35 migrants die crossing Niger

At least 35 migrants have died attempting the dangerous crossing of the Niger desert to Libya or Algeria on their way to Europe, a campaigning group said yesterday.

"Based on our own information, 35 to 40 migrants have died between January and August while crossing the desert," Aziz Chehou of the Niger NGO Alarme Phone Sahara told AFP.

Among the tens of thousands of people hoping to reach the North Africa coast for smuggling boats to Europe, many die after being abandoned by smugglers or after their vehicles break down en route.

Thousands of others are stranded in the desert after being turned back by border police in Libya or Algeria.

Hajj package prices to soar 20% as new tent rules drive up costs

Bahraini pilgrims who hoped for more affordable Hajj packages are instead confronting a steep price shock, as campaigns confirmed that 2026 packages will cost up to 20 percent more. The increase comes after last year's unexpected losses, with organisers citing higher operational expenses, particularly new requirements for tents in Arafat and Mina.

Rising costs

The reversal from earlier savings hopes to rising costs is striking. Campaign operators, who declined to be named, said expenses linked to new service

standards had forced them to increase prices by BD200 to BD250. The adjustment translates into a 15 to 20 percent rise across most packages.

A source added that the hikes are seen as necessary to prevent

a repeat of last year's financial setbacks.

Regulatory spotlight

The Ministry of Justice, Islamic Affairs, and Endowments has already received 67 applica-

tions from Bahraini campaigns seeking approval to operate next season. A meeting between the operators and the Supreme Committee for Hajj and Umrah Affairs is expected in the coming weeks to review preparations.

Dr. Ali Ameen Al-Rayyes, Director of Religious Affairs at the Ministry and Deputy Head of Bahrain's Hajj Mission, confirmed that new regulations will soon take effect. The rules will prevent campaigns from advertising packages or prices until they receive official approval.

Transparency push

Campaigns may still hold promotional exhibitions, but only if their content exactly matches the ministry-approved profile published online. Al-Rayyes stressed that the changes aim to build trust by ensuring pilgrims receive accurate and reliable information.

The regulations will also prohibit free Hajj offers or competitions that promise packages, closing the door on misleading promotions.

For pilgrims, the season ahead will bring clearer safeguards and stricter oversight, but it will also place a heavier burden on families already budgeting carefully for the spiritual journey of a lifetime.

Funds misuse scandal

Verdict due 16 September in BD230,000 Tamkeen benefits case

Verdict due 16 September in a BD230,000 benefits case involving the Labour Fund, Tamkeen, and the Social Insurance Organisation (SIO), built on alleged forged contracts and false entries. The First High Criminal Court is weighing charges against 10 defendants accused of taking money from Tamkeen and the SIO by submitting forged paperwork and inserting false data into electronic systems. The Financial Crimes and Money Laundering Prosecution said reports from the SIO showed losses of more than BD90,000

after company owners filed fake documents and manipulated insured persons' records to obtain pensions, end-of-service gratuities and lump-sum payments they were not entitled to.

Online platform

Tamkeen reported that the same group drew more than BD140,000 from wage-support funds by filing forged documents through its online platform. Prosecutors launched an inquiry, heard from representatives of both bodies and witnesses, froze accounts and property, and imposed travel bans. Investigators from the General Directorate of Anti-Corruption and Economic and Elec-

The National Financial Intelligence Centre was asked to trace financial movements, while a forgery expert concluded that

contracts linked to the case were false. Workers said to have been exploited were also interviewed. Charges say the first and second defendants entered false data into the IT systems of both bodies, using it to add and remove workers and to claim pensions and lump-sum indemnities. The same data was then used to obtain wage support from Tamkeen. **Untrue information** They are further charged with falsifying official electronic records by sending untrue information that was entered into the systems.

Labor Row Becomes Criminal Case

Court dismisses embezzlement charge

● **Labor clash drove allegations**

● **Defense proved funds accounted**

● **Court ruled evidence lacking**

A simmering labor dispute between an Asian employee and her company escalated into a criminal case

before the Fifth Minor Criminal Court, which has now acquitted her of embezzlement charges after finding insufficient evidence and possible malicious intent behind the complaint.

