# Step toward ‘just and lasting peace’

Historic shift as UK, Australia, Canada and Portugal recognise Palestinian state

Other Western countries, including France, are due to follow today

Britain, Australia, Canada and Portugal yesterday recognised a Palestinian state in a coordinated, historic shift in decades of Western foreign policy, triggering swift anger from Israel.

Portugal made it the latest Western nation to make the symbolic move as the war in Gaza shows no sign of ending.

Other countries, including France, are due to follow today at the annual UN General Assembly opening in New York.

Pressure

Israel has come under huge international pressure over its war against Hamas in Gaza launched in the wake of the October 7, 2023 attack, which has sparked a dire humanitarian crisis in the Palestinian territory.

Israeli leader Benjamin Netanyahu denounced the statehood moves and vowed “it will not happen. No Palestinian state will be established west of the Jordan River.”

He slammed the move as “absurd” and said it would “en-

danger” Israel’s existence, later vowing to expand Jewish settlements in the Israeli-occupied West Bank.

Hope

Netanyahu spoke after UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer said Britain was formally recognising the State of Palestine “to revive the hope of peace for the Palestinians and Israelis, and a two-state solution”.

The UK and Canada became the first members of the Group of Seven advanced economies to take the step, with Australia following suit.

Three-quarters of UN members now recognise Palestinian statehood, with at least 144 of the 193 member countries having taken the step, according to an AFP tally.

Canada “offers our partnership in building the promise of

a peaceful future”, Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney wrote on X.

Aspirations

Australia’s Prime Minister Anthony Albanese said the move “recognises the legitimate and long held aspirations of the people of Palestine to a state of their own”.

Palestinian president Mahmud Abbas hailed the rec-

ognitions as “an important and necessary step toward achieving a just and lasting peace”.

It is a watershed moment for Palestinians and their ambitions for statehood, with the most powerful Western nations having long argued it should only come as part of a negotiated peace deal with Israel.

Although a largely symbolic move, it puts those countries at odds with the United States and Israel.

US President Donald Trump said last week after talks with Starmer during a state visit to the UK that “one of our few disagreements” was over Palestinian statehood.

And French President Emmanuel Macron insisted in an interview with a US television network that releasing the hostages captured in 2023 would be “a requirement very clearly before opening, for instance, an embassy in Palestine”.

## Bahrain set to welcome first breath of autumn today

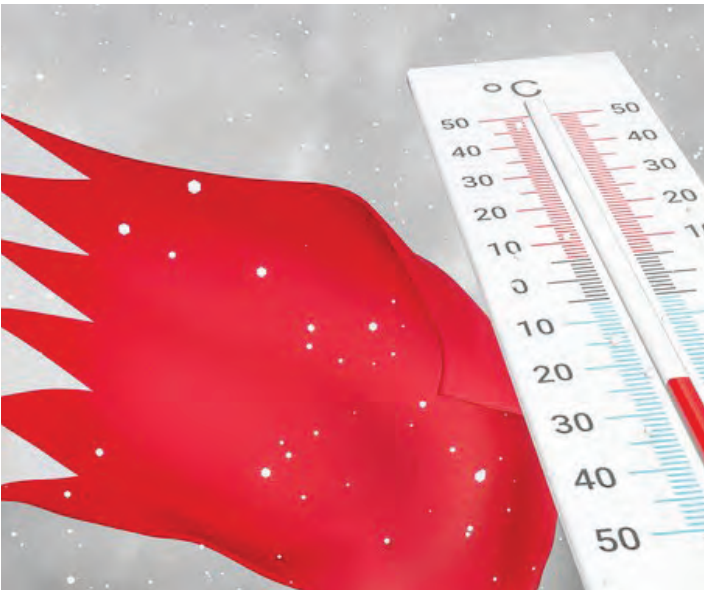

Autumn arrives in Bahrain today.

Forecasters expect the first dip of the season below 40°C, lower humidity, and a general easing in the air.

The Meteorological Directorate at the Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications says the shift begins today: highs under 40°C, maximum humidity no higher than 70 per cent, and an overnight low of 27°C.

A run of north-westerly winds is due through Thursday, 25 September, with speeds from moderate to brisk and at times



strong. Seas will be higher, and dust may be raised in open areas.

Temperatures have already begun to ease over the past week.

Continued north-westerlies should make evenings milder as surface humidity drops and it feels less hot.

Advisory

The Directorate advised the public, especially sea-goers, to take care and follow official notices.

