Eco expansion

Renewable energy makes up 1.5% of Bahrain's 20,000 gigawatt-hours of annual power output

The Electricity and Water Authority says the Bahrain generates about 20,000 gigawatt-hours of electricity a year, with renewables making up around 1.5 per cent of that total, as work continues to raise clean power's share in the overall energy mix.

Replying to a parliamentary question from MP Ahmed Al Salloom, the authority said the National Renewable Energy Plan, approved by the Cabinet in 2017, aims to lift the share of renewables to 20 per cent by 2035.

It linked the target to Bahrain Economic Vision 2030 and the goal of reaching carbon neutrality by 2060.

The authority said around 372 renewable projects, with total capacity of more than 141 megawatts, have been brought into operation so far.

Another 54 distributed projects are being developed, with total capacity expected to approach 500 megawatts in the coming years, alongside solar power plants planned for different sites.

Projects

It said it is keeping pace with technical and technological advances in renewables, reviewing options to raise their share in the energy mix, and upgrading its electronic systems so the grid can absorb renewable systems more effectively.

That work, it added, is intended to speed up applications to connect renewable systems. On solar generation, the authority said it is working on projects totalling 500 megawatts.

Model

This includes an expansion of the Al Dur Renewable Energy Station under a utility-scale model, described as being under implementation with capacity of about 100 megawatts.

It also said it has issued a tender to develop and deliver Bahrain's first solar power plant through a strategic partnership with the private sector, with production capacity of around 150 megawatts, while coordinating with private firms to build privately owned central power plants with total capacity of about 250 megawatts.

It said limited land availability for large central projects is being addressed through measures in the national plan that promote distributed renewable systems on rooftops, buildings, facilities and car parks, alongside ongoing checks of open areas for utility-scale photovoltaic farms.

and licensing under international standards.

Study

The authority said it has launched a 2-megawatt pilot wind project and is working on a feasibility study for a floating wind farm.

It added that it is also studying the scope to expand wind power within the energy mix, but said current data shows it is not economically viable because costs are high.

It said it is also running ongoing assessment studies of newer energy sources that could be added to the energy mix in future, including small modular reactors, noting that these are still in development and trial stages globally and have not yet been used on a wide commercial scale.

Designs, it added, are still moving through development

and licensing under international standards.

Requests

The authority said around 70 rooftop solar projects have been installed on homes so far, and it is seeing a rise in residential requests to connect solar systems, alongside awareness campaigns on renewables.

It pointed to net metering as a main incentive, under Ministerial Decision No. 2 of 2017 on net metering for renewable sources connected to the national electricity grid.

The authority said the policy allows households and premises to install renewable systems, use the power generated to meet their own needs, and export surplus electricity to the grid in return for bill credits equal to the amount exported.

MPs push for Bahrainisation in public pharmacies

Bahrain should restrict ownership of public pharmacies to Bahraini citizens, MPs have said in an urgent proposal that also calls for stronger checks on professional practice and a higher Bahrainisation rate in the sector.

The proposal asks the government to regulate the pharmacy profession and public pharmacy centres in a way that limits ownership to Bahrainis, strengthens professional oversight and increases the share of Bahrainis working in pharmacy.

MP Khalid Saleh Buanaq, one of the sponsors, said the request focuses on enforcing Article 27 of Decree-Law No. 18 of 1997 on regulating the pharmacy profession and pharmacy centres.

Licences

He said the article limits public pharmacy licences to Bahraini citizens and Bahraini companies.

"This proposal is centred on reaffirming the effective enforcement of Article (27)," Buanaq said.

He said the law also requires each pharmacy to be run by a licensed pharmacist, bars a pharmacist.

Reform review

Shura to discuss private education law and proposed cybercrime amendment

The Shura Council will discuss, at its twentieth session in the fourth session of the sixth legislative term, to be held today, the first supplementary report of the Services Committee on a draft law amending certain provisions of Decree-Law No. (25) of 1998 concerning private educational and training institutions.

The draft law, submitted by the Council of Representatives, includes a recommendation from the committee not to approve it in principle.

According to the memorandum of the Legislation and Legal Opinion Authority, the draft law aims to give priority to employing qualified Bahraini nationals in educational positions within the private sector.

Review

The committee explained in its report that during its review of the draft law, Law No. (4) of 2026 on private educational institutions was issued on January 28, 2026.

Article Five of the issuance

articles states that all provisions related to private educational institutions in Decree-Law No. (25) of 1998 are repealed, along with any text that contradicts the new law.

The committee noted that, in light of this legislative development, the objective of the draft law relates to provisions that are no longer in force regarding

private educational institutions. As for private training institutions, data provided by the Ministry of Labour showed that the Bahrainization rate among licensed trainers reached 93.12% in 2024, while the overall Bahrainization rate for licensed trainers stood at 74%.

This indicates that the intended goal of the draft law has al-

ready been achieved in practice through existing policies and regulations.

