NHRA's Chief Executive Officer Mariam Adhbi Al Jalahma received yesterday Ziyad Janahi, representative of "Aegis Medical" and handed over to him a certificate approving the factory as licensed manufacturers of medical N95 and PLY3 medical face masks in the kingdom.