From Dispute to Accusation

The woman in her forties, who worked in an administrative role for a chain of restaurants, was accused of embezzling BD 1,420 between 2023 and 2024. The accusation was based on an accounting report produced by the company and statements from its representative.

Her lawyer, Reem Al-Mahari, argued that the case stemmed

from an ongoing labor conflict in which the company had withheld her rights. She told the court that her client's role involved issuing checks for staff wages, payments to the Labour Market Regulatory Authority, social insurance contributions, and petty cash, all of which were properly transferred.

Malicious Prosecution Claim

Al-Mahari submitted documents proving the funds had reached the relevant authorities, and presented a labor court judgment confirming disputes with the company. She argued this suggested the criminal case

was filed in bad faith.

The court ruled that the accounting report only showed that seven checks worth BD1,420 had been issued, without proving any misappropriation. It also noted that the existence of labor disputes gave weight to the claim of malicious intent.

Citing Article 255 of the Criminal Procedure Law No. 46 of 2002, the court acquitted the employee, ruling that the evidence failed to substantiate the embezzlement charge.

The judgment highlights how workplace disputes can spill into criminal courts, where evidence and intent face closer scrutiny.

Minor Civil Court awards BD1,000 after teacher's sexual assault conviction

A court ordered BD 1,000 in compensation to a minor and his guardian after evidence of a teacher's conviction for sexually harassing the child established fault in the civil claim.

The Minor Civil Court issued the ruling in public and required the defendant to pay BD100 in lawyers' fees and all legal costs.

The father filed the claim on his son's behalf and was represented by lawyer Zainab Ali Madan. The civil award followed the teacher's conviction for an assault on school grounds.

On appeal, the sentence was reduced from three years' imprisonment to one year. A court certificate recorded no cassation, so the criminal judgment became final.

Facts

Relying on Article 158 of the Civil Code and the binding force of final criminal judgments under Article 309 of the Criminal Procedure Law, the court said it could not reopen facts settled in the criminal case.

Those findings established the fault element for this lawsuit.

The court found the child suffered material and moral harm due to the touching of sensitive areas and the resulting panic and fear.

Citing Article 161(a) on loss and loss of profit and Article 162 on moral harm, the judge assessed BD1,000 as just compensation.

Inquiry

A medical committee report found no permanent impairment, so the request to refer the case for further inquiry was refused.

The defendant did not attend the civil hearings despite service at his place of detention.

He was ordered to pay BD100 towards lawyers' fees and to bear all legal costs.

Municipalities Affairs building restoration on track

The Minister of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture, His Excellency Wael bin Nasser Al Mubarak, and H.E. Shaikh Khalifa bin Ahmed Al Khalifa, President of the Bahrain Authority for Culture and Antiquities (BACA), visited the ongoing restoration of the historic Municipalities Affairs building in Manama, where work has now passed the 60% completion mark.

Al Mubarak said the project reflects Bahrain's appreciation of its heritage and its long municipal tradition, which began with the establishment of Manama Municipality in 1919, the first of its kind in the GCC.

Restoration

He noted that the restoration, carried out in line with the highest conservation standards, preserves an important national landmark and reinforces the Kingdom's pioneering role in municipal governance in the region.

The Ministry added that the initiative follows the directives of His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, to safeguard the historical character and cultural identity of the site.

Open discussions

Events will run online and in person. The schedule includes open discussions, and cultural, literary and artistic workshops. Regular posts will look at character arcs and acting, and offer book and film analysis.

Set up in tribute to Ian Fleming, the British writer and reporter who created the agent, the club aims to serve as a meeting point for Bond followers in Bahrain and the wider region.

According to the organisers, the goal is to add a clear, steady strand to the local cultural calendar focused on a long-running series with worldwide reach.

Police sting success

Court of Cassation keeps 10-year jail terms for doctor and supplier in drug case

The Court of Cassation upheld convictions for drug offences against two men, affirming the High Criminal Court of Appeal, after a BD20 sting led police to a doctor and another supplier identified by a third defendant.

