37 die in violent start to **Uganda's election season**

◆ At least thirty-seven people died in violent clashes between Ugandan



security forces and supporters of opposition presidential candidate Bobi Wine this week, marking a particularly violent start to the country's election season. "Two days of protests were sparked by Wine's arrest ahead of a political rally in the run-up to January 14's election, in which he is seen as the main challenger to President Yoweri Museveni, who is seeking to extend his 36-year rule.

Authorities in Central America recovered more bodies from landslides triggered by hurricane lota, which battered the impoverished region this week, the second deadly storm to roar through this month. The number of reported deaths rose to more than 40 across Central America and Colombia, and the toll is expected to rise as rescue workers reach isolated communities. Most of the deaths occurred in Nicaragua and Honduras.

Former leader Corbyn suspended as Labour MP for three months

Jeremy Corbyn will be suspended as a Labour member of Parliament for three months as the party faces calls to launch a new investigation. the Telegraph reported. Corbyn was informed that the duration of the suspension could be reviewed depending on his actions, suggesting it could be shortened or extended depending on whether he issued an apology, the report added, citing sources. Corbyn was suspended from the party in October in

light of his comments after a report said the party was responsible for unlawful harassment and discrimination in its handling of allegations of anti-Semitism.

The US government put convicted rapist and murderer Orlando Hall to death by lethal injection, the eighth execution under the Trump administration since capital punishment was reinstated at the federal level **over the summer.** Hall, 49, was pronounced dead at 11:47 p.m. EST after officials at the US Bureau of Prisons administered him a fatal dose of the barbiturate pentobarbital at the bureau's execution chamber in Terre Haute, Indiana.

Azerbaijan troops enter first district handed over by Armenia

Nagorno-Karabakh handed back by Armenian separatists after almost 30 years as part of a Russian-brokered peace deal to end weeks of brutal fighting in the region. Troops moved into the district of Aghdam, one of three due to be handed back, the Azerbaijan defence ministry said, a day after columns of Armenian soldiers and tanks rolled out of the territory.



South Korean promoter was Aordered to compensate fans after Juventus superstar Cristiano Ronaldo failed to play an exhibition match as promised.

The five-time Ballon d'Or winner stayed on the bench throughout a 3-3 draw with a K-League all-stars team in July last year, despite the pleas and anger of a sell-out 65,000 crowd at the Seoul World Cup Stadium.

Match promoter The Fasta had run adverts promising the Portuguese striker would play.
