Russia seizes two more villages in southern Ukraine

The Russian army said yesterday it had captured two more villages in Ukraine’s south, where it has advanced in recent days as Kyiv scrambles to hold on to Pokrovsk further east.

Exhausted and outnumbered Ukrainian troops are struggling to fend off a larger Russian army as Moscow’s full-scale offensive nears its fourth winter.

The Russian defence ministry announced the capture of two villages, Mala Tokmachka and Rivnopillia, in the southern Zaporizhzhia region.

Turkey seeks to host next climate change talks

Turkey wants to host next year’s UN climate change talks and is ready to organise the event alone if there is no agreement on sharing the event, a Turkish diplomatic source revealed yesterday.

Australia and Turkey are locked in a stalemate over who should host the 31st United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP31) in 2026.

The host is selected by consensus, so unless Australia or Turkey withdraws or the countries agree to share the conference, both will miss out.

A decision by organisers should be made at the current COP conference in Belem, in Brazil.

Four killed in boat accident off Libya

Libya’s Red Crescent said it took part in a major rescue operation after two boats carrying close to 100 irregular migrants capsized off the country’s coast, leaving four dead.

The four dead were among 26 Bangladeshis travelling aboard one vessel, the organisation said.

The second boat was carrying 69 migrants, two of them Egyptian and the rest Sudanese, eight of whom were children, the Red Crescent said, reporting no deaths among them.

Proposal could increase irregular workers: Lawmakers

Shura legislators have thrown out a proposed 30-day grace period for renewing work permits, after their Services Committee ruled that employers are already protected under a new decree and warned that such a legal buffer could swell the ranks of irregular workers.

Yesterday the council endorsed the committee’s recommendation not to approve, in principle, a bill to amend Article (26) of Law No. (19) of 2006 on the Regulation of the Labour Market.

The bill had been drafted in light of a proposal from the Council of Representatives and has now been sent back to the Speaker of the lower house to notify the government of the decision, in line with Parliament’s own stance.

According to the explanatory memorandum of the Legislation and Legal Opinion Commission, the bill was meant to grant employers a grace period to renew work permits so that the penalty set out in Article (36) of the Labour Market Regulation Law is not imposed as soon as a permit expires.

It was also framed as a way to reduce lawsuits brought by

the Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) against employers before the courts and to avoid any interruption to the activity of businesses.

Review

His Excellency Acting Labour Minister Yousef Khalaf said the government “constantly reviews existing legislation, especially when comments arise from any party that a particular provision is no longer serving its purpose or achieving the goal behind it”.

He explained that, with regard to the settlement article in the Labour Market Regulation Law, LMRA had carried out an in-depth study and examined dozens of options in consultation with all stakeholders, especially those dealing directly with the authority.

The Acting Labour Minister added that the amendment issued by decree-law was “more comprehensive and clearer”, as it did not simply grant a grace period but was designed to give the worker the opportunity to

enter into a settlement, while introducing a sliding scale for settlement amounts from one to 10 days, and from 10 to 30 days.

This flexibility in the law, he said, delivers “effective oversight and fairness in enforcement”.

Penalties

Committee rapporteur Dr Ebtesam Al Dallal said the proposal centred on giving employers

extra time to renew permits to avoid these penalties, cut the volume of court cases and protect business continuity.

However, she stressed that the aims of the bill have already been achieved following the issuance of Decree-Law No. (12) of 2024, which amended Article (40) of the Labour Market Regulation Law.

Al Dallal explained that LMRA has put in place an effective system of early reminders and alerts on work permit expiry, sent in stages and in good time, in a way that takes employers’ interests into account and makes it easier for them to meet their obligations.

Argument

In light of that, she argued, there is no need to write a new legal grace period into the law.

She added that current legislation already allows employers to apply to re-issue a permit before it expires, which keeps the employment relationship in place without breaching the

rules or adding extra burdens on either side.

By contrast, she warned, the proposed wording could lead to an increase in irregular workers.

Stillborn

Second Deputy Chairwoman of the Shura Council Dr Jihad Al Fadhel described the legislative amendment as “stillborn”, noting that the MPs who originally submitted the proposal were the same ones who later rejected it.

She said that legislation governing the labour market is built on a philosophy of rights and duties, with careful ordering of obligations and attention to all parties concerned, “and therefore there is no room for any loss of rights”.

Shura Council member Dr Adel Al Maawda stressed that “the shared concern of everyone is to increase job opportunities for citizens”, which, he said, requires clear and flexible legislation that supports an investment-friendly climate.

Strike group

US aircraft carrier now in Caribbean

The US military announced yesterday that an aircraft carrier strike group had arrived in the Caribbean, greatly expanding the presence of American forces near Venezuela.

US President Donald Trump has ordered a troop buildup in the Caribbean as part of an anti-drug trafficking initiative, but speculation has abounded that Washington may be contemplating military intervention against Venezuelan strongman Nicolas Maduro.

The US Southern Command (SOUTHCOM), which oversees American forces in Latin America and the Caribbean, had previously said that the USS Gerald R. Ford Carrier

Strike Group had entered its area of responsibility.

Yesterday, it announced in a statement that the strike group had entered the Caribbean Sea, saying the move follows Trump’s “directive to dismantle Transnational Criminal Organizations and counter narco-terrorism in defense of the Homeland.”

The strike group includes the most advanced US aircraft carrier, two guided-missile destroyers, and other support vessels and aircraft.

It joins several warships already in the Caribbean, with the deployment dubbed “Operation Southern Spear.”

Since launching the anti-trafficking military campaign in September, US forces have killed at least 80 people.

