Historic Hospital to Get New Home, Old Site Becomes Museum



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His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa received Dr. George Cherman, CEO and Medical Director of the American Mission Hospital, along with US Ambassador to Bahrain Stephanie Hallett. They presented the King with

a gift marking "Isa the Great Year," commemorating the hospital's legacy, and briefed him on plans to rebuild the historic hospital on its original site as a gift to the capital for the next century.

As part of the plan, the former Women's and Children's Hospital building will be converted into a museum dedicated to the

history of healthcare in Bahrain.

The King welcomed his guests and thanked them for the gift, praising the hospital's plans as a reflection of continued efforts to develop health services. He commended the institution's staff for their expertise and dedication, noting the hospital's standing as one of the region's pioneering medical

The minister also met Emergency Minister Raed Al Saleh, signing a memorandum of understanding on disaster risk reduction and civil protection. This covers training, field visits and reconstruction support—reinforcing Syria's capacity to manage crises as the region navigates continued instability.

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NIHR Report Documents Iranian Attacks on Bahrain

12-Chapter Study Details Impact on Civilians and Infrastructure

● The report draws on official records, international documents and interviews with those affected.

National Institution for Human Rights (NIHR) launched a report documenting the human rights violations and effects stemming from Iranian attacks on the kingdom. It was unveiled at a press conference attended by the institution's chairperson and commissioners, its secretary-general, and media members.

Eng Ali Ahmed Al Derazi, NIHR's chairperson, said the report was prepared under the institution's legal mandate to monitor human rights conditions, document violations and analyse their impact, in line with the Constitution, national law and international standards. The attacks, he said, represented an exceptional challenge that demanded documentation from a legal, humanitarian and human rights perspective, both to preserve national memory and to highlight efforts made to protect civilians and keep essential services running.



Recommendations relating to government procedures and measures at the national level

- **Compensation Fund;** Create a National Reparation and Compensation Fund for victims, initially financed by the State budget until costs are recovered through international claims or frozen Iranian assets.
- **Psychosocial Support;** Develop national psychological and social support programmes for victims, especially children, women, older persons and people with disabilities, including rehabilitation and reintegration services.
- **Activate Humanitarian Law Committee;** Strengthen the National Committee on International Humanitarian Law to raise awareness, advise authorities, monitor compliance, review legislation, and provide training on humanitarian law.
- **Protect Infrastructure & Digital Space;** Reinforce protection of hospitals, schools, oil facilities, the environment and civilian infrastructure, and monitor cyberattacks and disinformation targeting digital services.
- **Strengthen Cooperation;** Improve coordination between government bodies, human rights institutions and civil society, and push for stronger international accountability for threats to air, sea and trade routes.
- **Regular Reporting;** Issue periodic reports on the humanitarian and human rights impact of the attacks, tracking needs, services and progress on protection and reparation.

The report has 12 main chapters, starting with the legal and methodological framework used for monitoring and documentation, before moving through state obligations and the human-

itarian and rights impact of the attacks. It draws on field visits and interviews carried out by the institution and closes with a set of recommendations. Al Derazi also singled out the Committee



for Documenting the National Resilience Epic, established by royal order, for its work recording the attacks and the challenges Bahrain faced, as well as the resilience and public solidarity shown throughout.

Dr. Malallah Al Hammadi, NIHR's vice chairperson and head of its Detention and Facilities Visitation Committee, walked through the report's recommendations, which are grouped into three levels spanning national and international measures and broader steps to strengthen human rights protection. These include expanded psychological and social support for the worst-affected groups, stronger protection for infrastructure and digital space, and greater use of legal and diplo-

Recommendations: Government Procedures and International Measures

- **File complaints with UN human rights mechanisms** – Submit documented official communications to the Human Rights Council's special procedures regarding Iranian attacks on civilians and infrastructure, addressing:
 - Special Rapporteur on extrajudicial, summary or arbitrary executions
 - Special Rapporteur on the right to adequate housing
 - Special Rapporteur on the right to health
 - Special Rapporteur on the human rights of internally displaced persons
 - Special Rapporteur on human rights while countering terrorism
- **Submit reports to the UPR Working Group** – Document humanitarian and human rights impacts, requesting urgent international recommendations on civilian protection, reparations and accountability.
- **Explore action at the International Court of Justice** – Study pursuing legal claims against Iran for violations of international law, including compensation for damages.
- **Engage specialized UN agencies – Approach:**
 - The World Health Organization, to document health and medical impacts
 - The Food and Agriculture Organization, to assess food and water security effects
- **Engage UN cybersecurity and crime-fighting bodies** – Approach the ITU, UNODC, UNOCT and ESCWA to document cyberattacks, digital infrastructure damage, disruption to government services, and economic losses, and to explore technical support and compensation mechanisms.
- **Strengthen international cooperation on environmental and emergency response** – Expand coordination and information-sharing on cross-border environmental risks, and support stronger international mechanisms for preventing and responding to disasters caused by unlawful attacks.

matic channels abroad, including closer cooperation with United Nations mechanisms to document violations and support accountability.

Commissioner Mohamed Juma Fuzaia, who heads the General Rights and Freedoms Committee, set out the report's key findings. It tracks the direct and indirect effects of the attacks across the kingdom, he said, with particular attention to the impact on women, children, the elderly, people with disabilities and workers in vital sectors.

The findings, he added, rest on a methodology built around accuracy, objectivity, independence and transparency, drawing on official sources, international documents, field visits and direct interviews.

NIHR described the report as a national human rights document meant to support efforts at home and abroad to protect human rights and reinforce respect for international law. The full report and an executive summary are available in Arabic and English on the institution's website.

