Riyadh talks on Iranian attacks, regional stability

Riyadh

Saudi Arabia yesterday evening hosted a consultative meeting of foreign ministers from several Arab and Islamic countries in Riyadh to discuss ways to address Iranian aggression and support regional security and stability.

Present were foreign ministers from Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) states, other Arab League members.

Iran has targeted US military assets, Israeli sites, and several Arab countries – including the UAE, Bahrain, Kuwait, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and Jordan – describing the strikes as responses to perceived support for the offensive campaign.

Casualties

The attacks have caused civilian casualties in some cases, infrastructure damage, temporary shutdowns of oil facilities, airspace closures, and disruptions to trade and transport. Saudi Aramco's Ras Tanura facility was affected after intercepted debris fell in the area.

Values


He emphasised that the message of faith remains rooted in moderation, wisdom and unity, values that bring people together and strengthen stability in times of uncertainty.

As Eid approaches and people fill markets across Bahrain, inspection teams have stepped up their presence, moving quietly between shops to ensure everything remains fair, safe and stable.

Abdulaziz Al Ashraf, Assistant Undersecretary for Control and Resources at the Ministry of

Industry and Commerce, said inspection campaigns have been intensified across all governorates in response to seasonal demand and current regional developments.

He explained that these efforts, carried out in cooperation with the private sector, focus on monitoring goods, ensuring price stability and verifying that businesses comply with regulations.

Beyond enforcement, he said, the aim is to strengthen trust between traders and consumers during one of the busiest times of the year.

Inspection plans have been tailored for the pre Eid period, covering key activities linked to the season.

Teams have been visiting fruit and vegetable shops, salons, tailoring outlets, bakeries, sweet shops, restaurants and catering kitchens, as well as malls and

commercial centres.

In each stop, there is more than routine checking, there is an effort to keep the rhythm of the market steady as families

Al Ashraf noted that inspections focus on tracking market conditions and ensuring the smooth flow of goods, while closely monitoring sales practices, discounts and promotional offers.

He stressed the importance of clear pricing and warned against misleading offers or unjustified price increases, confirming that legal action will be taken against violations.

The intensified campaigns, he said, reflect the ministry's commitment to maintaining a fair and balanced commercial environment that protects consumers and reinforces discipline in the market.

Waiver of municipal fee arrears for low-income death cases

Families of low-income Bahrainis who die can already

seek to have up to two years of unpaid municipal fees struck off, with other cases also open to review under rules now in force, the government has told MPs.

In a written reply to a proposal calling for the cancellation of electricity, water and municipal dues on death, the government said the legal and administra-

tive tools already in place deal with such cases while taking social and human grounds into account.

It said current decisions allow

overdue sums from up to two years before a person's death to be written off, so long as the deceased was listed by the Ministry of Social Development.

Man jailed for fatal road accident in Seef District

● **Basic safety breach**

A Gulf man was sentenced to two years in prison and will be deported after serving his term, following a fatal road accident in Seef District.

According to the First High Criminal Court, the man was driving under the influence of alcohol when his car lost control.

The crash left his wife dead from severe head injuries, while he sustained a serious fracture to his left arm.

The incident also caused damage to public property, including a road sign, a decorative tree, and a metal barrier.

Precautions

Investigations confirmed that the driver failed to observe basic safety precautions.

The court ruled that his reckless driving directly resulted in his wife's death and held him accountable for the consequences.

Price pressure

MP warns of shipping strain and building material shortages in Kingdom

● **Regional tensions affect industry**

Firms in Bahrain are facing steep extra shipping costs while the building trade is running into shortages of some materials, MP Hassan Ebrahim told Parliament, warning that the strain could feed through to prices in the local market.

Speaking during debate on a proposal calling for media plans for major accidents, disasters and emergencies, Ebrahim said regional tensions had led some global shipping lines to halt or reroute vessels heading to Gulf states.

As a result, he said, some cargoes were now being offloaded at other ports such as Khor Fakkan and Jebel Ali, leaving traders in Bahrain to bear war-risk fees, diversion charges and the cost of getting goods on to the Kingdom.

He said moving one container from Khor Fakkan to Bahrain

could cost about \$5,000, while the same journey from Jebel Ali could range from \$1,000 to \$3,000, with port delay fees on top.

“These challenges may place heavy pressure on commercial companies,” he said, adding that this could also push up the price of goods on sale in Bahrain.

Ebrahim said the building trade was also under strain because some materials had be-



trade during such periods.

Ebrahim called for a close look at what the government was doing to help traders and keep goods moving.

The legislator also pressed for stronger public messaging in times of crisis.

He said Bahrain needed clear, well-drawn media plans to get information to citizens and residents quickly, raise public awareness and lift the country's state of readiness.

“The economic wheel must keep turning even in times of challenge,” he said.

This period, he added, should not be treated as a pause or a holiday, but as one calling for harder work and a shared sense of duty.

He also spoke of cases in which citizens had tried to reach ministries by phone or email and got no reply.

That, he said, needed fixing to make sure public services kept running without harm to people's interests.

In some cases, he said, ministers were contacted directly, and he praised their response and follow-up.

Call for wider public-private partnerships

Bahrain's economy has held its footing through regional strain, Khalid Al Maskati said, as he made the case for stronger backing for small firms and a bigger part for private business in the country's development work.

