"The regional office will be the second of its kind as the first was opened in Seoul", said Bahrain Chamber for Dispute Resolution Chief Executive Officer Professor Nassib G. Ziadé.

## Take firm stance against Iran, Saudi asks Arab League

Saudi Arabia yesterday asked fellow Arab nations to take a "serious and honest" stand against Iran, saying that showing leniency toward Tehran would only encourage it to press on with its "aggression" and "meddling" in the internal affairs of Arab countries, the Associate Press reported yesterday.

Addressing a meeting of Arab foreign ministers in Cairo, Saudi Foreign Minister Adel Al-Jubeir said the pan-Arab organization needed to take a decision to be "non-compromising" in dealing with Iran.

He cited a ballistic missile fired by Iranian-backed rebels in Yemen earlier this month that was intercepted near the Saudi capital, Riyadh, as an example of how far Iran has gone with its aggressive policy in the region.

"Showing leniency toward Iran will not leave any Arab capital safe from those ballistic missiles," he said.

"We are obliged today to take a serious and honest stand... to counter these belligerent policies so that we can protect our security," said Al-Jubeir.

The Saudi Foreign Minister said his country was targeted by a total of 80 ballistic missiles fired by Yemen's Iranian-backed Shiite militia since the Kingdom in 2015 led a coalition to fight them alongside the internationally recognized government there.

Saudi Arabia, he added, will not stand idly by in the face of Iran's "blatant aggression."

## **Hezbollah controlling Lebanon: FM**

Foreign Minister Sheikh Khalid bin Ahmed Al-Khalifa yesterday said that Lebanon is under the "total control" of the Iran-backed Hezbollah.

"The Lebanese Republic, in spite of our relations with it as a brotherly Arab nation... is under the total control of this terrorist party," said Sheikh Khalid at the Arab League meeting called by Riyadh,



referring to Hezbollah. "Iran's biggest arm in the region at the moment is the terrorist Hezbollah arm," he said. (See also Page 5)

An MP has proposed imposition of a new fee on foreign remittances "as part of the ongoing efforts to save the Bahraini economy".

MP Jamal Dawood submitted the proposal to the House of Representatives' Speaker's office recently, instructing to impose BD1 fees on remittances below BD300 and BD10 for all money transfers exceeding the amount of BD300.

"Because of the continually deteriorating economic conditions in the past few years, such as the drop in the international crude oil prices, Bahrain's economy has been impacted hard. This law, if implemented, would pump at least BD90 million into the state exchequer, helping it to recover from the effects of the oil price fall," Dawood told DT News yesterday, justifying his proposal.

"BD1 isn't a big burden on any expat's personal budget. The number of expatriates in Bahrain is close to one million now. This small amount taken from each one of them while remitting money abroad would sure contribute to the revival of the national economy," Dawood said.

When asked about the growing general feel of "being over-burdened by fees" among expatriates in Bahrain, the legislator said, "Citizens and residents should stick together

during these hard times to maintain the Kingdom's economic pain. All should support the economy and work to protect. These trifle amounts will not impact them much, but would greatly serve the national economy."

MP Dawood explained that the bill, as per the council's bylaws, would be referred to the Legislative and Legal Affairs Committee and the Financial and Economic Committees in the council before the House could vote on it.

A similar proposal was passed by the council last year, despite several reservations from some MPs and the Central Bank of Bahrain. The previous proposal stipulated charging 0.5 to one per cent of each remittance made from Bahrain. However, it reached nowhere as the second branch of the Legislative Authority, Shura Council, rejected it. Recent data have showed that around BD2.5 billion is annually transferred from Bahrain by expatriate workers abroad.

## Won't launch nuke if Trump's order Illegal: Nuclear General

he top U.S. nuclear commander has said that he would resist President Donald Trump if he ordered an "illegal" launch of nuclear weapons.

Air Force General John Hyten, commander of the U.S. Strategic Command (STRATCOM), told an audience at the Halifax International Security Forum in Nova Scotia, Canada that he had given a lot of thought to what he would say if he received such an order.

"I think some people think we're stupid," Hyten said in response to a question about such a scenario. "We're not stupid people. We think about these things a lot. When you have this responsibility, how do you not think about it?"