The first-instance court had jailed the doctor and a second man for 10 years apiece and fined each BD5,000 for selling and using narcotics.

The third defendant received six months’ imprisonment and a BD100 fine for drug use.

The court ordered the seized items to be confiscated.

Report

The case started with a report in Riffa that a car was being used to place items in a home’s sewer

age pipe.

Checks linked the vehicle to the third defendant. He was arrested and searched with Public Prosecution approval.

In interview, he said he was on his way with a friend to collect drugs via a ‘dead drop’.

Admission

He admitted using drugs supplied by the first and second defendants and agreed to help police arrest them.

Under supervision he phoned the first defendant, a doctor, and asked for ‘CBD’ worth BD20 to be handed over near the private hospital where the doctor worked.

A team moved in with the third defendant present.

When the doctor approached and recognised him, he dropped a plastic container on the ground. He was arrested.

The container held a liquid believed to be a narcotic.

A search of his car found more plastic containers with the same substance.

Questioned, the doctor said the substances belonged to the second defendant, who had left them with him before travelling.

The second defendant was arrested later on his return at the land border.

User

Police enquiries pointed to the first and second defendants holding drugs for sale and use, while the third defendant was

a user.

Case papers record that the third defendant bought drugs twice from the doctor and many times from the second defendant.

About a month before his arrest he called the second defendant to buy drugs and was told to contact the doctor because the second defendant was outside the Kingdom.

Drug sales

A forensic download of the doctor’s phone showed numerous WhatsApp chats about drug sales.

Laboratory tests confirmed the seized items were narcotics.

The doctor said the drugs were the second defendant’s. The second defendant said they were the doctor’s. The appeal ruling was left in place by the Court of Cassation.

Pool of trainers assembly kicks off reintegration preparedness drive

◆ **Russian forces said yesterday** they had captured two more villages in eastern Ukraine while Kyiv said it was pushing back a rapid Russian advance that had pierced through its defences. In Russia, Kursk region governor Alexander Khinshtein said a Ukrainian drone attack in the district of Rylsk had killed two people in their car -- a 52-year-old man and his 13-year-old son. The latest developments in the war came hours after US President Donald Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin held talks on ending the conflict, with few visible results. The Ukrainian army, smaller and less equipped than Russia's, has been on the defensive for months as Russian forces advance slowly but steadily.

◆ **Air Canada** cancelled hundreds of flights Saturday as it began shutting down operations in response to a strike by flight attendants -- triggering summer travel chaos for its 130,000 daily passengers. Canada's largest airline, which flies directly to 180 cities worldwide, urged customers not to go to the airport if they have a ticket for Air Canada or its lower-cost subsidiary Air Canada Rouge. It said flights by Air Canada Express, which are operated by a third party, would not be impacted by the walkout. "Air Canada deeply regrets the effect the strike is having on customers," the company said in a statement. The Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE), which represents Air Canada's 10,000 flight attendants, said that strike action officially began at 12:58 am local time (0458 GMT) on Saturday.

◆ **Gaza's civil defence** agency said Israeli attacks killed at least 22 people on Saturday, warning that intensifying strikes on a Gaza City neighbourhood were placing its remaining residents in mortal danger. Civil defence spokesman Mahmud Bassal said conditions in the Zeitun neighbourhood were rapidly deteriorating with residents having little to no access to food and water amid heavy Israeli bombardment. He said that about 50,000 people are estimated to be in that area of Gaza City, "the majority of whom are without food or water" and lacking "the basic necessities of life". Media restrictions in Gaza and difficulties accessing swaths of the Palestinian territory mean AFP is unable to independently verify the tolls and details provided by the civil defence agency, the Israeli military and other sources.

Bread Wasted, Money Lost: Bahrain's Hidden Subsidy Crisis

Every discarded loaf is not just food—it's public money slipping through our fingers. Government support for flour in Bahrain is no longer just numbers on a page—it's a warning signal. Last year alone, flour subsidies jumped 18.1% to BD 30.4 million, highlighting a growing challenge for both the state and society.