The Council will also discuss the report of the Foreign Affairs, Defence and National Security Committee on a proposal to add a new Article (10 bis) to Law No. (60) of 2014 on Cybercrime.

The proposal was submitted by members Ali Hussein Al Shi-

habi, Jamal Mohammed Fakhro, Dr. Mohammed Ali Hassan Ali, Khalid Hussein Al Maskati and Dalal Jassim Al Zayed.

The committee recommended rejecting the proposal.

Memorandum

According to its explanatory memorandum, the proposal seeks to criminalize the use of information technology systems to produce, alter, circulate, distribute, publish or make available audio or visual content that could subject others to contempt or punishment, harm family reputation, or be committed for an unlawful purpose.

The committee stated that existing criminal provisions already provide sufficient protection against the misuse of deepfake technologies, making a new specific criminal article unnecessary.

Deepfake refers to the use of artificial intelligence and machine learning technologies to create or modify digital audio or visual content in a way that falsely represents real persons or events and is difficult to distinguish from reality.

Sigh of relief

Man cleared of stealing former wife's gold and electronic devices

A man has been acquitted of stealing his ex-wife's gold jewellery and electronic devices after a court found there was no evidence to support her claim.

The woman went to a police station and accused her former husband of taking her gold jewellery, a mobile phone, an electronic watch and wireless earphones.

The Lower Criminal Court cleared him, lawyer Taqi Hussain said.

Proof

In its judgment, the court said it may acquit if it is not satisfied the charge has been properly pinned on the accused, or if the proof is not enough.

It added that an acquittal does not require a judge to answer every piece of prosecution material, so long as doubt has crept into the case.

Prosecutors relied mainly on the woman's statement in the information-gathering record, where she said her ex-husband stole the items.

But the man told police the phone, watch and earphones

were gifts from her.

Home

As for the gold, he said she left it at home after the pair fell out, and that he did not object to handing it back.

The court said the basis put forward to show theft did not satisfy it and did not amount to proof strong enough for a conviction.

It found the papers held no certain evidence that the man had carried out the theft alleged.

It also said the woman's claim was not backed by supporting proof, and could not stand

alone.

The man's statement, it added, did not show acts that meet the elements of theft, given his account that some items were gifted and that the gold had been left in the home.

Belief

After weighing the case, the court said it could not form a firm belief that the offence had been made out.

It therefore acquitted the man under Article 255 of the Criminal Procedure Code.

The ruling was delivered in open court, clearing the defendant of the charge.

Social insurance amendment set for discussion

Proposed amendments to the Social Insurance Law are scheduled for discussion during the Nineteenth Ordinary Session of the Fourth Annual meeting of the Sixth Legislative Chapter, placing social protection mechanisms back at the centre of parliamentary focus.

The draft amendment, submitted by MPs Maryam Hassan Al Sayegh, Najeeb Hamad Al Kawari, Hassan Ebrahim Hassan, Jameel Mal Hassan and Mohamed Moosa Mohamed, seeks to revise Article 2 of the Social Insurance Law issued

under Decree Law No 24 of 1976.

The proposal has been reviewed by the Services Committee, which prepared its report ahead of deliberations in the chamber.

Provisions

Although detailed provisions will be clarified during debate, the amendment is positioned within broader efforts to enhance social security frameworks and reinforce financial safeguards for beneficiaries.

Lawmakers are expected to evaluate whether the suggested revisions strengthen coverage parameters and administrative

clarity within the existing system.

The return of social insurance to the legislative agenda reflects sustained parliamentary attention to income stability, pension mechanisms and long term social protection policies.

MPs are likely to examine the proposal's fiscal implications alongside its intended social impact.

As the session convenes, the discussion is expected to balance sustainability considerations with the objective of ensuring continued support for insured citizens under Bahrain's social protection framework.

Unify rules for unused government land 'takeover'

An urgent parliamentary proposal calls on the government to adopt one clear process for residents seeking to add small government-owned corners and strips of land beside their homes, with Dumistan's Block 1022 named as a case where applications have sat unresolved for years.

The request was submitted by MPs Munir Seroor, Zainab AbdulAmeer, Hassan Bukhammas, Hanan Fardan and Mohammed Salman Al Ahmed.

It says residents in several areas have repeatedly written to authorities asking to annex

adjoining plots that are often unused in practice.

According to the explanatory memorandum, many of these spaces sit next to existing houses and, in many cases, their addition would not affect zoning plans, public services or the public road.

The memo also says there is often no objection from neighbours.

The MPs say letters exchanged between the relevant bodies show there is no clear, flexible mechanism for handling these requests, which has left files delayed for long periods.

They link the issue to housing pressure and family needs, particularly for lower-income households.

The proposal asks the government, through the Ministry of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture, the Ministry of Housing and Urban Planning and other relevant bodies, to agree a single mechanism for reviewing requests to annex unused government land adjoining existing homes.