MP Demands Probe into Mother's Death After Weight-Loss Surgery

An MP has called for an urgent and independent inquiry into the death of a young Bahraini mother following weight-loss surgery at a private hospital, amid claims from her family that warning signs were overlooked.

Mohammed Al Janahi urged the National Health Regulatory Authority to probe the death of Aziza Janahi, a mother of two, after she suffered health problems following a mini gastric bypass.

He called for the full facts to be made public and for legal action against anyone found to have broken medical rules or failed in their duty of care.

Aziza's relatives say she suffered severe and repeated pain, along with other worrying symptoms, after the operation.

She returned to the hospital several times, but her family claim her complaints were dismissed as normal side effects of the surgery.

They also allege she was allowed to leave while still in an unstable state. Her health later worsened and she died.

Mr Al Janahi said the family's account raised grave questions about the care she received and pointed to suspected medical neglect in how the case was handled after surgery.

He said an open inquiry must find out what happened, who was responsible and if Aziza received the care she needed soon enough.

right of the deceased's family and the public,' he said.

The MP called for every member of the medical team involved in her care to be questioned. Anyone found to have neglected the patient or failed to act should be held to account, he added.

Mr Al Janahi also pressed for tougher checks on private hospitals and a review of how patients are watched for signs of harm after surgery. He said saving lives must come first and hospitals must act faster when patients show signs of serious illness after an operation.

The case should also be used to close any gaps in hospital checks and stop another family from suffering the same loss, he added.

Dr Al Sulaiti added that the project strengthens the department's ability to deliver efficient care, increases clinic capacity, and reinforces the quality of healthcare in line with international best practice.

Study Reveals Bahrain's Shark, Sawfish Diversity

Bahrain Waters Home to Seven Shark and Sawfish Species, Says Environment Council

Supreme Council for Environment (SCE) confirmed that seven shark and sawfish species live in the kingdom's waters, urging greater public care for marine ecosystems.

The four shark species include the whale shark—the world's largest fish—along with scalloped, great, and smooth hammerheads. Three sawfish species, known for their toothed snouts, are also present but face global threats.

During a recent tour at the Bahrain National Museum, museum guide Yusuf Alsaeed told The Daily Tribune that Bahrain's deeper waters are home to many sharks, contrary to popular belief. He said



traditional pearl divers regularly ventured into these waters in search of oysters, making encounters with sharks - one of the many risks of the profession. However, Alsaeed noted that sharks generally do not attack humans unless they smell blood or feel threatened.

The Save Our Seas Foundation recently completed Bahrain's first shark and ray DNA library, recording 577 individuals across 30 species between 2024–2025 to aid future monitoring.

The SCE stressed that curbing pollution and overfishing is vital to protect biodiversity.

Bahrain launches national training framework to strengthen early childhood education

The Ministry of Education has launched a National Professional Training Framework for employees working in early childhood education institutions, marking a new step towards enhancing the quality of the sector and strengthening the skills of those working with young learners.

Director of the Early Child-

She explained that the framework will guide licensed training institutions in designing and delivering specialised programmes for early childhood education staff, ensuring consistent quality

standards and addressing the sector's professional needs.

The Ministry said adopting the framework represents an important milestone in improving educational practices, raising the professional standards of early childhood educators, and investing in national talent to

support the development of future generations.

The initiative also reflects Bahrain's commitment to strengthening its position regionally and internationally in early childhood education.

Drug Conviction Upheld

Cassation court confirms 10-year jail term, BD5,000 fine and deportation

The Court of Cassation upheld a 10-year prison sentence and a BD5,000 fine against an Asian man convicted of helping a drug trafficker distribute narcotics in exchange for methamphetamine for personal use.

The court also ordered the confiscation of the seized drugs and his permanent deportation

after serving his sentence. Investigators recovered methamphetamine, marijuana, synthetic cannabinoids, drug paraphernalia and financial records linking the defendants to trafficking activities. The court ruled that witness testimony, confessions, forensic evidence and mobile phone records were sufficient to uphold the conviction.

Student Faces Arson Charge

Court postpones case over alleged house fire until July 28

A Bahraini court adjourned the trial of a 23-year-old student accused of deliberately setting fire to a house owned by heirs until July 28.

The defendant remains in custody after threatening to burn the property when his

sister refused to give him money. According to prosecutors, he later sent a WhatsApp message claiming he had started the fire. Civil Defence teams extinguished the blaze, which destroyed one room and damaged four others. The defendant admitted to the charge.

Man Blames Garbage Odours

Bahraini accused of setting fire to rubbish bins in Sitra

A 46-year-old Bahraini employee told the High Criminal Court that foul odours from accumulated garbage and psychological pressures drove him to set fire to rubbish containers near his home. He is facing four arson cases

involving the deliberate burning of garbage bins in Sitra. CCTV footage allegedly captured him pulling containers onto public roads before setting them alight. The court adjourned the cases until July 28 for further arguments.

Washington talks focus on Middle East security risks

GCC, Jordan Envoys Meet Top US Republicans Amid Regional Tensions

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Ambassadors from the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) states and Jordan met Congressman Brian Mast, Chairman of the U.S. House Foreign Affairs Committee, along with senior Republican members, under Bahrain's current GCC presidency.

Dr. Shaikh Abdullah bin Rashid Al Khalifa, Bahrain's Ambassador to the U.S., led the GCC side. He stressed the need to deepen the GCC-U.S. strategic dialogue to reinforce regional stability amid growing volatility.

Security concerns

Talks centered on the fast-changing security situation in the Middle East. Officials discussed protecting maritime shipping lanes, preserving freedom of navigation, and containing the fallout of regional tensions on the global economy.

