#### **Eid prayers to** be performed at Al Fateh Mosque

Eid Al Fitr prayers will be performed at Al Fateh Mosque, the Ministry of Justice, Islamic Affairs and Endowments has said.

However, the prayers will be limited to the imam and to a small number of people, in line with the precautionary measures taken by Bahrain to stem the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19).

The prayers will be broadcast live on television and on radio.


The decision to perform the prayers was taken based on the directives of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa to uphold the Islamic tradition.

Imams in other mosques will proclaim the traditional Eid takbeers (praise to Allah) that precede the prayers and sermons, but there will be no prayers.

Bahrain had shut down mosques as part of the preventive measures to mitigate the spread of the coronavirus through congregations.

Last month, it allowed the Friday prayers and the taraweeh prayers associated with the blessed month of Ramadan at Al Fateh Mosque.

The Eid prayers will be performed on Saturday or Sunday, depending on the sighting of the moon that marks the end of Ramadan, the ninth month on the lunar Islamic calendar based on the motion of the

The total number of people worldwide who have been confirmed to be infected with the coronavirus (COVID-19) is nearing five million.

As of early this morning, more than 4.94 million across the globe have contracted the disease, and more than 322,000 deaths have been recorded.

As the coronavirus outbreak eases in Western Europe and parts of the US, cases are rising steadily in Russia, which is now behind only the US in the number of reported infections.

he Ministry of Health announced yesterday that it had registered 348 new active cases of the coronavirus (COVID-19) in Bahrain.

This marked a steep increase in new cases, as compared to recent days.

From these, 233 are among expatriate workers, 114 are contacts of active cases and one is travel-related.

Their detection brought the total number of active cases in the Kingdom to 4,556. Nine of rest are stable.

## Medical robots aiding COVID-19 fight

Health Ministry trials use of AI-powered robots at coronavirus isolation, treatment centres

TDT | Manama

The Ministry of Health announced yesterday the use of new medical robots to help combat the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

Health Ministry undersecretary Dr. Waleed Al Manea revealed that this first-of its-kind experiment is being conducted in Bahrain's coronavirus isolation and treatment centres.

The Health Ministry intends to determine the benefits and extent of using Artificial Intelligence (AI) technology within Bahrain's healthcare system. Through these landmark trials, the ministry will assess their efficacy and study the need and scope for these smart robots to help support future work and services of health personnel.

The Health Ministry, in cooperation with a French company in the Kingdom, has provided two robots for the trial.

n official complaint has been filed under the Personal Data Protection Law (PDPL) by two expatriate residents against a man who verbally attacked them and filmed them without their

The PDPL, in effect since August 2019, protects individuals from unauthorised circulation of personal details on digital platforms.

A video has been circulating on social media since Friday in which the pair of Asians were shown to be victims of an unwarranted verbal attack directed at them by the accused man.

The man was seen in the video to be in his car while he filmed the two friends on their evening walk, with one of them also walking a pet dog.

The man, as can be heard in the video, yelled at the friends for not wearing facemasks during their excursion, as per government orders to help curb the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19) disease.

But according to one of the victims, they tried to explain to him that they were not wearing facemasks because they were out exercising, and the man would not listen while continuing his verbal attack.

As per Ministry of Health guidelines, citizens or residents who wish to exercise in public spaces are exempt from wearing masks.

The flight was part of the second wave of trips under the "Vande Bharat Mission" organised by the result, he was advised to undergo Kerala earlier this month, as part Indian government.





#### **Eskan Bank starts** returning April installments on housing loans

Eskan Bank said that it had started returning the April installments for all citizens with housing loans.

#### **US** auto plants get back to work after **COVID-19 halts**

T wo months after effectively freezing American auto manufacturing, Detroit's "Big Three" on Monday began to get back to business with masks, temperature checks and social distancing protocols to try to prevent coronavirus outbreaks.

Some hourly workers have expressed concerns about the risks of assembly line activity, where staff traditionally have worked side-by-side. But automakers say they will be able to work while practicing social distancing and taking other measures to protect workers.

The resumption brings a burst of fresh economic activity across states in the midwestern United States, a key swing area in the upcoming elections.

#### Australia watchdog suggests news boycott of Google, Facebook

Australia's competition watchdog suggested Tuesday that local media could organise a "collective boycott" of Google and Facebook to force the tech giants to pay for news they put on their platforms.

The radical idea was among a series of possible bargaining tools put forward by the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) as it considers a mandatory code of conduct for the tech firms.

Other mechanisms laid out in a 33-page "Concepts Paper" included bilateral negotiations between Australian media organisations and the two tech behemoths and collective bargaining involving all the country's news companies.

But acknowledging the global reach and immense power of Google and Facebook, it said an "alternative bargaining framework" could be needed if direct

"Amphan" is expected to pack winds gusting up to 185 kilometres (115 miles) per hour when it hits eastern India and Bangladesh today afternoon or evening, and with a storm surge of several metres, forecasters said.