Hyten, who is responsible for overseeing the U.S. nuclear arsenal, explained the process that would follow such a command. As head of STRATCOM "I provide advice to the president, he will tell me what to do," he said in his remarks, retransmitted in a video posted on the forum's Facebook page.



"And if it's illegal, guess what's going to happen? I'm going to say, 'Mr. President, that's illegal.' And guess what he's going to do? He's going to say, 'What would be legal?' And we'll come up with options, of a mix of capabilities to respond to whatever the situation is, and that's the way it works. It's not that complicated.'

Hyten said running through scenarios of how to react in the event of an illegal order was standard practice, and added: "If you execute an unlawful order, you will go to jail. You could go to jail for the rest of your life." The Pentagon did not immediately respond to a request for comment on Hyten's remarks.

They came after questions by U.S. senators, including Democrats and Trump's fellow Republicans, about Trump's authority to wage war, use nuclear weapons and enter into or end international agreements, amid concern that tensions over North Korea's nuclear and missile programs could lead to hostilities.

Trump has traded threats with North Korea's Kim Jong Un and threatened in his maiden United Nations address to "totally destroy" the country if it threatened the United States.- Reuters

# Retailers hoarding cigarettes ahead of duty hike

Retailers are hoarding cigarettes in anticipation of a duty hike, leading to a sudden drought of the product in the local market.

According to officials, shops are storing but refraining from selling cigarettes to the public as the country is bracing for imposing taxes on tobacco products as well as energy and carbonated drinks.

Once imposed, the taxes will double cigarette prices in the market with an average of BD2 per pack, according to a recent study by the Financial and Economic Affairs Committee in the House of Representatives.

As the implementation of the new duty nears, cigarette stock has been decreasing in local shops, with some brands actually disappearing from markets' shelves.

It was officially confirmed yesterday that some vendors are refraining from selling the cigarettes, with the aim to make a few quick bucks once the duty is imposed, cashing in on the lower prices they bought their stocks (average of BD1).

Consumer Protection Directorate in Industry, Commerce and Tourism Ministry vesterday announced that it has seized "21 stores that have been



proven to store and refrain from selling cigarettes to the public" and took the required legal and administrative procedures against, and referred their owners to the Public Prosecution.

"This action comes in the context of the directorate's legal obligation to prevent monopoly and collusion in accordance with the Consumer Protection Law 35 of 2012 and in particular Chapter 4 concerning competition and monopoly controls and violations," a statement issued yesterday by the directorate mentioned.

"Storing any product or refraining from selling it, attempting to exploit any emergency or exceptional circumstances will be legally addressed, in order to

prevent such practices that may extend to any strategic commodity. Such behaviours will not be tolerated," the directorate has stressed in its statement.

DT News reported last week that the country is one step away from imposing its first taxes, as both branches of the Legislative Authority approved a bill to join the unified GCC agreement on selective taxation.

The bill introduces 100 percent taxes on tobacco products and energy drinks, and a 50 percent tax on soft

It was passed on October 12 to the Government, which is expected to refer it to His Majesty the King for final ratification as a new law in the next few weeks.

## Court rejects appeal of man who assaulted his ex-wife

The Second High Criminal Court (court of appeals) yesterday rejected the appeal of a Bahraini man who was sentenced last month to one year of imprisonment for physically attacking his ex-wife.

As reported by DT News last September, the 52-year-old brutally attacked his 32-yearold Syrian ex-wife and mother of his five children at their home in Jeblat Habshi.

He reportedly punched her in the face several times, banged her head on the wall and beat her with a piece of tile on her head.

The woman was kept under medical observation for a couple of weeks, while her children were taken to Dar Al Aman shelter for Domestic Violence Victims.

She was diagnosed with concussion, hemorrhage and severe bruises and inflammations on the face and other parts of her body.




According to the victim, she was attacked by her ex-husband following 10 years of marriage because "he wanted to marry a younger Bahraini woman who is an employee and will spend on him".

The case made a huge impact on the Bahraini society, raising more concerns over domestic violence in the Kingdom and the means to combat it.