Much of this surge stems from global factors beyond our control: soaring wheat prices, climate change, the Russia-Ukraine war, and rising shipping costs. But what we can control is domestic consumption and how subsidies are managed locally.

The real issue lies in the silent waste that occurs across production, distribution, and everyday use.

The solution is not more subsidies, but greater awareness. Consumers must realize that wasted bread equals wasted public money—funds that could have supported health, education, or other vital services. Meanwhile, the government must pair price support with strict regulations and oversight to prevent misuse of subsidized flour.

This problem is no longer tolerable. Waste is no longer a private habit—it is a public offense. Every dinar lost to discarded bread undermines Bahrain's future and food security. We face a stark choice: act decisively through awareness, regulation, and accountability—or prepare for an even heavier bill that will inevitably fall on citizens.

Pakistan recovers bodies after rains kill over 340

Rescuers struggled to retrieve bodies from muddy debris on Saturday after flash floods triggered by heavy monsoon rains across northern Pakistan killed at least 344 people in the past 48 hours, authorities said.

The majority of deaths, 324, were reported in mountainous Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, the National Disaster Management Authority said.

Most were killed in flash floods and collapsing houses, while at least 137 others were injured.

One resident told AFP it felt like "the end of the world" as the ground shook with the force of the water.

The provincial rescue agency told AFP that around 2,000 rescue workers were engaged in recovering bodies from the debris and carrying out relief operations in nine districts, where rain was still hampering efforts.

"Heavy rainfall, landslides in several areas, and washed-out roads are causing significant challenges in delivering aid, particularly in transporting heavy machinery and ambulances," Bilal Ahmed Faizi, spokesman for Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's rescue agency, told AFP.

He said road closures meant rescue workers had to walk to some of the disaster sites in remote regions.

"They are trying to evacuate survivors, but very few people are relocating due to the deaths of their relatives or loved ones being trapped in the debris," Faizi said.

Buner district deputy commissioner Kashif Qayum Khan also said rescuers were forced to find new ways to reach remote areas.

"Many more people may still be trapped under the debris, which local residents cannot clear manually," Khan told AFP.

The provincial government has declared the severely affected mountainous districts of Buner, Bajaur, Swat, Shangla, Mansehra and Battagram as disaster-hit areas.

The meteorological department has also issued a heavy rain alert for Pakistan's northwest, urging people to take "precautionary measures".

Eleven more people were killed in Pakistan-administered Kashmir, and another nine in the northern Gilgit-Baltistan region, national officials said.

Five more were killed when a local government helicopter crashed due to bad weather during a relief mission on Friday.



Flash floods can develop in less than six hours of heavy rainfall, and sometimes in under an hour. Because of their sudden onset and powerful flow, they are considered the most dangerous type of flood, causing more fatalities worldwide than any other flooding event.

Trump moves away from ceasefire demand

Talks at an Alaska air base produced no breakthrough

US President Donald Trump yesterday shifted his campaign to halt the Ukraine war to securing a full peace agreement after a summit with Russia's President Vladimir Putin failed to secure a ceasefire.

Three hours of talks between the White House and Kremlin leaders at an Alaska air base produced no breakthrough but Trump and European leaders said they wanted a new summit that includes Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky.

Zelensky will now go to Washington on Monday while European leaders said they were ready to intensify sanctions against Russia after Trump briefed them on the summit.

Trump remained upbeat, calling the summit "a great and very successful day in Alaska!" in a Truth Social post. The US president added that European leaders had backed his plan for a new summit.

"It was determined by all that the best way to end the horrific war between Russia and Ukraine is to go directly to a peace agreement, which would end the war, and not a mere ceasefire agreement, which often times do not hold up," he added.

Zelensky in Washington

He confirmed Monday's meeting with Zelensky and said he hoped a Trump-Putin-Zelensky summit would follow. "Potentially, millions of people's lives will be saved," Trump commented.

Before the summit, Trump had warned of "severe consequences" if Russia did not accept a ceasefire.