Speaking to Bahrain TV, the head of the Financial and Economic Affairs Committee at the Shura Council said the economy had shown a clear ability to adjust to fast-moving events around the region.

He said that staying power should now be matched by work to back small and medium-sized enterprises, keep goods flowing and draw the private sector further into state-led projects.

“The Bahraini economy has proven its ability to adapt quickly and positively to different variables and emerging circumstances,” he said.

Al Maskati said small and medium-sized firms were a key part of job creation, output and supply chains, which is why the government had placed weight on helping them cope with economic strain.

Arab business owner jailed for VAT evasion

In a case highlighting financial misconduct and regulatory violations, the High Criminal Court sentenced an Arab businessman to five years in prison, fined him BD247,559,551, ordered him to repay the same amount in evaded VAT, and ruled that he be deported after serving his sentence.

The case centered on the owner of a chain of grocery stores who was found guilty of evading value-added tax (VAT) by submitting false documents to the National Bureau for Revenue, and failing to maintain proper records of transactions and imports conducted in 2023.

According to prosecutors, the violations began in the first quarter of 2023.

In his capacity as the owner of the business, the defendant deliberately failed to pay the VAT due within the legally specified timeframe.

He also submitted inaccurate tax returns that omitted key revenue figures, with the intent of reducing the amount owed.

The defendant unlawfully deducted VAT inputs, failed to issue tax invoices.

Cautious optimism

Gold price surge and ongoing tensions soften Ramadan trade at Manama Souq

Gold price surges and ongoing political tension have contributed to a quieter Ramadan at Manama Souq's gold market compared to last year.

Since the onset of the conflict, customer footfall has declined, including hours that typically see higher traffic during the holy month.

In an effort to gauge the situation, The Daily Tribune spoke with several gold sellers in the souq.

Business

They indicated that while business has slowed, there is cautious optimism that upcoming occasions - Eid, anticipated tomorrow, Friday, followed by Mother's Day on Saturday, could help support demand.

Many store owners noted that customer turnout remains limited at present.

Many shops are now keeping

only minimal stock on hand due to the ongoing uncertainty.

However, regular customers continue to place orders.

Conflict

Speaking exclusively to The Daily Tribune, Jay Rathod, a gold seller at Manama Souq, said, "Last year this time in



Ramadan, 21-carat gold was around BD30, this year however it is BD53. Since the conflict began, customer numbers have fallen, from 10 to 15 per day last Ramadan to just 2 to 4 now."

He added, "Orders have also declined, from 50-60 last year to 12-15 this Ramadan. However, considering the gold price surge from last year, it is still enough

to sustain the business."

Rathod also noted that Bahrain's gold is typically popular among customers from other Gulf countries due to its distinctive designs.

Clients

"We usually receive many clients from Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, and the UAE who appreciate

Bahraini craftsmanship. This year, however, even they are visiting less frequently. Compared to last year, the souq feels quieter. However regular customers still place orders," he said.

Investment

Another gold seller, Sayed Ahmed, told The Daily Tribune, "Gold remains an important investment. Regardless of price fluctuations, it continues to hold value for the owner."

He added that while Bahraini customers usually purchase gold for Mother's Day, activity in the market this year remains subdued.

Compensation plan

Shops hit by Iran attacks seek electricity and water bill relief

● **Urgent proposal to ease burden of utility arrears**

Parliament has agreed an urgent proposal calling for shop owners, companies and other businesses hit by the effects of the Iranian attacks to be compensated for unpaid electricity and water bills that built up during the disruption.

The proposal was put forward by MPs Khalid Buanaq, Ahmed Al Salloom, Hisham Al Awadhi, Mohammed Al Marafi and Zainab AbdulAmeer.

It calls on the relevant authorities to look into a suitable way of compensating affected businesses, or easing the burden of utility arrears, after trade in some sectors was hit by the regional unrest.

Tensions

Khalid Buanaq said the move came in light of the economic effects caused by "regional conditions and security tensions" on commercial and service activi-

ty, chiefly where those circumstances led to some businesses slowing down or stopping in part.

He said some shops, firms and companies had been affected "directly or indirectly", which had harmed their ability to keep up with running costs and other financial duties.

Among the clearest pressures, he said, were electricity bills,

which form "a basic part of the operating costs of commercial establishments".

In some cases, those bills mounted up while business activity was weakened or partly halted during the exceptional period.

Buanaq said studying support or compensation for those accumulated bills would help ease the financial strain on affected

businesses and improve their ability to keep trading and regain operating stability.

Support

He said the proposal also rested on the state's wish to support the private sector, which he described as one of the main pillars of the economy and an important source of jobs.

"This proposal aims to enable the competent authorities to study an appropriate mechanism to compensate for, or reduce, the burden of electricity bills on affected businesses," he said, "in a way that achieves a balance between supporting economic activity and protecting the financial stability of these institutions."

He added that such a step would help firms harmed by exceptional circumstances and support a stable economic climate for growth and investment.

Bahrain food and medicine supplies fully secured

Bahrain continues to respond efficiently to the repercussions of the Iranian aggression, security and military forces work around the clock to safeguard the Kingdom and protect its residents.

Captain Al Mannai emphasised that public awareness remains a critical pillar of civil protection. He urged citizens and residents to follow official instructions and avoid approaching or touching missile or drone debris.