Education upswing

Postgraduate numbers surge as Bahrain’s university enrolment hits 52,674

Student enrolment in Bahrain’s higher education sector has risen to 52,674 in the 2024/2025 academic year, according to figures from the Higher Education Council (HEC), up 23.4 per cent from 42,690 students in 2016/2017. The data show that overall enrolment has grown while the pattern of study has shifted. Bachelor’s programmes in public and private institutions registered 45,649 students this year, compared with 46,828 last year, a fall of about 2.5 per cent. Master’s degrees drew more students. Enrolment in these programmes reached 3,470 in 2024/2025, up from 3,258 in the previous academic year, an increase of 6.5 per cent. **Sharpest rise** Doctoral study recorded the sharpest rise. PhD enrolment climbed to 419 students this year, against 271 in 2023/2024, a growth rate of 54.6 per cent. The figures point to higher numbers entering advanced postgraduate courses in higher education institutions in the

kingdom. Short-term higher education courses at diploma level saw little change. A total of 3,136 students were enrolled in diploma programmes in 2024/2025 across public and private providers. The same set of data also lists the structure of the sector. **Private sector** In the current academic year, the private sector includes one institute, two colleges and 12 universities, while the public sector has one college and two universities, bringing the total to 18 higher education institutions. In 2023/2024, the private sector had one institute, two colleges and 11 universities, while the public sector ran two colleges and two universities. The total number of institutions in 2022/2023 stood at 18, after reaching 21 in 2021/2022. According to the Higher Education Council figures, enrolment numbers and the make-up of institutions have both shifted over recent years, with more students registered on postgraduate programmes and changes in the balance between public and private providers.

Eco revisions

Renewable energy bill set for review on fees, liability and ministerial powers

The Shura Council yesterday sent a draft law proposal on renewable energy back to its Public Utilities and Environment Committee for more study, after a long debate in which members supported the move towards clean power but questioned fees, liability and the scope of ministerial powers. The proposal, put forward by Talal Al Mannai, Dalal Al Zayed, Dr Mohammed Ali Hassan, Jumaa Al Kaabi and Ali Al Aradi, is tied to Bahrain’s Economic Vision 2030 and to easing power costs for homes and businesses. Committee rapporteur Ejlal Bubshait said the text is meant to “create an attractive environment for investment in renewable energy, keep pace with the global move towards clean energy and set a comprehensive legal frame for the sector”, while easing pressure on the grid and “saving in the budget of the Ministry of Electricity and Water”. **Clean power** Bubshait told the chamber that the draft is designed to “strengthen the Kingdom’s



ability to grow renewable and sustainable energy resources” by encouraging clean power in place of electricity generated from fossil fuels. She said the proposal would help Bahrain reach carbon neutrality and hit its targets for cutting emissions, and would “reinforce the steps Bahrain has taken towards the environmental challenges facing countries around the world and its international obligations in the environmental field”. She added that the proposal gives legal form to the Royal Vision of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa as outlined in the Royal Address opening the fourth session. In that speech, HM the King stressed “the importance of focused investment in renewable energy to achieve the independ-



ence needed to preserve and develop national resources in order to sustain the natural and agricultural environment”. **Approval** Under the draft, anyone who wants to connect a unit generating electricity from renewable sources to the distribution system would first need approval from the competent authority, under rules issued by the minister. Bubshait said this step was meant to ensure that connections “meet the technical requirements that do not harm the distribution system, maintain the smooth running of the network and avoid faults that may result from connection without regard to technical aspects”. After the exchanges, the Council voted to return the proposal

to the Public Utilities and Environment Committee so that members can re-examine the clauses and report back with revised wording. During the debate, several members made the case for a shift away from fossil fuels. Committee head Dr Hassan said renewable energy, “also known as clean energy”, comes from “permanent sources such as the sun, wind and water” and is gaining ground worldwide. **Alternative** “It is the alternative to fossil energy and investment in it is increasing in major countries and in some Arab states,” he said. “The proposal aims to reduce dependence on ordinary energy sources.” He pointed to “the development of technologies for producing this energy, increased awareness in this field, and the international obligations imposed by environmental agreements and the reduction of carbon emissions” as reasons for the move. He added that the draft “is in line with Bahrain’s Vision 2030 and matches the Sustainable Development Goals in Goal 17, and has a large economic return”. Second deputy chairperson of the Council Dr Jehad Al Fadhel told colleagues the draft sits with the chamber’s wider work on new areas such as artificial intelligence. “The draft law proposal strengthens the Council’s lead in updating the legislative system, such as the law on artificial intelligence,” she said.

Shura Council strikes down economic redundancies bill

A proposal to toughen rules on economic redundancies has been struck down by the Shura Council, which warned it would deter firms from hiring long-term staff and duplicate existing labour protections. At its latest sitting yesterday, the council voted not to approve amendments to the Labour Law in the Private Sector, Law No. 36 of 2012, and agreed to send the bill back to the lower house for another look. The draft, forwarded from Parliament in amended form, sought to replace Article 110 and add a new Article 110 bis to govern redundancies for economic reasons and the way employers notify the Labour Ministry.

Contracts

According to the memorandum from the Legislation and Legal Opinion Commission, the bill would have recast Article 110 to set out how contracts may be ended on economic grounds, with the stated aim of securing social fairness and making sure employers took all possible steps before ending the contracts of Bahraini workers. The new Article 110 bis was drawn up to organise how notices from employers to the ministry are dated and recorded when redundancies are planned, with the drafters linking the move to Article 13 of the Constitution on the role of work in social stability and growth. Shura’s Services Committee took a different view.

It said the draft text would make dismissal procedures more cumbersome and lead to extra forms and checks for companies without clear gain. **Complications** Committee rapporteur Hala Ramzi told members the proposal “complicates procedures and places an extra burden on employers without any practical return”, and would place ‘administrative and accounting duties on the Ministry of Labour outside its remit’. The lawmaker added that the bill overlooks grounds for ending an employment contract that are not tied to the state of a business, and that it “creates legislative duplication with Article 111 of the current law”, which already deals with compensation for workers.

Court orders BD12,100 refund over flat sale

The High Civil Appeals Court has upheld a ruling to cancel a flat sale and order a BD12,100 refund to a Bahraini buyer after finding the property was already under mortgage and the seller had kept quiet about it, according to lawyer Sara Ali.

