

His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa yesterday took part in the 32nd Arab Summit in the Red Sea coastal city of Jeddah, alongside Arab leaders who welcomed Syrian President Bashar al-Assad back into the fold.

It was the first time Assad had appeared at the Arab League since Syria was suspended in 2011. The summit also featured a

surprise appearance by Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky. His visit was his first to the Middle East since Moscow's invasion in February 2022.

In his address, HM King expressed his commitment to advancing joint Arab action, welcoming the restoration of diplomatic relations between Saudi Arabia and Iran, the ongoing humanitarian truce in Yemen, and Syria's return to the Arab League.