Northern Governorate Prosecution Head Mohammed Salah yesterday confirmed that the court rejected the man's appeal and upheld the previously issued verdict.

# Iran is the real threat to

Cairo

Iran poses a serious threat to the region, Minister of Foreign Affairs Shaikh Khalid bin Ahmed bin Mohammed Al Khalifa told Arab League's extraordinary session yesterday, pointing out that the missile that targeted Riyadh was not the first attack on Saudi Arabia by parties operating in favour of Iran in the region such as the Houthis.

The meeting at the headquarters of the Arab League in Cairo was held to discuss ways to address Iranian interference in the internal affairs of Arab states.

The Foreign Minister added that the bombing of an

oil pipeline in the Kingdom of Bahrain was not the first attack, but comes as part of a series of long attacks that cost the Kingdom of Bahrain thousands security men and citizens, and all those crimes were perpetrated by Iranian agents in the region.

Shaikh Khalid warned that there is a serious escalation of Iranian practices in the region, which puts everyone in front of a great responsibility, which is the responsibility of maintaining Arab national security through the only mechanism, the mechanism of ioint Arab action.

"Iran is not only fighting directly from its coasts, where it is conducting smuggling operations and many other activities, but it has many arms in the region," Shaikh Khalid said, adding that Iran's biggest arm in the region is Hezbollah's terrorist wing, which is located in the Lebanese Republic, the Republic of Iraq and the Syrian Arab Republic among other places.

"Iran is the great challenge to the Arab national security, which is exposed to a state that is trying to clearly overthrow and control countries, and does not hesitate to take any action to reach this goal," Shaikh Khalid said

He pointed out that everyone bears responsibility, and that the Lebanese Republic, which is a brotherly Arab country



that is loved and appreciated, is under full control of the terrorist Hezbollah, which is not only targeting acts within the borders of Lebanon, but crosses the borders to all Arab

"We must be clear in this regard, we do not talk about Arab differences, we talk about threats to us all, and if we do not take this issue seriously, we will be deficient," Shaikh Khalid said.

The Foreign Affairs Minister expressed hope that joint Arab action will be more effective in establishing security and stability in the region and in maintaining Arab national

# Women Empowerment awards to be announced on Wednesday

The winners of Her Royal Highness Princess Sabeeka bint Ibrahim Al-Khalifa Award for Bahraini Women Empowerment will be announced on Wednesday.

A ceremony will be held under the auspices of Her Royal Highness Princess Sabeeka bint Ibrahim Al-Khalifa, Wife of His Majesty the King and Supreme Council for Women (SCW) to honour the 2017 winners

The 5th edition will acknowledge the landmark strides achieved by Bahraini women in the public and private sectors and growing participation in the national development endeavour. Bahrain embarked on a wideranging strategy to empower

women and facilitate their economic integration to play their role in the development march on the basis of equal opportunities and bridge gender gaps.

Launched in 2006, HRH Princess Sabeeka bint Ibrahim Al-Khalifa Award for Bahraini Women Empowerment has had a positive impact on institutions in the Kingdom of Bahrain. According to latest statistics, the rate of women's participation in public sector enterprises increased by 11 per cent in ten years to top 49pc in 2016, up from 38pc in 2006.

As for the private sector, the rate of women's participation increased by 9pc to top 33pc up from 24pc of the overall workforce.

The rate of women's participation in the high managerial positions rose to 45pc, compared with 59pc for medium managerial positions. The number of sponsors of the award soared by 123pc to top 77 in 2016, up from 30 in 2006, which reflects the impact of the prize in promoting corporate culture to integrate women's needs and foster gender equal

pportunities.

The commitment to set up equal opportunities committees also soared from 38pc in 2011 to 95pc last year. The companies which took part in the contest or won the award achieved strides in incorporating the principles of equal opportunities and the integration of women's needs in their strategies.

## **Bahrain to participate in Universal Children's Day**

The Labour and Social Development Ministry underlined Bahrain's annual participation in the celebration marking the Universal Children's Day and the World Day for the Prevention of Child Abuse which are observed on November 19 and 20, in line with a recommendation by the United Nations General Assembly in 1954.

