolested before trying his luck from outside the box and benefiting from a heavy deflec-

tion to beat Dominik Livakovic in the Croatia goal on 16 minutes.

The lead lasted only seven minutes before Manchester City defender Josko Gvardiol lashed in an equaliser after some hesi-

man's land.

Depay maintai's Dutch lead

Memphis Depay's Dutch record-extending 55th international goal helped push the Netherlands to the brink of qualification with a 1-1 draw in Poland.

Jakub Kaminski had given Poland hope of pipping Netherlands to top spot in Group G two minutes before the break in Warsaw, latching onto Robert Lewandowski's through ball to slot past Bart Verbruggen in the Dutch goal.

But two minutes after the restart, Depay struck to maintain the Netherlands' three-point lead at the top of the group, and a massive goal difference advantage of 13 that makes qualification at home to Lithuania on Monday a formality.

In Group A, plucky Luxembourg gave Germany plenty of scares in a goalless first half before Newcastle forward Woltemade bagged a second-half brace to keep Germany top of the pool.

They need only a point at home to Slovakia on Monday to book their ticket to the World Cup.

Jadeja puts India on brink of victory

Ravindra Jadeja's four-wicket haul leaves South Africa reeling on a dramatic day in Kolkata

● South Africa slump to 93-7

● Rahul top-scores with gritty 39

● Gill retires hurt with neck issue

Veteran spinner Ravindra Jadeja took four wickets to put India in sight of victory on a manic day two of a low-scoring opening Test yesterday.

South Africa were 93-7 at stumps to lead by 63 runs in their second innings on an Eden Gardens pitch that has made batting decidedly tricky.

Fifteen wickets fell during the second day and KL Rahul's 39 - from 119 balls - in India's first innings remains the highest individual score of the match.

Proteas skipper Temba Bavuma tried to replicate Rahul's obduracy, making an unbeaten 29. Corbin Bosch, on one, was with him when play was called off due to bad light.

Spinner Simon Harmer had dragged the visitors back into the contest with figures of 4-30 that helped bowl out India for 189 with the hosts taking a slender lead of 30.

"Playing in India you know you will be under pressure and I thought we fought back well today in restricting them," Harmer

told reporters.

"Cricket's a funny game, we could be sitting here tomorrow night with a completely different story. South Africa manage to get to 150 and bowl India out for 80."

"If there is one thing that this team has showed it's that they can fight when the backs are against the wall," added Harmer.

Jadeja's 27 was key to India's first innings total and the 36-year-old all-rounder showed the other side of his game with some testing left-arm spin.

South Africa found themselves

in a hole when Kuldeep Yadav and Jadeja removed the openers Ryan Rickelton and Aiden Markram either side of the tea break.

Jadeja kept up the pressure as he struck twice in one over to send back Wiaan Mulder, caught behind by Rishabh Pant for 11, and two balls later Tony de Zorzi who was caught off his glove and thigh pad by Dhruv Jurel at short-leg.

He had South Africa in more trouble when he spun the ball sharply to bowl Tristan Stubbs

for five to bring the house down at the iconic venue that had over 47,000 fans according to official data.

The biggest cloud on India's horizon was the absence of skipper Shubman Gill who retired hurt on four with a neck problem. He did not return to resume his innings and nor did he field, with vice-captain Pant leading the team.

Sundar hit two fours and one six in his otherwise laboured knock before falling caught behind to Harmer.

Gill walked out to loud cheers

but his stay was limited to three balls as he swept Harmer for a four at backward square-leg and then held his neck in pain.

The physio soon arrived and Gill walked back to the pavilion.

Rahul kept up his hard work from day one when he made 13 off 59 balls and on day two looked more assured until his departure off Keshav Maharaj.

India went into lunch at 138-4 and Jurel started with two fours after the break before Harmer had him caught and bowled for 14 to trigger a collapse.

Jadeja took India into the lead with a boundary but fell lbw to Harmer and India slipped further when pace bowler Jansen had Kuldeep caught behind for one.

Harmer cleaned up Axar Patel to end the Indian innings. Jansen returned figures of 3-35.

Sinner beats De Minaur to reach ATP Finals title match

Jannik Sinner continued his mastery over Alex de Minaur yesterday with a straight-sets win to reach the ATP Finals championship match for the third year in a row.

Sinner broke late in the first set and then pulled away from De Minaur to complete a 7-5, 6-2 win -- his 13th in as many meetings with the Australian.

The Italian world number two has yet to drop a service

game en route to the final. He will try to defend his title on Sunday against top-ranked Carlos Alcaraz or Felix Auger-Aliassime.

Sinner has won his last 18 sets played in Turin, where he beat Taylor Fritz in last year's final. The four-time Grand Slam champion is on a 30-match winning streak on indoor hard courts.

The 24-year-old Sinner hasn't dropped a set at the ATP Finals since losing the 2023 final to Novak Djokovic.

Alex Marquez claims Valencia MotoGP sprint victory

Alex Marquez claimed a dominant victory in the final sprint of the MotoGP season in Valencia yesterday, his third such triumph of 2025.

The Ducati-Gresini rider, who has sealed second in the overall standings behind his champion brother Marc, beat out KTM's Pedro Acosta by 1.149 seconds, while Fabio Di Giannantonio finished third.

Home favourite Marquez started from second on the grid behind Marco Bezzecchi but took the lead at turn one and never relinquished it.

The Italian also sank behind Acosta, who zipped into second place at turn two, eventually finishing fifth.

However despite a disappointing outing it was enough for Bezzecchi to wrap up third place in the championship under grey skies in Valencia and give Aprilia their first top-three finish.

Two-time MotoGP champion Francesco Bagnaia has struggled in recent weeks and dropped to fifth in the standings behind Acosta as he came in 14th in the sprint on his Ducati.

Marquez said he would try

win the Grand Prix on Sunday to complete a first weekend double triumph.

"It's one of those goals that is there but has never quite come together," he told DAZN.

"In Malaysia in 2023, I missed out on Sunday, and the other day in Portimao, (and) Montmelo, I think that was the clearest opportunity.

"Here, it's true that I didn't expect to win today, there were stronger riders than me, but we

managed to put together an almost perfect race. So tomorrow, we have to try to take a step forward in the warm-up, and from there, we'll see what happens."

Jorge Martin, the championship winner in 2024, brought up the rear in 22nd as he made his comeback following a fractured collarbone in September.

Last year's event in Valencia was cancelled because of the deadly flooding in the region.
