# Trash trouble

Complaints about waste top 2,415 reports submitted through Tawasul

Rubbish complaints have topped a log of 2,415 cases lodged through the Tawasul app from January to October, with nearly a quarter of all reports blaming poor cleanliness in the Capital, the Capital Trustees Board has said.

The board reported that 825 complaints, or 24.5 per cent, were linked to litter and waste, while 325 reports (9.5pc) concerned monitoring and inspection and 320 (9.39pc) focused on

municipal fees.

A further 231 cases (6.7pc) fell into other categories and 183 complaints (5.3pc) dealt with

parcs and gardens.

Most of the complaints on cleanliness centred on people throwing rubbish in places not

meant for waste, along with disputes over municipal fees.

### Park maintenance

Residents also asked for park maintenance, the removal of abandoned vehicles, more rubbish containers in suitable spots, routine cleaning work, the provision of rubbish bags and action on sewage issues.

During the same meeting, board members met representatives from the Bahrain Tourism and Exhibitions Authority (BTEA) to discuss plans for the "Hawa Al Manama" events.

# Data Powers MENA's New Startup Reality Amid AI Challenges

Quality gaps slow AI growth

● Data emerges as key barrier

● Bahrain strengthens startup support

● Founders prioritise execution

Data took centre stage in Bahrain as Tenmou hosted the 10th MENA Angel Investors Summit 2025 at The Diplomat Radisson Blu Hotel, where founders and investors confronted the region's biggest barrier to startup growth.

Speakers made it clear that while artificial intelligence is now a minimum requirement for new ventures, data quality and access have become the defining obstacles for companies

hoping to scale.

His Excellency Abdulla bin Adel Fakhro, Minister of Industry and Commerce, attended the summit, signalling continued government commitment to strengthening the innovation environment. The event gathered founders, angel investors, venture capitalists and ecosystem partners in what has grown into Bahrain's flagship platform for early-stage investment.

### Data Barrier

Zade Al Borshaid, Director, Investments, Antler MENAP, said AI is no longer a differentiator because every early-stage venture is expected to use it. He explained that the real challenge lies in data, particularly within large organisations still tied to legacy, non-cloud systems that limit startups trying to build accurate, scalable tools.

He highlighted Roya AI as an example of a new generation of ventures focused on sovereign, on-premise large language models for government agencies. These systems include

technologies that help law enforcement recreate a suspect's appearance or voice from DNA when databases cannot provide a match.

### Team Strength

Al Borshaid added that early-stage investment decisions hinge more on the founding team than the initial idea, emphasising that most startups pivot repeatedly before settling



on a viable path. He noted that Antler MENAP's screening process illustrates this focus, with 10,000 applicants narrowing to fewer than 100 residency participants and only 20 to 25 ultimately securing investment.

Suhail Ghazi Algosabi, Chairman of Tenmou, said that founders across the world share similar hurdles, including fundraising, cash flow, team development and product-market fit.

He encouraged MENA entrepreneurs to recognise how far the region has come, supported by sovereign funds, accelerators, government programmes and collaborative networks between financial institutions and venture capital firms.

### Regional Insight

Zainab Al Sharif, Partner at Plus VC, said founders are increasingly building products

rooted in local data rather than importing Western franchise models. She noted that smaller markets such as Bahrain, Kuwait and Qatar offer ideal environments to refine ideas before expanding into larger economies. She also stressed that 70 percent of investment decisions depend on the strength of the team, including communication, responsiveness and evidence of traction. Sherif Abdelaty, Co-Founder of Gainz, said execution consistently outweighs hype and that trust must be established long before formal fundraising begins. He urged founders to present their achievements confidently, value their work and select investors who recognise long-term potential rather than short-term gains.

This year's summit showed that the region's next wave of innovation will be led by founders who can navigate the data challenge, build resilient teams and sustain execution, with Bahrain positioning itself as a platform where those capabilities can take shape.

# Expedited Justice

Sharia courts resolving more files than they receive, leaving only 1,533 cases pending

Numbers from Justice Ministry show Sharia courts are closing more cases than they take on, with only 1,533 files still pending and divorces making up six per cent of marriages since the current legislative term began.

In a written reply to MP Jalal Kadhem, the Ministry of Justice, Islamic Affairs and Waqf said Sharia courts at all levels recorded a clearance rate of 103 per cent in 2024, meaning more cases were concluded than lodged.

The average duration of a case across all courts and tiers last year was put at 3.3 months.

The ministry said it aims to support the judicial authority in delivering quick and accessible justice, while preserving family ties and making greater use of technology in court procedures.

Compulsory step

It pointed out that family reconciliation has become a compulsory step before Sharia cases reach the bench, under Decree-Law 22 of 2015 amending Provisions of Procedures before Sharia Courts Law.

From the start of the legislative term to date, Sharia courts have registered 13,801 marriage contracts.

Of these, 10,139 were between Bahraini men and Bahraini women, 1,729 between Bahraini men and non-Bahraini women, 1,140 between Bahraini women and non-Bahraini men, and 793 between non-Bahraini spouses on both sides.

Husbands

By age group, most husbands were aged between 25 and 35, followed by those in the 18-25 bracket.

Smaller numbers of marriage contracts involved men aged 35-45, and a further group aged over 45.

The ministry also set out figures for the Family Reconciliation Office, which seeks to settle disputes before they turn into full court cases.

It said the office dealt with 911 cases in 2023, 1,164 in 2024 and 859 so far in 2025, bringing the total to 2,934.

Over the same period, 4,336 files were referred on to the courts after no settlement was reached.

Reconciliation success

The reconciliation success rate has edged up year on year, rising from 38 per cent in

2023 to 41 per cent in 2024 and 43 per cent so far this year, giving an overall rate of around 40 per cent.

