Bahrain's perfect run meets Algeria's last stand

U16 Arab Basketball Championship gold medal match

Unbeaten Bahrain face Algeria for the U16 Arab Basketball Championship gold medal. Bahrain topped the six-team table with a spotless 5-0 record, outscoring opponents by 113 points. Their campaign featured four routs - 90-58 over Qatar, 80-54 against Algeria, 81-57 versus Kuwait,

and 93-70 against Tunisia - before a 80-72 win over hosts Egypt sealed first place. They head into tonight's decider as the clear form team.

Algerian Resistance

Algeria finished second at 4-1, their only stumble coming against Bahrain. They opened with a 76-42 thrashing of Kuwait and beat Qatar

57-35, then scraped past Tunisia 67-61. A dramatic 76-74 win over Egypt showed their resilience under pressure, and they'll need every ounce of that fight to reverse fortunes in the final.

Stars of the Show

For Bahrain, Somto Patrick Onoduanyi has been the tournament's standout, leading

in efficiency (177), rebounds (92), and steals (23), while scoring 95 points. Hassan Showefi has chipped in 84 points and 62 boards, while Hassan Fouad tops the three-point charts with 12. Skipper Aly Hussien has provided leadership with 19 assists and seven triples. Algeria lean on Abdelkarim Yahiaoui (70 points, 64 rebounds, 113 efficiency) and sharpshooter Redouane Bertouche (62 points, eight threes). Rim protector Anes Hadjoudj adds 47 rebounds and 15 blocks.

One More Step

Bahrain arrive chasing back-to-back regional titles, having already won last month's FIBA U16 Asia Cup GBA Qualifiers. Algeria, though, see redemption on the line. Having been humbled by Bahrain once, they'll need to tighten their defense and ride Yahiaoui's inside presence to have a chance.

Marquez wins sprint at Austrian MotoGP

Spielberg, Austria

Marc Marquez extended his lead at the top of the MotoGP standings when he won Saturday's Austrian Grand Prix sprint at the Red Bull Ring.

It was his 12th sprint victory of the season, his sixth in succession, and it takes the Ducati rider 123 points ahead of his brother Alex Marquez with Sunday's Grand Prix still to come, followed by another nine race weekends in the 22-race season.

Early leader Alex (Ducati-Gresini) was second in the 14-lap race with Pedro Acosta (KTM) completing the podium.

Marc Marquez, who had never previously won at this circuit, had only been beaten once in sprints this year when his brother Alex outdid him at Silverstone and he had to bide his time to claim fraternal bragging rights once again.

With five laps remaining, Alex made a slight error exiting a chicane which opened the door for his elder brother to slide through and take the lead which he held until the end.

Clutch Maxwell leads Australia to T20 series win over South Africa

Glenn Maxwell took a brilliant catch before smashing a half-century under pressure to help Australia overcome a dogged South Africa by two wickets and seal the three-match Twenty20 series in Cairns on Saturday. In response to South Africa's 172-7, Australia were in trouble at 122-6 in the 14th over before Maxwell stepped up with an unbeaten 62 off 36 balls.

There was a late twist when South Africa quick Corbin Bosch dismissed Ben Dwarshuis and Nathan Ellis with consecutive deliveries.

But Maxwell crunched a boundary on the penultimate ball of the match before cele-

brating with gusto.

Hot favourites Australia won the first match but were stunned by a 52-run defeat in game two before moving to

Cairns in northern Queensland, which hosted its first T20 international.

"It was a little nerve-racking," Maxwell said. "I tried

to stay on strike as much as I could and cash in on anything loose."

Australia captain Mitchell Marsh elected to field in helpful conditions for seam bowlers, a contrast to the batting-friendly surfaces used in the opening two games in Darwin.

Veteran quick Josh Hazlewood rebounded from an errant performance in game two by dismissing captain Aiden Markram for one in the first over.

Lhuan-dre Pretorius hit a quick-fire 24 before falling to Ellis, bringing to the crease Dewald Brevis who smashed a South African T20 record of 125 not out in game two.

He crunched his sixth delivery onto the roof before a

diving Maxwell dropped a tough one-handed chance at long-on.

Brevis motored to his half-century off 22 balls.

Maxwell, a brilliant fielder, redeemed himself in the 12th over with a superb diving catch in the outfield to halt Brevis' charge on 53.

South Africa's innings ran out of steam and their total appeared well short when Marsh dominated a 66-run opening partnership with Travis Head.

But South Africa hit back with the quick wickets of Head (19) and Josh Inglis for a first ball duck.

Marsh made 54 before holding out to 19-year-old quick Kwena Maphaka, who later in the 11th over dismissed Cameron Green (nine).