Astronomy researcher Ali Al Hajari said the approaching autumnal equinox, driven by the tilt of the Earth’s axis, will lower the Sun’s height at noon and trim temperatures by about

0.1°C a day.

Night-time lows are slipping from 30°C to 27°C, and daytime highs from 38°C to 35°C.

Coolness

A touch of coolness at night is expected in late October, with daytime easing running to the end of November.

He added that the move from summer to winter is gradual rather than sudden, though it shows up in daily life: seasonal illnesses among children and older people, more migratory birds over the Kingdom, the start of various planting and harvest periods, and an increase in certain fish that draw local fishermen.

# Fraudulent fronts

Message parlors allegedly used to disguise money laundering operations

● Court set to rule October 14 in BD138,000 case

The First High Criminal Court has scheduled October 14 to deliver its verdict in a high-profile money laundering case involving a general manager and several Asian investors accused of channeling more than BD138,000 in illicit funds linked to prostitution.

According to the Public Prosecution, the defendants, along with a deceased accomplice, allegedly operated a network of message parlors in Bahrain between 2019 and 2023.



Investigators said the establishments were used as a front to collect cash and card payments generated from prostitution activities.

The proceeds were then funneled through bank transfers and currency exchanges to disguise their illegal origin. Evidence presented in court

indicated that a large portion of the funds was transferred abroad, with the defendants profiting from the transactions. Investigators also noted that many of the clients engaged in prostitution were from the same countries to which the funds were remitted.

### Conviction

The defendants and the deceased accomplice had earlier been convicted of charges including inciting and facilitating prostitution, profiting from the exploitation of others, and managing establishments used for prostitution.

They were each sentenced to two years in prison in that case. The court will now decide whether the accused are guilty of laundering BHD138,747 linked to the same activities.

## Al-Dhaen Hails Partnership

Bahrain's relations with Japan have entered a new era with the elevation of ties to a strategic partnership, said MP Dr. Maryam Al-Dhaen while calling it a historic turning point that strengthens innovation and knowledge economy goals.

She noted the upgrade goes beyond protocol, opening avenues for political, economic, scientific and cultural cooperation while rooted in peace and sustainable development.

### Practical pillars

Dr. Al-Dhaen pointed to agreements signed during HRH Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa's visit to Tokyo, covering intellectual property with the Japan Patent Office, a memorandum with JAXA, and digital transformation. These, she said, form practical pillars for youth to gain advanced expertise, supporting Bahrain's Vision 2030.

### Deep roots

Noting that the ties trace back to 1934's first Bahraini oil shipment to Japan and formalised in 1972 with diplomatic relations, Dr. Al-Dhaen affirmed the elevation reflects the leaderships' will to build a partnership that advances stability, prosperity, and a shared future.

## Expat jailed for three years, fined and deported over phone scam

Three years' jail, a BD1,000 fine and deportation for an Asian expat who stole BD1,100 in a phone-code scam run with help from a shadowy overseas

gang.

The court said he worked with accomplices abroad to target residents in Bahrain, calling victims and tricking them into sharing verification codes sent to their phones.

Once the code was entered,

the gang could access the victim's account and transfer the money out before anyone noticed.

In one instance, the man pretended to be a Ministry of Justice employee.

He phoned a victim and

claimed he could help recover money from a previous case.

All he needed, he said, was the code that would arrive on the victim's phone.

Moments later, BD1,100 was gone and the money was sent abroad.

# Dairy to Digital Ties

Talks stretch from dairy to digital

● Food, dairy and IT in focus

● BCCI and Serbian chamber co chair

● Expo 2027 briefing adds weight

From dairy farms to digital technologies, Bahrain is pushing for a broader trade agenda with Serbia as it works to build partnerships beyond oil and traditional industries.

## New cooperation

A Bahraini delegation led by the Bahrain Chamber of Commerce and Industry met with the Serbian Chamber of Commerce and Industry in Belgrade to explore fresh opportunities in food production, dairy products, information technology, construction and financial services. The meeting was held during the official visit of His Highness Shaikh Nasser bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Representative of His Majesty the King for Humanitarian Work and Youth Affairs.

By placing food and dairy on the same table as digital and

financial services, both sides highlighted a deliberate move towards diversification. Officials said the aim was to create new channels of partnership that can boost trade exchange and deepen bilateral ties.

