he 2018 United Nations eGovernment Development Index has offered fifth rank in Asia to Bahrain, stressing the Kingdom's e-governance strides.

The Kingdom also achieved a high ranking of 26th internationally.

This makes Bahrain one of two Arab countries to be categorised as 'Very high E-Government Development Index' (EDGI) countries by the UN.

Only 40 countries received the 'Very High in EDGI' classification amongst 193 countries that were evaluated.

Denmark, Australia, and Republic of Korea came out on top of the 40 Top ten countries for e-governance in Asia

Ranked 21st, the UAE was the only Arab country that ranked higher than Bahrain ranking at 21st. The countries that ranked above Bahrain in Asia are Republic of Korea, Singapore, Japan, and the UAE.

It is the only global report that assesses the e-government development status of the 193 UN member states.

"It serves as a tool for countries to learn from each other, identify areas of strength and challenges in e-government and shape their policies and strategies in this area. It is also aimed at facilitating discussions of intergovernmental bodies, including the United Nations General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council, on issues related to e-government and development and to the critical role of ICT in development."

Information and eGovenrment authority Chief Executive Mohamed Ali AlQaed said that the cooperation and efforts from government entities such as the Ministry of Education, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Works, Municipalities Affairs and Urban Planning, Ministry of Labour and Social Development, Ministry of Finance, Supreme Council for Environment and Ministry of Information Affairs helped greatly in propelling Bahrain towards such advancement in the field of e-governance. He said that websites of these government entities were evaluated by the UN for the report.

The Kingdom also achieved fourth position internationally in the Telecoms Infrastructure index (TII) which was part of the UN report. In a statement released yesterday, Transportation and Telecommunication Minister Kamal Ahmed extended his congratulations to His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, His Royal Highness Prime Minister Prince Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa and His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Crown Prince, Deputy Supreme Commander and First Deputy Premier, on Bahrain's achieving fourth place internationally in the Index.
