**Three COVID-19 deaths, 713 new cases**

The coronavirus (COVID-19) took the lives of three citizens yesterday in Bahrain, including two women aged 60 and 76 and an 80-year-old man, raising the virus death toll to 224.

Out of 11,438 tests conducted, 713 new infections were detected among 146 expatriates, 563 contacts and four travellers. There were also 676 recoveries, but the active cases still rose to 6,902, with 148 receiving treatment and 52 in critical condition.

# Virus fight 'a success story'