She said her client, a man in his thirties, had agreed to buy a freehold flat for BD28,000 from a projects company.

Before signing the final sale contract, he paid BD12,100, with the remaining BD15,900 due on signing.

Sale procedures

Both sides agreed that the flat would be handed over within five months, once the sale procedures were completed.

The lawyer explained that the seller did not deliver the flat.

The buyer then contacted the Survey and Land Registration Bureau, where he learnt that the unit formed part of a tower mortgaged in favour of another institution and that other complaints had been lodged about the same building.

Amount

Four months later, the buyer asked the seller to return the amount he had paid.

No money was returned, so he brought a case before the

flat was in fact mortgaged in favour of an institution.

The court said the case file contained nothing to show that the buyer knew about the mortgage before the agreement, while the two defendants were required to inform him of any burden on the property.

Duty

It added that, although a mortgagor may dispose of a property under the law, this does not relieve him of the duty to act in good faith and with honesty in dealings, and he ought to have told the buyer about the mortgage.

The court also rejected the defendants' attempt to rely on the rules on earnest money and the bar on recovering it, finding that the BD12,100 formed part of the purchase price from the

outset, not a separate deposit.

The judges went on to find that the second defendant had engaged in fraud. He appeared in court and stated that the flat was not mortgaged, while knowing that it was, in his capacity as partner and owner of the first defendant company.

Property

He did not reveal the mortgage and instead confirmed that the property was free of it.

On that basis, the court held him jointly liable with the company under Article 18 bis, paragraph 2, of the Commercial Companies Law.

It ended by rescinding the contract, restoring the parties to their previous position and ordering the two defendants, jointly, to pay the buyer BD12,100.

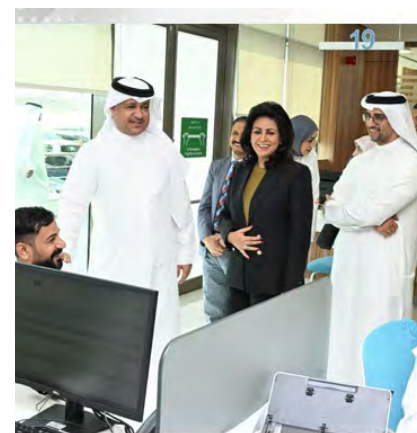

This came during his meeting with a trade delegation from the Turkish Electro Technology Exporters' Association (TET) on 16 November 2025 at the Chamber's headquarters. Kanoo welcomed the delegation and provided an overview

of the Chamber's history, services, and its role in supporting Bahrain's private sector. S. Korea's Samsung plans \$310 bn investment to power AI expansion

South Korean conglomerate Samsung unveiled yesterday a plan to invest \$310 billion over the next five years mostly in technology powering artificial intelligence, aiming to meet growing demand driven by a global boom.

The business group's flagship Samsung Electronics is already one of the world's top memory-chip makers, providing

crucial components for the AI industry and the infrastructure it relies on.

South Korea is also home to SK hynix, another key player in the global semiconductor market. The five-year investment package includes plans to build a new semiconductor facility, Pyeongtaek Plant 5, designed "to meet the needs of memory-chip demands", Samsung said in a statement.

Once in full operation, "the Pyeongtaek plant is expected to play an even greater strategic role in both the global semiconductor supply chain and South

Korea's domestic chip ecosystem," it said. The new line is scheduled to begin operations in 2028.

Samsung SDS, the group's IT and logistics arm, will establish two AI data centres in South Jeolla and Gumi, the company said, without providing further details.

Samsung Group is a network of affiliated companies with complex cross-shareholdings under the Samsung brand, rather than a single legal holding company.

It is South Korea's largest chaebol, the family-run con-

glomerates that dominate the country's economy.

The \$310-billion plan also includes some projects unrelated to AI.

Under the investment package, the company said that Samsung SDI, its electric-vehicle battery affiliate, was exploring the creation of a domestic production line "for next-generation batteries, including all-solid-state batteries".

The AI boom has delivered a major tailwind for Samsung Electronics and SK hynix, whose high-performance memory chips have become indispensable for AI computing.

Samsung Electronics has reported that its profit increased more than 30% year-on-year in the third quarter, driven by AI-fuelled demand.

AI-related spending is soaring worldwide and sky-high tech share valuations have fed concerns of an AI market bubble that could eventually burst, like the dot-com boom that imploded at the turn of the millennium.

The investment package announced on Sunday comes after the South Korean government had pledged to triple spending on artificial intelligence next year. President Lee Jae Myung has vowed to "usher in the AI era" and make the country one of the world's top three AI powers, behind the United States and China.

Istanbul hotel evacuated after tourists die of suspected poisoning

The hotel where a family of Turkish-German tourists were staying when they suffered suspected poisoning that killed the mother and two children, was evacuated Saturday, local media reported.

All guests staying at the unnamed hotel in the Fatih neighbourhood near Istanbul's historic peninsula were relocated to other hotels, Bir-Gun newspaper said, without saying how many people were involved.

Another two tourists staying at the same hotel were taken to hospital Saturday after coming down with nausea and vomiting, the paper said, without elaborating.

The family fell ill on Wednesday after eating several popular street food dishes in the waterside neighbourhood of Ortakoy, at the foot of a bridge spanning the Bosphorus.

They were taken to hospital but the two children, aged six and three, died on Thursday and the mother a day later, the justice minister said.

The father remained in "critical condition", Istanbul's regional health chief Abdullah Emre Guner said late Friday on X.

Different media reports looked at various foods the family was thought to have eaten.

But investigators have also discovered that a room on the ground floor of the hotel had recently been sprayed with pesticides, the Hurriyet news website reported Saturday.

Police had detained a hotel employee and two pest control workers, raising the number of people held in connection with the incident to seven, it added.

They said the family was Turkish, but living in Germany. They had come to Istanbul on holiday.

