 \mathbf{B} ritain's financial watchdog yesterday said it had fined Barclays bank £42 million (\$56 million) for "poor handling of financial crime risks".

The Financial Conduct Authority said in a statement that the fine was "for separate instances of failings in its financial crime risk management" between 2015 and 2023.

A Barclays spokesperson said the British bank is "deeply committed to the fight against financial crime and fraud", after its third FCA fine for failings in financial crime controls since

US drug raids net \$10 mn in crypto linked to Sinaloa cartel

m s}$ lion in cryptocurrency linked to Mexico's Sinaloa cartel during raids that netted massive quantities of fentanyl and other drugs, officials said Tuesday.

The Sinaloa cartel is one of six Mexican drug trafficking groups that President Donald Trump has designated as global "terrorist" organizations.

The cryptocurrency seizure countrywide operations that netted 44 million fentanyl pills, 4,500 pounds (2,000 kilograms) of fentanyl powder and nearphetamine since January, the US Department of Justice said in a statement.
