Tensions with Iran have spiked since May when the Trump administration said it had detected increased Iranian preparations for possible attacks on US forces and interests in the Gulf area.

### **British Airways** suspends flights to Cairo

 $\mathbf{B}^{\mathrm{ritish}}$  Airways suspended flights to Cairo for seven days on Saturday to allow for a security assessment, the airline said.

"We constantly review our security arrangements at all our airports around the world, and have suspended flights to Cairo for seven days as a precaution to allow for further assessment," the statement said.

It added it would never operate an aircraft unless safe to do so. When asked for more details about why flights had been suspended and what security arrangements the airline was reviewing, a spokeswoman for the airline responded: "We never discuss matters of security."

Three Egyptian airport security sources told Reutersthat British staff were checking security at Cairo airport on Wednesday and Thursday.

The British Foreign Office advises against all but essential travel by air to and from the Egyptian resort of Sharm el-Sheikh, but has not issued similar warnings against air travel to and from Cairo.

The Egypt State Information Service could not immediately be reached for comment.

### New Delhi asks Iran to free 18 Indians on seized tanker

### New Delhi. India

'ndia said yesterday it was in touch with Teh-**I**ran to secure the release of 18 of its nationals serving on a British-flagged tanker seized by Iran in the Strait of Hormuz.

The Philippines also said it would ask Iran to free a Filipino crew member on the Swedish-owned Stena Impero which was seized on Friday, as tensions mount in a key waterway for the world's oil supplies.

Raveesh Kumar, spokesman for India's foreign ministry, said that 18 of its nationals were on the ship and said New Delhi was "in touch with the government of Iran to secure (their) early release and repatriation".

The tanker was impounded off Bandar Abbas port for breaking "international maritime rules" after colliding with a fishing boat, Iranian authorities said.

The Philippine toreign aepartment said a Filipino, three Russians and a Latvian were also among the ship's

"(Philippine) Ambassador to Iran Fred Santos is contacting Iranian authorities to seek assurance that the Filipino seafarer is safe and will be released soon," it said, adding the unidentified crew member's family has been notified.

The recruitment agency that supplied the Filipino crew member told Manila there were no reported injuries as the vessel headed for the Iranian coast on Friday, the department added.

Iranian authorities said the tanker has anchored off Bandar Abbas with all its 23 crew aboard.

Britain said a second ship had also been seized in the Persian Gulf -- the Liberian-flagged Mesdar.

The Mesdar's British owner said the vessel had been temporarily boarded by armed personnel, but was free to leave and that all crew were "safe and



### The exploration of space in key dates

### **1957: SPUTNIK**

On October 4, 1957, Moscow launches the first artificial space satellite, Sputnik 1, ushering in the Cold War tussle for the cosmos.

The beach ball-sized aluminium sphere takes 98 minutes to orbit the Earth and sends back the first message from space, simple "beep-beep-beep" radio signals.

On November 3, Sputnik 2 carries the first living being to fully orbit the Earth, a small street dog called Laika. She dies after a few hours.

### 1961: GAGARIN, 1ST MAN

On April 12, 1961, Soviet cosmonaut Yuri Gagarin becomes the first man in space, completing a single, 108-minute orbit.

Twenty-three days later, Alan Shepard is the first American in space when he makes a 15-minute trip on May 5.

The Cold War rivals are only joined in space by a third country in 2003 when China sends up Yang Liwei onboard Earth orbiter Shenzou V.

### 1969: ON MOON On July 21, 1969,

**US astronaut Neil** Armstrong is the first man to step onto the Moon, his teammate **Edwin Aldrin joining** him around 20 minutes later.

Between 1969 and 1972, 12 astronauts -- all American -- walked on the Moon as part of NASA's Apollo program.

### **1971: SPACE STATION**

**On April 19, 1971**, the Soviet Union launches the first orbital space station, Salyut 1. Construction of the stilloperating International Space Station (ISS) starts in 1998. The ISS, in which 16 countries

participate, took over from the Russian space station Mir, which was brought back to Earth in 2001 after 15 years in orbit.

### 1976: MARS

**On July 20, 1976,** US spacecraft Viking 1 becomes the first to successfully land on Mars and send back images of the Red Planet.

The robot Opportunity explored Mars between 2004 and 2018, with NASA's **Curiosity Rover still** active there.

### **1981: SPACE SHUTTLE**

On April 12, 1981, the US space shuttle Columbia, the first reusable manned spacecraft, makes its first voyage.

It is followed by Challenger, Discovery, Atlantis and Endeavour, which serve the ISS until the shuttle programme winds up in 2011.

The United States has since depended on Russia to transport its astronauts to the ISS. Two US shuttles were destroyed in flight, with the loss of 14 astronauts: Challenger in 1986 and Columbia in 2003.

### 1990: **HUBBLE**

#### On April 25, 1990, the Hubble is the first space telescope to be placed into orbit, at 547 kilometres (340 miles) from Earth.

Thirteen metres (42 feet) long, Hubble revolutionises astronomy, allowing scientists to observe the planets and most distant stars and galaxies.

### **Anime studio fire** 'an arson attack', Japan police say

Tokyo, Japan

The horrifying fire at a renowned anime firm which killed dozens in Kyoto is being treated as arson and murder, Japanese police have said, with scores of detectives investigating the deadliest violent crime for decades in the famously safe country.

