Health minister warned people in Bahrain yesterday that the coronavirus infection could spike again if the behaviours don't change. Bahrain has reported a sudden spike in COVID-19 cases, according to the National Medical Taskforce for Combating the

Coronavirus, particularly in the past two weeks. The task force has said that people here have allowed themselves to get into such a predicament with the "non-compliance fo precautionary guidelines during Ashura holidays." This resulted in a distressing spike in the caseloads over the

Faeqa bint Said Al-Saleh said that such "irresponsible" behaviours if continued, would only result in triggering a surge in the infections while warning that the "pandemic is far from over". Those who "failed to comply with mandatory procedures, caused the infections to surge
