US to send more troops

rs President Donald Trump has approved sending Userican troops to bolster Saudi Arabia's air and missile defences after the largest-ever attack on the Kingdom's oil facilities, which Washington has squarely blamed on Iran. The Pentagon said the deployment would involve a moderate number of troops - not numbering thousands - and would be primarily defensive in nature. It also detailed plans to expedite delivery of military equipment to both Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates.

Works Undersecretary at the Works, Municipalities Affairs and Urban Planning Ministry, Ahmed Abdulaziz Al Khayyat, said that the Tender Board had launched and awarded 14 tenders, worth BD 4,128,665, in August.

The tenders covered roads and sanitation projects, as well as those of construction and maintenance works, he added.

The Undersecretary pointed out that tenders for nine projects, worth BD 3,345,905, in the roads, sanitation, construction and maintenance fields had been awarded.

He also said that five tenders, with an estimated cost of BD 782,760, related mainly to the operation of the treated wastewater network and the maintenance of the residence of the Permanent Representative of the Kingdom at the United Nations in New

Mr Al Khayyat noted that a total of 54 purchase demands, costing BD 157,976, had been approved during the same month.

The Works Ministry had also received a number of rehabilitation applications from various sectors, five of which were approved and their licenses issued, four were rejected and three were canceled automatically, he indicated.

According to a report by The Washington Post, which cited two unnamed former US officials, the complaint stemmed from Trump's communications with Ukraine, and a "promise" allegedly made by the president.

Trump slammed the story as "ridiculous" and attacked the "partisan whistleblower," even though he said he does not know the person's identity.

Trump insisted he had a "totally appropriate" conversation, without detailing with whom, or what was said, and suggested it was Biden and his son who should be investigated for their actions in Ukraine.

Biden shot back forcefully, demanding Trump immediately release the transcript of the call and saying the reports that Trump sought to coerce his Ukrainian counterpart, if true, amounted to "clear-cut corruption."

Suspicions have focused on a July 25 call between Trump and Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky, a former comedian who was elected in May.

Trump's Democratic opponents have been probing that call in connection with allegations Trump and his personal lawyer Rudy Giuliani tried to pressure the Ukrainian administration.