Participants described U.S.-GCC-Jordan ties as a decades-old strategic partnership. They agreed to expand cooperation to support peace and development.



Dr. Shaikh Abdullah said all sides share a commitment to dialogue as the main tool for

resolving crises, calling for closer coordination on today's cross-border challenges.

Al Maqasees Market in Isa Town Nears Completion

Councillor Says 90-Stall Project Set to Open Within Months

The long-awaited Isa Town Local Market, known as Al Maqasees, has entered its final stages of construction, with Northern Municipal Council member Dr Salman Mohsen Abdulla predicting it will open within the coming months.

Speaking from the project site, Dr Abdulla, who represents the fourth northern constituency, thanked the press for its continued coverage of the market's progress. He said the reporting had helped highlight the project's importance and reflect residents' eagerness to see it completed.

"After years of waiting, the project has become a tangible reality, and only a short time remains before it opens," he said, adding that residents regularly ask him about the opening date given the market's importance to traders and the local community.

He said the Ministry of Mu-

nicipalities Affairs and Agriculture continues to follow up on the project closely alongside the Northern Municipality, which is overseeing construction through completion to ensure the market meets required specifications.

The market will include 90 stalls for traders, Dr Abdulla said. Construction has reached an advanced stage, with most of the stalls already finished and only a limited number left to complete before the project is fully handed over.

He thanked Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture Minister

Eng Wael bin Nasser Al Mubarak and Undersecretary for Municipal Affairs Eng Shaikh Mohammed bin Ahmed Al Khalifa for their direct involvement in keeping the project on schedule.

bid documents at BD100 each, with a BD4,000 bond required from contractors, ahead of a July 15 closing date.

Netherlands to ban Israeli settler products from Sept 22

The Netherlands government announced yesterday that it would ban imports from Palestinian territories occupied by Israeli settlers from September 22.

The Netherlands will join Ireland, Belgium and Spain among European Union countries that have imposed restrictions on trade with territories occupied by Israeli settlers.

There have been growing calls for the 27-nation bloc to impose EU-wide restrictions over Israel's military action in Gaza and increased vio-

lence in the occupied territories, but some EU members are reluctant.

Israel's occupation of Palestinian territories is considered illegal under international law. And the Dutch foreign ministry said: "With the proposed measures, the Netherlands is reinforcing its commitment to fulfilling its international legal obligation not to contribute to this unlawful situation."

The ban will apply to "the import, purchase, and sale of goods originating from illegal Israeli settlements located in the Palestinian territories", the ministry said.

Trump vows to help Lebanon pursue peace with Israel

US President Donald Trump vowed yesterday to help Lebanon "a lot" as its president, Joseph Aoun, sought Washington's backing for a fragile effort to disarm Hezbollah and forge a path to peace with Israel.

Meeting Aoun at the White House, Trump said Lebanon had been "a very mistreated country" that had been "hit hard" for decades.

"It's probably a dangerous place in a lot of ways," Trump told reporters. "But they love the country... and we're going to help it. We're going to help it a lot."

Aoun, the first Lebanese president invited to Washington since 2009, asked Trump for political support and continued backing for the Lebanese army, which has begun deploying in southern areas under a US-backed framework agreement with Israel.

"We need to support the LAF," Aoun said, referring to the Lebanese Armed Forces. "Without the LAF, everything will collapse."

The Lebanese president, a former army commander, said the military was "the backbone

of security and stability" and the country's most trusted institution.

His visit came as the Lebanese army moved into an area of the south under a deal with Israel aimed at proving Beirut can extend state authority and disarm Iran-backed Hezbollah.

But in a sign of the fragility of the agreement, the Lebanese army said Israeli troops fired near its soldiers deploying in a so-called "pilot zone" Israel is supposed to withdraw from.

Asked whether Washington would put additional pressure on Israel to withdraw, Trump said: "We'll be looking at that."

Lebanon is under pressure to prove that it can and will disarm Hezbollah, which Israel has set as a precondition for ending its occupation in southern Lebanon.

The "pilot zones" where the Lebanese army is deploying are primarily located just outside territory Israeli forces invaded after Hezbollah opened rocket fire on Israel and drew Lebanon into the Middle East war in March.

The army said Tuesday it had begun deploying to one of three pilot zones, the village of Zawtar al-Gharbiya. Israel's military said it would be "adjusting its force posture" in one pilot area.

Hours later, however, the Lebanese army said Israeli forces "opened fire in the vicinity of these units," adding that the incident would hinder the deployment.

The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) said it had only fired "warning shots into the air" after Lebanese soldiers entered an area that was "not part of the pilot area."

"The Lebanese Armed Forces personnel withdrew from the area, and no injuries were reported," it added.

US President Donald Trump said yesterday the United States was far from finished with Iran and warned the next US military target could be an underground nuclear complex known as Pickaxe Mountain.

Pickaxe Mountain is a deeply buried nuclear site near Natanz where Western intelligence suspects Iran is building an undeclared enrichment facility.

"We'll be hitting that area pretty soon, and very heavily," Trump said, adding that he would not normally announce targets but "there's not a thing they can do about it."

Trump estimated it would take Iran more than 20 years to rebuild from current damage, addressing reporters during a White House meeting with Lebanese President Joseph Aoun.

"If we left right now, it would take Iran 20, 25 years to rebuild. Okay, and we're not finished at all...we're not leaving right now."

Iran stepped up its strikes in the Middle East on Tuesday, two weeks after its war with the United States resumed, with Jordan, Kuwait and Bahrain coming under attack.