## Private sector role

The session was co-chaired by BCCI Second Vice Chairman Mohammed Abduljabbar Al Kooheji and Serbian Chamber Deputy President Mihailo Vesovi, with Bahrain's Ambassador to Serbia Ahmed Abdulrahman Al Saati also present. Business leaders and senior economic figures from both countries joined the talks, underlining

how private sector partnerships can lay the groundwork for joint projects that reflect global economic trends.

Bahrain's delegation noted that the Kingdom's advanced infrastructure and flexible regulations support its role as an investment hub and a gateway to Gulf and Arab markets. When combined with Serbia's strengths in food production and manufacturing, the cooperation sets the stage for mutual growth.

## Expo 2027 outlook

The delegation also attended a briefing on Expo 2027 Belgrade, which will be held under



the theme 'Play for Humanity: Sport and Music for All'. Organisers said the international event would attract broad global participation and provide a platform for innovation in sustainable development, creative industries, technology, health and sport.

Bahrain's meetings in Belgrade showed a push to widen its trade map by linking food and dairy with IT and finance, signalling a strategy to grow economic options from dairy to digital.

## Trial opens in major employment fraud case

The First High Criminal Court has begun hearings in the trial of five defendants — two men and three women — accused of orchestrating a large-scale employment fraud through two bogus companies.

According to prosecutors, the scheme enabled 55 fake employees to be registered between 2022 and 2024, allowing the group to unlawfully collect BD3.2 million in social insurance benefits.

During the latest session, the defendants denied all charges.

## Contracts

The third and fourth defendants argued they were unaware the employment contracts were forged, while the second defendant claimed he is illiterate and unable to use a computer.

Several defense lawyers appeared in court. Attorney Hamad Boushlaibi submitted a memorandum seeking his client's acquittal, while lawyer Fatima Al-Mutawa, representing attorney Sharifa, requested additional time to review documents and prepare her defense.

The court adjourned the case until September 28.

The case was uncovered after the General Authority for Social Insurance flagged

irregularities during routine inspections.

Investigators found that the companies had submitted falsified contracts to register employees, enabling them to claim unemployment benefits and lump-sum payouts.

Officials discovered that the firms had no physical presence at their listed commercial addresses.

Further scrutiny revealed repeated signatures on multiple contracts and uniform salary structures — BD350 for secondary school graduates and BD600 for university degree holders — regardless of role or experience.

A captain from the Anti-Corruption Crimes Directorate testified that the companies were fictitious entities created solely to defraud the social insurance system.

According to his testimony, the first and second defendants recruited individuals as "ghost employees," arranging for them to receive BD350 in monthly wages.

Workers were instructed to keep BD50 and return the remainder to the prime defendant or his associates.

Through this scheme, the defendants allegedly secured unjustified social insurance benefits, including unemployment allowances and fabricated service credits.

## BD3mln government procurement requests reviewed

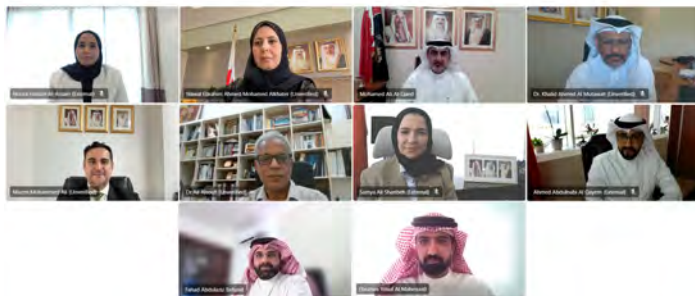

The committee discussed sev-

eral key items, including the Consumer Protection Complaints and Enquiries system.

The system will use AI to document complaints from multiple channels, and classify, analyze,

and process them efficiently, with automated verification of attachments such as contracts and invoices.

It will also analyze complaint patterns, generate statistics,

provide comprehensive summaries of recurring issues, and offer smart dashboards to accelerate processing, increase transparency, and enhance customer satisfaction.

The committee also reviewed the Ministry of Health electronic system project, which automates the calculation of impairment percentage using American Medical Association standards.