The event is considered as an opportunity to re-assert the need to prevent violence against children and provide them with a secure environment for their upbringing by shedding light on main programmes and challenges and taking the necessary procedures to protect the children's interest and promote their welfare

# 72 participants in Bahrain's first speedcubing competition

The first Speedcubing Competition to take place in Bahrain, the Bahrain Open 2017, was inaugurated by Eman Hussain, Assistant Undersecretary of the Ministry and Juzer Rupawala, the Regional Director of the Lulu Hypermarket on Saturday.

Held at the Ramli Mall, A'ali, the day-long event has attracted 72 participants who competed against each other to set a speed record in unscrambling the Rubik's Cube, a twisty puzzle of different colours that have to be aligned colour-wise in the

least possible time. The event is recognised by the World Cube Association (WCA), a non-profit organization that regulates all speedcubing competitions all over the world,

Participants represented at least 16 nationalities: Bahrain, India, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Argentina, Egypt, USA, New Zealand, China, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Syria, Lebanon and the Palestinian Territories.

The competition has 5 events: Rubik's Cube (3x3x3), 2x2x2, 4x4x4, 3x3x3 One-Handed, Pyraminx (a pyramid-shaped puzzle). Each competitor got 5 attempts to solve the puzzle. The average was then calculated by eliminating the fastest and slowest solve. Competitors are then ranked based on their average.

The contest was for three kinds of WCA-recognised records: National Records, Continental Records, and World Records for both single and average times.

"Brain stimulation games such as this, is something Lulu Hypermarket always encourages. We are happy that this first Bahrain event was held in Ramli Mall." said Regional Director Juzer Rupawala, "We invite other such organisations to join us and promote these mindchallenging games and activities throughout the Kingdom."

## Search for missing sub fails to find any clues

vast search by Avast search o, multinational task force for an Argentinian submarine that went missing in the South Atlantic with 44 crew members four days ago has so far failed to provide any clues as to its possible location.

The hope that arose from seven failed satellite calls detected Saturday morning, which Argentina's defence ministry at first said could be from the missing submarine, is also dimming fast. The government said yesterday said it cannot confirm that the attempts came from the ARA

"Regrettably, we have not yet had any contact with the submarine," Argentinian navy spokesman Enrique Balbi said yesterday morning. The satellite call attempts were registered between 9am and 3pm on Saturday, lasting between four and 36 seconds. but there was no voice contact. "There were seven attempts with a very weak signal that failed to connect," the officer said. "We are trying to squeeze that information to obtain some concrete data and a geolocation."

Argentina's defence ministry said it was working on tracing the location of the calls with

an unnamed US company that specialized in satellite

The families of the ARA San Juan's crew are deeply distressed, and urged the

government to clarify the situation. "We want the government to confirm if the calls were from the submarine," said Claudio Rodríguez, brother of crew member Hernán Rodríguez, who was travelling yesterday from his home in the western province of Mendoza to the submarine's home port in Mar del Plata to join other relatives gathering there in desperate search of

A total of 13 ships and six aeroplanes are braving strong winds and high waves over an area of 66,000 sq km (25,500 sq miles) more than 400 km (250 miles) east of the bay of San

Jorge off the coast of Patagonia in southern Argentina.

The Argentinian navy lost radio contact with the San Juan after its last scheduled transmission on Wednesday morning. It was on a 10-day voyage from Argentina's southernmost port, Ushuaia, to the naval base at Mar del Plata, 400km (250 miles) south of Buenos Aires.

Argentina's navy said it was not sure what happened to the submarine or why it lost contact but that it was now convinced the ship was beneath the surface and not adrift on choppy seas, as was previously thought. (The Guardian)

## IS militants defeated in final stronghold



he Syrian army and its allies The Syrian army and the took complete control over Albu Kamal, Islamic State's last significant town in Syria, a military news service run by Hezbollah said yesterday.

The army had declared victory over Islamic State in Albu Kamal earlier this month but the jihadists then staged a counter-attack using sleeper cells hidden in the town.

Driving Islamic State from Albu Kamal means only a few villages along the Euphrates and patches of nearby desert, as well as isolated pockets in other parts of the country, remain in Syria of the caliphate it declared in 2014.