The blaze on Thursday killed 34 people and wounded dozens more at Kvoto Animation -- well known among fans across the world for its animations of popular manga works -- and left anime fans and insiders shocked and heartbroken.



### Xenophobia sweeping through Turkey's cities

Stoked and exploited by politicians, this sentiment has grave implications for some of the world's most vulnerable people

herumours spread like wildfire, fanned by social media. In June, a Turkish crowd burned down Syrian storefronts in Istanbul's Kucukcekmece district, following an apparent fake news incident in which a local woman was said to have been harassed by Syrian refugees.

In July, after the secular opposition - which is friendlier towards the Assad regime than President Recep Tayyip Erdogan's ruling Justice and Development Party (AKP) - won the Istanbul mayoral elections, viral hashtags on social media demanded that "Syrians get out".

For the most generous of Syria's neighbours in terms of hosting refugees, patience is wearing thin - the result of politicians fuelling and exploiting flames of communal hatred and an economic downturn that has hit ordinary Turks hard.

Turkey hosts the highest total number of refugees in the world. Very few experience the kind of destitution seen in Lebanon, where most refugees are forced to live in crowded tent settlements that flood every winter. Nevertheless, anti-Syrian xenophobia is growing. This sentiment is more dangerous than the kind of prejudice seen in forced return of dispossessed civilians to a barbaric regime.



A report in early 2018 by the International Crisis Group found a rapid increase in inter-communal violence, particularly in Istanbul, Izmir and Ankara. 

### **Equifax close to** \$700m settlement for data breach: report



**Washington, United States** 

Us credit agency Equifax is close to a \$700 million settlement agreement with authorities over the theft of sensitive personal data of nearly 150 million customers, the Wall Street Journal reported.

The company, which gathers data on consumers to help lenders determine borrowers' creditworthiness, revealed in 2017 that hackers had stolen the personal details, including names, dates of birth and social security numbers of nearly half the country.

It prompted the resignation of CEO Richard Smith and several other executives, while chief information officer Jun Ying was charged for insider trading after liquidating his shares when the company discovered the breach.

The deal could be announced as soon as Monday, the paper reported Friday, citing anonymous sources. The amount could still change depending on the number of plaintiffs who join a class action lawsuit against Equifax, they added.

Regulators will also ask the firm to strengthen its control procedures, risk management, and security systems at an additional cost of \$1.25 billion, the report said.

Equifax were sued for having identified but not corrected the breach, having insufficient security systems and delaying reporting the problem.

The incident prompted a public outcry and a congressional probe.

### Lebanon parliament passes 2019 austerity budget

The vote came nearly two months after cabinet approved the budget, which is expected to trim Lebanon's deficit to 7.59 per cent of gross domestic product -- a nearly 4-point drop from the previous year.

The deficit was 11.2pc of GDP

Lebanon is one of the world's most indebted countries, with public debt estimated at 141 percent of GDP in 2018, according to credit ratings agency Moody's.



### **China Southern Airlines to receive** \$4 billion capital injection

**↑**hina Southern Airlines Will carry out an equity diversification plan that will involve the injection of 30 billion yuan (\$4.36 billion) of capital from three inves-Saturday.

The Guangdong Hengjian Investment Holding Corporation, the Guangzhou Urban Construction Investment Group and the Shenzhen Penghang Equity Investment Fund will each inject 10 billion yuan into the airline, as part of the country's efforts to diversify ownership structures among state-owned firms.

The move will significantly improve the company's debt-to-asset ratio, generate funds for its growth and help modernize its decision-making mechanisms, the announcement said.

It will also use the funds to serve its main air transportation business, pay for construction related to China's Belt and Road Initiative and support aviation development in cities in the southern province of Guangdong.

China Southern is one of 96 enterprises owned and administered directly by the central government.

The US Department of Transportation (DOT) on Friday granted American Airlines Group Inc and Oantas Airways Ltd final approval to operate a joint venture after a prior effort was rejected in 2016.

The department last month had issued an order tentatively approving the agreement and granting antitrust immunity to the airlines covering international service.

**US Transportation Secretary** Elaine Chao announced the approval on Friday afternoon, noting it was the first completed review of an airline joint venture proposal during the Trump administration

Algeria sink Senegal to claim 'incredible' second **Africa Cup of Nations title**

aghdad Bounedjah's early goal propelled Algeria to a first Africa Cup of Nations title in 29 years after a fiery 1-0 victory over Sadio Mane's Senegal in Friday's final

Bounedjah gave Algeria a dream start in the second minute when his deflected shot looped over Senegal goalkeeper Alfred Gomis, and it proved enough for the 1990 champions to lift the trophy on foreign soil for the first time.

"It's incredible. The win is for the whole country," Algeria goalkeeper Rais M'Bolhi told beIN Sports. "We have to thank (coach) Djamel Belmadi. The situation was tricky in the past before he arrived."

"It's a bit hard to soak in right now but I think we'll realise what we've

For Senegal, who lost to Algeria by the same scoreline in the group stage, the long wait for a first continental crown goes on as coach Aliou Cisse, the captain of the 2002 runners-up, again fell short in the final.