Trump backing Putin's Ukraine land plan: source, reports

US President Donald Trump backs a Russian proposal for Moscow to take full control of two Ukrainian regions and freeze the front line in two others which Moscow only partially controls, a source told AFP.

The source with knowledge of the matter said Russian President Vladimir Putin "de facto demands that Ukraine leave Donbas", an area consisting of the Donetsk and Lugansk regions in eastern

Ukraine.

"Trump is inclined to support it," the source said.

Trump on Saturday spoke to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky and European leaders about his talks Friday with Russian President Vladimir Putin.

"The Ukrainian president refused to leave Donbas," the source said. Zelensky has rejected any territorial concessions, saying he is bound by Ukraine's constitution. But he has not ruled out discussing the issue at a trilateral meet-

ing with Trump and Putin. The New York Times also cited two senior European officials saying Trump supported Putin's plan "to end the war in Ukraine by ceding unconquered territory to the Russian invaders, rather than try for a ceasefire".

The Financial Times reported that Putin had told Trump that "he could freeze the rest of the frontline if his core demands were met" and the message had been relayed directly by Trump in his call on Saturday.

cept a ceasefire.

When asked about this by Fox News after the talks, Trump said that "because of what happened today, I think I don't have to think about that now".

Putin has repeatedly said only a full peace deal could halt the war he ordered in February 2022, which has left tens of thousands dead and widespread destruction in Ukraine.

Putin again spoke of addressing the "root causes" of the conflict at the summit and some analysts said Trump may have conceded ground.

"Faced with what appears to be Putin's stonewalling, lectures on history, or other dodges, Trump backed

away again," said Daniel Fried, a former US ambassador to Poland and now a fellow at the Atlantic Council think tank.

Flying back to Washington, Trump spoke first with Zelensky, the White House said.

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer, French President Emmanuel Macron, German Chancellor Friedrich Merz, NATO Secretary General Mark Rutte and European Commission president Ursula von der Leyen and other European leaders later joined a call, officials said.

The Europeans, who had been wary of the Alaska meeting, held their own talks on Saturday and afterwards expressed support for a new summit.

Their statement did not mention a ceasefire, just the need for more action to force Russia into "a just and lasting peace".

"As long as the killing in Ukraine continues, we stand ready to uphold the pressure on Russia. We will continue to strengthen sanctions and wider economic measures to put pressure on Russia's war economy until there is a just and lasting peace," they said.

The war went on despite the summit. Ukraine an-

nounced Saturday that Russia launched 85 attack drones and a ballistic missile during the night. Russia said it had taken two more villages in Ukraine.

Trump and Putin emerged from their talks to offer warm words at a 12-minute press briefing but took no questions.

"We're not there yet, but we've made progress. There's no deal until there's a deal," Trump said.

He called the meeting "extremely productive" with "many points" agreed, but did not offer specifics.

'Next time in Moscow'

Putin also spoke in general terms. "We hope that the understanding we have reached will... pave the way for peace in Ukraine."

Putin warned Ukraine and European countries to "not create any obstacles" and not "make attempts to disrupt this emerging progress through provocation or behind-the-scenes intrigues".

As Trump mused about a second meeting, Putin smiled and said in English: "Next time in Moscow".

Security guarantees

Guarantees to secure any future peace deal were not mentioned in the Trump-Putin final declaration.

But Trump told Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky and European leaders that a NATO-style guarantee for Kyiv could be on the table, Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni and a diplomatic source said -- but without actual NATO membership for Ukraine.