Most of the forces battling Islamic State in Syria and Iraq have said they expect it to go underground and turn to a guerrilla insurgency using sleeper cells and bombings.

Western intelligence agencies have said it will still be able to inspire attacks on civilians around the world.

"The Syrian Army and its allies in the axis of resistance have expelled Daesh from its last stronghold on Syrian soil," the Hezbollah news service reported.

The "axis of resistance" is used by those in it to describe the alliance of Iran, Syria and Shi'ite militias including Hezbollah.

The British-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said on Sunday that most IS members withdrew from the town, with fighting continuing in the perimeter of Albu Kamal.

Islamic State's area of rule in Syria has crumbled this year under two rival military campaigns.

The Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) alliance of Kurdish and Arab militias, backed by a U.S.-led coalition has driven it from much of its territory in the north, including its former Syrian capital Raqqa.

Syria's army and its allies have waged an offensive across central and eastern Syria backed by Russian air and missile power.

The two offensives have mostly avoided conflict with each other through communication between the United States and Russia. However, Syrian and Iranian officials have said that Damascus seeks to regain control over areas held by the SDF. (Reuters)

# Palestine 'to cut US ties' over office

he Palestinians will freeze their ties with the US if it follows through on a threat to close the Palestine Liberation Organisation's office in Washington, a senior PLO official warned.

The surprise American  $move \, and \, Palestinian \, backlash$ came as US President Donald Trump seeks bargaining chips in his bid to broker an elusive Israeli-Palestinian peace deal.

Trump has a 90-day window to avert the closure if he deems progress has been made.

PLO Secretary General Saeb Erekat said his organisation had officially told Washington that "we would put on hold all our communications with this American administration" if the office were closed.

The PLO, which the international community sees as representing all Palestinians, must have its permission to operate its premises in the American capital renewed every six months.

Palestinian foreign minister Rivad al-Malki said it was the first time since the 1980s that the State Department had refused to renew it.

Malki said Palestinian officials had received a letter from Washington "saying that the Secretary of State had not found enough reasons to keep the office

"This has not happened the past, and we have



demanded clarifications from the State Department and the White House," he said.

"They told us that there would be a meeting of senior legal experts on Monday. Then they would give a clear answer," he said, adding that Palestinian leaders would then meet to discuss their response.

A US State Department official cited "certain statements made by Palestinian leaders" about the International Criminal Court as the reason behind the nonrenewal.

president Palestinian Mahmoud Abbas, in his latest speech at the UN General Assembly, suggested taking the issue of Israeli settlements

to the ICC.

2015 In Congress issued a resolution barring Palestinians from seeking to wield influence over the ICC regarding investigations into Israeli nationals.

president Palestinian Mahmoud Abbas was "deeply surprised" by the State Department's move, his spokesman Nabil Abu Rudeina said in remarks carried by official Palestinian news agency WAFA on Saturday.

He said the decision represents an unprecedented step in the history of the Palestinian-American relationship, and has dangerous consequences for the peace process and the

American-Arab relations."

It "represents a blow to attempt to build peace", he

The State Department official said Trump had 90 days to decide whether to waiver the decision if he deems "the Palestinians have entered into direct, meaningful negotiations with

The peace process has been deadlocked since April 2014 following the collapse of indirect negotiations led by then US secretary of state John Kerry.

The office of Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said the decision was "a matter of US law." (AFP)

audi Arabia plans to Simpose a 5 per cent value added tax on gasoline from January 1, 2018, the Saudi tax department said on one of its Twitter accounts.

The announcement on a special VAT Twitter account set up by the General Authority of Zakat and Tax came in response to a question from a Saudi citizen.

"The VAT rate of five per cent for petrol will be applied starting January 1, 2018," GAZT said.

The previous week the authority had indicated the local transport of passengers and goods within Saudi

Arabia, and associated services would be subject to the standard 5 per cent VAT rate, with businesses collecting the tax from travellers upon purchasing the travel ticket.

However, it said that the international transport of passengers and goods will be zero-rated according to the Unified VAT Agreement for the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) and the VAT Implementing Regulations. Separately the kingdom is

also said to be working on a mechanism for fuel price increases that could take effect by the end of the year.