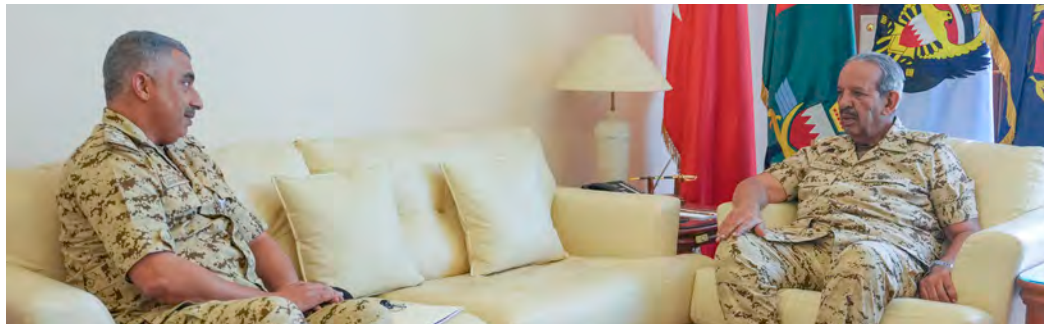
The system will provide a transparent evaluation mechanism, enhanced accuracy, and reliable outcomes, and will facilitate data availability for research and future analysis.

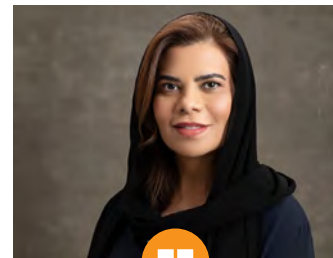

## Americans would dominate board of new TikTok US entity: W. House

Washington, United States

A deal for the Chinese parent company of popular video-sharing app TikTok to sell its US operations would see the creation of a board dominated by Americans, the White House said Saturday.

"There will be seven seats on the board that controls the app in the United States, and six of those seats will be Americans," White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt told Fox News.

She said a deal could be signed "in the coming days."

The United States has forcefully sought to take TikTok's US operations out of the hands of Chinese parent company ByteDance for national security reasons.

Under President Donald Trump's predecessor Joe Biden, Congress passed a law to force ByteDance to sell its US

operations or face a ban of the app.

US policymakers, including Trump in his first term, have warned that China could use TikTok to mine data from Americans or exert influence on what they see on social media.

But Trump turned to the platform, which is hugely popular with young Americans, to garner support during his successful 2024 presidential campaign.

The Republican president has repeatedly delayed implementation of the ban while a deal has been sought.

Investors reportedly being eyed to take over the app include Oracle, the tech firm owned by Larry Ellison, one of the world's richest people -- and a major Trump supporter.

Leavitt seemed to confirm Oracle's participation.

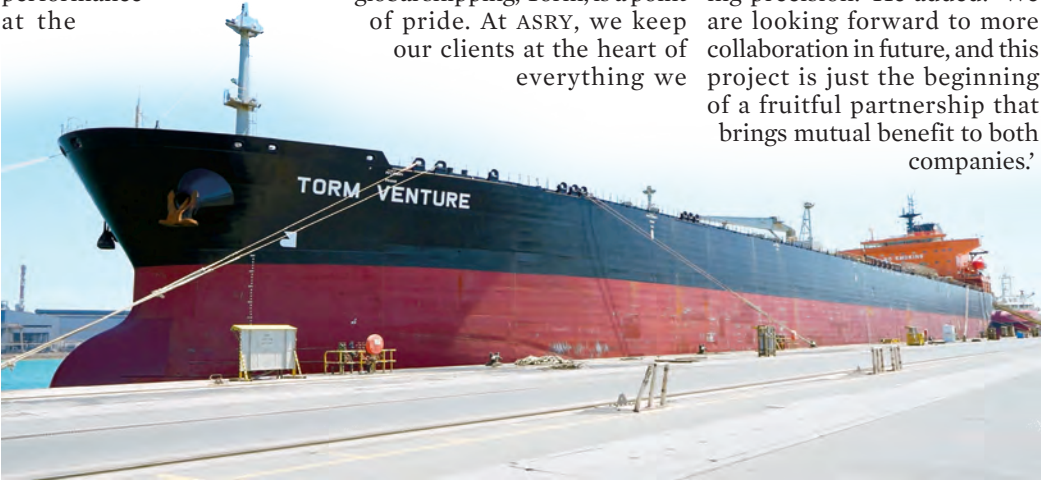

## European airports getting back online after cyberattack

European airports were starting to recover on Sunday from a cyberattack affecting their check-in systems that has caused flight cancellations and huge delays for thousands of passengers over the past two days.

While Brussels airport said almost one-fifth of Sunday’s scheduled departures had been cancelled, other affected hubs said their schedules were getting back to normal.

London Heathrow and Dublin airports said they were managing passenger flows while they tried to fix the problem with the software.

Dublin airport said it expected to function normally throughout Sunday.

Its “team is continuing to support airlines today as they



deal with the ongoing disruption caused by a Europe-wide technical issue that is impacting on their check-in and boarding systems,” it said in a post on X.

