## Trump calls for Fed governor to resign, widening pressure on central bank

Us President Donald Trump called Wednesday for Federal Reserve Governor Lisa Cook to step down, expanding pressure on the central bank after recent criticism of Fed Chair Jerome Powell for not lowering interest rates sooner.

"Cook must resign, now!!!" Trump wrote on his Truth Social platform, while sharing a Bloomberg news report on how the Federal Housing Finance Agency's director has called for greater scrutiny of Cook over a pair of mortgages.

FHFA director Bill Pulte -- a staunch ally of Trump's -- had reportedly written a letter to the US Attorney General calling for an investigation of Cook while suggesting that she might have committed a criminal offense.

It was not immediately clear if such a probe will take place.

The Trump administration has pursued allegations of mortgage fraud against high-profile Democrats who are seen as political adversaries of the president.

The US leader's targeting of Cook, who sits on the central bank's rate-setting committee, comes after his repeated broadsides against Powell while the Fed kept the benchmark lending rate unchanged this year.

Cook took office as a Fed governor in May 2022 and was reappointed to the board in September 2023. She was sworn in later that same month for a term ending in 2038.

Cook has previously served on the Council of Economic Advisers under former president Barack Obama. In recent months, Trump has called Powell a "numbskull" and "moron" as the central bank held rates steady to monitor the effects of US tariffs on inflation.

### **Hackers access data** of 850,000 Orange **Belgium customers** Brussels. Belgium

Telecoms provider Or-▲ ange Belgium said Wednesday it was hit by a cyberattack that saw hackers access the data of 850,000 customers.

No critical data was compromised in the end-of-July incident, the firm said, explaining that its clients' passwords, email addresses, bank and financial details were not affected.

"However, the hacker gained access to one of our IT systems containing the following data: surname. first name, telephone number, SIM card number, PUK code, tariff plan," it said in a statement.

"As soon as the incident was detected, our teams blocked access to the affected system and tightened our security measures."
