Trump threatened to bomb Oman if it "gets in the way" of a US deal with Tehran on the Strait of Hormuz and called for Iran to surrender.

"If Oman gets in the way, we'll bomb them," Trump told Fox News journalist Trey Yingst, referring to ongoing



talks between Oman and Iran on con-

trol of the strait, while Washington is also pursuing its own talks. Tehran and Muscat have been talking for weeks on future maritime navigation

arrangements through the shipping route, and the foreign ministry in Tehran said earlier Monday that the two sides were working on a joint declaration.

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