On divorce, the ministry recorded 2,030 cases in 2023, 2,073 in 2024 and 1,504 in 2025 to date, a total of 5,607 cases since the start of the current legislative term.

Of these, 3,969 involved Bahraini couples, 909 involved Bahraini men married to non-Bahraini women, 396 involved Bahraini women married to non-Bahraini men, and 333 were between non-Bahraini spouses.

Marriage contracts

The ministry said the 5,607 divorces represent six per cent of the total marriage contracts

registered over the same period.

The average age of men in divorce cases was given as 40, while the average age of women was 34.

MP Kadhem had asked for a full breakdown of pending Sharia cases, marriage and divorce statistics by type, nationality and age group, along with data on the work and success rate of the Family Reconciliation Office.

The ministry said it hoped the figures supplied would meet Parliament's request and thanked MPs for their interest in issues touching family and social stability.

## Appeal rejected in 350kg hashish smuggling case

A drug trafficker has lost his challenge to a life sentence after the High Criminal Court ruled that his opposition to an earlier in absentia judgment had no legal basis.

The court confirmed the original ruling jailing him for life for his role, with six others including a woman, in forming a cross-border network that moved narcotic drugs into Bahrain by sea.

Judges stated that the defendant had not advanced any new legal arguments against the conviction or sentence, so his opposition was treated as though it had never been filed.

According to the case file, the investigation began after information from secret sources pointed to a group importing narcotic substances from outside Bahrain.

Network

The network was led by a

man based in an Arab country who dealt with contacts inside Bahrain to bring in drugs and psychotropic substances and then sell them for trafficking purposes.

Investigations found that the first and second defendants worked for the head of the network in return for money.

They went out into Bahrain's territorial waters, met members of the group on the high seas at pre-agreed coordinates and received consignments of drugs.

Batches

These were handed over in batches to the third defendant, who paid them and then handled local distribution.

Enquiries showed that the total quantity brought in was about 350 kilogrammes of hashish, received in several shipments.

Further investigation indicated that, between 2021 and 2023, all the defendants except the seventh formed a criminal gang that imported narcotic substances into Bahrain via the sea route.

## Company to pay sacked expat worker BD1,500 compensation

A Labour Court has ordered a company to pay an expatriate worker more than BD1,500 after finding he was dismissed part-way through a fixed-term contract without proper notice.

The ruling awards BD333 in unpaid wages. Interest is fixed at 6 per cent a year on delayed sums for the first six months, then rises by one percentage point for each extra month of delay, capped at 12 per cent a year, running from the due date until payment.

The court also ordered BD100 in lieu of notice, BD267 for accrued annual leave with interest of 1 per cent from the date of entitlement, BD800 as compensation for termination, and the cost of a return air ticket.

Court fees and lawyers' costs



are payable as well.

Case papers show the man joined on a one-year contract at BD100 a month.

He said he worked beyond normal hours, including rest days and holidays, before being told to leave without pay or explanation.

Through lawyer Zahida Al Sayyed, he sought payment of three months' delayed wages, overtime, leave dues, compensation for unfair dismissal, interest on late sums, a service certificate and a ticket home.

## LMRA-BISB cooperation



His Excellency Nibras Talib, Chief Executive Officer of the Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) and Chairman of the National Committee for Combating Trafficking in Persons, met with Fatema Al Alawi, Chief Executive Officer of Bahrain Islamic Bank, in the presence of a number of officials from both sides. Talib underscored the bank's national role in supporting strategic projects, especially the upgraded Wage Protection System (WPS) that enables employers to pay the salaries of workers electronically through a unified, streamlined platform that strengthens labour rights and promotes stability in the workplace.

He noted that these efforts aim to sustain health awareness across all segments of the Southern Governorate and advance its well-merited ambition.

# Home burden

Council urged to reject draft building law over fears of added expenses for homeowners

Muharraq's municipal councillors are being urged to reject draft Building Regulation Law that accompanies Decree-Law No (53) of 2025, after the council's Financial and Legal Committee said it would increase costs for homeowners and introduce penalties, including possible jail terms, for breaches of building rules.

Working under Municipalities Law No (35) of 2001, the committee said it had reviewed the draft, examined its articles on permits, inspections and procedures, and studied its likely effect on neighbourhoods and local services. On that basis, the committee recommended that the council should not approve the draft.

The committee stated that its main concern lies with Article 25, which would require every project and building job to be supervised by an engineering office.

## Report

According to the report, applying the same rule to all works, including minor repairs and routine maintenance, would place an extra financial load on citizens.

The committee added that the law does not group projects into large, medium and small

categories, which in its view could lead to measures that do not match the scale of the work.

It also noted that many of the detailed rules are left to the implementing regulation, without a clear general frame in the law, raising the risk of uneven practice between different areas.

## Engineering office

Under the same article, the competent authority would be allowed to appoint an engineering office with the required technical capacity to inspect a project before issuing a completion certificate, with the licence applicant required in all cases to pay for the inspection.

The committee said that, in the absence of a ceiling or fee guide, inspection charges could rise and differ from one office to another.

It also pointed out that the draft does not spell out any right of appeal or re-assessment and

argued that bringing in a second office to check a project already supervised by a first could result in duplicated steps and higher costs without clear technical need.

## Duties

Article 27, dealing with the duties of the engineering office and building contractor, would require the supervising office to inform the authority of its appointment, the appointment or removal of the main contractor and any subcontractor, and any stoppage of work.

One paragraph treats the stoppage or suspension of building works for three consecutive months, or for another period to be named in the implementing regulation, as a case that must be reported.

The committee warned that compulsory reporting in such situations could expose project owners to penalties or fines

even when work pauses for reasons outside their control, such as funding delays, family issues or changing market conditions.

## Paperwork

For small or non-structural jobs, it added, this could add paperwork without clear benefit for safety or build quality.

On penalties, the report raised concerns about Article 41, which allows a fine of between BD500 and BD1,000 for certain breaches.