He also warned against photographing or sharing such materials on social media, stressing the risks they pose to public safety. Any sightings, he said, must be reported immediately through the emergency number 999.

Markets

From an economic perspective, Rawan Janahi, Head of Marketing Campaign Services at the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, confirmed that local markets are stable and well supplied as Eid Al-Fitr approaches.

She noted that livestock shipments continue to arrive regularly, ensuring sufficient availability of meat, poultry and essential food items across retail outlets.

Stocks fall, oil surges as US inflation jumps and Israel strikes gas facilities

Stocks markets fell and oil prices surged Wednesday after a closely watched US inflation gauge came in hotter than expected and Iran said that Israel struck one of its gas facilities.

Brent oil rose five% to over \$108 a barrel after Iran vowed to hit energy facilities throughout the Gulf in retaliation to what it said was an Israeli attack on a facility on the Gulf coast serving a massive gas field it shares with Qatar.

The three main US stock indexes all opened lower, and European stock markets reversed earlier gains.

The US Labor Department reported before the start of trading that the Producer Price Index (PPI) rose 0.7% from the previous month, much faster than the 0.3% increase expected by analysts, and further clouding the outlook for interest rate cuts.

"The key takeaway from the report is that the uptick in producer prices was seen in both goods and services, and the added point is that this higher inflation occurred before the war with Iran and subsequent surge in energy prices, which will foment concerns about a worsening inflation situation," said Patrick J. O'Hare, an analyst at Briefing.com.

The PPI report came just ahead of a slew of meetings of the world's top central banks, with the US Federal Reserve gathering later Wednesday, to be followed on Thursday by the European Central Bank, the Bank of England and the Bank of Japan. While they were all expected to keep rates steady, the latest inflation reports could lead to more hawkish comments from the central bankers.

"The (ECB's) Governing Council will not want to risk a repeat of 2022 when inflation risks were initially underestimated and perhaps contributed to the eventual surge to double digit inflation," said GianLuigi Man-

druzzato, senior economist at EFG Asset Management.

Markets have been pricing in one rate cut this year in the United States, but could be forced to shift positions if Fed policymakers do so given the surge in energy prices.

The dollar, which had been little changed ahead of the Fed meeting, rose on news of the latest Israeli attacks.

Earlier Wednesday, oil prices had fallen slightly after Iraq said it had resumed limited oil exports through the Turkish port of Ceyhan, using a pipeline that avoids the effectively shut Strait of Hormuz, through which a fifth of global oil flows.

Kuwait arrests 10 Hezbollah members, thwarts 'terrorist' plot: ministry

Kuwait arrested 10 militants affiliated with the Iran-backed Lebanese Hezbollah group yesterday, who were accused of plotting "terrorist" actions against vital infrastructure, the interior ministry said.

"The State Security Agency has successfully thwarted a plot for a terrorist operation targeting vital installations," the interior ministry said.

"Ten citizens, members of a terrorist group affiliated with the banned Hezbollah terrorist organisation were apprehended," it added.

Qatar orders departure of two Iranian diplomats over gas facility attack

AFP | Doha, Qatar

Qatar's foreign ministry yesterday ordered Iran's military and security attaches along with their staff to leave the country within 24 hours, following an attack on its massive natural gas facility.

"Both the military attache and the security attache in the embassy, in addition to those working in the two attache offices, persona non grata, and requests that they leave the state's territories within a maximum period of 24 hours," the ministry said, in a social media post.

Saudi Arabia says 5 drones intercepted approaching energy facility in east

AFP | Riyadh, Saudi Arabia

Saudi Arabia's defence ministry said yesterday that five drones approaching an energy facility were intercepted in the kingdom's east, in the latest strikes to target the Gulf's energy installations.

The official spokesman for the ministry reported the "interception and destruction of 5 drones that attempted to approach one of the energy facilities in the Eastern Region", according to a post on its official X account.

Saudi Arabia says four injured in Riyadh by shrapnel following interceptions

Nuclear plant hit

The UN nuclear watchdog said Iran reported a strike on the country's only operational nuclear power plant but that it caused no damage.

Russia, which helped build the plant and has staff on site, said it had received a report of a missile strike on the plant's inner perimeter and called the attack "completely unacceptable".

War 'will hit all'

Iran's top diplomat said the repercussions of the war in the Middle East would be felt globally.

"Wave of global repercussions has only begun and will hit all -- regardless of wealth, faith, or race," Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi posted on X.

Iranian army chief Amir Hatami threatened to launch a "decisive and regrettable" retaliation for the killing of security chief Larijani.

Iran strikes cause 'extensive damage' at major Qatar gas hub

AFP | Doha, Qatar

Iranian strikes caused "extensive damage" at the world's largest gas hub in Qatar, the Gulf state's energy firm said Thursday, and an AFP journalist saw a vast fire illuminating the night sky visible from roughly 30 kilometres away.

QatarEnergy said emergency teams had been "deployed immediately to contain the resulting fires," at the Ras Laffan facility on the tiny Gulf state's north coast after it was "the subject of missile attacks".

In a statement Qatar's foreign ministry condemned what called a "brutal Iranian attack targeting Ras Laffan" saying the targeting represented a "direct threat to its national security".

