# 13 Chinese tourists killed as bus plunges into ravine in Laos

Bangkok, Thailand

At least 13 Chinese tourists were killed and dozens iniured when their bus skidded off the road and plunged 30 metres into a ravine in Laos, a police officer said yesterday.

The bus was carrying more than 40 Chinese nationals heading towards the tourist town of Luang Prabang when the accident occurred late on

"At this moment, 13 bodies have been recovered... while two are still missing," police officer Xaiyaphon Chitavong said, blaming brake failure for the accident.

He added that 31 people were receiving medical treat-

# **Turkey warns Syria** 'not to play with fire'

Ankara, Turkey

urkey warned Damascus yesterday "not to play with fire" a day after a Turkish military convoy was cut off by an air strike in north-

"The regime should not play with fire... As we have previously said, we will do whatever is necessary to ensure the security of our soldiers and observation posts," Foreign Minister Mevlut Cavusoglu told reporters in

But, he added, "we hope it does not reach that point".

The Turkish military convoy of around 50 armoured vehicles had entered the Idlib province on Monday heading towards the key town of Khan Sheikhun, where Russian-supported regime forces are fighting to retake the area from jihadists and

The Turkish defence ministry said that an air strike hit, killing three civilians and wounding 12.

But the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, a UK-based monitor, said a Russian air strike hit a rebel vehicle leading the convoy just outside the town of Maaret al-Noman, 15 kilometres (nine miles) north of Khan Sheikhun.

Cavusoglu said the convoy's "duty was to ensure the safety of a Turkish observation post", adding that Ankara had "no intention to move our ninth observation post".

Disgraced financier Jeffrey Epstein wrote a will two days before he died, puttinghis \$578 million in assets into a trust with unnamed beneficiaries, the New York Post reported Monday.

Epstein, a wealthy hedge fund manager who befriended many politicians and celebrities over the years, hung himself in prison on August 10 as he awaited trial on sex trafficking

On August 8, he signed a last will and testament filed in the Virgin Islands, where he owned a private island, transferring his wealth into "The 1953 Trust," the Post reported.

It posted a copy of the will online showing that Epstein claimed he had more than \$56.5 million in cash, equities of over

**Epstein was convicted in** 2008 in a Florida state court of paying young girls for sexual massages at his Palm Beach mansion.

He served just 13 months in jail over the Florida charges under a plea deal struck by the then-federal prosecutor in the state, Alex Acosta, who was forced to resign as US labor secretary over the issue

\$300 million as well as a fixed income of more than \$14 mil-

Epstein also listed six luxury properties, including in New York, Florida and Paris and more than \$18 million in "aviation assets, automobiles and boats," the Post

The document did not name any listed beneficiaries. Bloomberg News reported that the move could make it more difficult for Epstein's alleged victims to sue his estate.

Several women have filed lawsuits seeking damages for sexual abuse.

Epstein was accused of trafficking girls as young as 14 for sex. He denied the charges but faced up to 45 years in jail if found guilty.

The Post's report came as The New York Times released new details about Epstein's final days in Manhattan's high-security Metropolitan Correctional

Citing sources, the newspaper said he hated his vermin-infested cell so much that he paid for lawyers to meet him for up to 12 hours a day in a different

He rarely washed and slept on the floor instead of his bed, they said.

The US Justice Department and the FBI are investigating how one of America's most high-profile prisoners was able to kill himself just weeks after an apparent earlier suicide at-

#### **Duterte to visit Beijing** Manila, Philippines

President Rodrigo Duterte will visit Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping next week to raise their conflicting claims to the South China Sea, as the Filipino leader faces pressure at home to confront Beijing.

While Duterte has embraced China and had largely set aside a oncetense standoff over the resource-rich waterway, a series of confrontations have stoked domestic discontent.

Duterte heads to China on August 28 and is due to return to the Philippines on September 2, his spokesman, Salvador Panelo, told journalists yesterday.

### Five held in France for urging attacks on G7 police

Paris, France

rench authorities arrest-P ed five people accused of encouraging attacks on a hotel slated to accommodate police during this weekend's G7 summit in Biarritz, a source close to the inquiry said yesterday.

The arrests occurred on Monday morning, just days ahead of the summit chaired by French President Emmanuel Macron who will from Saturday host the likes of Donald Trump, Angela Merkel and Boris Johnson in the glitzy resort in southwestern France.

Several of the suspects are young members of radical anti-capitalist groups known as "black blocs" which played a major role in violent street protests that rocked Paris and other French cities over the last months.

The investigation was triggered after a woman living in the area posted a message online pinpointing a hotel where gendarmes policing the summit will