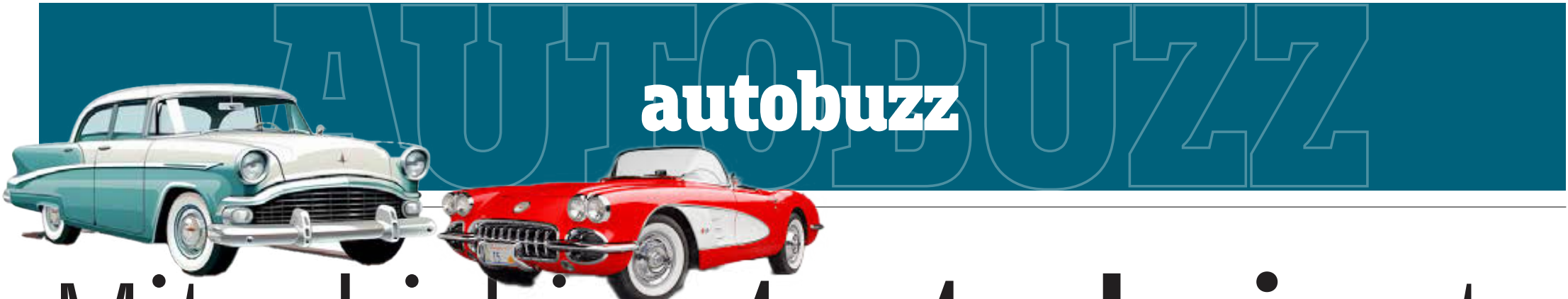
France, Britain and others said they could contribute troops as peace deal guarantors in Ukraine, but not on the frontline.

Nothing on land concessions-

Ukraine's biggest fear ahead of the Alaska summit was that the United States would push it to give up territories currently occupied by Russia, which comprise around 20 percent of its land, not counting Crimea, which was annexed by Russia in 2014.

Mitsubishi patents design to eliminate SUV tailgate rattles

The key innovation comes from how the inner structure is reinforced

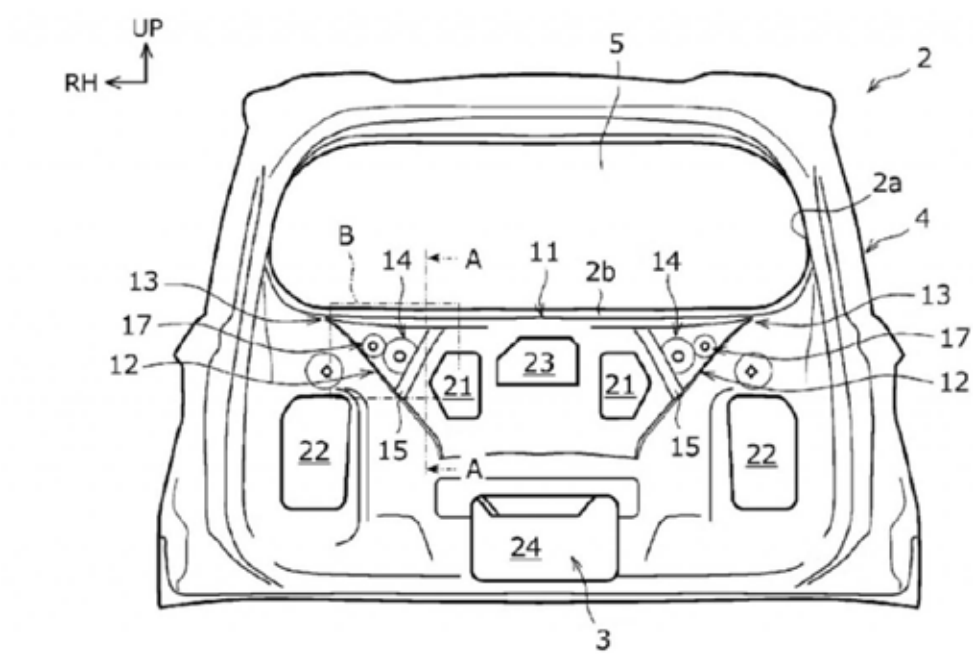
Rattles from the rear of SUVs are a familiar annoyance, especially on bumpy or uneven roads. While owners often try quick fixes, they rarely last. Now, Japanese carmaker Mitsubishi seems to have found a more permanent solution.

A recent patent filing reveals a reinforced tailgate design with an integrated vibration damper, aimed at making the rear door stronger, quieter, and more refined.

The patent describes the tailgate in simple terms:

- Outer panel – the painted surface visible from the outside.
- Inner panel – the structural frame visible when the tailgate is open.
- Rear glass – the back window.