Maghrib begins with dates

As Maghrib approaches each evening, date stalls and specialty shops across Bahrain experience intense demand, with families keen to secure the finest varieties ahead of Ramadan gatherings. A field tour conducted by The Daily Tribune observed steady crowds selecting premium boxes and bulk quantities, reaffirming the date's central place at every iftar table.

Dates are more than a customary way to break the fast. They represent heritage, hospitality and continuity in a country long known as the "Land of a Million Palm Trees".

Production

According to the Ministry of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture, Bahrain produced approximately 14,000 tonnes of dates and related products in 2024.

This figure reflects sustained efforts to develop the palm and date sector, reinforcing

the Kingdom's standing among regional producers.

Officials note that palm cultivation is deeply rooted in Bahrain's history, with dates serving as a pillar of food security for centuries.

Beyond nutrition, the palm tree shaped daily life, as its fronds and fibres were used to craft baskets, fans, ropes, cages and even fishing tools.

Varieties

Among the most sought after local varieties is Khalas, particularly the premium "Royal Khalas", retailing between BD2.500 and BD3.500 per kilogram.

Kheneizi, often described as the "Queen of Bahrain's palms", ranges from BD3.000 to BD4.000 per kilogram.

Ajwa is priced between BD4.500 and BD6.000, while Medjool averages BD5.000 to BD7.000 per kilogram.

With supply remaining stable, traders say the surge is driven not by shortage, but by devotion to a tradition that begins, quietly and faithfully, with a single date at sunset.

Dawn blast begins fast

Traditional cannonfire's deep boom across Bahrain echoes Ramadan spirit

Over the past few days since the start of Ramadan, a deep, resonant boom has echoed across Bahrain, marking the rhythm of the holy month.

The Ramadan cannon, once a wartime tool, now signals the start of fasting in the morning and Iftar at sunset, uniting communities through faith, tradition, and heritage.

At the heart of this centuries-old practice are the officers from the Ministry of Interior.

Usually, three to four officers are assigned per cannon, and from their perspective, they are not merely performing a duty - they are torchbearers of a cherished heritage.

Safety

Coordinating closely with their chief, they ensure each blast is ceremonial, precise, and meaningful, with pride visible in their eyes as they carry the city's shared tradition forward, while also ensuring the safety of spectators around them.

Across Manama, Muharraq, Northern, and Southern governorates, the cannon is fired with precision each day throughout Ramadan.

Ten minutes before Fajr, its echo reminds residents that the fast is about to begin.

As evening descends, 15 seconds before Maghrib, it signals the joyful moment to break the fast, carrying across rooftops, alleys, and open squares.

Iftar

In Manama and Muharraq, the cannon is fired both at dawn and dusk, while in the Northern

and Southern governorates, it is fired only at Maghrib to mark Iftar.

Each shot carries its own significance, eight shots mark the official start of Ramadan after the Maghrib prayer, a single shot signals Iftar, and another marks Imsak, the pre-dawn start of the fast.

At the month's end, the tradition culminates with eight shots at the sighting of the Eid

crescent and a final eight-shot salute on Eid Al-Fitr.

Even in an age of digital reminders, the cannon's boom remains the most authentic way to unite the community, bridging past and present.

Each resounding blast carries whispers of centuries, the pulse of the city, and the quiet joy of Ramadan, still thrilling both locals and expats alike.

Brazil, India ink critical minerals deal as leaders meet

India and Brazil agreed to boost cooperation on critical minerals and rare earths yesterday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said after talks in New Delhi with Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva.

"The agreement on critical minerals and rare earths is a major step towards building resilient supply chains," Modi said.

Brazil has the world's second-largest reserves of critical minerals, which are used in everything from electric vehicles, solar panels and smartphones to jet engines and guided missiles.

India, seeking to cut its dependence on top exporter China, has been expanding domestic production and recycling while scouting for new suppliers.

"Increasing investments and cooperation in matters of renewable energies and critical minerals is at the core of the pioneering agreement that we have signed today," Lula said.

The details of the deal were not immediately available but a senior Indian foreign ministry official said official discussions were underway.

"President Lula gave a very detailed presentation on Brazil's substantial critical minerals and rare earth reserves," P. Kumaran told reporters at a media briefing.

"He said only 30 percent of

their reserves have been explored and that there is substantial scope for exploration, processing minerals and also using them."

'Reflection of trust'

Nine other agreements and memoranda of understanding were finalised on Saturday, covering digital cooperation, health, entrepreneurship and other fields.

"Brazil is India's largest trade partner in Latin America. We are committed to taking our bilateral trade beyond \$20 billion in the coming five years," Modi said.

"Our trade is not just a figure, but a reflection of trust."

Lula, who arrived in New Delhi on Wednesday for a summit on artificial intelligence, is accompanied by a delegation of

more than a dozen ministers as well as business leaders.

On Saturday, he was given a ceremonial welcome and paid tribute to India's independence hero Mahatma Gandhi, before holding the meeting with Modi.