The attacks came as Saudi Arabia was hosting foreign ministers from across the Arab and Islamic world for talks in Riyadh to discuss the fallout from the Middle East war.

Doha's defence ministry later said its air defences intercepted two Iranian ballistic missiles targeting Ras Laffan with no reported casualties and civil defence said the fire had been brought under control.

"This will complicate the situation and could have uncontrollable consequences, the scope of which could engulf the entire world," Masoud Pezeshkian wrote on X, adding that such attacks "will yield nothing" for Iran's foes the US and Israel.

Iran launched salvos of drones and missiles towards the Gulf states on Wednesday evening with several strong blasts heard in the Saudi capital Riyadh, according to AFP journalists, and a missile threat intercepted in the UAE, according to authorities.

Four people were injured when shrapnel from a ballistic missile interception fell on a residential area of the Saudi capital Riyadh on Wednesday, the civil defence said.

Riyadh's defence ministry said it intercepted four ballistic missiles on Wednesday with a fragment falling near a refinery south of the Saudi capital.

Multiple drones were also intercepted and destroyed as they headed towards Saudi gas facilities in the kingdom's the Eastern Province.

Israel army silent on attack on Iran's gas facility in Gulf

Israel, US hit Iranian gas facility

US-Israeli strikes hit Iranian facilities at a major Gulf gas field yesterday causing a fire, Iranian state television reported.

"Moments ago, parts of the gas facilities located in the South Pars Special Economic Energy Zone in Asaluyeh were struck by projectiles fired by the American-Zionist enemy," state television reported, citing Ehsan Jahanian, the deputy governor of the southern Bushehr province, where the facility is located.

It added that firefighting teams were dispatched to the scene to contain the fire.

The South Pars/North Dome mega-field is the largest known gas reserve in the world.

The field supplies around 70 percent of Iran's domestic natural gas.

Iran, which shares the massive field with energy giant Qatar, has been developing its side since the late 1990s.

During the 12-day war in June last year, Israel struck Iranian facilities operating at the field.



UAE condemns targeting of South Pars gas field, after Iran blames US, Israel

The United Arab Emirates affirmed that targeting energy facilities linked to the South Pars gas field in the Islamic Republic of Iran, which is an extension of the North Field in the sisterly State of Qatar, constitutes a dangerous escalation. Targeting energy infrastructure poses a direct threat to global energy security... It also entails serious environmental repercussions and exposes civilians, maritime security, and vital civilian and industrial facilities to direct risks.

Qatar says targeting of Iran gas facility 'dangerous and irresponsible'

Doha yesterday condemned attacks on an Iranian facility on the Gulf coast serving a massive gas field it shares with Qatar.

"Israel's targeting of facilities linked to Iran's South Pars gas field, which represents an extension of Qatar's North Field, is a dangerous and irresponsible step amid the current military escalation in the region," foreign ministry spokesman Majed al-Ansari wrote on X. "Targeting energy infrastructure constitutes a threat to global energy security, to the peoples of the region, and to its environment."

Israel says killed Iran intel chief, tells military to hunt down officials

AFP | Jerusalem, Undefined

Israel killed another top Iranian official, intelligence minister Esmail Khatib, and declared yesterday that its military is authorised to kill any senior Islamic republic figure it gets in its sights.

Iran's president Masoud Pezeshkian branded Khatib's death a "cowardly assassination".

News of Khatib's death came the day after Iranian security chief Ali Larijani was

confirmed killed in an Israeli strike.

"Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and I have authorised the IDF to eliminate any senior Iranian official for whom the intelligence and operational circle has been closed, without the need for additional approval," Israel's Defence Minister Israel Katz announced.

"We will continue to thwart them and to hunt them all down."

Ben Gurion airport hit by 'debris' after Iranian missile fire

An Iranian missile barrage killed two people near Israel's commercial hub of Tel Aviv, medics said yesterday, while authorities said falling munitions hit multiple sites in central Israel overnight. Police said a cluster bomb hit a residential building in Ramat Gan, a city just outside Tel Aviv, and the roof collapsed on an elderly couple.

NATO allies in talks on 'best way' to re-open Hormuz strait

Oslo, Norway

NATO chief Mark Rutte said yesterday that the military alliance's members were discussing the "best way" to open the Strait of Hormuz, through which a large chunk of

the world's oil supply normally passes. "I have been in contact with many allies. We all agree, of course, that strait has to open up again. And what I know is that allies are working together, discussing how to do that, what is the best way to do it," Rutte told a news conference during a visit to a NATO exercise in northern Norway.

"They are working on that collectively, to find a way forward," Rutte added.

Germany 'would have advised against' war

German Chancellor Friedrich Merz said Berlin "would have advised against" starting a war with Iran, had it been consulted by the US or Israel.

While Tehran "bears responsibility" for the current

crisis in the region, Merz said, Berlin had "made it clear that we still have many questions regarding this war," and Israel and the US had shown "no convincing plan as to how this operation could succeed".

Russia condemns Larijani killing

Russia condemned the killing of Iranian security chief Ali Larijani, after ally Tehran vowed retaliation for the death of the military official whom Israel claimed to have killed in an airstrike.

"We firmly condemn actions aimed at harming the health and, even more, the killing of the leadership of sovereign and independent Iran," Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said.