Heathrow Airport said in a statement the “vast majority of flights” continued to be operated thanks to collaboration with the airlines.

A Brussels airport spokeswoman said 45 of 257 departing flights had been cancelled and passengers could expect delays of “between 30 and 90 minutes”.

Airports began reporting problems with passenger

check-in software supplied by Collins Aerospace on Friday.

The company said on Saturday it was “actively working to resolve the issue and restore full functionality to our customers as quickly as possible”.

The aviation tech company, which specialises in digital and data processing services, is a subsidiary of the American aerospace and defence group RTX, formerly known as Raytheon.

Cyberattacks and tech outages have disrupted airports around the world in recent years, from Japan to Germany, as air travel increasingly relies on online, interconnected systems.

The aviation sector saw a 600-percent increase in cyberattacks from 2024 to 2025, according to a report by French aerospace company Thales released in June.

◆ **US President Donald Trump** will lead tributes to Charlie Kirk on Sunday at a huge stadium gathering to honor the young right-wing influencer slain in America's latest spasm of political violence. As he left the White House to fly out west, Trump said the memorial service aimed "to celebrate the life of a great man. Really a great man." He added: "Will be a very interesting day. A very tough day." Thousands of people lined up in the pre-dawn dark hoping to get into the 63,000-seat American football stadium hosting the service and honor the young Republican star who was a close ally of the president and is credited with helping him get reelected.



**Trump to lead tributes at memorial for conservative leader Kirk**

◆ **President Donald Trump** yesterday said he would defend Poland and the Baltic states in case of an escalation from Russia, following Moscow's incursion into Estonia's airspace. Asked whether he would help defend the EU members if Russia intensifies hostilities, Trump told reporters: "Yeah, I would. I would." Estonia has requested an emergency meeting of the UN Security Council on Monday following Friday's incursion. Three Russian MiG-31 fighters violated Estonian airspace over the Gulf of Finland, triggering complaints of a dangerous new provocation from the European Union and NATO but a denial from Moscow. Italian F-35 fighters attached to NATO's air defense support mission in the Baltic states, along with Swedish and Finnish aircraft, were scrambled to intercept the Russian jets and warn them off.

◆ **Syria is set** to hold the selection process for a transitional parliament on October 5, in accordance with a constitutional declaration announced earlier this year, the electoral commission said yesterday. The People's Assembly of Syria was dissolved by the country's new Islamist authorities who seized power after ousting longtime ruler Bashar al-Assad in a lightning offensive last December. The upcoming legislature, which will serve for a five-year transitional period, will comprise 210 lawmakers -- 140 designated by local committees supervised by the electoral commission and 70 directly nominated by interim President Ahmed al-Sharaa. The process will be held on October 5 "in the electoral districts of Syria's provinces", the commission wrote on its Telegram channel. It did not specify if all provinces would take part.

**White House says \$100,000 H-1B visa fee to be one-time payment**

The White House issued a major clarification Saturday to its new H-1B visa policy that had rattled the tech industry, saying a \$100,000 fee will be a "one-time" payment imposed only on new applicants.

US Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick, in announcing the major fee increase on Friday, said it would be paid annually, and would apply to people seeking a new visa as well as renewals.

But White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt issued a clarification on Saturday, hours before the new policy was to go into effect.

"This is NOT an annual fee. It's a one-time fee that applies... only to new visas, not

renewals, and not current visa holders," she said in a social media post.

The executive order, which is likely to face legal challenges, comes into force Sunday at 12:01 am US Eastern time (0401 GMT), or 9:01 pm Saturday on the Pacific Coast.

Prior to the White House's clarification, US companies were scrambling to figure out the implications for their foreign workers, with several reportedly warning their employees not to leave the country.

Some people who were already on planes preparing to leave the country on Friday de-boarded over fears they may not be allowed to re-enter the United States, the San Francisco Chronicle reported.

Evacuations in Philippines, Taiwan as **super typhoon** nears

The Philippines and Taiwan ordered evacuations yesterday ahead of possible flooding and landslides as Super Typhoon Ragasa approached, gaining strength on its way to an eventual collision with southern China.

The storm was undergoing "rapid intensification" and expected to make landfall on the sparsely populated Batanes or Babuyan islands by Tuesday afternoon, the Philippine weather agency said.

Maximum sustained winds were 185 kilometres per hour at the storm's center as of 11 am (0300 GMT), with gusts reaching up to 230 kph as it moved

westward toward the archipelago. Local officials "must waste no time in moving families out of

danger zones", interior department Secretary Jonvic Remulla said in a statement.