The US military said last night it had completed its latest round of strikes against Iran, targeting various sites to counter Tehran's

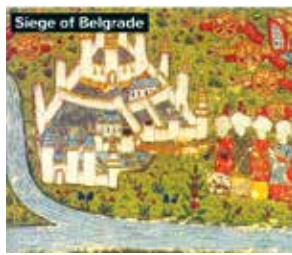

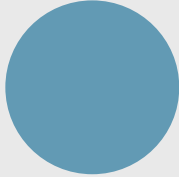

'Sit down!' Australian politician berates dog on live TV

Atop lawmaker from Australia's far-right One Nation party has grabbed headlines after exploding at a misbehaving dog as he was grilled on live TV.

Former deputy prime minister Barnaby Joyce was being interviewed on national broadcaster ABC on Monday night when he interrupted the one-on-one to shriek "sit down!"

"Sorry, it's the dog," he told the journalist.

pooch then interrupted the proceedings again, with Joyce saying: "I do apologise for this dog, it's just started to bail up."

"Don't worry about the dog, just answer the question," replied journalist Sarah Ferguson, who was grilling Joyce on his party leader Pauline Hanson's recent meeting with far-right British figurehead Tommy Robinson.

"Don't be rude. Otherwise, this interview will come to a grinding halt, Sarah," Joyce snapped back.

think this is a normal way to speak to your dog, sit down!"

Asked about the feedback, Joyce told the Sydney Morning Herald the outcry reflected a divide between the cities and rural Australians.

"People in the regions laugh about it," he said.

"People in the inner city think it's a war crime."

Opinion polls show One Nation, for decades a fringe group led by provocateur Hanson, has become Australia's most popular party in recent months.

Hanson has defended her decision to appear on a podcast with Robinson, a former football hooligan turned anti-Islam activist whose profile has soared in recent years.

She drew outrage back home for telling Robinson the end of the "White Australia" policy -- which restricted non-white immigration -- in the 1970s was partly responsible for the country's current ills.

Hanson later denied she was calling for a return to that policy.



It's not the first time the cattle-farming politician has fallen foul of man's best friend -- he once threatened to kill Johnny Depp's dogs.

His outburst drew ire across Australia, with Victoria state lawmaker Georgie Purcell of the Animal Justice Party writing on social media: "if you



UAE to invest \$6.2 bn in Abu Dhabi gas project

The United Arab Emirates' state oil giant ADNOC is to invest \$6.2 billion in an Abu Dhabi natural gas development project, the firm announced yesterday.

In a statement, ADNOC said it took the \$6.2 billion final investment decision to develop the offshore Umm Shaif Gas Cap with France's TotalEnergies, Italy's Eni and China National Petroleum Corpo-

ration.

The investment is expected to produce more than 600 million standard cubic feet of gas per day from 2030, alongside associated gas liquids, the company said.

"ADNOC is accelerating its integrated gas strategy to further harness the UAE's vast gas resources," industry minister Sultan Ahmed Al Jaber said.

The move would also expand the UAE's "LNG platform, as global demand for natural gas continues to rise", added

Al Jaber, who is also the ADNOC group's chief executive.

The investment comes as hydrocarbon-rich Gulf nations face challenges in boosting their output following Iranian attacks and the closure of the Strait of Hormuz, a vital waterway for energy exports.

In May the UAE announced its main gas-processing complex, the Habshan site in the capital Abu Dhabi, would not return to full capacity until next year, after it was targeted in the Middle East war.

Trump orders new 50% tariff on many Canadian goods

Washington, United States

US President Donald Trump signed orders Monday to impose new 50-percent tariffs on many Canadian goods, claiming "discriminatory treatment" by Ottawa against American alcohol, automobile and dairy products.

The tariffs take effect in 30 days and cover a wide range of goods including wine, hockey sticks and cement, said the White House in a fact sheet.

Trump tapped a little-known legal provision for the new duties -- Section 338 of the Tariff Act of 1930 -- which allows officials to take action against countries said to engage in discriminatory trade practices.

The latest duties will not apply to energy, potash and goods already impacted by sector-specific tariffs, the White House said.

India summons Russia envoy to condemn deadly ship attack in Ukraine

India summoned Russia's top envoy in New Delhi on Tuesday to protest against an attack on a cargo ship leaving Ukraine's port of Odesa that killed four Indian nationals.

The Indian foreign ministry said it had summoned Vladimir Ladanov, the Russian charge d'affaires, to convey "grave concerns" and "unequivocal condemnation" of the attack on commercial vessel MV Golden Leo on Sunday.

The ship had five Indians on board, four of whom were killed, it said.

"Such attacks undermine the safety, security, and stability of international maritime commerce," the ministry said in a statement.

Gaza civil defence says Israeli strikes kill 12, including family of six

AFP | Gaza City, Palestinian Territories

Gaza's civil defence agency and witnesses said Israeli strikes killed 12 people, including a family of six, in the Palestinian territory yesterday.

One airstrike hit a house belonging to the Al-Masri family in central Gaza City in the north, according to the territory's civil defence agency, which operates as a rescue service under Hamas.

Witnesses said six members of the family were killed, including four children. Gaza's Al-Shifa hospital said it had received the bodies and the wounded.

Relatives gathered at the hospital. Some wept as the body of a girl was placed in a white plastic bag and laid alongside the other bodies wrapped in thick blankets.

15 Minutes that divided Football Fans

The laws of the game, set by the International Football Association Board (IFAB), are clear. The 'halftime interval' should not exceed 15 minutes.

