US Navy ship on fire for 12 hours off Japan



♦ A fire on a US Navy ship off Japan was finally put out after 12 hours early yesterday, the US military said, after local vessels spent most of the **night dousing the blaze.** Two US sailors were treated for minor injuries from the fire

which broke out on the USS New Orleans in the southern island of Okinawa on Wednesday, the US 7th Fleet said in a statement. "The cause of the fire is currently under investigation... New Orleans' crew will remain aboard the ship,"

Ukrainian suspect arrested

Though the Mid-Atlantic bore the brunt of the impacts, the National Hurricane Center (NHC) urged beach goers throughout the entire East Coast to refrain from swimming to avoid being caught in potentially life-threatening conditions.

Zelensky demands security guarantees before summit

Ukrainian leader wants firm security guarantees before meeting Putin

- Zelensky says meeting depends on security guarantees
- Allies drafting military coalition led by UK and France

krainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said he could meet with Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin, but only after his allies agree security guarantees for Ukraine to deter future Russian attacks once the fighting stops.

In comments released yesterday, he also warned both sides were preparing for further fighting. Russia was building up troops on the southern front line and Ukraine was test-launching a new long-range cruise missile,

Russia said yesterday that Ukraine did not appear to be interested in "long-term" peace, accusing Kyiv of seeking security guarantees completely incompatible with Moscow's demands.

US President Donald Trump is trying to end Russia's three-anda-half year invasion of Ukraine through talks with Zelensky and

Indian, French leaders agree to strengthen 'strategic partnership'

India and France agreed to strengthen their strategic partnership and economic exchanges in a phone call between the two countries' leaders yesterday, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi said.

Modi and French President Emmanuel Macron also coordinated their positions on the war in Ukraine and the conflict in Gaza.

"Had a very good conversation with my friend President Macron," Modi said in a post on social media, adding that they had agreed to strengthen their "strategic partnership".
