Iran threatens to enrich uranium to 60% purity

T John the ante in a standoff with Washington, Iran's Supreme Leader yesterday threatened to enrich uranium up to 60% purity.

"Iran's uranium enrichment level will not be limited to 20% We will increase it to whatever level the country needs...We may increase it to 60%," state television quoted Ayatollah Ali Khamenei as saying.

He also accused Americans and Europeans of using unjust language against Iran, white threatening to hang on to its stance. "Our stance will not change," Khamenei said.

He repeated a denial that Iran would ever seek to build nuclear weapons.