Yet, during the FIFA 2026 World Cup final between Spain and Argentina, on Sunday, 19 July, the halftime interval lasted about 30 minutes. It was in fact exactly 27 minutes and 27 seconds, according to USA Today.

Initially, when the world learned that FIFA planned, for the first time, a 30-minute halftime show during the World Cup Final at New York New Jersey Stadium—in the style of the NFL Super Bowl—the backlash was immediate.

Critics cited breaches of the Laws of the Game, risks to player health, and disruption to the match's rhythm. They argued that the extended break violated IFAB regulations, allowed players' muscles to cool down (increasing the risk of stiffness and second-half injuries), and reduced players' mental sharpness.

Also, making the fast-paced flow of soccer an "Americanized," highly commercialized event angered a number of traditional fans.

Three days before the final, both MSN and Yahoo Sports reported that FIFA had confirmed the halftime interval would last only 17 minutes—11 minutes for the musical performances and six minutes for stage setup and dismantling.

Even before I watched the show, I knew the announced lineup was simply too ambitious for the allotted time. However meticulous the planning, it was bound to overrun.

Could the music of Madonna, Shakira, Justin Bieber, BTS, Coldplay, Burna Boy and Gustavo Dudamel really be squeezed into just 11 minutes? Impossible, I thought.

And impossible, it was.

The show overran just as, I am sure, many others around the world thought it would.

However, the important thing is this. All hell did not break loose. Floodgates did not burst open. Nothing spiraled out of control. Everything went smoothly, even though it took a few minutes more.

Many surprises were woven into the colourful and spectacular show. Brazilian football legends Ronaldo and Ronaldinho joined Madonna before she performed her hit song Music, thrilling the spectators.

The Muppets—Kermit the Frog, Miss Piggy, and Animal—also made a special appearance regaling the young and old alike.

The PS22 Chorus, the viral public elementary school choir from Staten Island, New York, got a chance to perform alongside the fabulous band Coldplay.

Gustavo Dudamel, the legendary Venezuelan conductor, brought together Venezuela's Simón Bolívar Symphony Orchestra and the USA's New York Philharmonic Orchestra for their first-ever joint collaboration.

Burna Boy, the celebrated Nigerian singer, songwriter, and record producer, performed with Shakira their now-famous song Dai Dai.

The Italian slang expression, meaning "Come on!" or "Let's go!"—similar to the Arabic Yalla—was released by the two artists in May 2026 as the official song of the FIFA World Cup 2026.

Beyond entertainment, the halftime show also became a high-visibility global platform for the FIFA-Global Citizen partnership, designed to raise awareness, inspire philanthropic commitments, and generate public support for the FIFA Global Citizen Education Fund.

A portion of FIFA's 2026 World Cup ticket revenue is directed to this fund, which aims to expand access to quality education and sports for children worldwide across nearly 200 countries.

Produced by Global Citizen alongside Live Nation and Done + Dusted, and curated and directed by Chris Martin of Coldplay, the event was well-designed to benefit the FIFA Global Citizen Education Fund.

After organizing those 104 matches, between 48 countries, in 16 stadiums, in three countries, I am sure, we can all excuse FIFA for those 15 minutes.

GCC Rejects Houthi Claims

Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) Secretary-General Jassem Mohamed Albudaiwi strongly rejected and condemned statements made by the Houthi group's military spokesperson against Saudi Arabia, describing the allegations as baseless and an attempt to distort facts.

Albudaiwi said the claims were part of a “failed and exposed attempt” to evade responsibility for the group's actions, which he said have worsened the suffering of the Yemeni people and threatened regional security and stability.

He stressed that such “irresponsible statements” would not alter the established facts, including Saudi Arabia's continued efforts to support the Yemeni people, promote security and stability, and provide humanitarian and relief assistance.

The GCC chief also condemned the Houthis' continued



threats to maritime navigation, emphasising that the security of sea routes and freedom of international trade are fundamental pillars of regional and global stability.

He said any attempts to target international waterways represent a clear violation of international law, the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, and relevant UN Security Council resolutions.

He reaffirmed the GCC's full solidarity with Saudi Arabia and its support for all measures taken by the Kingdom to safeguard its security, sovereignty, and national interests.

Syria Sees Tourism Surge

Foreign visitor arrivals jump 448% in first half of 2026



Syria recorded a sharp rise in tourism during the first half of 2026, with total visitor arrivals increasing by 111 per cent compared with the same period last year, according to the Ministry of Tourism.

Official figures showed that 3.52 million visitors arrived between January and June 2026, up from 1.67 million during the first half of 2025.

The strongest growth came from international tourists, whose arrivals surged by 448% to 719,000 from 131,000 a year earlier. Visitors from Arab countries also more than doubled, rising 107% to 664,000.

Global Interest Grows
Turkey was the leading source of international visitors, followed by Germany, Sweden, the United States, the Netherlands, Canada and the United Kingdom, highlighting growing interest from European and North American travellers.

Among Arab countries, Jordan ranked first, followed by Lebanon and Iraq, while arrivals from Gulf states also continued to increase.

The ministry attributed the rise to increasing interest in Syr-

ia's cultural heritage, historical sites and authentic travel experiences.

Tourism Minister Mazen Al-Salhani said the figures reflected growing confidence in Syria as a travel destination and would help stimulate investment, hospitality and tourism services.

He added that tourism was becoming a key driver of economic growth by creating jobs, attracting investment and supporting local businesses.

Diaspora Visits Rise

Visits by Syrians living abroad also increased significantly, reaching 2.13 million during the first six months of 2026, compared with 1.22 million during the same period last year—a rise of 75%.

