### UNESCO strips England's Liverpool of world heritage status

The English city of Liver-pool has been removed from UNESCO's list of world heritage sites after the United Nations' cultural agency found new buildings, including a football stadium, undermined the attractiveness of its Victorian

Liverpoolwas named a World Heritage Site in 2004, joining cultural landmarks such as the Great Wall of China, the Taj Mahal, and the Leaning Tower of Pisa. The city is only the third place to be removed from the prestigious list.

After a vote in China by members of its World Heritage Committee, UNESCO said on Twitter thatLiverpoolshould be deleted from the international cultural organisation's list.



The UN heritage body said years of development had caused "irreversible" damage to the historic value of the River Mersey waterfront.

### Israel looking into NSO spyware allegations

Tsrael has set up a senior in-**⊥**ter-ministerial team to look into growing allegations that spyware sold by an Israeli cyber firm has been abused on a global scale, an Israeli source said on Wednesday, while adding that an export review was unlikely.

The team is headed by Israel's National Security Council, which answers to Prime Minister Naftali Bennett and has broader areas of expertise than the Defence Ministry, which oversees exports of NSO Group's
