# Kiwis compound Proteas woes

Kane Williamson rides luck to guide New Zealand to narrow World Cup win over South Africa

Williamson leads from front in tight run chase at Edgbaston as Proteas edge even closer to World Cup exit door

ane Williamson anchored New Zealand to a tense four-wicket victory at Edgbaston yesterday after an astonishing stroke of luck when South Africa failed to review an edge from the Kiwi captain.

The Black Caps' skipper was on 76 when he got a faint edge to a ball by leg-spinner Imran Tahir that Quinton de Kock took behind the stumps but South Africa took no action.

That decision could prove fatal to their tournament hopes, with the Proteas now needing a miracle to progress to the semi-finals after just one win from six matches, while New Zealand now top the 10-team table.

Earlier, Martin Guptill, who had been guiding New Zealand towards their target of 242 off a rain-reduced 49 overs with a minimum of fuss, trod on his stumps to spark a mini collapse.

The batsman, on 35, pulled Andile Phehlukwayo and ended up swivelling, stump with his foot.

Two overs later New Zealand slipped at 80-4. to 74-3 when Ross Taylor tickled a Chris

## Today's match **Australia vs Bangladesh**

Trent Bridge - Nottingham

Australia have won four of their five matches at the World Cup so far, bouncing back from defeat to India by beating Pakistan and Sri Lanka in their last two games. Bangladesh have won two matches so far and lost two others, with one match rained off - they chased 322 to beat West Indies by seven wickets last time out. The Tigers boast the World Cup's leading run-scorer so

far - Shakib Al Hasan having scored two centuries and two 50s on his way to 384 runs in four innings.

### Australia

Australia have won four of their five matches so far at the World Cup 2019, with their only defeat coming in their third game when they lost to India.

They made a winning start against Afghanistan, after bowling them out for 207, and then had Mitchell Starc's five-wicket haul to thank as they defended 288 in a 15-run win against West Indies.

Defeat to India followed - falling for 316 in reply to 352/5 - but Australia have passed 300 in both matches since and won each of them, 307 proved 41 runs too many for Pakistan in the first, as they got back to winning ways, before Aaron Finch's superb 153 powered them to 334/7 and an 87-run win against Sri Lanka.

### Bangladesh

Bangladesh won their opening match of the tournament against South Africa, posting 330/6 and holding on to win

The Tigers lost their next two, posting 244 in a two-wicket loss to New Zealand, before then falling for 280 in reply to England's 386/6 in Cardiff.

They bounced back in style, however, as Shakib Al Hasan's second consecutive century led a huge chase of 322 to beat West Indies by seven wickets in just 41.3 overs last time out.