Iran vows to target Gulf energy

Iran's military said it would target energy infrastructure across the Gulf following a US-Israeli attack on its facilities at a major gas field, state television reported yesterday.

The military's operational command Khatam Al-Anbiya said in a statement that it would "severely strike the source of the aggression and consider targeting the fuel,

energy and gas infrastructure" of countries from which the attacks were launched.

Iran accuses Gulf states of allowing US forces to conduct attacks from their territory, and Iranian state television published a list of "legitimate targets" including oil and gas facilities in Saudi Arabia, Qatar and the United Arab Emirates, saying they "will be targeted in the coming hours".

Iran was not rebuilding nuclear enrichment

US intelligence finds

US intelligence concluded Wednesday that Iran was not rebuilding nuclear enrichment capacities that were destroyed in a June 2025 US-Israeli attack, contradicting President Donald Trump's justifications for his ongoing war.

Tulsi Gabbard, a Trump ally who is director of national intelligence, shared the conclusion in written testimony as part of an annual threat assessment but did not repeat the finding when speaking to senators.

"As a result of Operation Midnight Hammer, Iran's nuclear enrichment program was obliterated. There has been no efforts since then to try to rebuild their enrichment capability," Gabbard said in the testimony to the Senate intelligence committee.

Pressed by a Democratic senator on why she did not repeat the conclusion on camera, Gabbard said that she did not have enough time to read the full testimony at the hearing but did not deny the assessment.

Trump has repeatedly said that he ordered the attack on Iran alongside Israel on February 28 due to an "imminent

threat."

Trump said after the June 2025 bombing that the United States had completely destroyed Iran's nuclear sites but since his latest war has said that Tehran was weeks away from a nuclear bomb, a finding not shared by most observers and despite ongoing talks on a nuclear deal.

A senior aide to Gabbard -- who herself as a congresswoman had led opposition to war with Iran -- resigned on Tuesday, saying there was no "imminent threat" and that Trump was misled by Israel and media.

In her remarks to senators, Gabbard said Iran had been

suffering heavy blows in the weeks of attacks -- which included the killing of the long-time supreme leader, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei -- but that the Islamic republic was still functioning.

The US intelligence community "assesses the regime in Iran to be intact but largely degraded due to attacks on its leadership and military capabilities," Gabbard said.

"If a hostile regime survives, it will likely seek to begin a years-long effort to rebuild its military, missiles, and UAV forces," Gabbard said, referring to unmanned aerial vehicles, or drones.

Beware: He Is Watching You!

It happened many years ago—I mean, in 2010—back when life was simple, evenings were predictable, and our biggest worry was choosing between dosa and pizza.

Like many, we had a weekly ritual: "Let's go out." No agenda, no plan—just drive, eat, come back, and feel accomplished. That day, we picked Zallaq—smooth drive, sea breeze, and of course, the compulsory roadside snacks.

An hour later, we returned home. The watchman greeted us as usual. Our villa was in a compound with the sea on three sides, a single-entry gate, three guards, and, seemingly, zero chance of anything going wrong.

While my wife went for a shower, I walked into the bedroom to change—and there it was. The cupboard looked different. I sensed immediately that something was terribly wrong.

Our locker was open, and to my surprise, it was empty.

The big question—how did this happen? Doors locked. Watchmen alert. Sea all around. No broken windows. No drama. Just a silent, surgical strike.

The thief clearly knew our house better than we did.

My wife was devastated. We never recovered the gold or money we lost. But what we did gain was something priceless: fear. It moved in with us rent-free.

So we did what any logical person would do—we moved. New compound. More security. Cameras everywhere. Guards who looked like they took their job seriously. We even installed our own CCTV system inside the villa.

But one fine afternoon, while we were at work, someone walked in—broad daylight, no appointment—and walked out with our expensive watches.

My wife didn't even argue. She just gave me that look—the "we are moving again" look.

So we moved again.

New place. Gated. Two security guards. Solid system.

Day one: perfect.

Day two: theft in the neighbour's house.

I told my wife, "Welcome to the club."

Thankfully, this time we had some positive news. The police caught the thief and brought him to the compound. He looked calm, almost impressed. While leaving, he asked the watchman: "I entered right in front of you. What exactly is your job?"

Nobody could answer. The watchman didn't have to—he was fired the next day.

After all this, my wife raised her eyebrow. I offered my final piece of wisdom:

"Let's just not keep anything expensive at home."

To some extent, the problem has been resolved. We even joked about not locking the main door—as if to send a message: "Dear Jean Valjean, welcome to our home. Please enjoy your short stay while we are away."

But the mystery remained. How did the thief know exactly where to look? Who told them? The maid? The cleaner? A delivery person? Or was it just bad luck?

I finally found a possible answer.

While browsing the NewsOfBahrain page yesterday, I noticed a cybersecurity alert. It warned about unsecured CCTV cameras. These so-called vigilant watchdogs, it said, can easily turn into silent informants if not properly protected.

Hackers can get in, watch your home, study your routines, and plan their moves with chilling precision.

And suddenly, everything starts to make sense.

What if our biggest investment in security has quietly become our biggest vulnerability? The CCTV camera—installed to protect us—may, in some cases, be exposing us instead.

I think I've found part of the answer.

So here's what we can do: secure your internet network and cameras with strong, unique passwords. Keep your systems updated. Avoid connecting your DVR to the internet unless necessary. Do not allow direct remote access to your cameras, and always enable multi-factor authentication wherever possible.