The committee argued that a minimum of BD500 does not take account of the range of possible violations and could be high for minor or non-structural cases.

It also noted that the draft does not classify violations as serious, medium or minor, which, in its view, could lead to different treatment of similar cases.

## Sitra road and sewage projects near completion

Road, sewage and treatment-plant works worth tens of millions of dinars are under way on Sitra Island, with schemes in Blocks 602, 603 and 604 progressing alongside an expansion of the northern sewage treatment plant, the Capital Trustees Board has announced.

Board members reviewed this year's municipal and infrastructure works in Sitra and noted that the Ministry of Works is carrying out a programme of projects in the eighth constituency to improve public facilities and meet the needs of nearby homes.

Board member Mohammed Al Abbas said roadworks in Block 602 include new streets, speed humps, underground ducts for future utility services, upgraded lighting and new direction signs and road markings.

The project, which has a total cost of BD4,421,083, has reached 88 per cent completion and is scheduled to finish

in the fourth quarter of this year.

He added that the first phase of the sewage network in Block 604 is designed to serve around 280 properties.

## Work

The work covers 5,300 metres of main pipes and 1,400 metres of secondary lines, together with 725 inspection chambers, 280 house connections and one lifting station.

According to Al Abbas, the scheme is 83 per cent complete and is expected to be finished in the third quarter of 2025, at a cost of 1,349,889 dinars.

Al Abbas said another sewage project in Block 603 is planned to serve 119 properties.

It involves 2,554 metres of main lines and 1,304 metres of secondary lines, plus 256 inspection chambers and one lifting station.

The completion rate stands at 31 per cent and the work is due to be handed over in the third quarter of 2026, with a budget of 2,320,550 dinars.

# Bahrain's 'Global Justice Bay' highlighted at Riyadh forum

Professor Marike Patrani Paulsson, Secretary General of The Council for International Dispute Resolution of the Kingdom of Bahrain, participated as a speaker on a distinguished panel at the 7th Arab Lawyers

Forum held in the Saudi capital, Riyadh.

During the session, Professor Paulsson highlighted Bahrain's launch of the Global Justice Bay initiative, announced during the King Hamad Forum for Neutral Justice on 5 November.

She described the initiative as a significant step in strength-

ening Bahrain's position as an international centre for dispute resolution and legal cooperation, bringing leading global institutions together under one platform to support the justice ecosystem at both the regional and international levels.

Prof. Paulsson also discussed Bahrain's notable progress in

the field of international commercial adjudication, including the establishment of the Bahrain International Commercial Court (BICC), one of the first courts in the Arab world to operate bilingually in Arabic and English, with the unique feature of allowing its judgments to be appealed in another jurisdiction, namely the Republic of Singapore.

She additionally reviewed Bahrain's pioneering contributions within the Working Groups of the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL), particularly her involvement in Working Group II on electronic arbitral awards.

## Information Ministry mourns media figure

The Ministry of Information mourned the passing of veteran broadcaster and media figure Ahmed Hussain Khonji, who passed away after a distinguished career in radio and television broadcasting.

## Dangerous stunt



The General Directorate of Traffic has announced the arrest of a motorist and the impounding of his vehicle after a video circulated on social media showing him performing reckless stunts in the Busaiten area, endangering his life and the safety of others. The directorate confirmed that legal action has been taken against the driver, stressing that such violations pose a serious threat to road users. It added that the move comes as part of ongoing efforts to promote traffic safety and curb behaviour that jeopardises public security on the roads.

## GCC judicial course for military officers

# Council seeks maximum income-rule exemption for fire-damaged homes

The Southern Municipal Council has agreed to press for a change in the income rules for fire-damaged homes under the Cities and Villages Development Project, after backing a proposal to lift the current BD800 ceiling in such cases.

Councillors voted yesterday to write to the Minister of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture, asking him to amend the project's guidance manual so that families whose homes are damaged by fire, and whose cases are confirmed by a Civil Defence report, are exempt from the maximum-income condition.

All other requirements on ownership and proof would remain in place.

## Applicants

Under the existing rules, applicants for home maintenance, rainproofing and fire-related

repairs must have a basic salary plus social allowance that does not exceed BD800.

The service cap is set at BD10,000.

According to the council's study, this can leave families who earn just over that limit facing high repair bills after a blaze, even though they have no realistic way to plan for or absorb such costs.

The proposal, submitted by councillor Abdullah Darraj, would lift the income ceiling for fire cases across all projects covered by the scheme in Bahrain.

## Documents

Eligibility would rest instead on documents and reports already required by the municipality: a Civil Defence report confirming the incident and the extent of damage, proof of ownership, the home address in official records and an electricity bill showing that the property is the main residence.



Darraj said that fire incidents are sudden, cause serious damage to key parts of a home such as wiring, plumbing, floors, finishes and sometimes structural

elements, and can leave a building unsafe or unfit to live in.

He argued that such cases amount to an emergency, regardless of what the household

earns, and that support should hinge on the nature of the incident and the condition of the

home rather than income alone.

## Programme

Darraj said the home-maintenance programme overseen by the Ministry of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture, in

coordination with municipal councils, offers important help to Bahrainis and that repairs funded for fire-damaged homes act as “a lifeline for families that have suffered psychological and financial shock” following sudden house fires, helping them return to normal daily life and stability.

The reasoning attached to the proposal states that removing the income cap in fire cases does not sweep away controls. Instead, it places more weight on the existing checks, which are designed to verify that the applicant owns and lives in the damaged home and that Civil Defence has recorded the fire and its impact.

It notes that disasters such as fires affect low- and middle-income households alike and that assistance should not be withheld simply because a family's income is above BD800 once its main home has burnt.

## Health Council studies insurance status of non-Bahraini widows

Non-Bahraini widows of Bahraini men are under review for inclusion among the groups treated as citizens in Bahrain's compulsory health insurance scheme, according to a written reply from the Health Ministry.

