As part of the campaign, Civil Defence teams inspected fire extinguishers to confirm their validity, placement, and accessibility, while also checking the operation of early warning systems. Specialists from the EWA examined electrical connections and extensions in shops and kiosks to ensure they met technical specifications and to identify any random or hazardous wiring.