I've taken these steps myself.

But the question still lingers: what about the hacker? Is he getting smarter, too?

Is the game still on?

Trump waives shipping law

AFP | Paris, France

President Donald Trump temporarily waived a century-old shipping law to help ease energy costs that have surged since US-Israeli strikes on Iran plunged the Middle East into war.

Trump's move to issue a 60-day Jones Act waiver would lift a ban on foreign-flagged vessels transport-

ing cargo between US ports over this period.

It is a step to mitigate "short-term disruptions to the oil market" from the conflict, said White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt in a statement. "This action will allow vital resources like oil, natural gas, fertilizer, and coal to flow freely to US ports for sixty days."

South Korea secures UAE oil

South Korea said it would receive an additional 18 million barrels of oil from the United Arab Emirates through alternative supply channels, bypassing the need to use the

Strait of Hormuz. The presidential chief of staff declined to elaborate on the route. About 70% of South Korea's oil imports normally pass through the strait.

Iraq exports via Turkey

Iraq announced it had resumed limited oil exports through the Turkish port of Ceyhan, using a pipeline that avoids the under-fire Strait of Hormuz. The state-owned North Oil Company said it was sending an in-

itial 250,000 barrels a day from its fields in the northern Kirkuk province through the pipeline, well below the 3.5 million barrels a day it has shipped from its southern Basra fields via Hormuz.

Asia petrochemical output slows

The Middle East war is forcing petrochemical giants in key Asian economies to cut production as the conflict rattles supplies of naphtha, a crucial oil-derived component used to make a range of

plastic goods. Mitsubishi Chemical and Mitsui Chemicals have cut output, Shin-Etsu Chemical said it would raise prices, and LG Chem warned it may not be able to fulfil some orders.



PSG, Real Madrid, Arsenal march into last eight

European heavyweights advance in Champions League

Holders Paris Saint-Germain, record 15-time winners Real Madrid and Arsenal surged into the quarter-finals of the Champions League on Tuesday, while Sporting produced a brilliant comeback in Portugal to end Bodo/Glimt's remarkable run.

PSG appear to be coming back into the form which saw them win the Champions League for the first time in their history last season, as the French club crushed Chelsea 3-0 in London to claim a comprehensive 8-2 aggregate victory in their last-16 tie.

Chelsea had been left with a mountain to climb after a late collapse in last week's first leg, and PSG quickly snuffed out any chance the English club had.

Khvicha Kvaratskhelia followed his first-leg double by opening the scoring on six minutes at Stamford Bridge, with Chelsea defender Mamadou Sarr misjudging a long ball on his Champions League debut and then being outmuscled by the Georgian who applied the finish.

Bradley Barcola fired in a brilliant second goal from an Achraf Hakimi assist, and the home fans were streaming for the exits when substitute Senny Mayulu swept in PSG's third on the night just after the hour.

"We clearly dominated, we are very happy to be in the quarter-finals and I think it is well deserved," PSG coach Luis Enrique told Canal Plus.

PSG's fourth victory against English opposition in a two-legged knockout tie since the start of last year sets up a last-eight tie against Liverpool or Galatasaray, who meet on Wednesday at Anfield with the Turkish side leading 1-0 from the first leg.

Two-time European champions Chelsea were not the only English club to be eliminated on

Tuesday, with Manchester City losing 2-1 at home to Real as they went out 5-1 on aggregate.

Real led 3-0 from the first leg in Spain, where Federico Valverde scored a hat-trick, and their qualification was never in doubt after City's Bernardo Silva was sent off on 20 minutes for stopping a goalbound Vinicius Junior shot on the line with his arm.

Vinicius converted the penalty, and Pep Guardiola's side had too much to do, even if Erling Haaland levelled the scores on the night before half-time with his 30th goal this season.

Sporting comeback sinks Bodo/Glimt

Real replaced Thibaut Courtois with Andriy Lunin in goal at half-time, and the tie was over long before Vinicius scored again in stoppage time to seal the win on the night.

"All of us players know that the good games are coming and when Madrid play in this competition, everything changes," said Vinicius, as Real knocked City out for the third season running.

Real are almost certain to face Bayern Munich in a heavyweight quarter-final, with the Germans 6-1 up against Atlanta before Wednesday's return match.

Premier League leaders Arsenal's dream of a quadruple remains alive after they beat Bayer Leverkusen 2-0 at the Emirates Stadium for a 3-1 aggregate success.

They had needed a late penalty to draw in Germany last week, and finished the tie off in the return with goals either side of half-time from Eberechi Eze and Declan Rice.

Eze broke the deadlock with a long-range rocket late in the first half and Rice's composed finish killed off Leverkusen.

"We had four or five situations where we should have scored a third but overall we fully deserved to win and be into the quarter-finals," said Arsenal coach Mikel Arteta.

His team now face Manchester City in the English League Cup final on Sunday, and will play Sporting in the quarter-finals.

The Portuguese champions produced a superb fightback, overturning a 3-0 deficit from last week's first leg against Bodo/Glimt by beating the Norwegians 5-0 after extra time in Lisbon.

Goncalo Inacio and Pedro Goncalves scored before a Luis Suarez penalty on 78 minutes forced extra time.