Greece to supply winter gas to war battered Ukraine

Zelensky visited Athens at the start of a European tour

● Greece is “the natural gateway for American liquefied natural gas to replace Russian gas in the region

● Greek authorities plan to cooperate with US companies to increase the flow

Greece signed a deal with Ukraine on Sunday to supply US-origin liquefied natural gas (LNG) to the war-battered country whose energy infrastructure has been crippled by Russian strikes.

The agreement came as Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky visited Athens at the start of a European tour aimed at shoring up his country's defences and energy supply, as it enters another gruelling winter nearly four years into Russia's invasion.

Exhausted and outnumbered Ukrainian troops are struggling to fend off Russian forces, and both sides have been attacking each other's energy infrastructure power stations and oil refineries as the war drags on with no sign of peace talks.

Greece's national gas company DEPA Commercial and its Ukrainian counterpart Nafto-

gaz announced the deal, which will run from December 2025 until March 2026, following a meeting between Zelensky and Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis.

The agreement “marks an essential step in strengthening regional energy cooperation and European energy security”, according to a joint statement.

The deal, signed at a ceremony attended by US ambassador to Greece Kimberly Guilfoyle, will make it possible to “support Ukraine in the midst of a difficult winter”, Mitsotakis and Zelensky said.

Guilfoyle visited Zelensky at the Ukrainian embassy in Athens on Sunday, the state-

run ERTNEWS tv channel reported.

“Relations between our countries are taking on a crucial new dimension: that of a new secure energy artery, stretching from south to north, from Greece to Ukraine,” Mitsotakis said.

He called the deal a “decisive step toward definitive energy independence from Russian gas” -- a key goal for Europe, which has struggled to wean itself off imports.

Most European Union countries recently approved a ban on imports of Russian natural gas by the end of 2027, a decision aimed at hitting Russia's funding for the war.

Mitsotakis also pledged Greek

support for Ukraine's postwar reconstruction and to deepening defence cooperation, according to a joint declaration.

They plan on “enhancing security in the maritime domain, including cooperation on the development and deployment of maritime (sea) UAVs, joint exercises and training related to unmanned maritime systems, and enhanced information-sharing on maritime threats.”

The Ukrainian president expressed gratitude to US President Donald Trump “for the fact that we will be able to receive natural gas not only from Greece, but also (US gas) via Greece”.

Gambling ads target Indonesian Meta users despite ban

Gambling promoters are using deceptive marketing tactics to reach Indonesian users across Meta platforms, despite the company's policies and a government crackdown on the illegal practice.

An AFP investigation found dozens of paid gambling adverts disguised as innocuous content to circumvent Meta's ban on such promotions in Indonesia.

Online and offline gambling -- and publicising it -- is outlawed in the country, but billions of dollars still flow through the sector each year.

Meta could potentially face government sanctions if it does not address the violations.

The posts on Facebook, Instagram and Threads appear to promote video games or treatments for conditions such as diabetes. But they redirect users to betting websites.

“It's become really disturbing,” said Zee, a 32-year-old Indonesian gamer who encountered the ads on Instagram.

“I suspect their target is people who like playing games, therefore children can also see such advertisements,” said Zee, who did not provide her real name due to privacy concerns.

Another 24-year-old social media user, who wished to be identified as Moli, said she al-

ways reports such ads on Instagram, but they keep reappearing.

Meta did not respond to requests for comment, but nearly two dozen advertisements AFP shared as a sample were later removed.

Steep penalties

Indonesian authorities say they have taken down more than 5.7 million pieces of gambling-related online content over the past eight years.

Police have also stepped up enforcement, with at least 85 influencers arrested last year for promoting online betting.

Penalties are steep, including potential prison terms of up to

10 years, while gambling itself is punishable by up to four years in jail.

The Ministry of Communication and Digital Affairs said it regularly asks social media platforms to remove gambling-related content, and issues warning letters if those requests go unanswered.

“Continued inaction will result in a third warning letter sent to the platform, which carries additional penalties and may lead to access termination,” Alexander Sabar, director general for digital space supervision, told AFP.

In October, the ministry temporarily suspended TikTok's operating license because the

platform refused to provide data related to the alleged monetisation of live activities from accounts suspected of online gambling.

AFP asked Sabar if the minister will summon Meta following the findings of paid gambling ads.

He said the ministry maintains regular communication with social media platforms, and often raises the issue of gambling adverts.

The ministry “urges all digital platforms to strengthen their ad detection and moderation systems in accordance with Indonesian laws and regulations”, Sabar told AFP on November 12.

“Should repeated violations

be found and left unaddressed, we will take enforcement in line with the applicable regulations.”

Bait and switch

Between September and November, AFP found dozens of active Indonesian gambling ads in the Meta Ad Library, a platform operated by the US company to maintain transparency around paid promotions.

Some offered tips for “how to lower diabetes”, while others touted the health benefits of different fruits.

AFP found that one account ran 49 gambling ads under the title: “Pomegranate: The Exotic Red Fruit Rich in Benefits”.

The post's Indonesian caption appeared harmless, but it redirected users to a betting website promising newly registered users they can “directly win”.

The Facebook page behind the ads listed its location as Hanoi, although AFP could not independently verify where it was based. The account's transparency details showed it was run by multiple administrators.

AFP reached out to several such accounts, but responses were not forthcoming.

AFP works in 26 languages with Meta's fact-checking programme, including in Asia, Latin America and the European

Union.

Big business

A forthcoming study from Indonesian research firm Populix, whose findings were shared with AFP, reveals 98 percent of social media users in the country have been exposed to gambling promotions -- including paid advertisements.

Of those, 32 percent say they eventually tried online gambling after seeing such promotions in their social media feeds.

Four percent of that group say they still gamble.

“The advertisements promised a win or jackpot,” Populix research manager Nazmi Tamara told AFP.

Betting content on social media takes many forms, from comments under posts and small overlays on videos to content that openly promotes gambling platforms, said Vivi Zabkie, the firm's head of policy and society research.