The ministry said returning expatriates were helping strengthen Syria's international image by sharing their experiences and encouraging more people to visit.

Al-Salhani described the Syrian diaspora as “ambassadors” for the country, saying their visits play an important role in promoting Syria's tourism potential worldwide.

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Youth basketball team set for rescheduled Gulf qualifiers

Bahrain's youth men's national basketball team will begin their quest for qualification to the FIBA U18 Asia Cup later this week after the Gulf Basketball Association (GBA) U18 Championship was rescheduled.

The regional qualifying tournament will now be held from July 25 to 30 after being postponed from its original dates of July 17 to 22. Qatar will host the five-team competition, which also features Saudi Arabia, Kuwait and Oman.

The tournament serves as the Gulf qualifying event for the FIBA U18 Asia Cup, with three places available at the continental finals, scheduled to take place in Ahmedabad, India, from August 13 to 23.

Bahrain head into the competition full of confidence after successfully defending their title at the Arab Youth Men's Basketball Championship earlier this month in Tunisia.

Coached by veteran tactician Salman Ramadhan, the national

team is expected to field a squad similar to the one that lifted the Arab crown, spearheaded by tournament Most Valuable Player Somto Patrick Onoduenyi and fellow standout Hassan Abdulkadir.

The Bahrainis continued their preparations with training sessions at the Bahrain Basketball Association Arena in Um Al Hassam Sports Complex ahead of their departure.

The tournament will be played in a single round-robin format at the Al Gharafa Sports Club Arena in Al Rayyan, with Bahrain opening their campaign against Saudi Arabia at 6pm, before facing Kuwait at 4pm, Oman at 4pm and hosts Qatar at 6pm.

Bahrain will also be aiming to improve on their bronze-medal finish at the previous Gulf qualifying event in 2024, when they narrowly missed out on a place at the Asian Championship.

A return to the continental stage would mark Bahrain's first appearance at the FIBA U18 Asia Cup since the 2018 edition in Thailand.

Bahrain eye top-two finish against hosts China

Bahrain's junior men's national handball team will look to carry their momentum into the knockout stage when they take on hosts China in their final Group A preliminary-round match at the 19th Asian Men's Junior Handball Championship today.

Ahmed Eid starred in Bahrain's victory over Oman with eight goals to earn Player of the Match honours. Mohammed Aadam, Ahmed Alsamaheji and Ahmed Abdulla each added four goals, while Abbas Ali and Abuthar Yateem chipped in with three apiece.

Bahrain produced a dominant second-half display against Oman, turning a narrow 15-13 halftime lead into a comfortable 10-goal victory after outscoring their Gulf rivals 18-10 after the break.

The quarter-finals will be played on Friday, followed by the semi-finals on Saturday. The tournament concludes next Monday with the gold and bronze medal matches.

The championship also serves as the Asian qualifier for the 2027 IHF Men's U21 World Championship in North Macedonia, with the four semi-finalists earning qualification.

Former MotoGP champion Quartararo to make Honda switch

Former MotoGP world champion Fabio Quartararo will join Honda on a two-year deal next season, the team announced yesterday, as the Frenchman bids to reignite his career.

The 27-year-old is set to leave Yamaha after eight seasons.

He won the MotoGP title in 2021 and finished runner-up the following year but has since struggled to maintain that level.

"Honda Racing Corporation

(HRC) are pleased to announce the signing of Fabio Quartararo for the 2027 and 2028 MotoGP World Championship seasons," the team said in a statement.

"Quartararo will race for the factory Honda HRC team as the 850cc era of MotoGP begins from 2027."

His move to Honda had appeared increasingly certain for weeks after other teams confirmed their rider line-ups for next season.

The Japanese manufacturer, which has been rebuilding since

the departure of Marc Marquez to Ducati in 2024, is banking on the Frenchman to help revive

its fortunes.

The 2027 season will usher in new technical regulations, reducing engine capacity from 1,000cc to 850cc, a change that could reshuffle the competitive order and potentially end the dominance enjoyed in recent years by Ducati and now Aprilia.

Quartararo's first season in MotoGP was in 2019 and he quickly established himself at the highest level, two years later becoming the first French rider to win the premier-class world championship.

Arrogance or pride? Argentina grapples with World Cup villain label

Defeated finalists face global backlash over aggressive pitch tactics and post-match antics

- Critics blast Argentina for dirty tactics
- Fans defend passionate football style
- Final marked by fouls and brawls
- Racism claims target supporters

Critics blasted Argentina for dirty tactics and poor sportsmanship during their 1-0 loss to Spain, cementing the country's status as World Cup villain that grew throughout the tournament.

But Argentines argue they are just passionate and misunderstood.

"I think we deserve some credit for not being very well-liked, because of this tendency to be arrogant and look down on most people from a pedestal," said Leo Simone, 55, a lawyer, from his home north of Buenos Aires.

"They confuse arrogance with pride," his wife chimed in, preferring not to give her name.

While star Lionel Messi is beloved around the world, anti-Argentina sentiment grew as critics argued they were FIFA's darling and received favorable referee calls such as penalties and cards shown to opponents.

Then came the final, replete with fouls, brawls on the pitch, and the Argentine squad turning their backs when Spain received the World Cup trophy.

The New York Times called it a "tetchy, petulant and distasteful performance."

Former Germany player

Thomas Hitzlsperger wrote on X that the team were "disgusting sportsmen" and British television personality Piers Morgan said "they basically just went around whacking as many Spanish players as they could."

Near Ezeiza Airport, where thousands of fans welcomed the players returning to Buenos Aires on Monday night, Maximiliano Heredia, a 35-year-old construction worker, said: "We've always been criticized, we're used to it. But we always give it our all."

