Bangladesh reaches 484-9 on Day Two, extending dominance over Sri Lanka with record partnership

angladesh continued their dominance over Sri Lanka on the second day of the first test yesterday, finishing at a commanding 484 for nine -despite a few late breakthroughs by the hosts.

The Tigers resumed on 292 for three overnight and turned the screws on a batting-friendly wicket, with Mushfiqur Rahim and Najmul Hossain Shanto extending their record-breaking partnership.

The 264-run partnership finally ended when Shanto fell for 148, deceived in the air as he attempted to drive one.

Shanto's fluent innings was peppered with 15 boundaries and a six.

Mushfigur kept going with wicketkeeper Litton Das before finally falling for 163, a marathon for Sri Lanka with a brisk 90 hours and 350 balls.