The value of online gambling transactions in Indonesia reached 927 trillion rupiah (\$55.7 billion) between 2017 and the first quarter of 2025, the Indonesian Financial Transaction Reports and Analysis Center told AFP.

It previously said 80 percent of online gambling users are students and individuals from low-income backgrounds.

Budget coffee start-up leaves bitter taste in Berlin

Instantly recognisable by their electric blue shop fronts, branches of LAP Coffee have become a common sight in Berlin's hippest neighbourhoods over the past two years.

With their no-frills interiors, minimalist service model and cappuccinos for just 2.50 euros (\$2.90), the outlets have become popular haunts for Berliners on a budget.

But LAP, which stands for Life Among People, has also caused a backlash in the German capital from critics who say it is squeezing out local cafes, prompting protests and even vandalism.

Founded in Berlin in 2023 and backed by several heavyweight investors, LAP now has 16 outlets in the capital and eight more in Hamburg and Munich.

Inside its branches, seating is sparse -- the idea being to snap an Instagrammable selfie in front of the chic decor before taking your coffee away in one of LAP's signature electric blue cups.

Behind the counter, a staff member presses the logo of your chosen drink on a touch screen, the machine starts up and the coffee comes out -- no grinding or filtering required.

"It's very fast!" said Artur Kluge, a 22-year-old student, at one of LAP's branches in

the trendy Berlin neighbourhood of Prenzlauer Berg.

He considers the quality of the caffeinated beverages to be "pretty good".

But in a country where the price of coffee has risen by 21.3 percent over the past year, he really comes to LAP because "two or three euros is definitely a good price".

'Fair, honest coffee'

However, not all Berliners are so enamoured with the new chain. In October, several LAP shop fronts were sprayed with red paint.

Posters in the streets proclaim that the "aggressive" expansion of the chain is the "rotten

cherry on top of a gentrification process that has already driven too many people and small businesses out of our neighbourhoods".

A few minutes' walk away, Umut Ekinici, owner of Auntie's Cafe, believes LAP is "changing the market".

In Prenzlauer Berg, a former East Berlin neighbourhood that has so far resisted the likes of McDonald's and Starbucks, there are already six branches.

"All they have to do is press a button, serve the coffee, say goodbye and that's it," Ekinici said.

"I think most people are happy with the prices. I completely understand that. But it's destroying the other small coffee businesses."

LAP co-founder Ralph Hage, who previously worked for Red Bull and investment bank Standard Chartered, told AFP the company is simply offering "fair prices and honest coffee to customers".

"We've seen very little innovation in coffee in the last 30 years. The lower prices are possible through efficiency and innovation on the preparation method," he said.

LAP is not some evil multinational corporation but a "local business" that is "generally very open to dialogue", he said.

"Ultimately, it is becoming increasingly difficult for small, independent businesses that are not geared towards quick profits to find space at all when these large chains are spreading," Mario said.

Flyers posted around the neighbourhood accuse LAP of being supported by "big investors involved in the development of military drones and AI-based weapons systems".

"If this trend continues, all we will have left is chains backed by large funds and luxury restaurants," Mario said.

Luxury houses eye India, but barriers remain

The globe's biggest luxury brands have dreamt of India's vast consumer base for decades, but navigating the market has proven to be a complex task.

French retailer Galeries Lafayette is the latest to try its luck, opening its first Indian store on Sunday: a sprawling five-floor outlet in Mumbai, the country's financial capital.

Its splashy foray into the market is getting a local boost from the fashion arm of the Aditya Birla Group, a major Indian conglomerate.

Luxury expert and Comite Colbert CEO Benedicte Epinay called the arrival of the French department store "an important step".

India, with 1.4 billion people, offers what Epinay called "a promising market, but still a complicated one".

Brands must not only overcome high customs duties, a cumbersome bureaucracy and infrastructure limitations, but must also compete with a robust domestic luxury market.

Galeries Lafayette's Mumbai store of 8,900 square metres (105,000 square feet) has some 280 luxury and designer brands spread across it, according to figures from the French retailer on Sunday.

Almost all of the brands are foreign, which industry professionals warn is a bold gamble given the rich local clothing culture.

Galeries Lafayette's international development director, Philippe Pedone, said at Sunday's launch more local brands would be added.

Mumbai resident Sonal Ahuja, 39, told AFP: "I think a lot of brands like Louis Vuitton and Gucci and Dior have been doing a pretty good job at sort

of weaving Indian design into their products."

"But at the end of the day, if you want to buy something to wear to a wedding, you will buy (from Indian fashion designers) Sabyasachi or Tarun Tahiliani. Why would you want to buy something foreign that is trying to be Indian?" she said.

'Ticks all the boxes'

India's luxury market is still relatively small, but expanding rapidly.

Valued at \$11 billion in 2024, it is set to triple to \$35 billion

by 2030, said Estelle David, South Asia Director at Business France.

India's economy creates tens of thousands of new millionaire households each year.

These consumers increasingly splurge on everything from Lamborghini cars to Louis Vuitton bags.

"When a luxury house looks at a new country, it considers the number of wealthy people and the rise of a middle class," Epinay said. "India ticks all the boxes."

The reality is more complex.

French luxury giants contacted by AFP declined to comment. Their silence, analysts suggest, reflects a lack of positive things to say about a market widely considered difficult.

"They have very little data to show they are making profits or generating a return on investment," said Ashok Som, from France's ESSEC Business School.

In the early 2000s, the biggest fashion houses eyed India as their next growth engine after China. But the market remains tiny a quarter of a century later, Epinay said.

According to Epinay, most brands have only one to three stores in India, compared with 100 to 400 in China.

In her view, the only real similarity between the two giants is "the size of their populations". India lacks China's "social, linguistic and territorial homogeneity", Epinay said.

India still has limited numbers of premium malls, most of which do not match what customers find in the Middle East, Europe, the United States or China.

"India is not at the same stage

of development, so it's very difficult to compare," Business France's David said.