Uruguayan full-back Maxi Araujo gave Sporting the lead in the tie for the first time in the 92nd minute, and Rafael Nel made sure of their progress with the fifth right at the end.

Bodo/Glimt's fantastic run comes to an end as Sporting reach the quarters of Europe's elite club competition for the first time since 1983.



Senegal stripped of AFCON title, Morocco declared champions

Senegal punished for player walkout during chaotic final

● Walk-off protest proved decisive

● Late penalty sparked chaos

● Senegal vow CAS appeal

Senegal say they will appeal after they were sensationally stripped of the Africa Cup of Nations title on Tuesday and the Confederation of African Football (CAF) instead declared Morocco champions, two months after their chaotic final.

Several Senegalese players controversially walked off the pitch in Rabat during the final on January 18 in protest when the hosts were awarded a penalty late in second-half stoppage time.

After Senegal's players eventually returned having been coaxed back onto the pitch by captain Sadio Mane, Morocco missed the penalty and Pape Gueye went on to score the goal in extra time that gave his team a 1-0 victory.

CAF said that having studied Morocco's appeal, "the Senegal national team is declared to have forfeited the match" and the result was "officially recorded as 3-0" in favour of Morocco.

The CAF Appeals Committee justified its decision by applying Articles 82 and 84 of the AFCON Regulations, which state that if a team "refuses to play or leaves the ground before the regular end of the match without the authorisation of the referee, it shall be considered (loser) and shall be eliminated for good from the current competition".

The articles add that the team contravening the regulations "will lose its match by 3-0".

The Royal Moroccan Football Federation (FRMF) said in a statement its appeal "was never intended to contest the sporting performance of the teams participating in this competition, but solely to request the application of the competition regulations".

"The Federation reaffirms its commitment to respecting the rules, to the clarity of the competitive framework, and to the stability of African competitions," the statement added.

Senegal's football authorities said they will appeal "as soon as

possible" to the Court of Arbitration for Sport.

"The Senegalese Football Federation condemns this unjust, unprecedented and unacceptable decision, which brings African football into disrepute," it said in a statement.

Chaotic scenes

Minutes before the end of the match, some Senegalese supporters attempted a pitch invasion, while Senegal's players halted the game for nearly 20 minutes to protest the late pen-

alty awarded to Morocco.

The controversial spot-kick was awarded by Congolese referee Jean-Jacques Ndala right at the end of the allotted eight added minutes in normal time following a VAR check for a challenge on Brahim Diaz by El Hadji Malick Diouf.

The game was goalless at the time and Diaz could have won the trophy for Morocco with the spot-kick in the 24th minute of added time at the end of normal time.

But Senegal goalkeeper

Edouard Mendy easily saved the weak attempted 'Panenka' chip by the Real Madrid winger, who was clearly distracted by the long delay that followed the penalty award.

The game at the Prince Moulay Abdellah Stadium then went to extra time, and Gueye's brilliant 94th-minute strike won it for Senegal.

Several of the team's players posted on social media after the announcement that they had been stripped of the title.

who plays for French club Lyon, posted a picture of himself lifting the Africa Cup of Nations trophy with a message that said "they're mad", in an apparent reference to CAF.

In the immediate aftermath of the final, FIFA president Gianni Infantino had condemned "some Senegal players" for the "unacceptable scenes".

"It is unacceptable to leave the field of play in this manner, and equally, violence cannot be tolerated in our sport, it is simply not right," Infantino, who attended the match, said.

In late January, CAF imposed a series of disciplinary sanctions, including fines amounting to several hundred thousand euros, on the federations of both countries for unsportsmanlike conduct and violations of fair play principles.

The appeal trial of 18 Senegalese supporters, imprisoned since the final and sentenced to prison terms ranging from three months to one year for "hooliganism," which was scheduled to take place on Monday, has been postponed until March 30.

The celebration that never came

A tasteless AFCON title for Morocco

Football is at its best in the heat of the moment, when victory is celebrated instantly on the pitch. Yet Morocco's 2025 Africa Cup of Nations title, awarded months after Senegal's 1-0 extra-time win was overturned, strips the sport of that immediacy. On Tuesday, CAF declared the Teranga Lions to have forfeited the final, handing Morocco the trophy on paper. On the field, however, the contest's authenticity and emotion were lost.

The rules are clear. Article 82 of the AFCON regulations states that a team leaving the pitch

without the referee's authorization can forfeit the match. During the final, Senegal's players walked off for about 15 minutes at the insistence of head coach Pape Thiaw after a late penalty was awarded to the Atlas Lions. Urged back by captain Sadio Mane, they completed the match and scored the winning goal in extra time. If a forfeit was justified, it should have been enforced immediately. Delaying the decision undermines the spirit of the contest and fuels long-standing criticism of African football governance.

The contrast between on-field action and off-field administration could not be sharper.

Brahim Diaz's missed Panenka drew scrutiny, yet Moroccan players endured the full 120 minutes. Had CAF applied the rule in real time, Morocco could have celebrated with fans, parades, and chants intact. Instead, the championship arrived administratively and awkwardly. In protest, Walid Regragui, who guided Morocco to the 2022 World Cup semi-finals, resigned before the ruling was announced.