New details of the value added tax, set to be

implemented in both the UAE and Saudi from next year, are being revealed in both countries ahead of implementation.

Âll Arabian Gulf countries have committed to implement the Unified Agreement for Value Added Tax, but nations are moving at different paces of implementation, raising doubt about the possibility of a harmonious introduction of the levy. According to PwC each GCC state establishes its own separate national legislation with detailed compliance requirements and rules outlined in each respective legislation.

Middle Eastern stock markets generally fell yesterday, weighed down by geopolitics and concern about Saudi Arabia's anticorruption crackdown, while Dana Gas shares sank in Abu Dhabi because of a British High Court ruling on its Islamic bonds.

The Saudi stock index fell 0.6 per cent. Among the biggest losers was Al Tayyar Travel, whose founder has been detained in the corruption probe; it sank a further 5.2pc, bringing its losses since the crackdown was announced two weeks ago to 31pc.

Kingdom Holding, whose chairman Prince Alwaleed bin Talal has also been detained, dropped 3.1pc.

But construction company Al Khodari rose 1.3pc after saying it had made a gross profit of 13.9 million riyals (\$3.7m) by auctioning off plant and machinery, and would reflect that profit in its fourth-quarter earnings.

In Abu Dhabi, the index fell 1.1pc as Abu Dhabi National Energy Co slid 4.6pc in very thin trade and Dana, which is seeking to avoid redeeming its sukuk by declaring them invalid, dropped 4.2pc in heavy trade.

Dubai's index fell 1.1pc as Emaar Properties lost 1.2pc. On Thursday, it priced the initial public offer of shares in its unit Emaar Development at 6.03 dirhams per share, in the lower half of an indicative range of 5.7-6.9 dirhams set earlier this month.

Courier firm Aramex dropped 3.6pc to 4.55 dirhams, confirming a break below technical support at its September low of 4.75 dirhams. A double top formed by the March and July highs points down to around 4.20 dirhams.

In Muscat, Omantel dropped 1.2pc after credit rating agency Moody's

The film was aired in India on Sony PIX on Friday. It also stars Lulu Wilson, Annalise Basso and Alexis G. Zall. (IANS)



imbabwe's ongoing crisis Ldescended into outright chaos vesterday after president Robert Mugabe failed to announce his resignation as widely expected in a national address on live television.

Instead, in a rambling address, Mugabe offered no concessions to his critics. the tens of thousands who marched calling for his resignation or the army commanders who led the military takeover last week.

Instead, the 93-year-old autocrat said that "we cannot be guided by bitterness or revengefulness which would not makes us any better ... Zimbabweans" and said that he would preside over a special congress of the ruling Zanu-PF party scheduled for next month - suggesting he has no immediate intention of stepping down.

Mugabe said he believed that the military "operation" launched last Tuesday by army commanders was motivated by "a deep patriotic concern for the stability of the nation" which "did not amount to a threat to our well-cherished constitutional order'

"I am aware that many developments have occurred in the party, given the failings of the past, and anger they might have triggered in some quarters .... [but] I am confident that from tonight our whole nation will put shoulder to the wheel," Mugabe said.

Earlier in the day, the veteran leader, who has been

in power for 37 years, was sacked as leader of the Zanu-PF and told by 200 of the party's top officials gathered at an extraordinary meeting in Harare to resign as head of state or face impeachment when parliament reconvenes on Tuesday.

Emmerson Mnangagwa, the vice-president whose sacking 13 days ago led to the military takeover, was appointed interim leader of the party.

Tsvangirai, who has been abroad receiving treatment for cancer, is now back in Zimbabwe

Mnangagwa is widely expected to take over from Mugabe as president.

The moves by Zanu-PF follows huge demonstrations in cities across the country on Saturday demanding Mugabe leave power. His refusal to go plunges the country into deep uncertainty.



## **US** destroyer slightly damaged in collision

AU.S. guided-missile destroyer, USS Benfold, guided-missile sustained minor damage when a Japanese tug drifted into it during a towing exercise off central Japan on Saturday.