Modi said that "our cooperation in the defence sector is also continuously growing," hailing a "win-win partnership".

"When India and Brazil work together, the voice of Global South becomes stronger and more confident."

Speaking at a business forum later in the day, Lula said Brazil was ready to cooperate in one of the world's largest global defence markets.

"We do not want only to sell," he said. "We want to buy, invest, and consolidate our presence in India, with technology transfer and training of personnel."

◆ **Libya's Prime Minister**

Abdulhamid Dbeibah has undergone "successful" treatment at a heart hospital, his office said Saturday, but his specific ailment was not disclosed. "I assure you that I am fine, by God's grace," said statement posted on social media overnight. The treatment was carried out at a facility in the northwestern Libyan city of Misrata on an undisclosed date. Dbeibah said he later travelled abroad for "additional medical checkups for reassurance", though this was not the primary reason for his trip. Italian media outlets previously reported he had been admitted to a leading cardiac facility in Milan on Thursday for a general check-up.

◆ **At least three dead as migrant boat capsizes off Greek island**

involving a commercial ship, authorities said Friday. Twenty migrants were rescued by the commercial vessel which was directed to the area on the orders of the Greek Search and Rescue Center. Most of them were Egyptians and Sudanese, and there were four minors among them, the Athens News Agency reported. According to Greek public broadcaster ERT, an accident occurred when the vessel approached the migrants' wooden boat. As the passengers tried to climb up ladders into the vessel a sudden movement caused the small boat to capsize. The search for survivors was continuing with four patrol boats, an aircraft, and two ships from the European border agency Frontex, a spokesperson for the Greek coast guard told AFP.

◆ **The bodies of three migrants** were picked up in waters off the Greek island of Crete during a rescue effort

◆ **Armed men killed** at least 38 people in the village of Dutse Dan Ajiya in Nigeria's northwestern Zamfara State, local police and authorities said yesterday. The attack occurred in the night of Thursday into Friday in the remote village, which had "few access routes" said Yazid Abubakar, spokesperson for the Zamfara police, adding: "Right now, normalcy has been restored in the area."

At least 38 killed in armed attack in north-west Nigeria

According to Hamisu Faru, a local legislator, who reported 50 deaths from the attack, "the bandits came from Gando forest. They laid siege on Dutse Dan Ajiya and opened indiscriminate fire, killing any resident who tried to flee." Armed gangs, locally called "bandits", are based in forests straddling the states of Zamfara, Katsina, Kaduna, Sokoto, Kebbi, and Niger, from where they launch attacks on villages. The Nigerian army has deployed to the region for several years to combat these groups, but the violence continues. The rising violence by jihadist groups and bandits in Nigeria in recent months has drawn the attention of the United States.

Trump hikes US global tariff rate to 15%

President Donald Trump praised the global duty on imports into the United States to 15 percent on Saturday, doubling down on his promise to maintain his aggressive tariff policy a day after the Supreme Court ruled much of it illegal.

Trump said on his Truth Social platform that after a thorough review of Friday's "extraordinarily anti-American decision" by the court to rein in his tariff program, the administration was hiking the import levies "to the fully allowed, and legally tested, 15% level."

The US leader had announced an initial 10 percent duty in the immediate aftermath of the Supreme Court ruling.

And Trump added that over the next few months, his administration would seek further alternative ways to impose "legally permissible" tariffs.

Saturday's announcement is the latest in a careening process that has seen a multitude of tariff levels for countries sending goods into the United States set and then altered or revoked by Trump's team over the past year.

It also appears on its face to be an attempt to circumvent the Supreme Court's

latest ruling, which offered perhaps the firmest rebuke yet of the Republican leader's sweeping and often arbitrary duties, his signature international trade policy.

The new duty by law is only temporary -- allowable for 150 days. According to a White House fact sheet, exemptions remain for sectors that are under separate probes, including pharma, and goods entering the US under the US-Mexico-Canada agreement.

Trump spent much of the past year imposing various rates to cajole and punish countries, both friend and foe.

On Friday, the White House said US trading partners that reached separate tariff deals with Trump's administration would also face the new global tariff.

The conservative-majority high court ruled six to three on Friday that a 1977 law Trump has relied on to slap sudden rates on individual countries, upending global trade, "does not authorize the President to impose tariffs."

Trump, who had nominated two of the justices who repudiated him, responded furiously, alleging without evidence that the court was influenced by foreign interests.

"I'm ashamed of certain members of the court, absolutely ashamed, for not having the courage to do what's right for our country," Trump told reporters.

Hezbollah warned yesterday that it would have no choice but to fight on after an Israeli strike on targets in Lebanon killed eight of its operatives.

Lebanon's government has vowed to disarm Hezbollah, but Israel insists it retains the right

to defend itself by striking the Iran-backed militant group.

On Friday, the Israeli military said it had hit Hezbollah command centres in eastern Lebanon and targets linked to the Palestinian group Hamas in the south.

