Four-star boutique hotels, Tax standards, security services

Tender board opens 133 bids for 17 tenders

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Bahrain's National Bureau for Revenue is looking forward to purchasing IT solutions for the implementation of International Taxation standards.

The deal is according to a tender placed by the Bureau with the Tender Board of Bahrain.

The board announced that three companies are competing for the contract for which the lowest bidder is Digimap Ltd and the highest bidder is BearingPoint International IT Solutions Center.

Digimap Ltd quoted BHD 252,500.000, and BearingPoint International IT Solutions Center is asking BHD 1,841,750.000 to take up the work.

The move emerged as the tender board opened 133 bids received for 17 tenders placed by various ministries and authorities in the Kingdom.

Two 4 star Boutique hotels

Bilaj Al-Jazayer Real estate development company is planning to construct two four-star boutique hotels and Beach Club at Bilaj Al Jazayer.

The company's tender to award the contract found 24 takers. However, the tender board website says, it suspended 14 of them. Bid values are also not disclosed.

Bilaj Al-Jazayer also had another tender seeking security

ty and safety services at Bilaj Al Jazayer (private and public beach).

Ten interested parties came forward, of which three stands rejected. The highest bidder is Almoayyed Security (BHD 406,350.000), and the lowest bidder is Kingdom Security Protection Services WLL (BHD 105,386.400)

Gulf-Air catering

Gulf Air, who actively places tenders, this week is seeking catering uplift services on board the plane at John F. Kennedy International Airport, New York, USA.

The tender board said it received four bids but suspended three of them. LSG Group is the only qualified bidder.

Ministry needs security-guards

It also emerged the Works Ministry had some openings for security guards for safeguarding its premises. Twelve parties came forward with Bahrain

Guarding Solutions SPC owned by Mohamed Alrayes quoting BD 637,200.000 emerged as the lowest. Almoayyed Security's BHD 1,075,032.000 is the highest bidder.

Radiology devices for Askar Health centre

Health Ministry said it is looking forward to equipping the new Khalifa Health centre in Askar with radiology devices.

Tender for the process attracted nine bidders. Wellflow Gulf Trading WLL's BHD 39,244.000 was the lowest quote, and Yousuf Mahmood Husain WLL's BHD 147,841.020 the highest.

Ministry purchasing hardware

Ministry of Finance and National Economy's tender for purchasing computer hardware, licensed software and extended warranty attracted 11 bidders. BHD 1,139,055.960 quoted by Universal Enterprises emerged as the lowest.

Carpenters

The committee said five companies competed for a contract by the Bahrain Authority for Culture and Antiquities to provide workers for the carpentry workshop and maintain them for two years. Durrat Al Muharraq Cleaning & Maintenance's BHD 130,132.800 was the lowest bid.

LMRA cleaning logistics

Labour market Regulatory Authority has some opening for providing logistics and cleaning services for which 17 companies competed. Basma marble and granite quoted the lowest bid of BHD 19,422.900 and MC6 Industrial Services the highest bid of BHD 997,804.800.

BAPCO contracts

In the oil and gas sector, the committee opened three bids for a tender by the Bahrain Petroleum Company (Bapco) for the sale and removal of a basement barge and its spare parts.

Bapco also had two other contracts: a five year purchase agreement for catalyst dumping and recharging of NO:2 Poly Plant Reactors and a three-year contract for non-destructive inspection services. First one received four bids and the second one nine bids.

Wanted ambulance nurses

The committee opened two tenders for Tatweer Petroleum, the first for providing medical services and ambulance nurses for three years, for which received four bids. The second was for the supply of Emerson flowmeter or equivalent, also received four bids.

Edama leasing property

Moreover, the committee opened a bid for Bahrain Real Estate Investment Company (Edama) for leasing a property in Hamad Town with an area of 1,781.8 square meters. The tender attracted two bids.

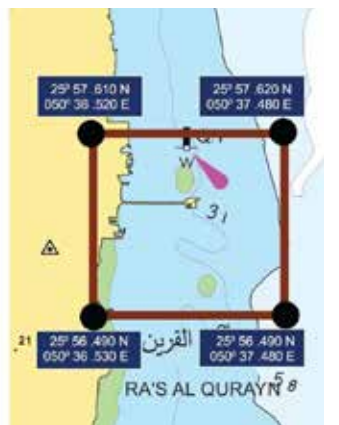
No entry to Ra's Al Qurayn

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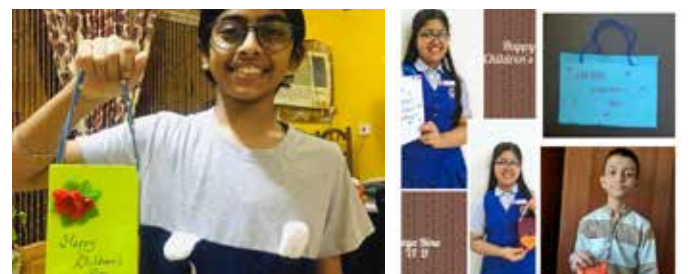
The Coast Guard Command has placed Ra's Al Qurayn as a restricted area for the next three months, starting Thursday.