Galeries Lafayette executive chairman Nicolas Houze said the luxury giant plans to open a second store in Delhi by the end of the decade, with an initial revenue target of 20 million euros (\$23 million).

'Adapt to the culture'

High customs duties often push Indian consumers who can afford top end to take a \$350 round trip to Dubai, where they can buy a French luxury handbag for up to 40 percent less than at home.

Vishal Mathur, 46, an entrepreneur who works in his family's business in Mumbai, told AFP "one is willing to pay for craftsmanship, for style, for the brand".

"But to say you should pay extra just to buy in India? No way."

India and the European Union have committed to finalising a free-trade agreement by the end of the year, which would bring "fresh air to the market", Epinay said.

And profiting in India will require creative thought.

Although major foreign ready-to-wear brands have outlets in megacities such as New Delhi, Mumbai and tech-capital Bengaluru, Western fashion remains in the minority.

Many men wear the traditional knee-length kurtas for special occasions, while flowing saris remain the most popular for women.

Brands such as Louboutin, Dior, Chanel and Bulgari are already collaborating with designers, labels, Bollywood stars and local influencers to appeal to Indian consumers, market specialists say.

"You have to adapt to the culture, to tastes and consumption habits," David said.

◆ A volcano in southern

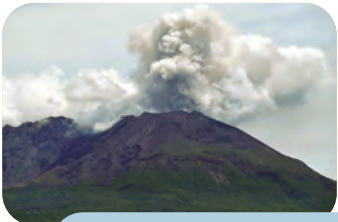
Japan erupted early Sunday sending a plume of ash and smoke into the sky and prompting a warning over ashfall. Sakurajima, one of Japan's most active volcanoes, erupted before dawn, sending ash and smoke up to 4,400 metres (14,400 feet) into the sky, the Japan Meteorological Agency said. No damage has been reported, an official in Kagoshima prefecture, where the volcano is located, told AFP. But the weather agency forecast ashfall in part of Kagoshima and neighbouring Miyazaki prefecture, as the eruption continued several times. "In areas where a moderate amount of ashfall is expected, please take measures to protect yourself from ash, such as using umbrellas or masks, and make sure to drive slowly," the agency said.

◆ **Iranian Foreign Minister** Abbas Araghchi said Sunday that the country had no undeclared uranium enrichment sites and that all of its facilities were monitored by the UN's nuclear watchdog. The assertion came after US media outlets, including the Washington Post and the New York Times, reported that Iran had accelerated construction at a secret underground nuclear site called "Pickaxe Mountain", or Kuh-e Kolang, near its Natanz facility. "There's no undeclared nuclear enrichment facility in Iran; all of our facilities are under the safeguard and monitoring of the agency," Araghchi said during a forum in Tehran. He added there was "no enrichment" taking place at present because the sites were damaged in the recent war with Israel.

◆ **Libya's Red Crescent** said it took part in a major rescue operation after two boats carrying close to 100 irregular migrants capsized off the country's coast, leaving four dead. The four dead were among 26 Bangladeshis travelling aboard one vessel, the organisation said. The second boat was carrying 69 migrants, two of them Egyptian and the rest Sudanese, eight of whom were children, the Red Crescent said, reporting no deaths among them. The organisation said it had received an alert overnight Friday about two boats that had capsized in the Mediterranean. They had departed from the Libyan city of Khoms, 120 kilometres (75 miles) east of Tripoli. Photos published by the Red Crescent late on Saturday showed migrants receiving medical care, clothes and blankets in Khoms, as well as body bags containing the four dead. The Red Crescent said it had worked alongside the coast guard and port authorities Libya is a key transit country for thousands of migrants seeking to reach Europe by sea each year.

K-pop star Nana subdues home intruder

K-pop star Nana helped overpower a home intruder and is recovering in hospital after suffering injuries during the tussle, South Korean police said yesterday.

The intruder, a man in his 30s, broke into the K-pop star's home early on Saturday, before being taken down by Nana with the help of her mother and arrested.

The 34-year-old celebrity and her mother, who suffered serious injuries and lost consciousness, are being treated in hospital, South Korea's Yonhap news agency reported.

The intruder broke into Nana's residence in the suburbs of Seoul to steal valuables, a detective at the Guri Police Station told AFP.

"She and her mother overpowered the intruder, a man in his 30s, in a physical struggle, resulting in his arrest," the investigator said.

The suspect is in custody on charges of aggravated robbery, he added.

Nana, whose

real name is Im Jin-ah, is a singer-turned-actress with a strong fan base who first rose to prominence as part of Orange Caramel, a sub-unit of the girl group After School. The trio's music video for "Catalena" has more than 35 million views on YouTube.

"Nana also sustained physical injuries while trying to escape the dangerous situation," Yonhap news agency reported.

"The mother has regained consciousness, and both of them are currently in need of treatment and complete rest."

Nana's agency has not responded to AFP's request for comment.

Nana debuted in 2009 as a member of After School before transitioning into acting, landing several leading roles in television dramas.



Major MAGA figure says facing threats 'fueled' by Trump

Marks an extraordinary rift in the MAGA movement

Marjorie Taylor Greene, a former key political ally of Donald Trump, said Saturday she was being targeted by a wave of threats after the US president lashed out at her on social media.

The 51-year-old Republican congresswoman had previously been a standard-bearer of Trump's Make America Great Again Movement (MAGA), but the president on Friday announced he was withdrawing all support for "Wacky" Marjorie.

He followed up again Saturday morning with multiple posts on his Truth Social platform attack-

ing Greene as a "lightweight" and even a "traitor" to the Republican Party.

Greene said later on X that she was "being contacted by private security firms with warnings for my safety as a hot bed of threats against me are being fueled and egged on by the most powerful man in the world."

The high-profile rupture

comes after Greene in recent weeks has distanced herself from the president, as he faces growing criticism over US cost of living concerns and the Jeffrey Epstein scandal.