In Taiwan, authorities said nearly 300 people will be evacuated from Hualien County in the east, adding figures could change depending on the typhoon's movement.

"We estimate that a land typhoon warning will be issued tonight... and tomorrow morning at 6 am the typhoon will approach Taiwan's offshore," the Central Weather Administration said.

Philippine weather specialist John Grender Almario told a Sunday press briefing that "severe flooding and landslides" were expected in northern areas of main island Luzon.

Outcry after Trump urges Justice Department to charge his enemies

The top US Democratic senator warned yesterday that President Donald Trump's call for the Justice Department to take action against his enemies puts America on a path to dictatorship.

Turning the agency "into an instrument that goes after his enemies, whether they're guilty or not... is the path to a dictatorship," Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer said on CNN. "That's what dictatorships do."

He added: "I think it's a real threat to democracy."

Trump publicly urged his Justice Department on Saturday to take action against his perceived enemies, the latest in a series of moves that critics say have shattered the agency's traditional independence.

In a social media post addressing "Pam" -- apparently Attorney General Pam Bondi -- Trump fumed over the lack of legal action against California Senator Adam Schiff and New York Attorney General Letitia James, both Democrats.



Schiff and James are among a handful of people who have been accused by a close Trump ally, Federal Housing Finance Agency Director Bill Pulte, of falsifying documents on mortgage applications.

"We can't delay any longer, it's killing our reputation and credibility," Trump said.

On Friday, Trump fired the federal prosecutor who was overseeing the probe into James, after the attorney reportedly insisted

there was insufficient evidence to charge her with mortgage fraud.

Erik Siebert, US attorney for the Eastern District of Virginia, told staff of his resignation via an email on Friday, the New York Times and other US media outlets reported.

"I fired him, and there is a GREAT CASE, and many lawyers, and legal pundits, say so," Trump said Saturday, apparently referencing the probe into James.

On Friday, asked by a reporter to comment on the case, Trump said: "I am not following it very closely. It looks to me like she's very guilty of something, but I really don't know."

Schiff and James have separately clashed with Trump in prior years, leading investigations that the Republican president alleges were political witch hunts.

During Trump's first term in the White House, Schiff, then a member of the US House, led the prosecution at the president's first impeachment trial, which was based on allegations he pressured Ukraine to interfere in the 2020 election.

After Trump left the White House, James brought a major civil fraud case against him, alleging he and his company had unlawfully inflated his wealth and manipulated the value of properties to obtain favorable bank loans or insurance terms.

A state judge ordered Trump to pay \$464 million in that suit, but a higher court later removed the financial penalty while upholding the underlying judgment.

Get pregnant in our hotels and receive rewards, Polish hotelier says

A Polish real estate group hopes to tackle the country's falling birth rate by rewarding clients who conceive babies in its hotels.

On its website the Arche group, which owns 23 hotels and numerous buildings across the country, laments the demographic crisis resulting from the steady 12-year decline of Poland's birth rate.

In an attempt to reverse that trend, the hotelier has launched an incentives programme offering "free special events", such



as a baptism, to clients who can prove that "the conception" of a baby was "linked to the couple's stay" at one of their properties.

Couples are also offered a bo-

children born after the parents buy a home with the company.

The programme, Arche Generations, is valid for "couples (man and woman)", conditional on at least one partner being an adult Polish citizen and living in the country. Bonuses will also be offered to Arche employees who have children.

As of late June, the population of Poland was approximately 37.4 million inhabitants, one million fewer than in 2015, according to the National Statistics Office GUS.

# US deal on Bagram base 'not possible'

An Afghan government defence official said Sunday that a deal over Bagram air base was "not possible", after US President Donald Trump said he wanted the former US base back.

Bagram, the largest air base in Afghanistan located north of the capital Kabul, was the centre of

US operations in their 20 year against the Taliban.

Trump threatened unspecified punishment against Afghanistan if it was not returned -- four years after it was abandoned by US troops.

"If Afghanistan doesn't give Bagram Airbase back to those that built it, the United States of America, BAD THINGS ARE GOING TO HAPPEN!!!" the 79-year-old leader wrote on his Truth Social platform.

On Sunday, Fasihuddin Fitrat, chief of staff of Afghanistan's ministry of defence, said "some people" want to take back the base through a "political deal".

"Recently, some people have said that they have entered negotiations with Afghanistan for taking back Bagram air base," he said in comments broadcast by local media.