'No one was injured on either vessel and Benfold sustained minimal damage, including scrapes on its side, pending a full damage assessment, a statement from the U.S. Seventh Fleet said.

'Benfold remains at sea under her own power. The Japanese commercial tug is being towed by another vessel to a port in Yokosuka. The incident will be investigated,'

incident, which occurred in Japan's Sagami Bay, marks the fifth time the U.S. Navy's 7th Fleet in the Pacific has been involved in a crash.


The idea, which was never proposed because it was apparently considered to have a "very slight" chance of being accepted, offers a look into how Washington

# Fleetwood clinches Race to Dubai crown Race to Dubai crown Dhawan carry India into lead

Kolkata, India

Openers KL Rahul and Shikhar Dhawan KL Rahul capitalised on vastly improved batting conditions, both overhead and underfoot, to lead India's recovery on the fourth day in Kolkata. After Rangana Herath's third Test fifty had bulked up Sri Lanka's lead to 122, there was only one likely winner in the game. But then after Dhawan struck a 116-ball 94 and Rahul hit an unbeaten 73, there would be none it seemed.

Mohammed Shami, on his home ground, rattled through Sri Lanka's middle order to finish with four wickets, while Bhuvneshwar Kumar added two wickets on the fourth day to return 4 for 88 in bowling Sri Lanka out for 294. With Umesh Yadav also taking two wickets, this was the third time India's seamers took all ten wickets in a Test innings at home, and the first such instance since 1983-84.

Rahul and Dhawan then replied with aggression that has typified their recent Test run. Sunny overhead conditions and a surface that seemed to have settled down helped drastically.

On most pitches, a slightly fuller-than-good length is ideal. But Lahiru Gamage



bowled on either side of that, dishing out three half-volleys to Rahul in his first over, which were punched for three boundaries through mid-off. He compensated with a shorter length thereafter, erring in Dhawan's wheelhouse, who cut and pulled gleefully.

Dinesh Chandimal was quickly forced to turn his spinners. With no turn, it played nicely into the openers' hands. Rahul nudged and nurdled, opening and closing

the bat face to accumulate runs, while Dhawan was more expansive, often using his feet to loft the ball straight.

Herath, more often than not Sri Lanka's second-innings star, was taken apart. In 29 overs, India had wiped out their deficit, and undone more than three days of diligence from Sri Lanka.

With Dhawan on 94 and the light fading, he committed the only two mistakes of his innings off the same delivery.

He drove loosely at Dasun Shanaka, but an inswinger found his inside edge. He reviewed immediately, and replays showed a sharp spike as ball passed bat. India finished the fourth day at 171 for 1, with a lead of 49. (espncricinfo)

side was rewarded in the 79th minute when Cavani grabbed his second, applying another emphatic finish from inside the area to wrap up another comfortable win for his side.

Cavani went close to his hattrick when forcing Tatarusanu into another excellent save three minutes later and Neymar was inches away from adding a fifth goal with an angled shot from the edge of the area.



ewis Hamilton has revealed what he said to Sebastian Vettel after their clash at the Azerbaijan Grand Prix earlier in the season.

Vettel accused Hamilton of brake-testing him during the Safety Car period in Baku and responded by driving up alongside the Mercedes and hitting his car from the side.

Hamilton's data showed no evidence that he did force a collision between the two rivals and Vettel was given a 10-second stop/go penalty which some thought was a little lenient.

Hamilton and Vettel spoke to each other about the incident after the race, with the Brit warning Vettel not to disrespect him again.

"When I spoke to him later, I was like 'that's a sign of disrespect, so don't ever disrespect me like that again otherwise then we will have problems'," said Hamilton when discussing his reaction.

"I've never done that to someone. I don't even know what he was thinking to have done... I've never been in a position like that. "I guess people react differently under certain pressures."

Hamilton said that the incident could have easily distracted him from his "ultimate goal" of winning the World Championship but he was not prepared to let Vettel do that.

"I think there's different ways in which you can handle things," added Hamilton.

"I knew what I was there to do and I wasn't going to let anything distract me from doing that.

"I wasn't going to let myself say something or react in a way that's going to cause some negative swirl which is going to steer me off course from my ultimate goal. (planetf1)