The real innovation lies in the



inner structure. A main stiffening bar runs horizontally just below the rear window, adding rigidity to the upper section. From

either end of this bar, diagonal reinforcements extend downward toward the centre and bottom of the tailgate, forming a

triangular framework that boosts strength. At the junctions where the horizontal and diagonal

supports meet, Mitsubishi has positioned mounting points for a dynamic damper. This component absorbs and dissipates vibrations, reducing flex and eliminating rattles, giving the tailgate a tighter, more premium feel.

By combining reinforcement with vibration control, Mitsubishi's de-

sign tackles both strength and noise at once. The result is not only improved durability but also a more refined driving experience—whether on rough roads or at highway speeds, where wind and body flex can often make a tailgate chatter.

If brought into production, this technology could finally make rattling SUV tailgates a thing of the past.



Origin of SUVs

The term “SUV” (Sport Utility Vehicle) became popular in the 1980s, but vehicles with SUV-like traits existed much earlier. The Jeep Wagoneer (1963) is often considered one of the first modern SUVs, combining 4x4 capability with car-like comfort



Fuel Consumption

SUVs tend to be less fuel-efficient than smaller cars, and studies suggest that SUVs were the second largest contributor to the global rise in CO2 emissions between 2010 and 2018 (after the power sector).

Electric SUVs

The future is shifting too – some of the best-selling EVs worldwide are SUVs, like the Tesla Model Y, which recently became the world's top-selling car overall.



Pontiac Aztek: the car often dubbed the world's ugliest

Designed as a versatile crossover, it promised practicality with features like removable seats and even a built-in tent option. Despite its poor sales and negative reception, the Aztek has gained a cult following in recent years, partly due to its appearance in the TV show Breaking Bad. Today, it is remembered as both a design misstep and a quirky icon in automotive history.

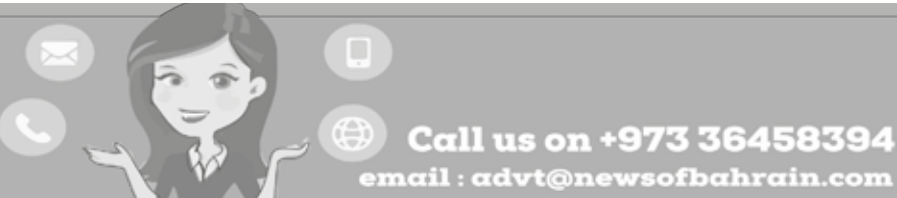

57-35, then scraped past Tunisia 67-61. A dramatic 76-74 win over Egypt showed their resilience under pressure, and they'll need every ounce of that fight to reverse fortunes in the final.

Stars of the Show

For Bahrain, Somto Patrick Onoduenyi has been the tournament's standout, leading

in efficiency (177), rebounds (92), and steals (23), while scoring 95 points. Hassan Showefi has chipped in 84 points and 62 boards, while Hassan Fouad tops the three-point charts with 12. Skipper Aly Hussien has provided leadership with 19 assists and seven triples. Algeria lean on Abdelkarim Yahiaoui (70 points, 64 rebounds, 113 efficiency) and sharpshooter Redouane Bertouche (62 points, eight threes). Rim protector Anes Hadjoudj adds 47 rebounds and 15 blocks.

One More Step

Bahrain arrive chasing back-to-back regional titles, having already won last month's FIBA U16 Asia Cup GBA Qualifiers. Algeria, though, see redemption on the line. Having been humbled by Bahrain once, they'll need to tighten their defense and ride Yahiaoui's inside presence to have a chance.

Clutch Maxwell leads Australia to T20 series win over South Africa

Glenn Maxwell took a brilliant catch before smashing a half-century under pressure to help Australia overcome a dogged South Africa by two wickets and seal the three-match Twenty20 series in Cairns on Saturday.

In response to South Africa's 172-7, Australia were in trouble at 122-6 in the 14th over before Maxwell stepped up with an unbeaten 62 off 36 balls.