"A deal over even an inch of Afghanistan's soil is not possible. We don't need it."

Later in an official statement, the Afghan government said warned that "Afghanistan's

independence and territorial integrity are of the utmost importance".

Trump has repeatedly criticised the loss of the base, noting its proximity to China.

But Thursday while on a state visit to Britain was the first time he publicly raised the idea of the United States retaking control of it.

US and NATO troops chaotically pulled out of Bagram in July 2021, under Joe Biden's presidency but as part of a 2020

Trump-brokered deal with Taliban insurgents.

The loss of crucial air power saw the Afghan military collapse just weeks later and the Taliban sweep back to power.

Trump was asked by reporters at the White House if he was considering sending US troops to retake Bagram.

"We won't talk about that, but we're talking now to Afghanistan, and we want it back and we want it back soon, right away. And if they

don't do it, you're going to find out what I'm going to do," he said.

A massive, sprawling facility, Amnesty International, Human Rights Watch and others have repeatedly raised allegations of systematic human rights abuses by US forces at Bagram, especially pertaining to detainees in Washington's murky "War on Terror".

The original airfield was built with assistance from what was then the Soviet Union in the early 1950s, expanded with US help during the Cold War, and significantly developed further by Moscow during the decade-long Soviet occupation of Afghanistan.

At the height of US control around 2010 it had grown to the size of a small town, with supermarkets and shops including outlets such as Dairy Queen and Burger King.

It was visited by several US presidents including Barack Obama in 2012 and Trump in 2019.



## British couple released by Taliban say feared execution

An elderly British couple released by the Taliban authorities after almost eight months in detention in Afghanistan arrived back in the UK on Saturday, telling the press that they feared "we would never be released".

Peter Reynolds, 80, and his wife Barbie, 76, arrived on a flight from the Qatari capital Doha, where they had stayed for medical checks following their release on Friday.

Barbie Reynolds smiled

broadly as the couple walked out of the arrivals area at London's Heathrow airport, accom-

panied by their daughter and British special representative to Afghanistan Richard Lindsay.

After their return, Peter Reynolds told The Times that the couple had "begun to think that we would never be released, or that we were even being held until we were executed". "We are bewildered as to why any of this happened and are very happy that this ordeal is over," he said.

For her part, Barbie said the toughest thing about the affair was "seeing my 80-year-old husband struggling to get into the back of a police truck with his hands and ankles chained".

Their family has spoken of

their "immense joy" on hearing that the Reynolds were released, and there were emotional scenes when they arrived in Doha on a flight from Kabul to be met by their daughter.

"This experience has reminded us of the power of diplomacy, empathy and international co-operation," their four children said in a joint statement on Friday. "While the road to recovery will be long as our parents regain their health and spend time with their family, today is a day of tremendous joy and relief."

Bahrain's Birhanu Balew wrapped up his campaign at the World Athletics Championships Tokyo 2025 yesterday, placing seventh in the men's 5000 metres final. The 29-year-old clocked 13:00.55 in the closing race at the National Stadium. The final, Bahrain's last

event of the competition, was among the most competitive of the championships. Olympic 1500m champion Cole Hocker of the US, who had failed to reach the 1500m final earlier in the week, rose like a phoenix in the 5000m to claim gold in 12:58.30, narrowly edging Belgium's Isaac Kimeli (12:58.78). France's Jimmy Gressier, fresh off his 10,000m win, secured bronze in 12:59.33. Remarkably, the top seven all dipped under the 13-minute mark, highlighting the race's exceptional quality.

Balew entered with hopes of earning his first-ever world medal, buoyed by his personal and Asian record of 12:48.67 set earlier this year in Paris. He positioned himself well for much of the contest but was unable to stay with the furious closing pace over the final lap. Still, his performance reflected his place among the sport's elite and capped a solid campaign in Tokyo.

# Arsenal deny City with late equalizer

Martinelli’s stoppage-time chip cancels Haaland opener as Guardiola’s defensive substitutions backfire

- Arsenal and Manchester City draw 1-1

Gabriel Martinelli rescued Arsenal as the Brazilian’s last-gasp equaliser salvaged a 1-1 draw against Manchester City yesterday when Pep Guardiola’s defensive tactics backfired at the Emirates Stadium.

With City clinging to the lead given to them by Erling Haaland early in the first half, Guardiola made a series of unusually cautious substitutions that left his side without a recognised striker on the pitch in the closing stages.