The ministry said the Supreme Council of Health is studying a recommendation to keep this group covered so they can go on receiving the same health care services they had during their husbands' lifetimes.

The move forms part of work to review and organise the categories included in the health insurance system in line with the purposes of the Health Insurance Law.

## Response

The response was sent to Shura Council member Nancy E. Khedouri, who had asked about the legal status of a non-Bahraini widow after the death of her Bahraini husband and whether she retains the right to benefit from services granted under Health Insurance Law No. 23 of 2018.

She also asked if there was any plan to list such widows among the ‘other categories’ treated as citizens in the compulsory scheme, in a way that

takes account of their social and humanitarian circumstances.

The ministry began by thanking Ms Khedouri for following health sector developments, in particular the scope of compulsory health insurance, the groups covered and the benefits to be provided to them under the packages mentioned in the law.

It then cited Article 26 of the law, which states that compulsory health insurance applies to all citizens, residents and visitors.

The same article provides that certain residents are treated in the same way as citizens: a non-Bahraini woman married to a Bahraini man, a non-Bahraini man married to a Bahraini woman, and the children of a Bahraini woman married to a non-Bahraini man.

It also leaves room for ‘other

categories’ living in the Kingdom to be specified by Cabinet decision based on a recommendation from the Supreme Council of Health.

On this basis, the ministry noted that all Bahraini citizens, residents and visitors fall within the compulsory health insurance scheme, with some residents placed on the same footing as citizens for the purposes of that scheme.

The law gives the Supreme Council of Health the option to recommend adding further categories to this group and to raise such recommendations to the Cabinet so that the necessary decision can be issued in line with the public interest.

The reply added that the council, drawing on studies and statistics, is identifying additional groups that need to be included and treated.

### South Africa to host G20 summit boycotted by US

Johannesburg, South Africa

South Africa will host the G20 summit this weekend, aiming to secure commitments on debt relief for developing countries and to tackle global inequalities as the United States boycotts the event.

US President Donald Trump, who has clashed with South Africa over its G20 agenda, is skipping the summit amid a wider US retreat from multilateralism that has rattled global order.

President Cyril Ramaphosa told reporters ahead of the November 22-23 event that the US absence is "their loss".

The United States is the most powerful of the 19 countries in the G20, which represents 85 percent of global GDP and about two-thirds of the world's population, and also includes the European Union and the African Union.

The US boycott echoes Trump's decision not to send an official delegation to the COP30 summit in Brazil.

## Flydubai orders 75 Boeings as deals roll in at Dubai airshow



Dubai, United Arab Emirates

Low-cost airline flydubai signed an initial order for 75 Boeing jets as the city's fast-expanding carriers bolstered their fleets again at the Dubai Airshow yesterday.

Flydubai's 737 MAX order valued at \$13 billion came a day after another initial agreement for 150 Airbus planes -- its first deal with the European manufacturer.

Emirates, flydubai's long-haul partner airline, signed for eight Airbus A350-900s worth \$3.4 billion on Wednesday, after snapping up 65 Boeing 777Xs earlier in the week.

The Dubai state-owned carriers are growing capacity ahead of the 2032 opening of a new airport, slated to be the world's biggest, in the Middle East financial hub.

"Looking ahead, proactive fleet planning is essential to ensuring we are well-placed to meet the rising demand for travel," said flydubai chairman Sheikh Ahmed bin Saeed Al Maktoum.

Dubai International Airport enjoyed a record quarter with 24.2 million passengers in the three months to June, underlining the sector's buoyancy.

Third-quarter numbers grew 1.9 percent, taking passenger traffic so far this year to 70.1 million, and putting Dubai on course for a record 95.2 million this year.

"I think the underlying reason is the attractiveness of Dubai as a city to come and live or visit," Dubai Airports CEO Paul Griffiths told AFP.

The airport, a major hub linking Europe, Asia and Africa, has been ranked the world's busiest for international passengers for 11 years.

The latest jet order from flydubai, which already operates a fleet of more than 90 Boeing 737 aircraft, is another boost for the US manufacturer following a torrid period marked by deadly crashes and delivery delays.

Emirates' 65-plane order came despite a seven-year delay to the 777X that has forced the airline to retrofit its existing fleet at a cost of more than \$6 billion.

## China to halt Japan seafood imports amid Taiwan spat

China will suspend Japanese seafood imports, media in Tokyo reported yesterday as a row sparked by comments about Taiwan deepens, although neither government confirmed the move.

The uneasy neighbours' most serious spat since 2012 was triggered by new Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi suggesting on November 7 that Tokyo could intervene militarily in any attack on Taiwan.

China, which claims Taiwan as part of its territory, has been furious, summoning Tokyo's ambassador and advising its citizens against travel to Japan.

The release of at least two Japanese movies will also be postponed in China, according to state media.

Reporting the suspension of seafood imports, Japanese media, including public broadcaster NHK, cited unnamed government sources.

China explained the move as necessary to monitor treated wastewater being released from the stricken Fukushima nuclear power plant, NHK said.

China had only recently resumed purchasing some marine products from Japan following an earlier ban imposed after the Fukushima operation began in 2011. The UN atomic agency said the release of the equivalent of 540 Olympic pools' worth of cooling water collected since a tsunami crippled the facility in 2011 was safe.

But Beijing has accused Japan of treating the Pacific as a

"sewer". Beijing's foreign ministry did not confirm the latest reported suspension when asked on Wednesday.

Ministry spokeswoman Mao Ning told a regular news conference: "Under the current circumstances, even if Japanese seafood were exported to China, there would not be a market."

Japanese government spokesman Minaru Kihara also said there had been "no notifications from the Chinese side on this". "It is important to follow through on the understanding shared between Japan and China in September last year (about seafood)," Kihara told reporters.