There was a late twist when South Africa quick Corbin Bosch dismissed Ben Dwarshuis and Nathan Ellis with consecutive deliveries.

But Maxwell crunched a boundary on the penultimate ball of the match before celebrating with gusto.

Lhuan-dre Pretorius hit a quick-fire 24 before falling to Ellis, bringing to the crease Dewald Brevis who smashed a South African T20 record of 125 not out in game two.

He crunched his sixth delivery onto the roof before a

Brevis motored to his half-century off 22 balls.

Maxwell, a brilliant fielder, redeemed himself in the 12th over with a superb diving catch in the outfield to halt Brevis' charge on 53.

South Africa's innings ran out of steam and their total appeared well short when Marsh dominated a 66-run opening partnership with Travis Head.

But South Africa hit back with the quick wickets of Head (19) and Josh Inglis for a first ball duck.

Marsh made 54 before holding out to 19-year-old quick Kwena Maphaka, who later in the 11th over dismissed Cameron Green (nine).

Thompson eclipses Lyles and Hodgkinson makes stellar comeback

Kishane Thompson eclipsed Olympic 100m champion Noah Lyles at the Silesia Diamond League meet on Saturday and Keely Hodgkinson made an impressive comeback over 800m a year since winning gold at the Paris Games.

A host of world and Olympic champions headlined by the likes of Karsten Warholm -- with an incredible performance in the 400m hurdles -- Armand 'Mondo' Duplantis, Faith Kipyegon and Femke Bol shone in hot and humid conditions in front of more than 40,000 fans in the Polish city of Chorzow.

In their first meeting since Lyles won Olympic gold by just five-thousandths of a second in Paris last year, Thompson made an electric start and led from gun to tape for victory in 9.87sec.

Lyles had to be content with

second in 9.90sec as the athletes fine-tune preparations for the September 13-21 world championships in Tokyo.

There was a timely return for Hodgkinson as the 23-year-old Briton showed no sign of the lingering hamstring problems that had sidelined her for months as she clocked 1min 54.74sec, the fastest in the world this year.

Kenya's serial world record breaker Kipyegon missed out on the long-standing world record in the women's 3,000m.

Six weeks after improving her own world 1,500m record in Eugene, Kipyegon clocked 8:07.04 over the non-Olympic distance, falling just short of the 8:06.11 world record set by China's Wang Junxia in 1993.

Blistering Warholm

Warholm looked in astonishing form in the 400m hurdles after a two-month training block at home in Norway, timing a world-leading time of 46.28sec.

It was the third fastest time ever run over the distance, topped only by the Norwegian's own world record of 45.94sec and American Rai Benjamin's 46.19sec.

Dutch star Femke Bol comfortably extended her six-race win streak in the women's 400m hurdles this year with victory in 51.91sec -- another world-leading time.

Duplantis, fresh from setting his 13th pole vault world record with 6.29m in Budapest on Tuesday,

failed to hit those heights but secured victory in 6.10m, having failed three attempts at 6.20.

World leader Melissa Jefferson-Wooden equalled Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce's meet record when she clocked 10.66sec for an impressive victory in the women's 100m.

World champion Sha'Carri Richardson could only finish sixth after a troubled few weeks following her arrest for a violent altercation with her partner.

Jamaica's top women's 100m runner, Shericka Jackson, claimed the honours in the 200m in 22.17sec as she powers back to form.

Cordell Tinch left it late, but the in-form American powered past three-time world champion Grant Holloway for a third victory this season in the 110m hurdles in 13.03sec.

Olympic champion Masai Russell came out on top of a stacked field in the 100m hurdles in a Diamond League record of 12.19sec ahead of American teammate Tonea Marshall.

"This win is very important to me because these are the women I'm going to be racing against at the world champs," said Russell.

Marileidy Paulino of the Dominican Republic edged Bahrain's Salwa Eid Naser for victory in 49.18sec in the women's 400m and Ethiopia's Gudaf Tsegay outpaced Kenya's Beatrice Chebet for the win in the women's 1500m in 3:50.62.
