MP calls for move to fast-track visa issuance to help stranded Bahrainis fly home

Bahraini citizens stranded abroad are calling for a way home, and MP Basema Mubarak says the answer lies in fast-tracking visas to countries with working airports.

She said she had received a number of appeals in recent days from nationals unable to return to the Kingdom due to heightened tensions in the re-

Many, she added, are struggling with the prospect of long and exhausting overland travel, particularly those accompanied by elderly relatives, young children or people with chronic health conditions.

Human toll

The journeys, she warned, are taking a human toll: physical, emotional and medical.

"We urge the relevant authorities to facilitate entry visas to countries with accessible airports," she said, "so that Bahraini citizens can fly back safely. This would provide a practical and humane solution for those unable to reach home saying urgent humanitarian by other means."