'We love it'

Many Argentines online wore the criticism as a badge of honor.

"There's something about Argentine irreverence that they can't tolerate. Our rebelliousness irritates them, enrages them... they call us cocky, cheaters, dirty. And we love it, it fills us with pride," journalist Pedro

Rosemblat wrote on his Instagram.

Sports journalist Ezequiel Fernandez Moores told AFP that some criticism was justified: "Sometimes we think we're the

center of the universe, that God and our own navel are Argentine."

He said local football codes of provocation, mockery, and boasting did not translate to a global audience.

"We can't expect the world to understand us, our way of being, feeling, and expressing ourselves," he said.

Nevertheless, the team turning their backs on Spain as they received the cup was "not right," he said.

The lawyer Simone rejects the notion that physical play makes Argentina a violent team.

"Argentina is a team that fights hard, like almost all South American football, but Spain also resorted to tactical fouls," he said.

"It's football: if you don't like being hit, play volleyball."

For Evelio Rubio, a 47-year-old Venezuelan neurologist who has lived in Argentina for a decade,

Messi says pain is 'immense' after World Cup final defeat

Lionel Messi has spoken publicly for the first time since Argentina's defeat in the World Cup final, saying the pain of the loss was "immense" while leaving his international future uncertain.

"The pain is immense, and this wound will take time to heal," the 39-year-old wrote on Instagram on Monday, a day after Argentina's 1-0 extra-time defeat to new world champions Spain.

The Argentina captain had left the stadium in East Rutherford, New Jersey, without speaking to reporters after Sunday's final. The expanded tournament in North America was the sixth World Cup of Messi's career with Argentina, and many interpreted his tears after the match as a possible farewell to the national team.

"It is hard to fully appreciate our achievement right now, but

this group reached two consecutive World Cup finals," Messi wrote, without addressing whether he intends to continue playing for Argentina.

The next World Cup will be held in 2030, with one of the matches scheduled to take place in Buenos Aires. Messi would be just short of his 43rd birthday when the tournament begins.

Alongside his message, Messi posted a photograph of himself wearing his runners-up medal.

"Thank you from the bottom of my heart for every greeting and message. Once again, we managed to unite as a country and stand together, sharing the immense pride of being Argentine," he wrote.

Messi also congratulated Spain, where he spent much of his club career, on winning its second World Cup title after its triumph in 2010.

it is impossible to understand from outside how "football is experienced here."

For a Venezuelan accustomed to his national team not winning titles, experiencing that passion from within "is spectacular."

Racism accusations

Argentine fans and some players have also faced accusations of racism -- such as a chant sung by the team in the past mocking the Black players on the French team as not being really French.

There is also a long history of club-level fans throwing bananas on the field or making monkey gestures at Brazilian fans or black players.

During this World Cup, FIFA condemned racism in a statement after an Argentine sup-

porter told a Black US influencer known as iShowSpeed to go "cry at the zoo" during a livestream.

American actor Samuel L. Jackson stirred controversy when he urged black people in an Instagram story not to support Argentina which he dubbed one of "the most racist countries in the world."

Sociologist Ivan Schuliaker of the National University of San Martin said people should not take racism related to football and apply it generally to Argentine society and history.

This racism exists and should not be denied, he said.

"But, in many cases, these labels come from colonizing countries that have not yet fully resolved the issue of racism."

La Liga chief says FIFA 'destroying football industry'

The president of the Spanish football league, Javier Tebas, accused FIFA of acting "irresponsibly" following the announcement of discussions regarding a possible 64-team World Cup in 2030, in an interview with an Italian sports daily published yesterday.

Tebas also said that FIFA president Gianni Infantino's time was "over", telling La Gazzetta dello Sport that there is a "system that is fundamentally flawed", which has allowed him to lead football's global governing body for a decade.

"The football industry is not just about the World Cup, however important it may be," he said.

"They are destroying the football industry -- which generates tens of thousands of jobs

-- for an event that lasts 40 days and involves only a minority of players."

At the World Cup opening ceremony in June, Infantino mentioned "discussions about expanding to 64 teams" for the World Cup's centenary in 2030, which will be co-hosted primarily by Spain, Portugal and Morocco, with Paraguay, Uruguay and Argentina also welcoming some matches.

Former Man Utd boss Ferguson salutes old rival Keegan

Former Manchester United manager Alex Ferguson has saluted Kevin Keegan for building Newcastle's "greatest team" following his old rival's death aged 75.

Keegan passed away on Monday after battling cancer, with Ferguson joining the tributes for one of football's most endearing characters.

Ferguson and Keegan were involved a fierce battle for Premier League supremacy, with United famously pipping Newcastle to the title in 1996.

Frustrated by Ferguson's comments in the media towards the end of that tense title fight, Keegan memorably ranted at the Scot in a iconic television interview.

But despite that row, Ferguson remained friendly with former Liverpool and

England striker Keegan, who earned his admiration with an impressive rebuilding job at Newcastle.

The Magpies were in danger of relegation to the third tier when Keegan took over, but he saved them from relegation be-

Keegan made Newcastle so dynamic that they were dubbed "the entertainers" for an eye-catching style that pushed Ferguson's team all the way in the title race.

Spain stars lap up adulation of estimated two million on parade

Players, fans and national leaders unite for jubilant celebrations across Madrid

New World Cup champions Spain enjoyed a vibrant night of celebrations after an open-top bus parade through the streets of Madrid in front of a jubilant crowd of an estimated two million people.

The players enjoyed drinks on their procession under a blazing sun, along the main arteries in the city centre where a sea of fans in red and yellow were waiting, before arriving at Cibeles square where they took to the stage and partied into the night.

