Chelsea fight off Slavia

Pedro leads Chelsea into Europa League last four despite Slavia Prague scare

helsea were given a fright by Slavia Prague in a 4-3 home win on Thursday that saw them to a 5-3 aggregate victory and a place in the semi-finals of the Europa League.

Already 1-0 up from the first leg, Chelsea were cruising when they scored three more goals in the first 17 minutes at Stamford Bridge courtesy of Pedro, an own-goal by Simon Deli and Olivier Giroud and were 4-1 ahead on the night at half-time.

But having been facing a rout, the Czech visitors restored their pride with two early second-half goals from Petr Sevcik as they threatened a remarkable come-

Chelsea, however, held on and the London club will face Eintracht Frankfurt for a place in beat Benfica 2-0 to go through on away goals after the tie ended level at 4-4 after two legs.
