#### Relief ready for Hodeidah

Riyadh

The King Salman Humanitarian Aid and Relief Center (KSRelief) has readied an urgent response plan as the Yemeni Army, backed by the Saudi-led coalition, tightens its grip on Hodeidah.

The plan involves sending specialized medical teams to the port city, and intensifying humanitarian and relief aid, Dr Abdullah Al Moallem, director for health and environmental aid at KSRelief, said yesterday.

The army took control of Hodeidah's airport on Saturday, and is continuing an offensive to liberate the city from Iran-backed Houthi militants.



Ali Al Awadhi became a proud symbol of the Kingdom as he performed Tawaf (circumambulating the Kaaba), during the 1941 flood which caused the Kaaba to be surrounded

The pictures from 77 years ago show Al Awadhi in the water, which measured up to more than a meter and a half high, in front of Maqam Ibrahim, as well as his brother and friend sitting by the door of the Ka'ba in the back.

Al Awadhi, who passed away in 2015, has previously said that he was about 12-years-old studying in Mecca, when the heavy rain persisted for an entire week without any interruptions.

He said that he went to the Meccan Sanctuary his teacher, when they found the place completely someone to swim, except for two incident, one flooded. Al Awadhi, who used to swim often, said from the Islamic era, and one 77 years ago.

Samen Kondorura, 40, died Friday when pallbearers lost their footing while carrying the coffin up a bamboo ladder in the Parinding valley in North Toraja district, local po-

"As the mother's coffin was being raised to the lakkian, suddenly the ladder shifted and collapsed, the coffin fell and hit the victim," Julianto Sirait, chief commissioner of the Tana Toraja resort police, said.

Sirait said the accident happened because the ladder was not properly reinforced but the family has declined to press charges.



## Council to close all illegal garages in Hoora

**♦** The Capital Secretariat Council will soon close all garages in Hoora.

All garage activities in Hoora and Maan Bin Zaaedah Avenue will be shut down, Deputy Chairman of the Board of the Capital Municipal Council Mazen Al Umran told Tribune yesterday.

"For the past few years, all spare parts shops in the area are not just selling spare parts but also repairing cars, where the cars come and park in the middle of the road causing a major traffic jam at the entire stretch of

"These workshops are not licensed to repair or fix anything other than selling spare parts. Further, it has come to our notice that these shops in the name of selling car accessories, are changing oil, tyres and filters in the middle of the road for hours."

The council has issued notice to all these shops. "A one-year time frame will be given to these shops and if they want to continue as repairing shops they will have to reallocate to services area. This has been an ongoing issue and we plan to address it now."

He also added that the council has closed down the municipal office in Tubli. "With the expansion of the municipal office in the Capital, it has been decided to merge the centre with the main head office to ensure smooth work flow."



ast week, I told you about how an ATM Machine withheld my credit card and BD20 in cash deposit to remove the block placed by the bank to incentivise me to make the minimum payment of BD7! Then, I talked about the inconvenience I had to go through calling the Customer Service Centre and visiting the branch to collect my card. Let's continue with the story. Of course, more inconvenience!

When I received my credit card from the customer service staff, I asked him: "What shall I do about the missing BD20 and the block on my card?" He replied: "Unfortunately, I cannot do anything about it. Please call the Credit Call Centre to follow up on this." I continued: "Can't you make a note in your system to inform them about my case in order to avoid making more calls." He replied: "No." I thought this was so strange: "Aren't we in the Digital Age and Employee Empowerment? Maybe not in this bank."

After a few days, I called the Customer Service Call Centre again. I had to go through the dreaded ritual of pressing

many numbers to speak to a "real" person. They informed me that I had to go to the Branch again to make an incident report about my case. I told the representative I did not want to go through the inconvenience of visiting the Branch. She told me: "Then, you can report this using the Online Banking Service." I thought: "This is much better."

I logged in to my account and clicked on "Contact Centre" and then "Send Message." This is when then system surprised me. It asked me to use my "Online Physical Security Key" in order to send the message to the Bank. This Bank has an advanced online security arrangement. Most of the online functions require me to use this Key to protect me from hackers. However, I was not carrying this Key with me. So, more inconvenience!

I called the Customer Service again. And when a "real" person spoke, I retold the story of my life. I asked her: "Why do I have to use the Security Key to be able to send a message to the Bank? I do not see any risk neither on me nor on the bank for doing this. What shall I do now to remove the block from my credit card?" She told me: "Since this is a credit card issue, it is better to contact the Card Centre." And I did. They told me: "Please contact the Service Centre." And by this, the Ping Pong continued.







Cri Lanka captain Dinesh Ochandimal has been charged with altering the condition of the ball in the second test against West Indies, the International Cricket Council (ICC) said yesterday.

Angry Sri Lankan players refused to take the field on the third day of the match in St Lucia on Saturday, delaying the resumption of play for almost two hours, after the ICC said umpires Aleem Dar and Ian Gould had changed the ball and awarded West Indies five penalty runs.

"Sri Lanka captain Dinesh Chandimal has been charged for breaching Level 2.2.9 of the ICC Code of Conduct," the ICC tweeted.

The breach relates to changing the condition of the ball. The same charge was levelled against Australia batsman Cameron Bancroft who was caught on camera rubbing sandpaper on the ball against South Africa in March.

## Roy joy as England see off Australia again

Explosive batting from Jason Roy and Jos Buttler helped England record their highest ever ODI score against Australia and fire them to a second successive win by 38 runs at Cardiff.

Buttler's unbeaten 91 propelled England to 342 for eight and although Shaun Marsh replied by also reaching three figures for the first time in an ODI for five years, the visitors were all out for 304 in the 48th over.

Another victory at Nottingham on Tuesday would clinch the five-match series for England and erase the embarrassment of their recent loss to Scotland in their opening white-ball game of the summer.

With captain Eoin Morgan ruled out before the start of play with a back spasm, England needed Roy to come out firing a century from 97 balls.

His departure, to a sharp catch from Tim Paine moments after the keeper had been cut on the face by a ball that reared up, did not check England's momentum and Buttler took up the charge, finishing the innings with a boundary.


