Mercedes dominate practice in Imola

Max Verstappen crawls to a halt in second practice session

Mercedes' Valtteri Bottas was quickest in the first practice session at Imola Emilia Romagna Grand Prix

Tercedes drivers Valterri Merceues and Lewis Hamilton produced the quickest times in practice on Friday for the Emilia-Romagna Grand Prix but Max Verstappen and Charles Leclerc both ran into trouble in the second session.

Bottas was quickest round the Mercedes. legendary Imola circuit in both sessions but only just, 0.01 seconds faster than his teammate Hamilton.

The pair were followed by AlphaTauri's Pierre Gasly and the Ferraris of Carlos Sainz and Leclerc who crashed into a wall at the end of the second session, lap, according to his team boss prompting a red flag and the decision not to restart.

There was bad news for Red Bull too as Verstappen pulled front right. up with a mechanical problem.

"Something snapped on the rear," Verstappen told his team.

The Dutchman, who finished second behind Hamilton in the season-opening Bahrain Grand third-fastest time in the opening session behind the two

Roma lined up a blockbuster Europa League semi-final clash with Manchester United on Thursday after holding Ajax to a 1-1 draw to go through to the last four 3-2 on aggregate.

Edin Dzeko's strike 18 minutes from time ensured the draw and passage for Paulo Fonseca's side, who were on the back foot for most of the match, and a showdown with United who strolled into the semis 4-0 after a 2-0 win over La Liga outfit Granada at Old Trafford.
