At stumps on the third day, the West Indies were 381-6, still 194 runs behind with Hodge unbeaten on 109 and Anderson Phillip at the other end on 12.

The 32-year-old Hodge crawled to his century off 224 balls, hitting 12 boundaries and being dropped on 74 by Daryl Mitchell off Ajaz Patel.

It took him 33 balls to get through the 90s, including a long stoppage on 97 after he was hit a painful blow in the box by a Michael Rae delivery.

India drops Shubman Gill T20 World Cup squad

T ndian selectors dropped Test **⊥** and ODI captain Shubman Gill yesterday from the T20 squad for the World Cup in February after a prolonged form slump.

Gill, 26, has scored only 291 runs in his past 15 matches in the game's shortest format at an average of 24.25.

"Shubman Gill is short of runs at the moment," chief selector Ajit Agarkar told reporters in Mumbai.

However, batter Suryakumar Yadav was retained as captain despite similar concerns over
