Hollywood star Matthew McConaughey wants to start his career in stand-up comedy. According to him, he was planning a comedy tour before the pandemic.

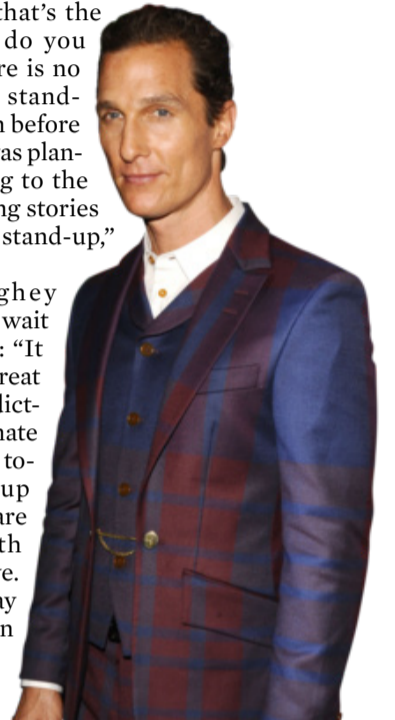
He wanted to try his career as a comic because he loves the "no-filter communication" provided by humour.

"I haven't shared this with many people but stand up is a no-filter communication. What I do as an actor, which is why I'm interested in doing stand up, is my raw expression goes through four filters before it gets to the screen," McConaughey said on "The Russell Howard Hour", reports femalefirst.co.uk.

"I'm doing someone else's script,

I'm being directed by someone else, I'm being filmed by someone else, I'm being edited by someone else before it's put in a capsule and put in front of you on screen. That's four filters from my original expression. So that's the goal. Where do you go where there is no filter? That's stand-up. So the plan before Covid was, I was planning on taking to the road and telling stories in an hour of stand-up," he added.

McConaughey says he cannot wait to get started: "It sounds like a great thing to be addicted to, the ultimate buzz. You look to-day at stand-up comics, they are the best truth tellers we have. If I can get away with this, then I'd love to."

Elton John wants to "normalise the conversation" around mental health.

The 'Tiny Dancer' hitmaker has joined a campaign run by MAN magazine to speak out about mental health alongside a host of other celebrity faces, which has been set up to raise awareness about the stigma

surrounding the topic, particularly in men, for International Men's Day on Thursday.

In a message to those suffering with their mental health, Elton told the publication: "You are not alone and you are loved. This has been an unprecedented year but I want you to know that it is okay to admit you are struggling and need some help. We need to talk about mental health to normalise the conversation, especially with men."

"I am thinking of you if you are struggling and hope you find

healing love and support."

Other celebrities taking part in the campaign include presenter, comedian, and actor Stephen Fry, footballer Harry Kane, and tennis superstar Sir Andy Murray.

Stephen said: "You're not alone in your struggle, however much you may feel it now. Trust me when I say the day will come when you will hug yourself for winning the struggle and staying up and on your feet. Damn it's hard, but damn it's worth it."

Whilst Harry added: "I want to encourage anyone suffering from mental health issues to seek the support they need. There's no shame in it. We all need to ask for help sometimes."

The publication also featured an interview with actor and comedian Russell Brand - who has battled with his mental health in the past, as well as with addiction - who said he managed to overcome his own struggles by developing an "awareness" for his actions.

Justin penned down a powerful message for his fans, describing the love he shares with God. "Jesus rose from the dead just as he promised, taking on the

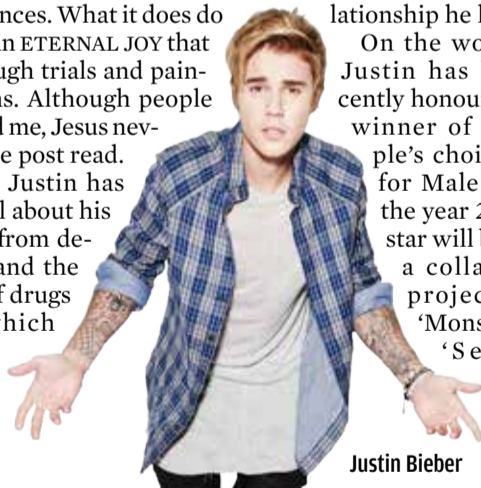

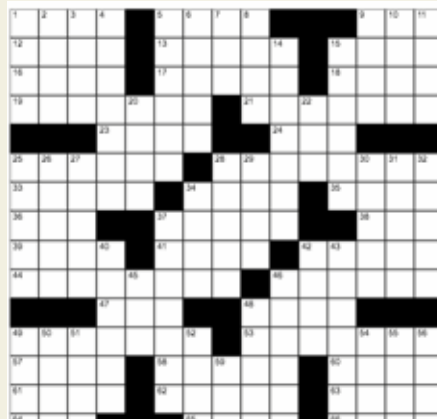