The squad and coach Luis de la Fuente were introduced one by one to the fans, each with their own choice of music that they sung along to, wearing "We are champions" shirts.

"(Spain) showed the world what it is to work together, with one mind and one heart," said pop superstar Shakira in a video message played to the team and crowd.

De la Fuente offered a similar message, hailing his players as the "best in the world" and telling fans not to forget that "together we are stronger".

The players and staff posed for a photo before Rodri raised the trophy again, just as he had done on Sunday night after Spain beat Argentina 1-0 in extra-time in New Jersey to be crowned champions.

After flying back from the

United States to Madrid, the players were received by King Felipe VI and the royal family earlier yesterday, and then Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez, before kicking off the parade.

Players passed around the gleaming World Cup trophy and waved to their adoring supporters, some lining balconies, others on top of bus stops.

Ferran Torres's strike in extra-time was enough to bring Spain their second World Cup, following a first victory in 2010.

"You have shown your grit, your resilience and your courage... combining head and heart," the king told La Roja's stars, who were dressed in suits but changed to more casual clothing for their parade on a hot summer's day.

"Kings of the world" ran the words on the front of their vehicle, with fans chanting "champions" to their heroes.

Rodri held the World Cup tro-

phy aloft at the top of the stairs as he descended from the Iberia plane that flew the team home after clinching their second star.

The Manchester City midfielder said this was the crowning achievement of his career.

"I've always said it, winning with your country is the most beautiful thing there is, above all a World Cup," said Rodri.

"This generation grew up watching (Iker) Casillas and (Andres) Iniesta lift the cup and that we can do it today is the biggest thing you can do in football."

Many younger supporters were not yet born when Iniesta's extra-time goal against the Netherlands secured Spain's first World Cup in South Africa 16 years ago.

"I'm really happy about the second star" Spain has earned,

"very joyful," said Hector Molinar, a 14-year-old student, who said he was able to see Torres, teen star Lamine Yamal and Arsenal's Mikel Merino as the bus parade passed him.

It is "very different" to live a day like today than to have someone tell you about it, Hector added.

Match-winner Torres joked he was "flying, literally" after the team returned from the United States after beating Argentina in New Jersey.

Cibeles party

Spain's World Cup winners bus parade started at the Prime Minister's residence Moncloa before heading towards Cibeles square, a traditional celebration point for the team, where hordes of fans had reserved their spots hours in advance.

Players lifted coach De la Fuente into the air towards the end of a night of pure joy for La Roja.

Spain's women's side also won the World Cup in 2023, meaning

for the first time a country has both trophies at the same time.

In 2030, Spain's men's side will defend their crown on home soil, as one of the World Cup hosts along with Portugal and Morocco.

"It's two for two," said Prime Minister Sanchez, of Spain's record in World Cup finals. "Why not dream of a third in 2030, especially with Spain as hosts?"

Argentina, despite the presence of all-time great Lionel Messi, failed to create clear chances against Spain's well-organised and more positive side in Sunday's final.

Messi had a sensational World Cup but drifted through the final like a ghost, shedding tears at the end.

"The pain is immense, and it's going to be hard for this wound to heal," wrote Messi on Instagram, going on to congratulate La Roja.

In Madrid, tears also flowed on Monday night, but they were tears of joy.

Evenepoel wins 'special' Tour de France individual time-trial

Olympic champion Remco Evenepoel stormed to victory in yesterday's 26.1km individual time-trial at the Tour de France to shave valuable seconds off Tadej Pogacar's overall lead.

Belgian Evenepoel, 26, blasted over the stage 16 course along the shores of Lake Geneva 28 seconds quicker than reigning champion Pogacar in second.

Everyone else finished more than a minute back, with Dane Mattias Skjelmose taking third at 1min 04sec.

That performance by the world and Olympic time-trial champion -- on Belgium's national holiday -- cut four-time Tour winner Pogacar's overall lead to 4min 32sec.

"It's amazing, it was a very nice TT (time-trial), a lot of peo-

ple on the side of the road," said Evenepoel.

"My whole family from both sides being here, my parents

came just today. My wife is here with her parents and the siblings as well.

"And also on the Belgian na-

tional day is pretty special -- I read this morning it's been a while since Belgium won on National Day, so I'm proud to be the one."

It was Evenepoel's second successive stage victory after he triumphed on Sunday's mountainous 15th stage.

It was his fourth Tour stage victory overall, and his third in time-trials.

He also extended the gap to third-placed Isaac del Toro to more than two minutes.

But it was a miserable day for Evenepoel's Red Bull-BORA-Hansgrohe team-mate Florian Lipowitz.

Two days after two-time former winner Jonas Vingegaard crashed out of the Tour while sitting second overall, German Lipowitz went down hard on a bend and was forced out of

the race.

He had been fifth overall until that point and had set the fourth fastest time in the three intermediate time-checks.

But several minutes after he crashed, Lipowitz was escorted

to a medical vehicle holding his left arm.

"That's very unfortunate, it's like a bittersweet pill to swallow with this victory, so I wish him all the best and I hope it's not too bad," Evenepoel said of his team-mate.

Both Pogacar and Del Toro had a scare going through the same bend where Lipowitz fell but managed to stay upright.

From the moment Evenepoel began his time-trial, it was clear he was on course to do something special.

Once the top 10 contenders began their races against the clock, Skjelmose set the fastest time, well ahead of the best of the rest.

Lipowitz, Del Toro and French teenage prodigy Paul Seixas were only a handful of seconds behind at the three time-checks.
