Novak Djokovic turned the page on his contentious US Open exit and began his claycourt season with a convincing 6-3 6-2 victory over wildcard Salvatore Caruso in the second round of the Italian Open yesterday.

The world number one was disqualified in New York after accidentally hitting a line judge with a ball during his fourth round match against Spain's Pablo Carreno Busta.

Djokovic's frustration boiled over after dropping his serve Caruso's serve in the eighth against Carreno Busta in the game before serving out the opening set at Flushing Meadows but 10 days on in Rome point in an imperious display against the unseeded Caruso.