Hezbollah said Saturday that eight of its fighters had been killed, after Lebanon's health ministry said 10 people died in the east and two in the south.

"What happened yesterday in the Bekaa is a new massacre and a new aggression," Hezbollah official Mahmud Qamati said, in a speech broadcast by the Al-Ma-

nar network. "What option do we have left to defend ourselves and our country? What option do we have other than resistance? We no longer have any option."

Lebanon's President Joseph Aoun also condemned the attacks, which came just days after the government said the army will start implementing the second phase of its plan to disarm Hezbollah in the south of the country.

The strikes came as tensions were also building between the United States and Iran, with US President Donald Trump threatening military action over the

Islamic republic's nuclear programme.

Iran backs several armed groups in the region, including Hezbollah and Hamas.

In Lebanon's eastern city of Baalbek, a mass funeral was held for commander Hussein Mohammad Yaghi and one of the fighters, with hundreds of people gathered, waving Hezbollah flags and chanting support. A Hezbollah official, speaking on condition of anonymity, told AFP all eight members of the group were attending a meeting in the eastern Bekaa region when a strike killed them.

Iranian students chant anti-government slogans, as US threats loom

Iranian students chanted anti-government slogans and scuffled with counter-protesters on Saturday in the latest display of anger at the country's clerical leaders, who also face a US military build-up aimed at pressuring them into a nuclear deal.

The gatherings at universities, which were reported by both local and diaspora media outlets, followed a mass protest movement that was met with a government crackdown last month that left thousands dead.

The crackdown had prompted US President Donald Trump to threaten to intervene militarily, though the focus of his threats eventually shifted to Iran's nuclear programme, which Western governments fear is aimed at producing a bomb.

The US and Iran recently resumed Oman-mediated talks aimed at securing a deal, but Washington has simultaneously increased its military presence in the region, dispatching two aircraft carriers, jets and weaponry to back its warnings.

Videos geolocated by AFP to Tehran's top engineering university showed fights breaking

out in a crowd on Saturday as people shouted "bi sharaf", or "disgraceful" in Farsi.

Footage posted by the Persian-language TV channel Iran International, which is based outside the country, also showed a large crowd chanting anti-government slogans at Sharif University of Technology.

Iranians had reprised their protest slogans earlier this week to mark the 40th day since thousands of people were killed as a wave of demonstrations was peaking on January 8 and 9.

They gathered again at several universities in the capital on Saturday, local media reported.

The unrest first broke out in December over prolonged financial strain, but exploded into mass anti-government demonstrations that were suppressed in a violent crackdown by security forces. The clerical authorities acknowledge more than 3,000 deaths, but say the violence was caused by "terrorist acts" fuelled by Iran's enemies.

The US-based Human Rights Activists News Agency (HRANA), however, has recorded more than 7,000 killings in the crackdown, the vast majority protesters.

Global summit calls for 'secure, trustworthy and robust AI'

Dozens of nations including the United States and China called for "secure, trustworthy and robust" artificial intelligence, in a summit declaration on Saturday criticised for being too generic to protect the public.

The statement signed by 86 countries did not include concrete commitments to regulate the fast-developing technology, instead highlighting several voluntary, non-binding initiatives.

"AI's promise is best realised only when its benefits are shared by humanity," said the statement, released after the five-day AI Impact Summit.

It called the advent of generative AI "an inflection point in the trajectory of technological evolution".

"Advancing secure, trustworthy and robust AI is foundational to building trust and maximising societal and economic benefits," it said.

The summit -- attended by tens of thousands including top tech CEOs -- was the fourth an-

nual global meeting to discuss the promises and pitfalls of AI, and the first hosted by a developing country.

Hot topics discussed included AI's potential societal benefits, such as drug discovery and translation tools, but also the threat of job losses, online abuse and the heavy power consumption of data centres.

Analysts had said earlier that the summit's broad focus, and vague promises made at the previous meetings in France, South Korea and Britain, would make strong pledges or immediate action unlikely.

US signs on

The United States, home to industry-leading companies such as Google and ChatGPT maker OpenAI, did not sign last year's summit statement, warning that regulation could be a drag on innovation.

"We totally reject global governance of AI," US delegation head Michael Kratsios said at the summit on Friday.

The United States signed a bilateral declaration on AI with India on Friday, pledging to "pursue a global approach to AI that is unapologetically friendly to entrepreneurship and innovation".

But it also put its name to the main statement, the release of which was originally expected on Friday but was delayed by one day to maximise the number of signatories, India's government said.

Amba Kak, co-executive director of the AI Now Institute, criticised the lack of a meaningful declaration, saying it was just "another round of generic voluntary promises".

"The fact that this declaration drew such wide endorsement, especially from the US, which held out in Paris, tells you what kind of agenda it is: one that is

AI-industry approved, not one that meaningfully protects the public," she told AFP.