Bangladesh authorities fear it will be the most powerful since cyclone Sidr devastated the country in 2007, killing about 3,500 people -- mostly due to a deluge of sea water sweeping in.

Junior disaster management minister Enamur Rahman said Tuesday that they have already evacuated several thousand people from low-lying areas.

"We will evacuate up to 2.2 million and try to keep casualties at zero," Rahman told AFP.

#### **Brazil jumps to** third in COVID-19 cases worldwide

 $\mathbf{B}^{ ext{razil has the third-high-}}$ coronavirus cases in the world, according to official figures released Monday, a troubling surge for a country struggling to respond to the pandemic.

With 254,220 confirmed cases, Brazil has now surpassed Britain, Spain and Italy in the past 72 hours on the list of total infections, and is behind only the United States (1.5 million) and Russia (290,000).

Brazil has registered 16,792 COVID-19 deaths, the sixth-highest toll in the world.

But experts say under-testing means the real figures could be 15 times higher or more.

The giant South American country of 210 million people is torn by a political battle over how to respond to the virus.

Far-right President Jair Bolsonaro compares the virus to a "little flu," condemns the "hysteria" surrounding it and is urging the country to get back to work to stop an economic crash.

#### **Puppy** scammers target **lonely Aussies** during lockdown



Australia is suffering a wave of puppy scams as fraudsters target the lonely and locked down with fake online offers of cavoodles, French bulldogs and other popular pooches,

authorities said. The consumer watchdog ACCC said the scammers fleeced people looking for a new pet out of some Aus\$300,000 (US\$196,000) in April alone, five times higher than the normal monthly average.



**President Donald Trump on Monday** made the surprise announcement that he is taking hydroxychloroquine, an anti-malaria drug that his own government experts say is not suitable for fighting the novel coronavirus. Trump,

noting that he has tested negative for the virus and shows no symptoms, said he'd been taking the drug as a preventative measure for about a week and a half. "I take a pill every day," he said, adding that he combines this with zinc. Asked why, he said: "Because I think it's good. I've heard a lot of good stories." House Speaker Nancy Pelosi said it's "not a good idea" for Trump to be taking the drug as a potential treatment for the coronavirus. "I would rather he not be taking something that has not been approved by the scientists, especially in his age group and in his, shall we say, weight group, which is morbidly obese, they say," Pelosi said during an appearance on CNN's "Anderson Cooper 360." "So, I think that it's not a good idea," she added.

Brazil re-enlisted more than 150 Cuban doctors Monday to help fight a surge in coronavirus cases, a year and a half after Havana ended a medical assistance program over a row with President Jair Bolsonaro. The doctors, who had opted to stay in Brazil after the Cuban government pulled the plug on the program that sent them, received new medical licenses from the Brazilian health ministry under a program to round up reinforcements for the overstretched health system.

President Vladimir Putin was forced to intervene personally on Monday in the epidemic sweeping Russia's North Caucasus region of Dagestan, as local officials described the coronavirus situation as a "catastrophe." For several days now, there have rumours of mounting fatalities and overwhelmed hospitals in the mountainous majority-Muslim region and local medical staff have taken to social media to make frantic appeals.

ndonesia on Tuesday called for Saudi Arabia to decide if it will allow the annual Islamic pilgrimage to Mecca, after the coronavirus pandemic plunged the ritual into doubt.

Last year around 2.5 million faithful travelled to Saudi Arabia from across the world to take part in the "hajj", which all Muslims must perform at least once in their lives if able.

The year-round "umrah" pilgrimage was suspended in March, while Saudi Arabia asked Muslims to temporarily defer preparations during the COVID-19 outbreak.

But Saudi authorities have yet to announce whether they will proceed with this year's hajj, which takes place at the end of July.

Indonesia's religious affairs ministry said a decision should be made before the fasting month of Ramadan ends this weekend.

"We hope the official decision on whether hajj will go ahead or be cancelled will be announced soon," ministry spokesman Oman Fathurahman told AFP Tuesday.

Indonesia is the world's biggest Muslim-majority nation and at least 231,000 of its citizens were registered to take part in this year's pilgrimage -- the largest contingent of any nation.

But Indonesia has held off confirming housing, transportation and other contracts with Saudi travel authorities, Fathurahman

"Until now the Ministry of Religious Affairs has yet to sign any contracts or pay the down payment for hajj services in Saudi Arabia," he added.

The pilgrimage is a key revenue earner for the kingdom but risks becoming a major source of contagion if pilgrims flock to Mecca's religious sites.

Eight Afghan soldiers were killed on Tuesday while repelling a fierce Taliban attack on Kunduz, a strategic city in northern Afghanistan that had briefly fallen to the militants twice in the past, officials said. Taliban fighters attacked several



government posts on the outskirts of the city at around 1:00 am, a defence ministry statement said, triggering heavy fighting. "With the support of air force their attack was repelled," it said, adding the fighting lasted for several hours. Putin signed a decree reinstating Mishustin as the head of government, nearly three weeks after the prime minister announced on television he had tested positive for coronavirus. Mishustin checked himself into hospital and his deputy was named interim prime minister, but he continued to participate in meetings via video-link wearing a suit and tie. The 54-year-old former tax chief was appointed prime minister in a surprise government shake-up earlier this year but had little time to make an impact before the coronavirus pandemic hit.

