Dr. Nassif welcomed the ART delegation and reviewed with them the status of the Full-Cycle Catalyst Management (FCM) services for the new Bapco residue hydrocracking unit known as 1RHCU, which is one of the key components in the Bapco Modernisation Programme (BMP), through which Bapco aims to boost the processing capacity of Bahrain's oil refinery from 267,000 to 380,000 barrels per day. Bapco awarded a five-year contract for residue hydrocracking unit services to ART, a joint venture between Grace and Chevron, which is a leading supplier of hydroprocessing catalysts.