In 2023, seafood shipments to mainland China accounted for 15.6 percent of a total of 390 billion yen (\$2.5 billion), down from 22.5 percent in 2022.

Hong Kong accounted for 26.1 percent, and the United States accounted for 15.7 per-

cent in 2023.

### 'Strong protest'

Key trading partners, China and Japan have seen ties frayed by territorial rivalries and military spending in recent years.

China is the biggest source of tourists to Japan, with almost 7.5 million visitors in the first nine months of 2025.

One analyst estimated that Chinese travellers have cancelled around half a million air tickets in recent days.

"Recently, 90 percent of our customers (going to Japan) have asked for refunds," Wu Weiguang, 48, a manager at a Shanghai travel agency, told AFP. "I think relations will be able to improve, as long as Japan can tone down their rhetoric... After all, there are a lot of Chinese people currently in Japan, including my cousin, who is married to someone there," said his colleague Zhou Pei, 47.

News in brief

◆ **An oil tanker seized** by Iran's Revolutionary Guards last week was released yesterday, the company managing the ship said, confirming all its crew were safe. "Columbia Shipmanagement can confirm that its managed product tanker TALARA was released at approximately 4:42 am local time (0112 GMT) on 19 November 2025 with its crew complement of 21 seafarers, all of whom are safe," the group said in a statement to AFP. Iran's Revolutionary Guards had said on Saturday they had seized the tanker a day earlier as it sailed from a port in the United Arab Emirates. They said at the time that it was carrying "unauthorised cargo" towards Singapore. But Columbia Shipmanagement said that "no allegations were made against the vessel, her crew and the vessel's managers and owners". The vessel was now "free to resume normal operations", the firm added.

◆ **Japan is set to give the green light** this week to restart the world's biggest nuclear plant, local media reported yesterday. The resource-poor country pulled the plug on nuclear power after the 2011 Fukushima disaster, but it wants to revive atomic energy and reduce its dependence on imported fossil fuels. The Kashiwazaki-Kariwa nuclear plant is expected to get approval this week from the local governor to resume operations, according to Kyodo News and the Nikkei business daily, citing unnamed sources. Hideyo Hanazumi, governor of central Niigata province, where the plant is located, is expected to hold a news conference on Friday, the reports said. Of the seven reactors at Kashiwazaki-Kariwa, only one will resume functioning. After the 2011 tsunami and meltdown at the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear plant, Japan shut down all of its nuclear reactors, with the public voicing unease about the energy source.


◆ **Myanmar's military** said yesterday it raided an internet scam hub on the Thai border, arresting nearly 350 people, part of a highly publicised crackdown against the booming black market compounds. Sprawling fraud factories have ballooned in war-torn Myanmar's border regions, housing scammers targeting internet users with romance and business cons worth tens of billions of dollars annually. Myanmar's junta has long been accused of turning a blind eye but has trumpeted a crackdown since February after being lobbied by key military backer China, experts say. Additional raids beginning last month were part of a propaganda effort, according to some monitors, choreographed to vent pressure from Beijing without too badly denting profits that enrich the junta's militia allies.

**Klimt portrait becomes second most expensive artwork sold at auction**

A portrait by Austrian artist Gustav Klimt fetched \$236.4 million in New York on Tuesday, becoming the second most expensive artwork ever sold at auction.

Six bidders battled for 20 minutes over the "Portrait of Elisabeth Lederer," which Klimt painted between 1914 and 1916.

The piece depicts the daughter of Klimt's main patron dressed in a white imperial Chinese dress, standing before a blue tapestry with Asian-inspired motifs.

Sotheby's, which managed the sale, did not disclose the identity of the buyer.

The most expensive painting ever sold at auction remains the "Salvator Mundi,"

attributed to Leonardo da Vinci, which was bought for \$450 million in 2017.

"Full-length society portraits of this impressive scale and from Klimt's pinnacle period (1912-17) are exceptionally rare; the majority in major museum collections," Sotheby's said of Tuesday's sale.

"The painting offered this evening was one of only two such commissioned portraits remaining in private hands," it added in a statement.

Several other works from Klimt were auctioned at the same event, including "Flowering Meadow" for \$86 million and "Forest Slope at Unterlach am Attersee" for \$68.3 million -- both part of the collection of Estee Lauder cosmetics heir Leonard Lauder, who died earlier this year.

**UK warns Putin as Russian military ship enters its waters**

UK military deployed a Royal Navy frigate and Royal Air Force planes

The UK government warned the Kremlin yesterday after saying a Russian military ship had entered British waters and directed lasers at UK pilots.

Defence Secretary John Healey told reporters in London that the ship had "entered" UK waters for the second time this year, following an earlier incursion back in January.

"The Yantar is on the edge of UK waters, north of Scotland, having entered the UK's wider waters over the last few weeks," he said during a press conference in Downing Street.

The UK military deployed a Royal Navy frigate and Royal Air Force planes to

"monitor and track this vessel's every move, during which the Yantar directed lasers at our pilots," he added.

He called the use of the lasers "deeply dangerous" and issued a message to Russian President Vladimir Putin.

"We see you. We know what

you're doing. If the Yantar travels south this week, we are ready."

Healey said the Yantar was "part of a Russian fleet designed to put and hold our undersea infrastructure and those of our allies at risk".

Britain and NATO allies have expressed growing concern about the risk Moscow poses to offshore infrastructure following the sabotage in recent months of several undersea telecom and power cables.

Nearly one in three women have experienced intimate partner or sexual violence, the World Health Organization said Wednesday, warning no society "can call itself fair, safe or healthy while half its population lives in fear".

"Violence against women is one of humanity's oldest and most pervasive injustices, yet still one of the least acted upon," WHO chief Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus said in a statement.