The dispute also marks an extraordinary rift in the MAGA movement a year before US mid-term elections.

Until recently a diehard pro-

Trump supporter, Greene has broken with the president on a host of issues. Trump expressed frustration with her for the first time on Monday, saying she had "lost her way."

Greene's sudden shift has prompted speculation that she is lining up for her own presidential bid in 2028, although she has dismissed it as "baseless gossip."

Perhaps the most sensitive area of criticism has been Greene's position on the Epstein scandal, which ensnared Trump again in recent days with the release of a new trove of emails.

After becoming a leading voice calling for justice for victims of the notorious sex offender over the summer, Greene this week was one of a few MAGA rebels who backed a push to vote on demanding the public release of files relating to the Epstein probe.

In her Saturday morning post on X, she again touched on the Epstein scandal.

"As a woman I take threats from men seriously," Greene said. "I now have a small understanding of the fear and pressure the women, who are victims of Jeffrey Epstein and his cabal, must feel."

India says accomplice of Delhi car blast 'suicide bomber' arrested

Indian authorities said yesterday that a deadly car blast in New Delhi last week was an attack carried out by a "suicide bomber", announcing the arrest of an accomplice.

The National Investigation Agency (NIA), the country's counter-terrorism law enforcement body, said the attacker and the second suspect were both from Indian-administered Kashmir, where police have carried out sweeping raids in recent days.

Announcing "a breakthrough" in the investigation, the NIA said it had arrested Amir Rashid Ali, describing him as an accomplice of the "suicide bomber" under whose name "the car involved in the attack was registered".

He had come to Delhi to "facilitate the purchase of the car which was eventually used as a vehicle-borne Improvised Ex-

plosive Device (IED) to trigger the blast", according to a statement from the counter-terrorism agency.

It identified the driver as Umar Un Nabi, a resident of Kashmir who was an assistant professor in general medicine at a university in the northern state of Haryana.

The explosion on Monday took place near a busy metro station close to the landmark Red Fort in the capital's Old Delhi quarter, where the prime minister delivers the annual Independence Day address.

A hospital official has said the blast killed 12 people. It was un-

clear whether Nabi was included in the toll.

The NIA's statement said the attack "claimed 10 innocent lives and left 32 others injured".

The NIA said it had seized another vehicle belonging to Nabi.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi has called the attack a "conspiracy", and his government vowed to bring the "perpetrators, their collaborators and their sponsors" to justice.

Israeli leaders voice opposition to Palestinian state before UN Gaza vote

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and members of his government underscored their opposition to a Palestinian state ahead of a UN Security

Council vote Monday on a resolution endorsing a US-backed Gaza peace plan.

The draft resolution would follow up on the ceasefire deal between Israel and Hamas brokered by US President Donald Trump,

giving the council's blessing for a transitional administration and a temporary international security force in the devastated territory.

Unlike previous drafts, the latest version of the resolution mentions a possible future Pal-

estinian state, which the Israeli government is vehemently against.

"Our opposition to a Palestinian state on any territory has not changed," Netanyahu said at a cabinet meeting on Sunday.

UN peacekeepers say Israeli forces fired on them in **S. Lebanon**

UNIFIL has been working with the Lebanese army

The United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) said yesterday that Israeli soldiers had shot at its peacekeepers from a tank near an army position in the country's south.

UNIFIL has been working with the Lebanese army to consolidate a truce between Israel and the Lebanese militant group Hezbollah reached last November.

"This morning, the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) fired on UNIFIL peacekeepers from a Merkava tank from near a position Israel has established in Lebanese territory," the peacekeepers said in a statement, adding heavy machine gun rounds hit about five metres from their personnel.

The force said the peacekeepers were able to "leave safely thirty minutes later" after the tank withdrew inside the Israeli position.

Israeli forces say 'no deliberate fire' at UN peacekeepers in Lebanon

Israel's military said on Sunday it had not intended to shoot towards United Nations peacekeepers in southern Lebanon, saying its forces mistook them for "suspects" and fired warning shots.

"After a review, it was deter-

mined that the suspects were UN soldiers who were conducting a patrol in the area and were classified as suspects due to poor weather conditions," the Israel Defense Forces said in a statement, adding: "No deliberate fire was directed toward UNIFIL soldiers".

"represents a serious violation of UN Security Council resolution 1701", which ended a 2006 conflict between Israel and Hezbollah, and also formed the basis of last November's truce.

That ceasefire sought to end more than a year of hostilities between the parties that broke out after the start of the Gaza war.

Under the deal, Israel was to withdraw its forces from south Lebanon, but it has kept them

at five areas it deems strategic.

It has also kept up regular strikes on Lebanon, mainly saying it is targeting Hezbollah sites and operatives.

Sunday's incident was not the first in which UNIFIL accused Israel of endangering its peacekeepers.

"Yet again, we call on the IDF to cease any aggressive behavior and attacks on or near peacekeepers," the force said.

UK govt defends refugee shakeup in face of hard right

Britain's interior minister on Sunday defended plans to drastically reduce protections for refugees and end automatic benefits for asylum seekers, insisting that irregular migration was "tearing our country apart".

The measures, modelled on Denmark's strict asylum system, aim to stop thousands of migrants from arriving in England from northern France on small boats -- crossings that are fuelling support for the anti-immigrant Reform UK party.

But the proposals were criticised as "harsh and unnecessary" by the Refugee Council charity and are likely to be opposed by left-wing lawmakers within Prime Minister Keir Starmer's embattled Labour government, which is trying to counter the hard right.

"I really reject this idea that dealing with this problem is somehow engaging in far-right talking points," Home Secretary Shabana Mahmood told BBC television.

"This is a moral mission for me, because I can see illegal migration is tearing our country apart, it is dividing communities."

Presently, those given refugee status have it for five years,

after which they can apply for indefinite leave to remain and eventually citizenship.

But Mahmood's ministry, the Home Office, said it would cut the length of refugee status to 30 months.

