m op}$ seed Matteo Berrettini became the first debutant since Boris Becker in 1985 to win the Queen's tournament, beating Briton Cameron Norrie 6-4, 6-7 (5/7), 6-3 yesterday.

The 25-year-old Italian may have dropped his first set of the week but his booming serve held up with 19 aces bombarding Norrie as he secured his fifth ATP title. Becker went on to win his first Wimbledon title aged just 17 weeks later but Berrettini, 25, was happy solely to focus yesterday's victory. "This is the nicest trophy for sure with all due respect to the others I have won," said Berrettini, who won 45 successive service games after being broken twice in the first round.