Yesterday's summit declaration struck a cautious tone on AI safety risks, from misinformation and surveillance to fears of the creation of devastating new pathogens.

"Deepening our understanding of the potential security aspects remains important," it said.

"We recognize the importance of security in AI systems, industry-led voluntary measures, and the adoption of technical solutions, and appropriate policy frameworks that enable innovation."

On jobs, it emphasised re-skilling initiatives to "support participants in preparation for a future AI driven economy".

And "we underscore the importance of developing energy-efficient AI systems" given the technology's growing demands on natural resources, it said.

The next AI summit will take place in Geneva in 2027. In the meantime, a UN panel on AI will start work towards "science-led governance", the global body's chief Antonio Guterres said Friday.



The event was also the source of several viral moments, including the awkward refusal of rival US tech CEOs -- OpenAI's Sam Altman and Dario Amodei of Anthropic -- to hold hands on stage.

The Sacred Table: honouring sustenance and curbing Ramadan food waste

In the Holy Qur'an, food is regarded as a "pure sustenance" and a divine sign for those who reflect. Allah describes the creation of cultivated gardens and crops of diverse tastes as blessings that demand both gratitude and moderation. Honoring the producers of this food is inherently tied to the command to give the poor their due on harvest day and to avoid squandering wealth, as those who waste are described as "brothers of the devils." This spiritual mandate frames food not just as a commodity, but as a trust from the Creator that must be handled with reverence.

Yet, in Bahrain, the spiritual discipline of Ramadan often clashes with a cycle of hyper-consumerism. While the Kingdom typically generates 400 tonnes of food waste daily, this figure skyrockets to over 600 tonnes during the Holy Month. This surge is driven by lavish hotel buffets where nearly a quarter of prepared food is discarded, and by impulsive household buying fueled by the socio-cultural pressure to provide "perfect menus." This cultural trend of "Israf" or extravagance leads many to believe that overcrowded tables signify hospitality, directly contradicting the Qur'anic injunction to eat and drink without wasting.

To realign modern habits with the spirit of the Prophet (PBUH), who advised leaving a third of the stomach for air, Bahrain must embrace practical, collective solutions. Residents can support organizations like the Conserving Bounties Society, which bridges the gap by collecting surplus hotel food for redistribution to thousands of needy families. On an individual level, mindful preparation through strict shopping lists and portion control at Iftar can significantly reduce household surplus. Furthermore, businesses can implement digital waste management tools to identify production "hotspots" and adjust their output in real-time.

Ramadan is ultimately a school of self-restraint; by curbing waste, we do more than protect the environment—we fulfill a fundamental act of worship and honour the divine gift of sustenance.

Toddler with faulty transplant that shocked Italy dies

An Italian toddler who received a faulty heart transplant died on Saturday, in a case that has caused outrage in Italy over alleged medical malpractice.

The two-year-old had received a transplant in December reportedly with a heart that was damaged during transit by coming into direct contact with dry ice.

Prosecutors are investigating six medical staff.

"It's over. Domenico's gone," the two-year-old's mother Patrizia Mercolino told Italian media.

She said a foundation would be opened in his name.

Her son had been on life sup-

port for weeks at a hospital in Naples in a case that has made headlines in Italy.

The donor heart was reportedly transported from Bolzano in northern Italy to Naples -- 800 kilometres away -- in an unsuitable container without a thermometer that could have signalled the excessively low temperature.

Health Minister Orazio Schillaci said in a statement quoted by Italian media that Domenico's case had "moved the whole of Italy".

Schillaci earlier spoke of his concern that organ donations could decrease as a result of the case, and called for "clarity" to ensure continued trust in the country's medical services.

Cup quest begins as Muharraq defend crown

The quarter-finals of the 10th edition of the Khalifa bin Salman Basketball Cup tip off on Saturday, February 28, at the Bahrain Basketball Association Hall in Umm Al Hassam, launching the knockout phase of one of the Kingdom's premier domestic competitions.

All eyes will once again be on defending champions Muharraq, who return to the tournament looking to build on last year's memorable triumph. The Red Wolves captured the 2025 title with a 89-86 victory over Manama in the final at Khalifa Sports City. The occasion carried added significance, coinciding with the FIBA Congress and Hall of Fame ceremony and attended by FIBA President Shaikh Saud bin Ali Al Thani, highlighting Bahrain's growing stature on the international basketball stage. The trophy was presented by HH Shaikh Isa bin Ali Al Khalifa, capping a landmark night for the club and the sport locally.

That triumph now sets the stage for a fresh campaign. Muharraq, who currently top the Zain Bahrain Basketball League standings with 13 wins from 14 games, have been placed at the head of Group A and will face Second Division runners-up Sitra in the quarter-finals. Manama, last season's runners-up and sitting second in the league with nine wins and five losses, headline Group B and take on Second Division champions Al Ittihad in a matchup charged with ambition and redemption.