That protection will be "regularly reviewed", and refugees will be forced to return to their home countries once they are deemed safe, it added.

The ministry said it also intended to make people granted asylum wait 20 years before applying to be allowed to live in the United Kingdom indefinitely.

It also announced that it would create "new safe and

legal routes for genuine refugees" through "capped work and study routes".

Asylum claims in Britain are at a record high, with around 111,000 applications made in the year to June 2025, according to official figures.

The Home Office called the new proposals, which Mahmood will lay out in parliament on Monday, the "largest overhaul of asylum policy in modern times".

It said the reforms would make it less attractive for irregular migrants to come to Britain, and make it easier to remove those already in the country.

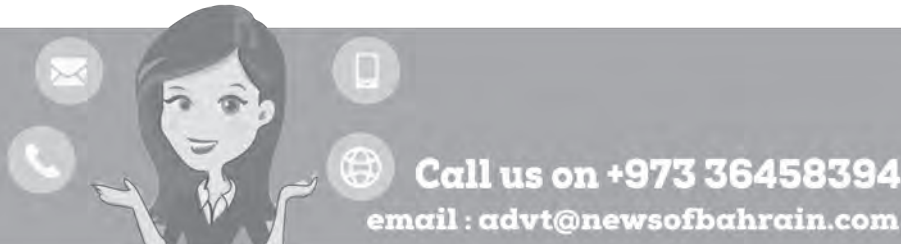

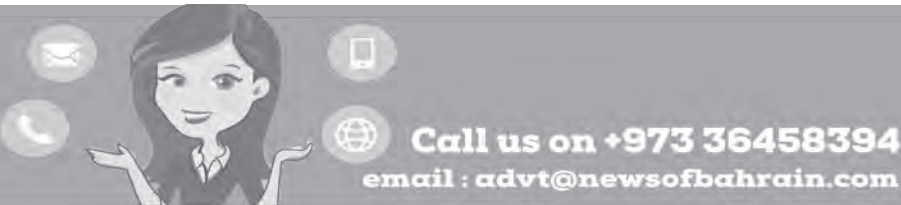

Saudi hand Bahrain first handball loss

Hosts Pull Away Early to Defeat Bahrain in Islamic Solidarity Games

Bahrain's senior men's handball team suffered their first defeat of the sixth Islamic Solidarity Games in Riyadh yesterday, losing 21-27 to hosts Saudi Arabia in a physical Group B encounter at the Olympic Complex's Green Hall.

After their dramatic opening win over Kuwait, Bahrain struggled to contain Saudi Arabia's blistering start, trailing 9-17 at halftime. Hassan Alturaiki, Sadiq Almohsin, and Mojtaba Al Salem powered the hosts early, capitalizing on Bahraini exclusions and defensive lapses, including penalties for Ahmed Kadhem and captain Hasan Ali. Bahrain's Husain Alsayyad and Ahmed Kadhem kept the nationals in touch initially, but Saudi Arabia's 7-1 mid-half surge proved decisive.

Bahrain improved after the break, with Hasan Alsamahi-ji converting twice, Kadhem scoring from the 7m line, and Hasan Ali striking key goals as the deficit narrowed to 20-15. Salman Alshowaikh, Bahrain's most reliable scorer, added four goals from wing positions, keeping them within range.

However, Saudi Arabia's relentless attack responded to every Bahraini push. Al Salem continued to score freely, Alturaiki added his fourth, and Hossam Gad and Abdullah Al-hulaili punished turnovers to

restore control. Late goals from Jasim Khamis and Hasan Ali trimmed the gap, but the hosts maintained composure to seal the 27-21 win.

Alshowaikh led Bahrain with eight goals, Hasan Ali added five, and Alsamahi-ji scored two. Kadhem and Khamis each had

two goals, with Qasim Qambar and Husain Alsayyad chipping in one apiece. Saudi Arabia were led by Al Salem's seven-goal performance, supported by Alturaiki (five), Almohsin (five), and Alabas Mohammed (five). Goalkeepers were influential, with Bahrain making eight saves and

Saudi Arabia recording 18. Bahrain, now 1-1 in Group B, return tomorrow at 2 PM to face Iraq in their final preliminary match. The top two teams advance to Wednesday's semi-finals, with medal games on Thursday and Friday.

Bezzecchi claims Valencia MotoGP victory in season-ender

Aprilia rider Marco Bezzecchi won the Valencia MotoGP yesterday to bring the season to a close and cap a fine end to his year.

The 27-year-old sealed third place in the championship in the sprint on Saturday and, starting on pole, edged out Raul Fernandez (Trackhouse) to celebrate in style.

Bezzecchi also triumphed last weekend in Portugal as Aprilia sealed back-to-back Grand Prix victories for the first time.

The Italian's third place also gave Aprilia their first top-three championship finish.

Marc Marquez clinched his seventh world title with five events to spare in Japan in September. His brother Alex sealing second place overall in October.

"I had a lot of fun," said Bezzecchi.

"It was tough but I am very, very happy, for the work the team did and I can't hope for a better way to finish the season and now we have to celebrate for sure."

Fernandez overtook sprint

winner Alex Marquez on the 12th lap to move up to second, still moe than a second behind Bezzecchi.

On his Ducati, Fabio Di Giannantonio pipped Pedro Acosta (KTM) to third.

Francesco Bagnaia, MotoGP champion in 2022 and 2023, finished a bitterly disappointing season early following contact caused by Johann Zarco on the first lap.

The French Honda rider was issued a long lap penalty as Bagnaia, who finished fifth in the championship, headed back to the pits.

Aprilia's Jorge Martin, competing in his first Grand Prix since a collarbone fracture at the Japanese Grand Prix in September, also left the race early as he had indicated he would on Saturday.

The 2024 champion, having served a double long lap penalty at the start, finished his injury-hit campaign after completing 15 laps, to conserve energy before testing next week.

"Aprilia Racing has decided to withdraw Jorge Martin from the race as a precaution," said his team in a statement.
