ahrain made an emphatic start to their campaign in the 2020 Asian Men's Handball Championship yesterday with a 45-16 hammering of New Zealand at Shaikh Saad Al Abdullah Sports Hall Complex in Kuwait City.

Both teams are in Group A of the tournament's preliminary round along with Iran. The Bahrainis' fine start put them on top of the division table.

Bahrain were in control of the contest from the very start, and they enjoyed a commanding 21-8 advantage at the half. They kept their foot on the gas the rest of the way and never allowed their rivals into the fight en route to the lopsided 29-goal

All but two of Bahrain's players made it onto the scoresheet. Ali Eid finished as Bahrain's top scorer with eight goals, while Mahdi Saad added seven. Ahmed Jalal had six and Bilal Basham Askani chipped in with four goals.

There was a quarter-final shock for two-time Grand Slam winner Simona Halep, who heads into the Australian Open with room for improvement after being upset 6-4, 6-2 by Aryna Sabalenka.

The reigning Wimbledon champion and former world number one dropped serve five times and was flattened in the second set by her opponent from Belarus.

The 71-minute rout leaves Halep standing 1-1 for the season with the first Grand Slam of the year starting on Monday in Melbourne.

Sabalenka will battle Dayana Yastremska on Friday for a place in the final after the Ukrainian 19-year-old beat a second top 20 opponent this week when she put out Croat Donna Vekic