The remaining quarter-final ties promise intrigue as the league picture continues to take shape. Third-placed Al Najma, with eight wins from 14 games, will meet the sixth-placed First Division team, a spot to be decided between Al Hala and Al Nuwaidrat following the conclusion of Round 15 of the league campaign. Al Ahli, currently fourth with seven wins and seven losses, will face the fifth-placed side, which will also be determined between Al Hala and Al Nuwaidrat once the final standings are confirmed.

As in previous editions, the professional regulations remain

unchanged. Teams may register two foreign professionals on the match roster, though only one is permitted on the court at any given time, adding a tactical layer to squad rotations and late-game management.

Looking ahead, the semi-finals will be contested in a best-of-three format at Khalifa

Sports Hall, with the first team to secure two victories advancing to the final. The title itself will be decided in a single winner-takes-all showdown, where one performance will determine the identity of the 10th edition champions.

Organised annually by the Bahrain Basketball Association,

the tournament has steadily grown in stature over the years. Al Ahli lifted the fourth edition crown in 2020, while Riffa claimed the title in 2019. With Muharraq defending their crown and Manama aiming to go one better, the stage is set for another compelling chapter in Bahrain's basketball season.

Chelsea, Aston Villa held in blow to Champions League hopes

Chelsea's chances of Champions League qualification were dented as Burnley snatched a 1-1 draw at Stamford Bridge, while Aston Villa also struck late to salvage a point against Leeds yesterday.

The Blues climb into the Premier League's top four only on goal difference after they paid for failing to build on Joao Pedro's fourth-minute opener.

Chelsea were dominant until Wesley Fofana was sent off with 18 minutes remaining for a second yellow card.

Burnley took full advantage as Zian Flemming headed in from a corner in the 93rd minute to keep their slim hopes of survival alive.

The Claret's edge to within eight points of safety.

Villa defied the odds to keep pace with Arsenal and Manchester City in the title race until recent weeks, but a 1-1 draw continued their poor run at Villa Park.

Anton Stach's spectacular free-kick from fully 40 yards (37 metres) at an angle caught out Emi Martinez at his near post to give Leeds the advantage. But Tammy Abraham then snatched a point for Villa two minutes from time.

Five Premier League sides are set to qualify for next season's Champions League thanks to the strong performance of English sides in European competition this season.

But Liverpool and Manchester United have the chance to close in when they face Nottingham Forest and Everton in the coming days. James Milner set a new record of 654 Premier League appearances in Brighton's 2-0 win at Brentford. Manchester City can close to within two points of leaders Arsenal when they host Newcastle in Saturday's 2000GMT kick-off.

Arsenal are in action on Sunday when they travel to local rivals Tottenham Hotspur in the north London derby.

Pegula sees off Svitolina to win Dubai WTA 1000 title

Jessica Pegula gave herself an early birthday present by clinching her fourth WTA 1000 crown with a comfortable 6-2, 6-4 victory over Elina Svitolina in the Dubai final yesterday.

The fourth-seeded American denied Svitolina a chance to win a third title in the northern emirate, and improved her record against the Ukrainian to 6-3 head-to-head.

Pegula, who turns 32 on Tuesday, has made at least the semi-finals in each of her last seven tournaments and walks away from Dubai with a 10th career title.

Pegula fought back from a set and a break down in the semi-finals against Amanda Anisimova on Friday, while Svitolina

battled through a three-hour marathon against Coco Gauff.

It was Svitolina who appeared to be suffering the most from the aftermath of the previous night, though, and it gave Pegula

the chance to jump to a double-break lead early in the final, and she never looked back as she wrapped up the victory in 72 minutes.

"I couldn't ask for a better

birthday present. I'm just super proud of myself. I had to play at a very high level, it was awesome," Pegula said in her on-court interview.

"I feel like when you can get off to a quick start, that eases the nerves a little bit.

"Mentally, I think, especially the match yesterday, I was down a set and 3-1, and I fought back, which made me feel free today. I trusted the things we've been working on and it paid off."

Svitolina, a champion in Dubai in 2017 and 2018, has lots to be proud of, having reached her first WTA 1000 final since Rome 2018.

The Ukrainian 31-year-old returned to the top 10 earlier this month for the first time since coming back from maternity leave and has enjoyed a phenomenal start to 2026, amassing a 15-3 win-loss record.

Moreira Keeps Al Khaldiya Title Charge Alive

Al Khaldiya delivered a statement of intent in the Nasser Bin Hamad Premier League with a dramatic 2-1 victory over Al Malkiya last night at Khalifa Sports City, a performance that signalled why they remain firmly in the title conversation. The reverse fixture last October had gone the other way, with Al Malkiya claiming a 3-1 win.

Under Tunisian head coach Lassad Al Chabbi, Al Khaldiya knew a win this time would restore them to the summit, and his side produced when it mattered most.