In a fresh report, the UN health agency estimated that 840 mil-

lion women globally -- nearly a third -- have experienced violence by an intimate partner, meaning someone they are in a romantic relationship with, or sexual violence in their lifetime.

In the past year alone, 316 million women -- 11 percent of those over the age of 15 -- faced physical or sexual violence by an intimate partner, the report showed.

Progress had been "painfully slow", WHO said, pointing out that intimate partner violence had declined by only 0.2 percent annually over the past two decades.

LynnMarie Sardinha, with

WHO's department of sexual, reproductive, maternal, child and adolescent health and ageing, warned the number of reported cases might even begin to rise.

"Increased awareness will likely lead to more reports of violence," she told reporters.

For the first time, the WHO report also includes national and regional estimates of sexual violence committed by someone other than an intimate partner.

It determined that a full 263 million women had experienced non-partner sexual violence since the age of 15, cautioning the problem was "significantly

under-reported due to stigma and fear".

Wednesday's analysis covers data collected between 2000 and 2023 across 168 countries, "revealing a stark picture of a deeply neglected crisis", WHO said. In 2022, for instance, just 0.2 percent of global development aid went to programmes focused on preventing violence against women.



**White rhino born at Spain zoo in conservation success**

A southern white rhino calf has been born at a zoo in eastern Spain, in a success for a European programme aimed at preserving the threatened species.

After a 491-day pregnancy, mother Kwanza gave birth to the male calf in early November, the Bioparc Valencia zoo said.

The zoo released a video showing the birth and the jubilant reactions of caretakers who had long awaited the event.

"We are very happy because we tried both artificial insemination and natural breeding, and finally we succeeded," the zoo's technical director for animals, Loles Carbonell, said in the video, without explaining how the

conception occurred.

It is the first birth of a southern white rhino at the zoo since it opened nearly 18 years ago.

The conception of the rhino was part of the European Endangered Species Programme, which aims to conserve populations of

endangered species kept in European zoos, helping to ensure their long-term survival.

"This birth is very important for the international conservation programme, as this is a highly threatened species," said Raul Olmo, a member of the zoo's animal care team.

The calf, dark in colour with pointed ears, will be named through a public vote from a list of options proposed by the caretakers.

The International Union for Conservation of Nature currently classifies southern white rhinos, which are prized by poachers for their horns, as "near threatened".

The species is found almost exclusively in southern Africa. Females give birth to one calf roughly every 3-4 years.

US asked Yemen to join international Gaza force

The United States has approached Yemen about joining an international force to be deployed in Gaza as part of President Donald Trump's peace plan, five Yemeni government sources, including top officials, told AFP.

The UN greenlit Trump's peace plan this week, but its realisation faces major hurdles, with Arab and Muslim nations hesitant to participate in the new International Stabilisation Force (ISF) that could end up fighting Palestinian militants.

The Yemeni government is yet to make a decision, the sources, including a top Yemeni diplomat, a military official and

an official from the Presidential Leadership Council, said.

They all spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss sensitive matters.

Another source at the presidential council and the Yemeni diplomat said any contribution to the force would be largely symbolic.

“If we do participate, it will be just a few officers or soldiers in the operations room and the contacts room for logistical purposes. They will not be involved in other operations under this scheme,” the diplomat said.

Asked about the request, a US State Department spokesperson told AFP “we're not going to detail private diplomatic conversations”.

They added that Trump

himself had said “there will be many exciting announcements in the coming weeks”.

Yemen's internationally-recognised government is largely fractured and weakened having been kicked out of the capital Sanaa by the Iran-backed Huthi rebels in 2014, who now control most of Yemen's population centres.

‘We can't say no’

A senior military official said Yemen's “participation in the international force has been discussed with the Americans, but we have not yet received an official request” to join the force.

Asked about Yemen's incentives to join the force, the diplomat told AFP: “The issue is we cannot say no”.

Trump says Saudi prince ‘knew nothing’ about the murder

US President Donald Trump yesterday said Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman “knew nothing” about the murder of journalist Jamal Khashoggi.

He raged at a journalist who asked the prince in the Oval Office about the case for embarrassing the Saudi royal on his first US trip and called Khashoggi “extremely controversial.”

“A lot of people didn't like that gentleman that you're talking about,” he said.

“Whether you like him or didn't like him, things happen, but he (the prince) knew nothing about it. And we can leave it at that. You don't have to embarrass our guest by asking a question like that.”

Trump also called for US broadcaster ABC, whose journalist asked the question about the murder, to have its license revoked in a furious diatribe against the “crappy” company.

At the gala dinner in the evening, Trump said he was

designating Saudi Arabia as one of just 20 major non-NATO allies around the world.

“I'm just telling you now for the first time, because they wanted to keep a little secret for tonight,” he said.

Soccer legend Cristiano Ronaldo, who plays in Saudi Arabia, was among the guests at the meal. So was billionaire Elon Musk.

Trump called the Saudi a “very good friend” and hailed him as being “incredible, in

terms of human rights, and everything else.”

The two countries later signed a host of deals, including a civil nuclear cooperation agreement that the White House said would last decades.

Trump also approved a “major defense sale package” which includes “future deliveries” of F-35s. They also agreed to share AI technology “while protecting US technology from foreign influence.”

South Korean ferry with 267 aboard runs aground

A South Korean ferry carrying 267 people ran aground on an uninhabited island off the country's southwest coast yesterday, authorities said.

The passenger vessel was travelling from Jeju island to the port city of Mokpo when it ran aground after 8 pm (1100 GMT), the Coast Guard said.

“So far, there have been no reports of casualties,” said a Coast Guard statement, which did not detail the cause.

Operations were underway to rescue the 246 passengers and 21 crew on board.

A photo released by Yonhap news agency shows the bow of the ferry pressed up against the island's tree-covered slope.

Another image shows passengers waiting to be rescued,

many of them wearing what appear to be life vests.

