British court acquits Barclays over capital raising deal with Qatar

Charges were over a \$3bn loan made by **Qatari investors**

British court has dismissed Acharges brought by the Serious Fraud Office (SFO) against Barclays over its 2008 capital raising, the bank said on Monday, suspending for now the threat of regulatory sanctions on its business operations.

"We are likely to seek to reinstate the charges by applying to the High Court," an SFO spokesman said. It was not clear when that application would



Earlier this month in an unconnected case, the Barclays chief executive, Jes Staley, was ordered to hand over more than £1.1m out of his own pocket as punishment for attempting to unmask a whistleblower.

be heard.

Barclays denied the SFO's allegation that a \$3 billion loan it made to Qatar in November 2008 was connected with a Qatari investment in the British bank which ultimately helped it avoid a British government rescue during the financial crisis.

Qatar has not been accused of wrongdoing itself, but public companies in Britain are normally prohibited from lending money for the purchase of their own shares.

The SFO had been pursuing charges that Barclays unlawfully received such financial assistance, and that it had committed fraud over two so-called 'advisory services agreements' between Qatar and the bank.
