Bahrain's **International Book Fair still** on hold after seven years

on hold, the Bahrain Authority for Culture and Antiquities (BACA) told Parliament, citing Covid-19 disruptions and delays in preparation.

In a written reply to MP Eman Shuwaiter, the authority said the fair is biennial, with the 18th edition held in 2018 alongside Muharraq's Capital of Islamic Culture events. The 19th edition, scheduled for 2020, was canceled due to Covid-19, and the 2022 cycle was also unable to proceed.

BACA said it has been working to revive the fair, preparing organisational studies covering technical plans, budgets, logistics, and funding, while contacting regional and international publishers.
