Fisherman battles poverty with plastic-bottle boat

ith hundreds of empty plastic bottles collected from the shores of Rafah in the southern Gaza Strip, fisherman Muath Abu Zeid has turned litter into a floating source of income.

The Palestinian father-of-four used glue and old nets to bind the bottles into a small fishing boat that he hopes will help him support his family.

Simple but effective, the 700-bottle craft is capable of carrying up to eight people out to sea, according to its 35-yearold skipper.

It takes him about eight hours

to pull in between five and seven kg of sardines, mullet and other small fish with his rod.

He sells his catch to passersby on the nearby corniche, making between 20 and 40 shekels (\$5-\$11) a day.

Muath's two younger brothers Mohammed, 23, and Ashraf, 20 - accompany him on his daily excursions. Neither were able to find work elsewhere.

"I'm a house painter but be-I'm unemployed," said skipper Muath, a descendent of refugees from a village near Jaffa in present-day Israel.


In his tweet, he highlighted the contributions by Keralites to the country and the need to help the state recover from the catastrophe.







New York University makes tuition free for all medical students New York, United States

N ew York University said Thursday it would offer all its current and future medical school students free tuition in an effort to tackle soaring debt levels and encourage more applicants. The move -- which it said was financed by the generosity of the university's "trustees, alumni, and friends," amounts to a reduction of \$55,018 in annual fees, regardless of financial needs or academic merit.

It does not cover living and administrative costs averaging \$27,000 a year.

According to the Association of American Medical Colleges, the median debt of a graduating medical student in the US is \$202,000 -while 21 per cent of doctors who graduate from a private school such as NYU face over \$300,000. NYU said it is the only top 10-ranked medical school in the US to offer such an initiative

Military and border guard commanders Aung Kyaw Zaw, Khin Maung Soe, Khin Hlaing, and Thura San Lwin were accused of leading violent campaigns against the Muslim Rohingya in Rakhine state as well as minorities in Kachin and Shan states.

"Burmese security forces have engaged in violent campaigns against ethnic minority communities across Burma, including ethnic cleansing, massacres, sexual assault, extrajudicial killings, and other serious human rights abuses," said Sigal Mandelker, Under Secretary for Terrorism and Financial Intelligence in the US Treasury.

Gold set for biggest weekly fall in more than a year

Investors seeking a safe place to store assets amid trade dis-



putes and a Turkish currency crisis have preferred the dollar to gold, undermining the reputation of bullion as a safe haven.

But news of planned US-China trade talks and a partial recovery of Turkey's lira have steadied nerves slightly. From a 13-month high on Wednesday against a basket of peers, the dollar has weakened against the currencies of key gold markets the euro zone and China, helping gold regain its footing, said ABN AMRO analyst Georgette Boele.

"I expect the dollar to peak in the coming weeks ... Gold should



roop reinforcements stepped up desperate rescue attempts in India's flood-stricken Kerala state yesterday after more than 100 bodies were found in a day and a half, taking the crisis death toll to 385.

The state has been battered by record monsoon rainfall in recent days and is "facing the worst flood in 100 years", chief minister Pinarayi Vijayan said.


In a Twitter statement released by his office, he said there had been "324 lives lost". a tripling of the death toll in the last 24 hours.

Vijayan added that 223,139 people have been moved to more

in water in his house in Chengannur, another badly affected district, has also gone viral. Other messages have been sent from people trapped in temples and hospitals as well as in their homes.

"The chief minister has confirmed 164 deaths (since August 9). Around 100 people died in the last 36 hours alone," a Kerala government spokesman told AFP.

Local media reports predicted the toll would quickly mount amid unconfirmed reports of more deaths in landslides and people found drowned.

The Kerala government has said it faces an "extremely grave" crisis and state chief minister Pinarayi Vijayan warned of a new wave of rainfall hitting the battered region.

The gates of dozens of dams and reservoirs across the state have been opened as water levels reach danger levels. That has added to the submerging of many villages.

North and central Kerala has been worst-hit by the floods with the international airport in the main city of





en Kim Kwang-ho fled advancing North Korean forces he expected to return home within days, so did not bother with a proper goodbye to his mother and brother. On Monday he meets his sibling for the first time in 68 years.

Now 81, Kim is one of a handful of Southerners to travel to the North's scenic Mount Kumgang resort next week for three-day reunions with family members separated by the turmoil of the Korean War.

Millions of Koreans were separated from their relatives by the 1950-53 conflict, which left the peninsula divided and all civilian communication banned between the two sides.

Since 2000, the Koreas have held 20 rounds of reunions, but time is running out for many ageing family members.

More than 130,000 Southerners signed up originally, most of whom have since died. The majority of the survivors are over 80 and the oldest participant this year is 101.

Close family connections across the border, like Kim and his brother or parent-child relationships, have become increasingly rare.

"I was so happy to hear my brother was alive," Kim said.

'I can't remember my mother's face'

But memories have faded over time.



Kim's father decided to flee, taking his four eldest children with him, when rumours circulated that the North Korean army was advancing on their village in far northern Myongchon county in late 1950.

Kim was 13 at the time, while his brother Kwang Il was nine -- a four-year gap that led to a lifetime apart.

"We thought we'd be away for only three days or up to a week, so women and young children were left behind to look after the house." Kim said.


But he laments that his older sister died 12 years ago and missed the chance to take part.

ributes have poured in for the beloved and iconic singer Aretha Franklin from friends, musicians, politicians and fans after the legendary "Queen of Soul" died aged 76.

"It's difficult to conceive of a world without her. Not only was she a uniquely brilliant singer, but her commitment to civil rights made an indelible impact on the world," singer and actress Barbra Streisand Aretha Franklin tweeted about Franklin, who died on Thursday after a history-making career that spanned six decades.

"I'm sitting in prayer for the wonderful golden spirit Aretha Franklin," said Motown legend Diana Ross, while former Beatle Paul McCartney called her "the Queen of our souls".

Franklin influenced generations of female singers with unforgettable hits including "Respect" (1967), "Natural Woman" (1968) and "I Say a Little Prayer" (1968).

Fans mourning the death of Franklin left balloons, flowers and mementos at Detroit's New Bethel Baptist Church, where as a child the star kicked off her storied career singing gospel.

Reverend Charles Turner described her passing as a "Great loss -- can't nobody replace her," adding that the grief felt by mourners was akin to the loss of a parent.



PCB's legal advisor Taffazul Rizvi said Jamshed was the "lynchpin" in the scandal.

"He will not be allowed to be involved with cricket or cricket administration even after his period of ban is over."

Jamshed did not participate in the first two editions of the PSL but was alleged to have played a major role in the spot-fixing scandal that engulfed the Twenty20 tournament last year.

Batsmen Sharjeel Khan and Khalid Latif were handed five-year bans for their role in the scandal, while paceman Mohammad Irfan and all-rounder Mohammad Nawaz received respective suspensions for 12 and two months.