They started brightly, taking the lead in the 15th minute. Moroccan winger Nizar El Otmani escaped his marker down the right and whipped in a teasing cross to the far post, where Congolese striker Joel Beya guided his header across goalkeeper Godwill Chia Ndong and into the far corner.

However, Al Khaldiya's intensity dipped after opening

the scoring, becoming reliant on wide deliveries and allowing Al Malkiya to grow into the game. The equaliser came in the 35th minute from a set piece. A free-kick was headed into a dangerous zone by Ahmed Muslim, sparking a scramble in the box before Nigerian midfielder Cyril Olisima reacted

fastest to slot the ball past Portuguese goalkeeper Ricardo Silva.

Level at halftime, Al Khaldiya pushed after the break. Moroccan midfielder Saifeddine Bouhra surged down the right three minutes after the restart, sending a low cross for Anas Ouahim, whose first-time ef-

fort was well saved by Ndong. Moments later, a flicked corner fell invitingly to Ayman Dirani, on loan from Wydad Athletic Club, but he could not make clean contact from close range.

The breakthrough came in the 88th minute. Bouhra's cross from the left was spilled under pressure by Ndong, allowing Brazilian forward Gleison Moreira to react sharply and finish with a controlled volley, sparking celebrations among the men in yellow. In the dying moments, Al Malkiya appealed for a handball by Dirani in the box, but after a VAR review, no penalty was awarded, denying Mahoozi's side a last-gasp chance to equalise.

The win moves Al Khaldiya to 36 points, level with Muharraq and three clear of Riffa, leaving Chabbi's side at the top courtesy of the head-to-head. Al Malkiya remain fourth on 23 points. Matchweek 15 concludes tomorrow with Sitra facing Al Hidd at Bahrain National Stadium at 9pm, rounding out the weekend's action.

New Zealand-Pakistan Super Eight World Cup clash rained off

The Super Eight clash between Pakistan and New Zealand in the Twenty20 World Cup was washed out without a ball being bowled after heavy rain in Colombo yesterday.

Persistent drizzle right after the toss -- which Pakistan won and opted to bat -- at the Premadasa stadium did not relent with umpires finally calling the match off at 9:05pm local time (15:35 GMT).

Not even a five-over match was possible by the 10:16 pm (16:46 GMT) cut-off time, giving the two teams one point each.

Pakistan, New Zealand, England and co-hosts Sri Lanka are in Group 2 of the Super Eights.

Title-holders India, South Africa, Zimbabwe and the West Indies are in Group 1.

The top two teams from each Group will qualify for the semi-finals.

Canada to face US in Olympic ice hockey final

Canada and the United States set up a showdown in the men's ice hockey final at the Winter Olympics by beating Finland and Slovakia in Friday's semi-finals.

Tournament favourites Canada and the USA will face off for gold at Milan's Santagiulia Arena on Sunday, while Finland and Slovakia will battle for bronze on Saturday.

Nathan MacKinnon scored Canada's winner in the final seconds to complete a thrilling comeback from two goals down in a 3-2 win against Finland, while the Americans breezed to a 6-2 victory over the Slovaks.

"It's everything. It's the gold medal at an Olympic Games. We are very lucky to be here and it's a great opportunity. We have got to be ready," MacKinnon said.

South Africa's De Kock says handling pressure key in India clash

Who "deals with the pressure better" will decide the India-South Africa Super Eights match, a repeat of the T20 World Cup final two years ago, said Quinton de Kock yesterday. The two unbeaten teams are familiar foes and both came through their T20 World Cup groups with perfect four-out-of-four records ahead of the clash in Ahmedabad today.

Aiden Markram's South Africa toured India late last year, losing 3-1 in a T20 series.

"I think that's what's going to make for quite a good game tomorrow, because we've played against each other quite a bit

over the last two months," said South Africa opener De Kock.

"And to be honest, the teams haven't really changed much.

"So, I think it's more when you're out there on the pressure side, who deals with the pressure better and wins the small moments in the game."

While South Africa looked strong in all departments in the group phase, the batting of the defending champions India has been inconsistent.

Opener Abhishek Sharma has recorded three consecutive ducks, but De Kock did not read too much into it.

"He's the number one T20 batsman in the world at the moment, according to the rankings, so he must keep doing what he's doing," said de Kock of the 25-year-old Abhishek. "He's ob-

viously quite young, he's bound to fail. So I'm sure at some point he's going to play an important knock." South Africa are being billed as strong contenders to meet India in the final in Ahmedabad on March 8.

De Kock said there were no favourites in the T20 format.

"I think the nature of World Cups, that it doesn't allow favouritism.

"At any moment, someone can win in a game out of nowhere. So that's the thing, it's quite a fickle game, World Cups, especially T20 World Cups.

"Games can be changed in a matter of two to three overs just by one individual."



The first ICC Men's T20 World Cup was held in 2007 in South Africa, and India national cricket team won the title by defeating Pakistan national cricket team in a thrilling final – kickstarting the global popularity of T20 cricket.
