Yasir spearheaded Pakistan's wicket-taking with 3-54 as New Zealand, who won the toss and batted on a grassless Sheikh Zayed Stadium pitch, were bowled out for a below-par 153 in 66.3 overs at the stroke of

The day saw 12 wickets fall as Pakistan closed at 59-2, having lost both their openers, Imamul-Haq (six) and Mohammad Hafeez (20), before Haris Sohail and Azhar Ali stopped the

Pakistan need 94 more to take a lead and go one up in the three-match series.

Imam was first to go as he edged Colin de Grandhomme's delivery to the slip while Hafeez miscued a pull straight to short mid-wicket -- both caught by Kane Williamson.

New Zealand skipper Williamson, declared fit after missing last Sunday's third one-day international due to a groin injury, top-scored with 63 before falling softly to medium pacer Hasan Ali, who finished with