It was the kind of rearguard action that is rarely associated with the attack-minded Guardiola, but his willingness to sacrifice his purist principles for a more pragmatic approach came back to haunt him.

It was a change made by Arsenal manager Mikel Arteta that proved decisive as Martinelli came off the bench to spare his team from a second defeat to a title rival after their loss at champions Liverpool in August.

Arsenal moved up to second

place, five points behind Liverpool, while City are languishing in ninth with just two wins from their first five league matches.

Already eight points adrift of Liverpool, it will take a significant improvement from Guardiola’s men to catch Arne Slot’s pace-setters, who have won their first five league matches.

Liverpool were the real winners from the slugfest in north

London, which left Guardiola without a league win in five successive matches against an opponent for the first time in his reign.

Despite grumbling about City having to play their Champions League opener against Napoli 48 hours after Arsenal were in action at Athletic Bilbao, Guardiola named an unchanged side.

Guardiola had said City might

as well go “hiking” in the 66 hours between the Napoli and Arsenal games, such was the lack of consideration for his players’ fitness.

But if Guardiola felt City had a mountain to climb, the trek looked more manageable after just nine minutes.

up play launched a blistering City break as Tijjani Reijnders sprinted towards the Arsenal area slipping a precise pass to the Norwegian, who applied the finishing touch with a clinical low strike from eight yards.

Haaland resisted the temptation to use his zen celebration after Arsenal’s Myles Lewis-Skelly had mockingly copied the pose when he scored in the Gunners’ 5-1 win over City in February.

Haaland’s fifth goal in seven league appearances against Arsenal took the 25-year-old to 12 goals in eight games for City and Norway this season.

Having conceded from open play for the first time this season, Arsenal were nearly breached again when Haaland teed up Reijnders for a powerful drive that forced David Raya to save.

Arteta was criticised for being

too cautious when he picked Martin Zubimendi, Declan Rice and Mikel Merino at Liverpool, but he selected the same mid-field trio and once again the move was far from a resounding success.

Noni Madueke’s blast from 12 yards finally forced a save from Donnarumma just before half-time.

A feisty clash threatened to boil over when City captain Bernardo Silva kicked the ball into Leandro Trossard’s groin before the Arsenal winger threw the ball back at him in retaliation.

“Hopefully he’s going to come next year to enjoy everything.”

Top seed Swiatek breezed her way into the final, winning back-to-back games on Saturday in a combined time of two and a half hours.

Her touch completely deserted her in the opening set of the final, committing error after error to hand number two seed Alexandrova the upper hand.

Four-time champion Max Verstappen cruised to victory for Red Bull in yesterday's Azerbaijan Grand Prix after series leader Oscar Piastri crashed on the opening lap and McLaren failed to clinch the constructors' title.

Driving with supreme authority, the Dutchman led from lights to flag to claim his first win on the unforgiving barrier-lined Baku street track, his second in succession this month, fourth this year and 67th of his career.

Verstappen came home 14.609 seconds clear of Mercedes' George Russell, who has been struggling with

sickness all weekend, and 19sec clear of Carlos Sainz who scored his first podium and best result since joining Williams from Ferrari this season.

Mercedes' teenage rookie Kimi Antonelli put his run of poor outings behind him by finishing fourth ahead of Racing Bulls' rookie Liam Lawson and Yuki Tsunoda in the second Red Bull – leaving Lando Norris, in the second McLaren, to come home seventh.

For Norris, it was a wasted opportunity to exploit Piastri's rare misfortune after the Australian's run of 34 points finishes ended in the Turn Six barriers.

He trimmed his title lead by only six points to 25 while McLaren, needing to

beat Ferrari by nine points for a second consecutive teams' title missed out, but have seven rounds remaining.

In winning, Verstappen completed more laps as race leader this season than Norris and delivered the sixth 'grand slam' of pole, win and fastest lap in his career.

With 255 points, he is now third behind Norris on 299 and leader Piastri on 324.

"An incredible weekend," said Verstappen.

Only a skirmish when Williams' Alex Albon hit Alpine's luckless Franco Colapinto interrupted the flow before Leclerc began the pit-stops, swapping his mediums for hards to rejoin 12th. Albon was given a 10-second penalty.

As Verstappen cruised calmly towards victory, the cars behind him scrapped for the crumbs as they boxed in the hope of finding fresh wind on new tyres.

It didn't work out for Norris who had battled his way into the top six when he came in. A messy pit-stop lost him a couple of places which could prove costly in the race for the title.