President Lee Jae Myung ordered “swift rescue efforts” and instructed officials to provide real-time updates to the public, his office said.

In 2014, a ferry carrying more than 470 passengers -- mostly pupils on a school trip -- capsized off the southwest coast, killing 304 people in South Korea's worst maritime disaster.







# Bahrain's Women Uphold Athletics Legacy

## Triple gold celebration as silver keeps Bahrain's momentum

Following Tuesday's dominant showing where Bahrain struck four golds on the track, the Kingdom continued its golden run yesterday at Prince Faisal Bin Fahad Stadium, claiming three more gold medals at the sixth Islamic Solidarity Games. Nelly Korir, Salwa Eid Naser, and Winfred Yavi each put in sensational performances in their respective events, further cementing Bahrain's position as a global athletics powerhouse.

Korir struck first, taking the women's 800m final in 2:02.59. The 34-year-old tactically timed her race, surging past Uganda's Halima Nakaayi and

Eid Naser claimed gold in the women's 400m, clocking 51.59. Naser, who also won three golds at the 2017 Islamic Solidarity Games in Baku, ran with her trademark speed and authority, holding off Nigeria's Patience Okon George and Uganda's Leni Shida. Her seamless acceleration through the final 100 meters showed why she remains one of Asia's most decorated sprinters.

The evening's track domination continued with Winfred Yavi, who powered to gold in the women's 5000m in 15:43.51. Already the winner of the 3000m steeplechase at these Games and a gold medallist in the steeplechase at the 5th Islamic Solidarity Games in Konya in

2021, the 25-year-old led from the front, fending off Uganda's Charity Cherop and Djibouti's Samiya Hassan Nour. Yavi's endurance and tactical nous made the 5000m a showcase of Bahrain's depth in distance running.


Not all Bahraini efforts were successful, however, as Zouhair Aouad failed to finish the men's

1500m, where Morocco's Anass Essayi took gold, Turkey's Mehmet Celik claimed silver, and Algeria's Chott Anis earned bronze. Bahrain did, however, add silver in the women's 4x100m relay, capping off the athletics programme for the day. Layla Kamal, Edidiong Odiong, Raihanah Garoubah, and Hajar Alkhaldi ran a strong, competitive race, keeping Bahrain in contention throughout. They crossed the finish line in 44.47, just behind Nigeria's 44.27, securing a hard-earned silver to close a remarkable day for the Kingdom's athletics team.

Bahrain now have a total of 23 medals at the Games, including 13 golds, 5 silvers, and 5 bronze medals. This haul places them fifth in the overall medal standings, behind Turkiye, Uzbekistan, Iran, and Egypt, because rankings prioritize gold medals over total medals. With athletics drawing to a close, today marks the final day of track and field competition and the penultimate day of the Games, with Nelly Korir set to again challenge for gold in the women's 1500m, offering Bahrain another opportunity to extend their medal tally.

# Bahrain Stun Qatar to Book Handball Final Spot

Bahrain booked their place in the men's handball final at the sixth Islamic Solidarity Games yesterday after a dramatic 31-30 win over Qatar at the Olympic Complex's Green Hall. The team survived a relentless contest that swung back and forth until the final whistle. It was a performance defined by composure under pressure and standout individual displays, as Bahrain fought their way into tomorrow's gold-medal match against hosts Saudi Arabia.

The match could hardly have started worse for Bahrain, who fell behind 0-3 within minutes as Qatar's Ahmad Madadi and Allaedine Berrached struck early. But Ahmed Kadhem's breakthrough settled the team, and Bahrain began to claw back control. Salman Alshowaikh ignited the turnaround with a flurry of goals, striking twice to level at

4-4 before Hasan Alsamahiji put Bahrain ahead.

The rest of the first half unfolded as a tense exchange of short-lived leads. Mohamed Ahmed, Mohamed Rabia and Mohamed Ali found important openings, while goalkeeper Mohamed Ali produced timely saves to keep Bahrain in reach. By halftime Qatar held a narrow 14-13 advantage, but Bahrain had already shown the resilience that would define the second half.

After the break, Qatar pushed

ahead 16-13, yet Bahrain refused to fold. Alshowaikh continued his superb form, Kadhem struck again and Hasan Ali delivered from the wing as Bahrain kept pace. From the 16th minute onward the game became a goal-for-goal exchange. Mohamed Ahmed and Mohamed Mohamed took charge offensively, converting crucial chances whenever Qatar threatened to edge clear. Mohamed Mohamed was particularly clinical, finishing a perfect 4/4.

With the match tied 27-27

entering the closing stages, Bahrain produced the decisive surge. Mohamed Ahmed broke through the defence, Mohamed Mohamed added another composed finish, and Husain Alsayyad struck late to keep Bahrain in front. Qatar responded through Madadi and Amine Gueris, but Bahrain's defence — supported by 16 saves from Mohamed Ali — held firm.

Bahrain now move on to tomorrow's final against hosts Saudi Arabia, who defeated the UAE 29-15 in the other semi-final. It sets up a compelling rematch, as Bahrain's only group-stage defeat came against Saudi in between their victories over Kuwait and Iraq. With momentum restored after their dramatic win over Qatar, Bahrain head into the final determined to overturn that earlier loss and push for gold at Green Hall.

# 3x3 Heartbreak for Bahrain After Bronze Loss

# Stunning Scotland win seals World Cup spot, Spain, Switzerland qualify

● **Scotland beat Denmark 4-2 with late goals**

● **Spain, Belgium, and Austria also qualify**

Injury-time wonder-goals by Kieran Tierney and Kenny McLean handed Scotland a stunning 4-2 win over Denmark on Tuesday to qualify them for the 2026 World Cup, while Spain also booked their ticket with a 2-2 draw against Turkey.

Belgium thumped Liechtenstein 7-0 to reach next year's tournament as Switzerland and Austria ground out draws to secure their places in the United States, Canada and Mexico.

