

US to send more troops

Us President Donald Trump has approved sending American troops to bolster Saudi Arabia's air and missile defences after the largest-ever attack on the Kingdom's oil facilities, which Washington has squarely blamed on Iran. The Pentagon said the deployment would involve a moderate number of troops - not numbering thousands - and would be primarily defensive in nature. It also detailed plans to expedite delivery of military equipment to both Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates.