This administrative title stands in stark contrast to Morocco's first AFCON triumph in 1976 in Ethiopia. Under Romanian coach Virgil Mardarescu, Morocco went unbeaten in a final four-team round-robin,

defeating Egypt and Nigeria before drawing with Guinea to seal the title. That victory was earned on the pitch, celebrated in real time, and remains a proud milestone in Moroccan football history.

Football shines brightest when triumph is earned on the field, not in boardrooms. Senegal, having completed the match and scored in extra time, was denied a rightful celebration and will continue to claim the trophy. Moroccans, meanwhile, are left with a title that feels hollow, its joy and immediacy lost. This championship is a reminder that football's beauty lies in the moments that unfold on the pitch.

Hala hold nerves to secure Premier Division survival

Al Hala secured their place in next season's Zain Bahrain Basketball League premier division on Tuesday night, edging Sitra 96-86 in a tense, winner-takes-all third game of the relegation play-off at Khalifa Sports City.

The result capped a dramatic series: Hala took the first leg 107-102 last Friday, only for Sitra to respond with a 104-92 victory on Monday, setting the stage for the decisive clash. From the outset, Hala imposed themselves physically, taking a 22-17 lead after the first quarter. Despite this, Sitra's talisman Austin Ajukwa continued to shine, scoring 22 points in the first half alone, as Hala's defenders repeatedly double- and triple-teamed him to try to contain his threat.

Late in the second quarter, Ali Mohsen briefly gave Sitra the lead, but Elijah Alon Love Robinson, who had signed and arrived just hours before the game, calmly sank two free throws to give Hala a 45-44 advantage at halftime. His instant impact set the tone for Hala's composed performance in the second half.

After the restart, Sitra surged into a six-point lead midway through the third quarter, following a Mohsen three-pointer. Yet Hala steadily wrested control back, with Ahmed Bindayneh's fast-break lay-up opening a 72-65 advantage. Sitra fought back to narrow the gap to two points heading into the final period, keeping the decider finely balanced.

In the fourth quarter, Binday-

neh delivered nine of his 20 points, including a five-point burst that restored Hala's lead. Elijah Love remained instrumental, while a contested three-pointer with just over two minutes remaining effectively sealed the game. Love finished

with 32 points, Abdulqader Thani added 25, Bindayneh contributed 20, and Nader Shaker chipped in 12 off the bench.

For Sitra, Ajukwa ended with 38 points on 10-of-29 shooting, while Mohsen and Dhaif Husain Dhaif added 19 and 15 points,

respectively. Ultimately, Hala's defensive discipline and timely scoring under pressure proved decisive, confirming their return to the premier division for 2026-27, while Sitra will remain in the second tier next season.

Bahrain Club clinches 25th Table Tennis League crown

Hassan Abdulrahim then came close to sealing the match, leading 2-0 and 8-5, but Al Ali produced a remarkable comeback to win 3-2 in the standout contest.

The decisive clash came between Rashid Sanad and Murtaadha Hussein, where Bahrain's captain secured a 3-1 victory, with set scores of 11-6, 10-12, 11-7 and 11-3.

The Bahrain Table Tennis Federation has postponed the trophy ceremony due to the national team's preparations for the upcoming World Cup in London, including participation in an international tournament in Tunisia.

BFA cancels youth competitions amid Gulf tensions

The Bahrain Football Association (BFA) has officially canceled all remaining youth competitions for the 2025-2026 season, in agreement with member clubs, due to the ongoing conflict in the Gulf and related safety concerns.

The decision follows Civil Defense Council directives prohibiting large gatherings and reflects strict adherence to precautionary measures. The

federation emphasized that protecting the health and safety of players, staff, and the broader sporting community is the top priority.

The federation expressed appreciation for the clubs' cooperation and understanding, stressing that this step balances public safety with the continued development of youth football, ensuring the well-being of all participants during this period of uncertainty.

Bahrain Beach Handball Set for Sanya

Both groups are expected to be highly competitive, with each match critical for qualification to the knockout stage.

The championship offers Bahrain a key opportunity to demonstrate the growth of its beach handball program while competing against Asia's leading teams in a major continental event.

Fernandez uncertain over Chelsea future after Champions League exit

Enzo Fernandez has suggested he could leave Chelsea at the end of the current season after the London club were knocked out of the Champions League.

With world club champions Chelsea currently sixth in the Premier League, they may yet fail to qualify for a place among European football's elite next term.

Argentina's Fernandez captained the Blues against PSG on Tuesday in the absence of the injured Reece James.

But the 25-year-old midfielder did little to end speculation he could be on his way out of Stamford Bridge, telling ESPN: "I don't know, there are eight games left and the FA Cup. There's the World Cup and then we'll see."

Fernandez, reflecting on Chelsea's latest loss to PSG, who put the tie to bed with two goals in the first 15 minutes at Stamford Bridge, added: "I think we failed to control the game. In the first leg, we lost focus in the final 15 minutes and conceded three goals, and here it happened at the very start.

"At this level, you can't concede two goals so quickly because of small details. Ultimately, over the two legs, PSG were the better side and deserve to go through. Since I arrived at Chelsea we have already passed through similar situations and we were able to turn them

around. Now, our focus must be on winning the FA Cup and achieving our goal of qualifying for next season's Champions League."

Eight-time FA Cup-winners Chelsea face third-tier Port Vale in the quarter-finals on April 4.