Scotland's late show in Glasgow means Steve Clarke's side have qualified for the global footballing showpiece for the first time since 1998.

Level at 2-2 as the clock ticked past 90, Denmark were set to advance to the World Cup as Group C winners until Tierney curled

in an exquisite finish from distance three minutes into injury time.

McLean then put the match beyond doubt as he lifted the ball over Danish goalkeeper Kasper Schmeichel, who was well off his

line, from the halfway line on 98 minutes.

"That just sums up this squad," captain Andy Robertson told the BBC. "Never say die. We just keep going right to the end and one of the craziest games.

"We put the country through it, but I'm sure it's worth it. We're going to the World Cup."

Earlier, Napoli midfielder Scott McTominay had given the hosts a third-minute lead with a towering overhead kick.

McTominay's clubmate Rasmus Hojlund levelled for Denmark from the spot just shy of the hour, before his side went down to 10 as Rasmus Kristensen picked up a second booking.

An anxious Hampden Park let out a roar of ecstasy and relief in the 78th minute as Lawrence Shankland turned in from close range.

But Denmark struck back again through Patrick Dorgu four minutes later before Tierney and McLean stole the headlines.

Denmark will now be in Thursday's draw for the Euro-

pean play-offs, which will take place next March.

Switzerland will appear in a sixth successive World Cup finals after drawing 1-1 in Pristina against Kosovo.

With the Swiss needing to avoid a defeat by six goals to seal top spot, they rarely looked troubled as Ruben Vargas handed them the lead in the 47th minute before Florent Muslija equalised.

**'Bitter-sweet'**

Euro 2024 winners Spain found themselves in a similar situation in Seville against Turkey but also never looked like going down to the seven-goal loss that would have sent the visitors through in their place.

Dani Olmo fired Spain ahead but Deniz Gul and Salih Ozcan struck for Turkey as the hosts conceded their first goals in the qualification process.

But Mikel Oyarzabal hit back after the hour to extend Spain's unbeaten run.

"We wanted to finish with a win and a clean sheet, so it's bitter-sweet... but we're happy to qualify for the World Cup," Olmo told TVE.

## USA thrash Uruguay 5-1 in friendly rout

The United States scored their most impressive win of Mauricio Pochettino's reign with a 5-1 thrashing of Uruguay in an international friendly on Tuesday.

A first-half goal blitz from Pochettino's side laid the foundations for an emphatic victory in Tampa against Marcelo Bielsa's overwhelmed Uruguay line-up.

World Cup co-hosts the United States raced into a 4-0 lead just before half-time thanks to a goal from Sebastian Berhalter, two goals

from Alex Freeman and a 42nd-minute strike from Diego Luna.

Although Giorgian de Arascaeta pulled a goal back in first-half stoppage time for Uruguay, Pochettino's team completed the rout with a 68th-minute Tanner Tessmann goal.

It was the first time the United States has ever scored five goals against a World Cup-winning nation and was further evidence that Pochettino's squad is on an upward curve after a bumpy start to the Argentine coach's reign.

## LeBron debuts in NBA record 23rd season as Pistons win streak hits 11

In his absence, the Lakers went 10-4 to stand fourth in the Western Conference.

That set the stage for him to start against the Jazz, breaking a tie with Vince Carter for the most career seasons in NBA history.

West Indies captain Shai Hope unfurled a brilliant 109 off 69 balls to give them a chance of squaring the three-match series after the hosts won the opener by seven runs in Christchurch on Sunday.

But some wayward late bowling opened the door for New Zealand, who have now won 11 successive ODI bilateral series at home dating back to 2019.

The result was hanging in the balance with three overs remaining, when the home side still required 40 runs to win.

Santner then struck the otherwise impressive seamer Matthew Forde for two fours and a

six in successive balls.

He swatted a six and four from the following over bowled by Shamar Springer to swing the advantage firmly to New Zealand.

Seasoned all-rounder Santner sealed victory with a cover drive off Jayden Seales and said he always felt the target could be hauled in.

"I thought 247 was a good score. They batted really well but it's one of those grounds

where, if you get a good start, you can cash in at the back end," he said.

"Obviously thrilled with the win."

Tom Latham was left not out on 39 while the chase was set up nicely by half-centuries to Devon Conway (90) and Rachin Ravindra (56) before New Zealand lost momentum through the middle stages.

Earlier, Hope produced his 19th ton in the format, finishing

with 13 fours and four sixes as he became the seventh West Indies player to go past 6,000 ODI runs.

He is the second fastest to reach the milestone -- in 147 matches -- behind Viv Richards.

Hope felt bittersweet about his innings.

"It's always good to try to give the team the best chance of winning the game," he said.

"But I always look at it from within, and there's more I could have done.

"I honestly thought 247 was enough, but clearly it wasn't."

The tourists pummelled 111 off the last nine overs, with lower-order batsmen Justin Greaves, Romario Shepherd and Forde all passing 20 to provide support for Hope.

Nathan Smith bagged late wickets for New Zealand to record career-best figures of 4-42 while fellow seamer Kyle Jamieson took 3-44.

## UEFA approves Barcelona's Camp Nou return in Champions League

Barcelona said in a statement that "UEFA accepted the request, considering that all the necessary requirements have been met."

The Camp Nou return will end a messy saga in which Barcelona repeatedly had to postpone their announced reopening of the stadium as construction delays and a failure to secure safety licences curtailed their plans.

The Catalans were humiliatedly forced to play two matches at their 6,000-capacity Johan Cruyff training ground stadium in the first weeks of the season after failing to get the permit they needed for Camp Nou, because of safety reasons.

The Spanish champions will host Eintracht Frankfurt at the Camp Nou on December 9, just over two weeks after inaugurating the stadium against Athletic Bilbao in domestic action on November 22.
