Awareness sessions held on voluntary retirement scheme

he Information and eGovernment Authority (iGA) briefed iGA staff on the Voluntary Retirement Scheme, a one-off initiative launched as part of Bahrain's Fiscal Balance Programme.

During the briefing - which took place at iGA's branches of Muharraq, Isa Town and Juffair - iGA's Acting Director of Human and Financial Resources, Mohamed Jasim Sayyar, outlined the criteria for the scheme and neurship as well as participation in the private sector.

years of service is one of the criteria for being considered for the **Voluntary Retirement** Scheme.

The briefing followed a directive issued by the Civil Service Bureau instructing government departments to begin impleits role in encouraging entreprementing the Voluntary Retirement Scheme. The scheme provides eligible participants with 2018.

early access to end-of-service packages and incentives consistent with existing laws and regulations, including access to a cash sum equal to five years' additional service, end-of-service increments for that eligible and end-of-service indemnity.

Participants must have completed ten years of service in the public sector and cannot be working in a senior position.

Measures are in place to ensure that the Voluntary Retirement Scheme will not affect public sector functions.

Registration for the scheme will be open until November 8,
