

Phase 2 of ILS-CAT III Upgrade Project on

n efforts to boost the Kingdom's air navigation systems and to align it with international standards, Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications announced the Implementation of Phase 2 of the ILS- CAT III Upgrade Project.

Kamal Ahmed, Minister of Transportation and Telecommunications, and French company Aeroport de Paris Ingenierie signed an agreement yesterday (ADPI), for an amount of BD 930,200.

The ministry stated that the implementation is with ioint efforts from MTT's Civil Aviation Affairs and the Bahrain Airport Company.

"Implementing CAT III, which ensures the highest level precision approach for aircrafts landing on the runway, is part of the ministry's plan to develop and modernise the ILS operations at Bahrain International Airport (BIA). The system enables pilots to navigate weather conditions and low visibility," The ministry stated.

Mr Ahmed said that the project involves installing additional lights on the runway and the development of auxiliary substations to support CAT III operations.

"I am pleased to announce that the MTT is about to appoint a consultant to upgrade the ILS operations at BIA to CAT III, which allow pilots to land in visibilities of up to 50m.

Court rejects fake bombers' appeals TDT | Manama

The High Criminal Appeals Court has rejected the appeals filed by four men convicted of planting a fake bomb.

The four were tried in connection with planting a fake bomb on Budaiya Highway, and they were sentenced to three years behind bars each.

The defendants were arrested after their human cells were extracted from the device which was found at the scene.

"I was with the trio at the third defendant's grandfather's house and we agreed to plant a mock bomb on Budaiya Highway.

"We used a big water bottle, tapes and electrical wires to make the device," the first defendant told prosecutors.

"I was asked to monitor the place to make sure that there were no police officers. And I did it.

"I then called the second defendant and instructed him to plant the bomb," he added.


The defendants were given lighter sentences owing to their ages at the time of the incident.

Number of missing in California fire hits 600

Paradise, United States

The number of people listed as missing in one of California's deadliest wildfires has skyrocketed past 600, authorities said Thursday, as the remains of seven additional victims were found by rescuers.

Butte County Sheriff Kory Honea said the number of missing had more than doubled during the day to 631 as investigators went back and checked emergency calls made when the fire broke out a week ago.

"I want you to understand that the chaos we were dealing with was extraordinary" when the fire started, he told journalists, in explaining the staggering new

The seven additional victims brings to 63 the number of people who have died in the so-called Camp Fire in northern California.

At least three other people have died in southern California in another blaze dubbed the Woolsey Fire.

President Donald Trump is set to visit California on Saturday to meet with victims of the wildfires believed to be the worst in the state's history.

t least 11 people were reported dead yesterday as a powerful cyclone battered India's eastern coast, authorities said.

Thousands of trees were felled by winds that destroyed homes and vehicles as hundreds of thousands fled to shelter

Cyclone Gaja packed winds of up to 120 kilometres (75 miles) per hour as it barrelled into Tacoast near Nagapattinam early dia's weather office said.

Torrential rain caused waterlogging and threatened landslides. There were widespread power outages in the region.

Authorities closed schools and colleges and thousands of emergency workers were on standby along with two naval ships with divers, helicopters and inflatable boats.

Authorities had warned fishermen since Sunday not to risk going out to sea.

Assange charged in

WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange has been charged in the United States, the organization said, in a development that could have implications for Robert Mueller's probe into alleged Russian meddling in the US presidential election.

Prosecutors inadvertently disclosed the existence of a sealed indictment in a court filing in an unrelated case, WikiLeaks said Thursday.

The exact nature of the charges against Assange was not immediately known.

North Korea tests new 'ultramodern tactical weapon'

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un has overseen the testing of a "newly developed ultramodern tactical weapon", Pyongyang's state media reported yesterday, a move seen by analysts as more of a political message than a serious provocation.

It marked the first official report of a weapons test by North Korea since it began a delicate diplomatic process with Washington over its nuclear and missile programme.

South Korea's Yonhap news agency, quoting an unidentified government source, said the weapon could be a long-range cannon that the North has been developing for many years.

It said the test was successful but did not specify the type of device involved.

Russia set for first ISS launch since accident

Moscow, Russia

A Russian Soyuz rocket with a cargo vessel is to blast off in the first launch to the International Space Station (ISS) since a manned accident last month.

"The mission control centre has completed the work set out for the launch of the Progress MS-10 cargo vessel. The takeoff of the Soyuz-FG rocket is set for 1814 GMT," Russian space agency Roscosmos said. The launch from the Baikonur cosmodrome in Kazakhstan is seen as a rehearsal for the next manned voyage, planned for December 3. That flight is to carry Russian cosmonaut Oleg Kononenko, Canadian astronaut David Saint-Jacques, and NASA's Anne McClain to the ISS.

The report, released ahead of the UN's annual World Toilet Day, found that 2.3 billion people worldwide lack a loo at home, including 620 million schoolchildren.

"This is not only threatens their health and education and safety, but it also threatens their future," said WaterAid's campaign director Savio Carvalho.







Pakistan need 94 more to take a lead and go one up in the three-match series.
