Senegal stun hosts Morocco to win AFCON title after final walk-off protest

Senegal won the Africa Cup of Nations as Pape Gueye's extra-time winner sunk hosts Morocco 1-0 after a chaotic final that saw the eventual champions storm off the pitch late in the game.

Brahim Diaz could have won the trophy for Morocco with a controversial spot-kick in the 24th minute of added time at the end of normal time as ugly scenes broke out in the stands.

But Senegal goalkeeper Edouard Mendy easily saved the weak attempted 'Panenka' chip by the Real Madrid winger, who was clearly distracted by the long delay that followed the penalty award.

The game at the Prince Moulay Abdellah Stadium then went to extra time, and Gueye's brilliant 94th-minute strike handed them the title.

"We had a feeling of injustice. Just before the penalty we thought we should have had a goal and the referee didn't go to VAR," said match-winner Gueye, who added that Sadio Mane had urged the team to come back onto the pitch for the penalty.

"Sadio told us to come back on and we remobilised. Edouard then made the save, we stayed focused, got the goal and won the game."

The controversial penalty was awarded by Congolese referee Jean-Jacques Ndala right at the end of the allotted eight added minutes in normal time following a VAR check for a challenge on Diaz by El Hadji Malick Di-

ouf.

The Moroccan team vehemently protested to the referee to check the images, but the decision to eventually give the spot-kick was met with fury by Senegal and their fans.

As most of their players walked off the pitch, some Senegal supporters at the opposite end of the stadium threw chairs and other objects and attempted

to get onto the field of play.

They were eventually contained by a large barrier of police and stewards, and their anger turned to delight when the penalty was saved.

The Senegal team had initially been riled by the referee's decision to disallow for a foul a goal scored by Ismaila Sarr in the second added minute.

Diaz's penalty miss clearly galvanised Senegal, however, and they scored in the fourth minute of extra time to stun the crowd of 66,526.

Sadio Mane won possession in midfield and found Idrissa Gana Gueye, who released his namesake Pape Gueye.

The Villarreal midfielder advanced towards the box before beating goalkeeper Yassine Bounou with a superb strike into the top corner, leaving the hosts distraught.

Riffa Stun Cup Holders to Reach Final

Riffa booked their place in the Khalid Bin Hamad Cup final yesterday with a hard-fought 2-0 extra-time victory over holders Al Khaldiya at Khalifa Sports City Stadium. Samuel Toscas opened the scoring in the 102nd minute, and Sayed Hashim Isa sealed the win in the 110th, ensuring Riffa's dramatic progression to the final.

The match was tense from the outset, with both sides probing cautiously. Riffa created the clearest chances in the first half, with Rodrigo denied from point-blank range in the 33rd minute and Wellington's curling strike just missing the far post before halftime. Al Khaldiya, under coach Lassaad Chaabi, struggled to impose themselves, a challenge compounded when star midfielder Saifeddine Bouhra went off injured early on.

Riffa will now await the winner of today's second semi-final between Muharraq and Sitra, kicking off at 7pm at the same venue, with the Khalid Bin Hamad Cup final scheduled for Saturday.

CAF to take 'appropriate action' following chaotic AFCON final scenes

African football's governing body CAF said Monday "appropriate action" would be taken against "those found guilty" after chaotic scenes marred the final of the Africa Cup of Nations.

CAF though did not attribute blame to either Senegal or Morocco.

In Sunday's final, most of

the Senegalese players walked off in protest when referee Jean Jacques Mdala awarded hosts Morocco a penalty deep into time added on of normal time with the match tied at 0-0.

A group of their fans fought with Moroccan security personnel at the other end of the stadium in Rabat.

Once the players returned to the pitch, Senegal 'keep-

er Edouard Mendy saved the spot kick and Senegal went on to win 1-0 in extra time.

"The Confederation Africaine de Football (CAF) condemns the unacceptable behaviour from some players and officials during the CAF Africa Cup of Nations Morocco 2025 Final between Morocco and Senegal in Rabat last night," read their statement.

Muharraq Stung by Ittihad Comeback

Muharraq gave a valiant display in Jeddah yesterday but fell 91-87 to Ittihad Club in the 2025-26 FIBA WASL Gulf League, ending their Group A campaign with a hard-fought third-place finish. The defeat also allowed Ittihad to exact revenge for their earlier loss to the Red Wolves in the Group Phase.

The Red Wolves, missing key players Timmy Bond and Kerwin Roach due to injuries, started strongly and built a fourth-quarter lead of up to 14 points. Nick West was outstanding, tallying a game-high 28 points alongside 15 rebounds, 7 assists, and 3 steals, while Mahmood Khalifa added 16 points and 6 assists. Nadel Abdulrahim, Mohamed Juma, and Ali Rashed all contributed in double figures, keeping Muharraq competitive throughout.

Ittihad, however, mounted a furious late rally led by Erick Neal, who recorded his first FIBA WASL triple-double with 31 points, 10 rebounds, and 12 assists, along with 5 steals. Neal's heroics began with a clutch rebound of his own missed three-pointer with 4:23 remaining, followed by a floater that broke an 85-all deadlock in the closing minute. Jarell Eddie added a layup to

give Ittihad the edge, before Neal iced the game with two precise free throws with 12.5 seconds left. Neal scored 17 points in the fourth alone, completing a stunning comeback for the defending Saudi champions.

Coach Peter Schomers praised his team's resilience despite the loss. "I'm happy with the way we played," he said. "Of course, I'd be more happy with the win. But since this game didn't affect our po-

sition, I can take pride in how the boys fought."

With the Group Phase complete, Muharraq secured the no. 3 seed in Group A and will now prepare for the Qualification to Semi-Finals, which kicks off on February 2. The Red Wolves have shown that even when stretched, they remain a formidable force in the Gulf League, and Bahraini fans will be eager to see them return stronger for the next stage.