British lawmakers yesterday heaped fresh pressure on the government for its handling of the coronavirus outbreak, calling its testing regime "inadequate" in the early stages. Prime Minister Boris Johnson has been criticised for his



initial response to the global pandemic, and has faced weeks of pressure about the availability of tests for the virus. The country has seen 34,796 deaths -- the secondhighest toll in the world behind the United States -- and 246,406 cases, according to the latest figures. But despite a recent surge in daily tests and the expansion of eligibility, MPs on a parliamentary committee said: "Testing capacity has been inadequate for most of the pandemic so far."

A 74-year-old immigrant who had pleaded to be released from a detention facility in California for fear of contracting COVID-19 died by suicide at the weekend, officials said on Monday. Choung Won Ahn, who suffered from diabetes, hypertension and heart ailments, was found dead late Sunday at the Mesa Verde Detention Facility located in Bakersfield, some two hours north of Los Angeles.

orld Health Organisation member states agreed yesterday to launch an investigation into its coronavirus response, after US President Donald Trump threatened to quit the UN agency and branded it a "puppet of China".

Trump has been locked in a bitter spat with Beijing, alleging it covered up the initial COV-ID-19 outbreak in central China late last year before the disease unleashed death and economic devastation across the planet.

Under pressure at home in the United States, which has far more deaths and cases than any other country, Trump has also targeted the WHO with accusations that it failed to do enough to combat the initial spread of

"They're a puppet of China, they're China-centric to put it nicer," he said at the White House on Monday, before threatening to make permanent a temporary freeze on US funding to the body.

Beijing, in turn, accused Trump of trying to "smear" China and shirking American responsibilities to the WHO.

With the row threatening the global response to the pandemic, WHO countries adopted a resolution calling for an "impartial, independent and comprehensive evaluation" of the international response and the measures taken by the agency.

Both the United States and China voted for the resolution tabled by the European Union at the WHO's annual assembly, despite earlier fears that the tensions might make a full consensus impossible.

More than 318,000 people have died of COVID-19 out of over 4.8 million infections worldwide since its emergence, and governments are scrambling to contain the virus while seeking ways to resuscitate their economies.







#### **Baby boom: Indonesia faces** virus-driven spike in births



About 4.8 million babies are born annually in Indonesia, a country of more than 260 million Jakarta

Tndonesia is facing a baby boom that could see more than 400,000 unplanned pregnancies as coronavirus lockdowns cut access to birth control, the national family planning agency said Tuesday.

Small health clinics have been temporarily shuttered while doctors and midwives are limiting patient numbers since the Southeast Asian nation implemented a partial lockdown last month to prevent the spread of COVID-19

That has made it more difficult for Indonesians to access birth control, the agency said.

By early next year, Indonesia -- the world's fourth most populous country -- could see 420,000 more babies born than would otherwise be expected, the agency estimated.

The figure is based on 10 percent of its 28 million member nationwide family planning practice having trouble getting birth control. About 4.8 million babies are born annually in Indonesia, a country of more than 260 million.

#### **Endangered Sumatran tiger found** dead in Indonesia



A Sumatran tiger has been found dead in an apparent case of poaching. Indonesian authorities said Tuesday, underscoring the threats to the survival of the critically endangered species. The 18-month-old male's decomposing body was found on Monday with its leg caught in a trap near a palm oil plantation in Sumatra's Riau province. "It had already been dead for several days when the team found it," said local conservation agency head Suharyono, who like many Indonesians goes by one name. "We concluded it was intentional because the hunter tied a pig carcass to the trap in order to attract and kill the tiger."

#### **Button shocked Vettel will not be at** Ferrari next season

Former world champion Jenson Button says he is shocked Sebastian Vettel will not drive for Ferrari next season and that it would be "madness" if the team had pushed him

Ferrari said last week that four-times world champion Vettel would leave them at the end of the 2020 season. after talks on a new contract ended without a deal.

They then replaced the German with Spaniard Carlos Sainz to race alongside Charles Leclerc.

German media had reported that Vettel, who won 14 races with Ferrari and is their third-most successful driver, had rejected a one-year extension with a reduced salary but the 32-year-old said financial matters played no part in the joint decision.

"If he was pushed, for me it's madness," Button, the 2009 world champion, told Sky Sports.

Ole Gunnar Solskjaer's side are set to resume small group training on Wednesday as Premier League clubs step up the "Project Restart" plan to finish

But all 92 remaining matches will have to be played in front of empty stands due to the pandemic, leading United to activate a refund or rebate to ticket holders for their remaining home fixtures.

If the Premier League get their wish to play at clubs' normal stadiums rather than at neutral venues, then United will have four home league matches to play.

Aware of the danger of supporters gathering in large groups during the health crisis, United have pleaded with their fans to stay away from matches and watch on television.
